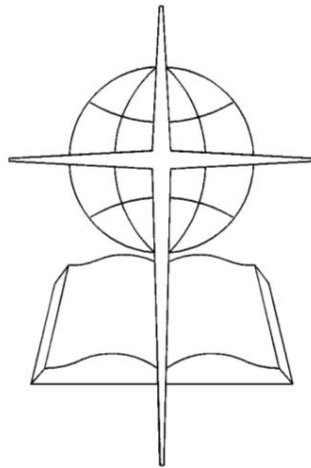

The following Constitution and Bylaws were adopted by the Hightower Baptist Association on September 29, 1994. The rules were reviewed and finally adopted on September 28, 1995, at Mayfield Baptist Church, Forsyth County, Georgia, during the Hightower Baptist Association. This Constitution and Bylaws shall govern the Hightower Baptist Association until amended.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS OF THE HIGHTOWER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

We the Baptist Church of Jesus Christ, having all been baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ and desirous of a spiritual union, we therefore propose to maintain order and rules of an Association according to the following plan:

NAME AND FORMATION OF THE ASSOCIATION

Article 1.

- 1.1 This Association shall be known by the name of THE HIGHTOWER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION and shall be composed of Messengers chosen by the different Churches in our Union who, upon producing letters from their Churches certifying their appointments, shall be entitled to a seat.
- 1.2 Messengers from member churches shall become delegates when seated. All ordained ministers having Church membership within the Association, or serving a Church within the Association, Officers of the Association Chairmen of the Standing Committees, members of the Standing Committees, and Assistant Parliamentarians are to be seated as delegates.
- 1.3 Each Messenger shall register at the convention of the annual meeting of the Association. Upon registration, the Messengers will automatically be seated as delegates. At a time deemed appropriate by the Moderator, the Clerk and Moderator shall inquire as to any Messengers whose names are not registered and such unregistered Messenger shall, upon addition to the register, be seated. The Clerk of the Association may delegate a registration committee to compile the list of Messengers to be seated. Upon proper registration, it shall not be necessary to conduct a role call of the Messengers to be seated. To assist with registration, each Church shall forward to the Clerk of the Association a list of all Messengers chosen by the Church. This list will be forwarded not less than ten days prior to the annual meeting of the Association. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing, the Clerk or delegated registration committee may devise a method of pre-registration to avoid registration requirements at the meetings of the Association. All member Churches shall endeavor to choose Messengers who are able to attend Association meetings. The Clerk of the Association or the delegated registration committee shall furnish to the Nominating Committee all registered delegates as soon as possible after the convention of the Association, however, not later than the end of day of the annual meeting of the Association.
- 1.4 Each Church in the Union may have two delegates and one additional delegate for every fifty members in excess of seventy-five members. In no case shall the combined representation of a Church exceed five delegates.

ELECTION OF MODERATOR, ASSISTANT MODERATOR, TREASURER AND CLERK

Article 2.

- 2.1 The Association thus formed shall choose by ballot a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall serve for one year. The Moderator shall be ineligible for one year after having served in the office for two years. It shall be permissible for the office of Clerk and Treasurer to be filled by the same person.

INDEPENDENCE OF ASSOCIATION AND MEMBER CHURCHES, ADJUDICARY AND ADVISORY ROLES

Article 3.

- 3.1 The Association shall have no coercive form to lord over it and shall abide in God's heritage and word in conducting all functions of the body. The Association shall be considered an advisory council in all matters respecting the internal concerns of the Church.
- 3.2 When an offense may be committed by one Church against another or when a serious difficulty may arise in an individual Church, it shall be the duty of the Association to take the matter or controversy into consideration and decide upon it. However, intervention by the Association shall come only after gospel steps

have been taken between the offending and offended Church or within the individual Church, as the case may be. The Association shall have the authority to issue rulings. Churches, which are the subject of such rulings, shall receive such rulings as advisory in nature. Nothing contained herein shall affect or impair the independence of each member Church. However, the Association may remove any Church from fellowship with the Association if the offenses involving the member Church are contrary to the Abstract of Principles of the Association or if such offenses jeopardize the spiritual integrity of the Association or the member Churches, or for other proper reasons which harm the fellowship and existence of the Association. The procedures for excluding a Church from fellowship set forth in Article 4, hereinafter addressed, shall be followed.

