May 5 & 6

Stained Glass Update

DURING THE NEXT MONTH the stained glass on the north side of the Worship Center should be complete, nearing the end of one of the largest, most complicated and spiritually significant changes in our current facility. These are exciting times!

The north side installation, contrary to appearances, is much different than the installation on the east side. First, there is significantly more glass surface on the north side, which means more and larger windows to make, and longer production time.

Installation on both sides feature placing the glass against the exterior window, by installing metal stops. On the east side the installers benefited from the hallway. The scaffolding could be built on the roof, which was a strong and stable surface.

On the north side, the floor slopes downward as the roof line gets taller, so both the distance and incline serve as problems. The most difficult challenge is where the windows are at their highest point, because of the oak wall of the end of the worship chancel. This creates a narrowing of the aisle. Experts have found a good and safe resolution to this challenge. Safety, and not speed, is the highest priority.

Please know that even when the north windows are installed, the project will not be complete. We are working towards creating a scheme for internal lighting, so that the windows might be seen on the street at night, as well as a way in which we can celebrate the stained glass as a project which has brought our community together.

THE EMBRACING THE JOURNEY component provided a meaningful opportunity and one participant said, "We made ourselves vulnerable to each other and demonstrated trust." Christie Schroff said this about the FEEDING ON THE WORD component, "Reading the Bible is like opening a conversation with God. There are many levels of absorption. You can re-read the same passage many different times in your life, with different understandings. The object of meditating on the Word is to move from intellectual processing to letting your inner self be transformed."

Janece Nelson said, "Prayer is not a private matter. We can pray with others and over others. There is no one proper way to pray. God wants us to communicate with Him from our heart and in doing so abandon ourselves and give it all to Him," when reflecting on DEEPENING OUR PRAYER LIFE. IN RESPONDING TO THE CALL, Julie Johnson said, "Radical availability was a new concept and I grew with this knowledge and questioned how I could be radically available." Finally while EXPLORING SPIRITUAL GUIDANCE, Deb Payne said, "I came to understand the differences in helping relationships in holy listening, hidden directors and spiritual guidance."

Abdelkarim, Sailwa and their four sons, Mohamed, 11; Ibrahim, 9; Salih, 7; and Ahmed, 2, have been renting their home since 2010. Abdelkarim and Sailwa applied for the Habitat Homebuyer Program so they could build a future for their children.

They need a safe, decent home to raise their growing sons. Currently, the family of six shares one bathroom with no exhaust fan. The A/C does not work; there is one window

air conditioning unit that works in one of the three bedrooms. The family sleeps together in the room when they need to cool off in summer months. The windows are hard to open to let in any fresh air and the home has a slight moldy smell. The home was one of the worst in terms of condition that the selection committee visited.

Abdelkarim works as a taxi-driver in New York City for six months of the year and attends Southeast Community College in Lincoln the other six. He makes enough money in NYC that while he is back in Lincoln, he can attend school full time. He is studying Business Administration with the goal to become a CPA. Sailwa works part-time at Goodwill, manages the home and takes care of the kids. They look forward to being good neighbors by taking care of each other, helping each other out and becoming part of the family.
