## **Stanhope Fire Station Officially Opened**

More than one hundred people witnessed the official opening of the Stanhope Fire station last month



Minister for Emergency Services, the Hon. Jane Garrett, unveiled the plaque at the opening of the new Stanhope Fire station.

Amongst those present were the member for Euroa, Steph Ryan and local Campaspe Shire Councillor, Adrian Weston, together with a member of the CFA state management committee, Mr Ross Coyle.

The station was opened by the Minister for Emergency Services, The Hon. Jane Garrett, who, in her opening speech, praised the efforts of the Stanhope Brigade for their 70 years of continuous service to the Stanhope District and the support the local community has given the brigade during all those years. She said the brigade certainly deserved the modern new facilities which cost \$510.000.00.

The Operations Manager for District 20 of the CFA, Peter Taylor, was also full of praise for the Stanhope brigade, mentioning in particular, the prompt action of the brigade in keeping to a minimum of damage, the fire which recently Fonterra experienced, which has put the cheese manufacturing plant out of action ever since. He said the damage could have been much worse if it had not been for the support the Stanhope brigade received from other brigades within the district. He also stressed the need for more females to join the brigade.

The Minister then presented medals to a number of long serving members. Brigade captain, Peter Dent, thanked all those who attended and gave mention to some of the older brigade members, who are now retired. In particular he mentioned Alec Nelson who is about the only surviving member of the original brigade.

Long serving members, Len Armstrong and Norm Cheong then cut the 70<sup>th</sup> birthday cake to celebrate the opening of the new station.

# Rid your trees of fruit fly

In the past few years Fruit Fly has devastated backyard fruit trees throughout Stanhope township.

The Stanhope & District Development Committee is urging all those, with fruit trees in their backyard, to act immediately to rid the district of this pest, which destroys a wide variety of fruit and vegetables.

#### Some useful hints.

If you do not value your fruit trees, then remove them altogether to save your neighbours trees from becoming infested.

Always collect any fallen fruit and place it in a sealed black plastic bag and leave it in the sun for a few days, then place in waste bin.

Purchase fruit fly traps from farm supply stores or nurseries and install in trees. Or you can make your own.

The time to act is NOW. Male fruit flies hatch in August and Females in October.

Recipes to catch Fruit Fly. Recipe No.1.

#### To attract Males.

Take 2 litres of water, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon of Vanilla Essence, 2 tablespoons of cloudy ammonia.

Pour 2 cups into a 2 litre milk bottle. Cut 2 holes of 1 cent size each side of each bottle, 2/3 of the way up between the lid and the mixture.

Do the same with another bottle. Hang in tree. Repeat every 2 weeks.

#### To attract Females.

For 2 x 2 litre bottles.

Take 1 heaped teaspoon of Vegemite, 1/2 cup of hot water, 1/4 cup of brown sugar, a finely chopped banana peel.

Fill to 1 litre with cold water. Cut 2 small holes near the top close to the lid.

Pour half the mixture into each bottle. Hang in tree. Repeat every 2 weeks.

#### Recipe No. 2.

Take an empty 2 litre milk bottle with lid on. Add approx. 1/2 cup of Apple Cider Vinegar and a drop of dish washing liquid.

Make a two holes (approx 5 mls diameter) near the top of the bottle. Hang at least one of these in each of your fruit trees.

Replace mixture every few weeks.

# Stanhope's Top Ten Footballers (part three)


As the excitement continues with "Yabby's" top ten greatest footballers that have played for Stanhope this month we highlight numbers 4, 3 and 2. In the past 2 months we have seen number 10 – Brenton Gray, 9 – Ian McDonald, 8 – Roy Barrett, 7 – Gavin Exell, 6 – Ellis Hicks and 5 – Charlie Gustavson.

4 – Hec Downing – Played senior footy for Stanhope at age 14 in 1928 which was a remarkable effort as there was no junior or reserves football during this era. His was a baker by trade and after several years of brilliant and consistent footy at Stanhope he moved to Rosebud for work and went on to win a league medal with Rosebud in the Mornington Peninsula League. After a couple of years at Rosebud he



a couple of years at Rosebud he returned to Stanhope and immediately made an impact at Stanhope once again. He was a very versatile footballer who played full forward, centre half forward and in the centre. He was a left footer who was very tough and had great pace with a strong pair of hands. Hec was an important player in the 1931 premiership side as an 18 year old and he was also one of the best players in the very strong 1944 premiership side. He signed with Melbourne in the VFL who were extremely keen to get him to join their list but did not play with them. Hec was approached by Kyabram to play for them and played a few permit games with them, and he immediately impressed the interleague selectors who picked him to represent the GVFL against the strong Ovens & Murray Football League where he starred at full forward kicking 4 goals. He also won a club best and fairest at Rushworth (Colliver Cup) in 1937. Towards the end of his career he moved to Boolarra where he purchased the local bakery and played a few games with them before retiring, and then assisted them for many years as a club trainer. Hec was a great clubman who followed the fortunes of Stanhope for many years after he moved away, and was a cousin to another very talented Stanhope footballer – Aub Downing. He regularly returned to Stanhope to catch up with many of his old mates including Banjo Pattison, Gillie Cochrane, Buster Haw, Tom Ryan, Alex Nelson and Andy Laws just to name a few, and also to watch the local footy or cricket. He was also a really good all round cricketer who played "A" grade for Stanhope and represented the KDCA for many years. A real gentleman and one of Stanhope's all time greats who made a real impact on and off the ground.