- 3.3 The Association may issue advisory rulings on points of doctrine or questions posed by any member Church. The Association is empowered to issue position statements or policies concerning matters affecting the well being of the member Churches or the individual members. The Clerk of the Association shall maintain a separate register of all rulings, position statements and policies passed or issued by the Association.

QUALIFICATION, ADMISSION AND EXCLUSION OF MEMBER CHURCHES

Article 4.

- 4.1 The Association shall be solely responsible for determining membership within the Association. Any Church seeking admission shall satisfy the Association as to the petitioning Church's qualification, including compliance with the Abstract of Principles of the Association. The Moderator may delegate a committee to determine the qualifications of the petitioning Church. This committee shall be known as The Committee to Examine New Churches on Articles of Faith.
- 4.2 Upon majority approval by the Association, the petitioning Church's admission into the Association shall be manifested by the Moderator extending the right hand of fellowship.
- 4.3 The Association, upon two-thirds vote by the delegates, shall have the power to exclude any Church from the Association upon grounds that the Church has departed from the orthodox principles of the gospel, or for any other proper reason that jeopardizes the union of the Association. Any church subject to exclusion shall have adequate and fair opportunity to defend any charges. The Association may delegate a tribunal for hearing, if deemed necessary to afford fairness. The tribunal shall report its findings at the next meeting of the Association. Unless otherwise delegated by the Association, the Executive Committee shall act as the standing tribunal.
- 4.4 Admission or exclusion of any church shall be entered into the minutes and recorded by the Clerk of the Association. The Clerk of the Association shall notify any Church in writing as to admission or exclusion and shall publish same within the minutes of the Association.
- 4.5 Any member Church desiring to withdraw from membership of the Association shall request withdrawal in writing. Upon majority approval of the Association obtained during the annual meeting, the petitioning Church shall be entitled to a letter of dismissal and membership will be canceled. The Clerk of the Association shall enter such withdrawal into the minutes of the Association and remove the withdrawing Church from the list of member Churches.

QUERIES

Article 5.

- 5.1 Queries are extraordinary inquiries of doctrinal matters in order to resolve doubt or questions. While encouraged for matters of doctrinal question or dispute, queries should be used sparingly and cautiously
- 5.2 Queries shall be presented at Union Meetings prior to presentation to the Association, or posed by a member Church. The Standing Committee on Queries shall convene not later than noon on the day of the annual meeting of the Association to review any queries presented and make recommendations to the body of the Association. The Standing Committee on Queries shall have the authority to determine and recommend that the subject matter not be considered as a query if the subject matter is not appropriate for a query as previously defined in this Article.
- The Standing Committee on Queries may recommend that the matter be considered as a motion or resolution before the Association; and, unless renewed in the form of a motion or resolution by any delegate of the Church presenting the query, the matter may not be considered. Queries, if deemed appropriate by the

Standing Committee on Queries, shall be read during the afternoon of the Association's annual meeting and acted upon in general business of the annual meeting.

CONDUCT OF MEETINGS OF THE ASSOCIATION, SPECIAL MEETINGS, DECORUM AND ROLE OF MODERATOR

Article 6.

