Pastor's Corner

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

The headlines left me stunned. The videos I saw left me shocked. The scenes coming from Kabul Airport as the Taliban takes control of the country of Afghanistan and people trying to escape the country seem other worldly. They are scenes that just seem so foreign to our experiences here in the United States.



Among all the people trying to flee the country I began to think of those who fear their lives for their Christian faith as their country falls back into the control of a group that has as a policy the desire for the total eradication of Christianity. We so often hear stories of the martyrs and can begin to think that the age of Christian martyrs was hundreds, if not thousands, of years in the past. But the truth is that there are places in the world where this very day it is risking your life to profess faith in Jesus Christ and to attend Mass.

This situation is not limited to Afghanistan. Places in the Middle East, in Asia, and in Africa people's faith and attendance at Mass puts them in danger of their lives. And yet they come and they believe.

At the end of last school year, when I was teaching a class of junior religion at Serra High School in San Mateo, the situation between Israel and Palestine was deteriorating and violence was breaking out and I decided to take a day with my class and hear from a friend of mine via Zoom, a Christian who was born and grew up in the Holy Land and has been a first hand witness to the violence over there. After sharing with the students the experience of huddling under the table with his wife and daughters as rockets flew overhead, he had the students in the palm of his hand. The students had a chance to ask questions and one of the students asked the question "have you ever thought about lying about whether or not you are a Christian in order to stay safe?" His answer was bold and straightforward. He said "even if a sword was put to my neck I would never deny being a Christian." His answer was impactful not only to the students but to me because I remember the pictures of ISIS followers holding knives to the throats of Christians within the past few years. This kind of stuff may be stories to us, but to many Catholics around the world, it is a reality. These are our brothers and sisters in Christ and they are desperately in need of our prayers.

Let us pray for those Christians around the world who face very real persecution and the possibility of death for following Christ and take inspiration from their heroic witness.

Saint Gregory the Great, OUR SAINT FOR THE WEEK



Many of us are used to popes who are major international figures not only in religion but also in politics. But this wasn't always the case. The saintly pope who really pushed the papacy into the world stage is one of the saints we celebrate this week. Pope Saint Gregory the Great was a young man serving in the civil Roman government as the prefect of the entire city in the mid 500s when he felt a call from God to join a monastery. Joining the monastery the other monks quickly discovered his remarkable leadership skills and he was put in charge of the monastery and from there the number of monks grew steadily. Even the pope recognized his skills and appointed him as a delegate to the Eastern kingdoms. At the age of 50, the clergy of Rome elected him Pope and he assumed the office of papacy, bringing his considerable skills to the Chair of St. Peter. Under Pope Gregory many monks were sent to England to begin to evangelize the island, much money was spent to free prisoners, and a lot of necessary reforms were made. Perhaps his single greatest lasting legacy is what we today call Gregorian Chant. Under Pope Gregory the music of the Church was centralized to be similar to the way that Jesus himself would have sung the prayers, as the music was based off of the ancient Jewish chants. On this feast of Pope St. Gregory it is good to pray for the Pope himself, the country of England, and for all church musicians. Pope St. Gregory, PRAY FOR US!


Faith Formation Program Registration Now Open!

Treasures from our Tradition

We know for certain that the sacrament of penance was a fairly rare event in the life of a Christian in the early centuries, but that everyone had a duty to admit their sins and ask forgiveness before giving thanks in the Sunday Eucharist and receiving Christ's Body and Blood at the table. Everyone today is familiar with this same ancient pattern. We also know about Lent and its journey of renewal, and even those who are returning from summer vacations may speak of a fresh perspective on life and a resolve to do better. Saint Augustine spoke of a third kind of penance, beyond the turning of the catechumens to a different life, beyond the normal everyday fresh starts, to a form that is severe and serious. Certain sins broke faith with the community: the sinners were obliged to give their names to the bishop and were barred from participation in the Eucharist. Augustine mentioned sacrilege, adultery, and murder as the culprits, great wounds for the perpetrator, wounds that were serious, deadly, mortal. Penance was such a frightening prospect that many people delayed their baptism for fear that they would sin, a practice with which Augustine was well acquainted. Pastoral need would eventually call the church to reconsider its practice. -Rev. James Field, © J. S. Paluch Co.


What Jesus Did, What Jesus Said

The oldest account of what happened at the Last Supper comes to us not from the Gospels but from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: "I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me'" (11:23-24). In our celebrations of the Eucharist, we are obedient to Christ's command to "do this." The priest, acting in the person of Christ, does what Jesus did and says what Jesus said. He takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it, and gives it to the Lord's disciples. He takes wine, gives thanks, shares it with us. We believe that the entire Eucharistic Prayer is consecratory, but we continue to hold these words of Jesus in special reverence. They are called the words of consecration, and the elevations of the host and chalice, the genuflections of the priest, and the optional ringing of a bell and use of incense remind us that we are in the presence of the Lord.

DOERS OF THE WORD

The second reading for today begins a five-week series of selections from James, a letter that is classified among the so-called "catholic" (or universal) epistles because they are addressed to a general audience rather than to one particular community. Today's text offers important advice for Christians of every generation. God is first cited as the author of all gifts, and in particular, reference is made to the gift of baptism by which we have been made the "first fruits" of the new creation.

What follows is advice based on a very Jewish understanding of the "word" as an active force, operative in the world. We are reminded that unless we, too, become "doers" of the word, our claim to faith is empty. Today and in subsequent weeks the author reminds us that it is equally important to do the "works" of love, for example, by caring for the "orphans and widows in their affliction."
