A LETTER FROM OUR PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

First Communion - A Special Day



This Saturday, May 5th was First Communion Day at St. Mary of the Woods. Every year First Communion Day is always one of the great days in the life of our parish. This year forty-three girls and boys from our faith community were given the Sacrament of the Eucharist and received the Body of Christ for the first time. During the ceremony I told the parents that they had every right to be extremely proud of their children and I offered the parents a special word of thanks.

Our faith is the most precious gift we have and one of the most important duties of parents is to pass on the gift of faith to their children. In having reached First Communion Day, the parents had brought their children another step. They had reached together a new spiritual milestone. So, in the name of the Church and our parish, I thanked the parents for all they are doing.

I mentioned too, our formation teachers: School Principal, school teachers, Director of Religious Education, our catechists and aides. Our entire formation and religious education team have done so much. I thanked too the relatives and friends of our first communicants - grandmas and grandpas, godparents, aunts and uncles, cousins, because their presence with us on First Communion Day added to the significance of the moment and it helped to emphasize the tremendous importance of the Eucharist. It was a marvelous day for our parish. The energy in those young people gave us all a boost. I look forward to their on-going participation, together with their families, in Sunday Mass and in the life of our parish into the future.

Unfortunately, one of the great tragedies of our time is that so many parents are not helping their children to develop a religious framework that will enrich their lives and give them the understanding and the vocabulary to meet whatever life will throw at them. Isn't there something inexpressibly sad about parents bringing their children to elocution and karate and ballet and baseball and basketball and indoor volleyball and the one thousand and one other lessons and courses that parents spend so much of their lives bringing their children to in the belief that these will in some way stand to their children as they grow up. And at the same time they rarely if ever bring their children to church or to Mass, never introduce them to the rituals that will give their children a scaffolding to help them make sense of life and to cope with whatever life will throw at them.

The irony is that parents were never so attentive to the needs of their children, never so committed to giving their children what they believe their children will need to make a success of their lives. Most parents would die for their children. And because so many parents can't stand back and take a long hard look at life, the gift that a religious impulse would be to their children is slipping like sand through their fingers.

I know a little girl called Rebecca and when her Granny is ill or when her Daddy is away from home, her mother brings her to the church on the way home from school and they light a candle for Granny to get better or for Daddy to come home safely (and occasionally for Basil the cat). That simple ritual - visiting the church, lighting the candle, saying a little prayer to God - has become for Rebecca a great comfort and a great solace when little worries impinge on her innocent mind. What that ritual gives Rebecca is a framework or scaffolding that helps her to deal with the uncertainties and confusions of her young life and if the effort is persevered with she will, as an adult, have a framework to help her cope with the unpredictable vicissitudes of her life into the future.

And because she will come to an appreciation of the value of a religious framework and the Christian rituals that sustain it she in turn will want to pass that on to her children. I have no doubt but that when Rebecca grows up and falls in love and has her own Rebecca, that just as her mother took her to the church to light that candle, that one day, she will take her child to another church, to light another candle.

That's what ritual is, a religious framework within which we can make some attempt to make sense of what we can make sense of and to live with what's beyond what our minds can understand. That's what prayer, Mass, and the Sacraments are all about: a scaffolding which sustains our connection with Jesus Christ, who is at the heart of life.

May God bless this year's first communicants, their parents, and families and may the light of faith, hope and love burn brightly for them all the days of their lives.

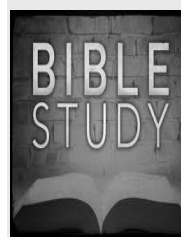
