Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated monthly but


must be scheduled weeks in advance. Active parishioners should contact your parish office to begin preparations.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT
Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of
fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays
during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from
meat. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18
until age 59 - and encouraged for all ages. When fasting,
a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as
two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full
meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are
binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age
14 and older. The fast on Good Friday is continued
until after the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as
the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of
the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more
fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.