3 - Bill Buzza - Played with Stanhope in the 1920's and 1930's mainly playing as a centreman and centre half forward. He was a very tough player, and a lovely drop kick as well as a very strong overhead mark. He kicked many goals for Stanhope, and both Essendon and North Melbourne tried to get him to the VFL but he remained at Stanhope. Bill commenced his footy



career with Dookie-Caniambo in 1926 and then played with Katamatite in 1927 where they went on to win the premiership that year. In 1928 he moved to Stanhope and for many years was able to play for Stanhope in the KDFL and also play for the very strong Rushworth sides in the GVFL, as games were played on Saturday's and Wednesday's. He starred in the 1931, 1936 (captain) and 1938 premiership sides for Stanhope in the KDFL, as well as playing in two premierships with Rushworth (1932 & 1933) during his 4 year stint at Rushworth. Bill was also keenly sought after by Rochester who offered him 3 pounds per game but he was content to stay with his local club. He also played in a premiership for Cobram in the Murray League towards the end of his career. Bill was also known as a forward thinker of the rules and systems of the game where he put many ideas to the league administrators (including the VFL) with many of these now in place. Was one of many of the Buzza family that have a long and proud history of farming and sport in the Stanhope area. A genuine star of the game who could easily have been Stanhope's best ever player.


2 – Keith "Snowy" Dunstall – Very speedy and clever centreman / onballer with great skills who could read the play extremely well and always seemed to be in the right position to gather the ball. He was a great overhead mark and was well known for taking a few screamers, and was very clean with his ball disposal by hand and foot, and always got high numbers of possessions. His disposal was very clean and he continually fed the ball forward making it very easy for the



Stanhope forwards to be on the receiving end of his passes. Snowy was a very consistent player as highlighted by the number of votes and awards that he received throughout his wonderful career. He played with Stanhope during the 1940's and 1950's and also played with Girgarre, where he won a McNamara League Medal in the KDFL in 1946. In 1948 he won the GVFL Morrison Medal as well as the club best and fairest in the same year, as well as winning club best and fairest awards in 1954 and 1956. His last few years were played at Girgarre, but Stanhope were very fortunate to have such a great player pull on the maroon and gold jumper for many years, where many of today's footballers would be in awe of this champion. A very skilful player and a pleasure to watch.


You know, I spent a fair bit of time there when they were building it - I helped by picking up things they had left lying around - keeping the place tidy.



## Brayden Foley's adventures with his horses

Otway View William, a miniature Shetland was the first pony to help develop a very special young man's understanding & enjoyment of horsemanship, riding and competing. Brayden acquired a severe brain injury at birth which resulted in epilepsy and numerous intellectual and physical difficulties. As a 2.5 yr old colt, Otway View William selected Brayden as his new owner even though Brayden was actually at a stud to look at an older and much more experienced pony. While it seemed ridiculous matching any 2.5 yr old child with a 2.5 yr old unbroken colt, their connection was unmistakable from the first moment they met. Brayden was the 1<sup>st</sup> and only person to ride Billy for many years and they were extremely successful in the open show ring winning hundreds of ribbons & sashes. At that stage they could not be members of an RDA club due to their young age. Brayden out grew Billy, so we broke him to harness. Look out for the 'Flyin Lion' at the pony trots.





who had never seen a child, Brayden then aged 7.8 climbed up on the gate, shook it like crazy and made siren noises. Horses nearby scattered, but Caerleon Peridot trotted straight up to Brayden, stretched out his neck and sniffed him in fascination. Again another unlikely but inseparable bond was formed. Brayden was adamant that this was to be his new horse. He broke Peri in doing superman impressions which involved extreme noise and lots of flapping of both arms and legs. Peri took everything in his stride without blinking an eye and within 3 months they had qualified in open events for the Nationals and Royals. By now Brayden had turned 8 and still needed to be on a lead at competitions as following judge's directions was not possible & we needed to ensure he didn't ride off into the sunset. At this stage competing in open events became more difficult and political on occasion, though not at APSB events. Unfortunately one such particularly upsetting incident shattered Brayden's equine spirit and he turned his back on horses altogether. Thankfully after six months an old mate came to the rescue from Rani Park Stud and asked Brayden to do him a favour by taking extra special care of Carisma Park Sunlight for 6 months. Brayden agreed and got back in the saddle very successfully to the delight of all involved. RDA comps were the next step. It was with no surprise that Caerleon Peridot and Brayden excelled from the start winning numerous sashes at Melbourne Summer Royal. Special Olympic events were next, and again this pair continued to wow both spectators and judges. After 3 events, often competing against much older riders they have never been unplaced with 3 gold medals & 7 silver medals to date.

The next one...... last year Brayden had picked this colts mum a year ago to be his future galloway, a magnificent TB X Aussie by Bimberdeen Brigadier (or did she pick him?). Unfortunately she bowed a tendon so she was put in foal to Mahogany Park Mr Bauris. Earlier this year her then unhandled colt foal just came up and sat on the front of Brayden's motorbike at 4 months old, in a 30 acre paddock. He wouldn't move until Brayden gave him a scratch and asked him to, so according to both of these boys RalAxeSon By My Side will be Brayden's galloway of the future.

Brayden's family would like to thank the many people and judges who haven't glared or tut tutted, but rather chose to smile, congratulate, cheer and high five a young man who often sings, yells and yahoos as he competes.