- 6.1** The regular meeting of the Hightower Baptist Association shall occur on either Wednesday or Thursday before the first Sunday of each October, but not on both days as has been the case in prior years. All business of the Association shall henceforth be conducted in one session day. The option to meet on either day shall be decided by delegates during the annual session of the Hightower Baptist Association or by the Executive Committee if a decision is not made during the annual session. If selection is not made by either body, the session shall be held on the Wednesday before the first Sunday in October. Special meetings of the Association may be called at any time during the calendar year by decision of the Executive Committee. Written notice of special meetings shall be provided at least two weeks prior to any special meeting, except in cases of emergency. Delegates to the special meeting shall be those chosen by the member Churches; otherwise the same delegates serving at the preceding annual meeting of the Hightower Baptist Association may continue to serve. Unless modified by member Churches, delegates shall serve for one-year terms.
- 6.2** The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper decorum, which decorum shall be created and modified in the discretion of a majority of the Association.
- 6.3** Meetings shall be opened and closed with a prayer. The meetings shall not adjourn until all business or matters regularly brought before the Association are concluded, except in extraordinary cases.
- 6.4** The Moderator shall be deemed to be the judge of order and decorum. The Moderator shall have the right to call order at any time. It shall be solely the duty of the Moderator to enforce the rules of decorum and order, and to properly conduct the meetings. The Moderator shall have the privilege of consulting with the Parliamentarian at any time during the meetings. The Moderator is charged with enforcing the rules of decorum and the Constitution.
- 6.5** The Moderator shall have the liberty to speak as any other member or delegate. However, the Moderator, upon exercise of the liberty of speech shall appoint another member to serve as pro tem Moderator while the Moderator speaks. If available, the Assistant Moderator shall serve in this capacity. The Moderator shall resume his duties upon completion of his leave to speak. The Moderator shall not vote unless the vote of the group is equally divided. In such cases, the Moderator shall cast the deciding vote. Unless provided to the contrary herein, all votes of the Association shall be governed by the majority of the Association delegates present. Voting in all cases shall be confined to the body, but corresponding messengers and visiting brethren may aid in council.
- 6.6** The Hightower Baptist Association is a self-governing body. Meetings shall be conducted such as to afford orderly presentation of motions and business of the body, at all times evidencing a Christian atmosphere of respect and fairness. The Moderator and Parliamentarian shall have the privilege of consulting Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, if necessary.
- 6.7** Any member of the assembly may appeal the decision of the Moderator regarding a point of order. However, this appeal shall take place at the time the decision is made and at no other time.
- 6.8** The Moderator shall appoint all committees except for the Standing Committees. The Moderator shall appoint Chairmen of any committee if the committee chair is absent. Chairmen so appointed shall be appointed from the ranks of the existing committee, if possible.
- 6.9** All items of business before the Association shall be presented by a motion and second in the general business session of the Association.
- 6.10** The Moderator shall clearly identify the delegate given leave to speak to the assembly. Only one delegate may speak at any time. Unless physically unable to do so, the delegate shall at all times stand when addressing the assembly or the Moderator. No delegate shall be interrupted while speaking, except by the Moderator, or for cause, such as departing from the subject matter under consideration, exceeding any imposed time limit for debate or speech, use of words of personal reflection or of offense to the body or the doctrine and principles of the Association. No member shall indulge in any practice that may have a tendency to interrupt in time of public speech or would dishonor the Association.
- 6.11** Any motion made and seconded comes under consideration of the Association unless it is withdrawn. Any motion pending before the Association shall be disposed of prior to another motion being proposed.

- 6.12** After debate, the Moderator shall restate any motion pending before the body of the assembly and call for a vote. Unless a decision is called for by the body of the assembly, votes shall be oral by method of yea or nay. Decisions of the body of the assembly may be conducted by rising vote for either the affirmative or negative. In extraordinary cases, a secret ballot may be conducted. Secret ballots require majority approval of the body of the assembly.
- 6.13** No member of the Association shall depart the service of the Association without leave of the Moderator. Anyone absenting himself shall be reported in the minutes as absent without leave. Absences for health or emergency matters are granted without necessity of approval.
- 6.14** The appellation of "brother," "sister", "brethren" or "sisters" shall be used in addressing each other.
- 6.15** Committee reports shall be typed and read before the body. Written committee reports shall be submitted to the Clerk not later than the opening of the Association meeting. Any committee needing assistance with typing may consult with the Parliamentarian or the Clerk. Written committee reports shall be deemed as accepted by the body without further motion, unless objected to by a majority of the body. Committee chairmen, or their delegates, shall read the written report before the body at the time so allotted. One member of the committee may speak before the body concerning the report, unless leave is obtained for other committee members to speak. Leave may be granted in the sole discretion of the Moderator, but shall be freely granted. It is not required that other committee members speak before the body. Committee reports may be discussed after presentation, but are received as read without motion or second.
- 6.16** Alternate speakers, including those delivering sermons, are just that and shall not be required to speak before the body unless the alternate feels led to do so, or if the primary speaker is not available, or with leave of the Moderator or the body.
- 6.17** The time limit for Committee chairman reports is 15 minutes. All other speakers, including visitors are limited to 10 minutes each. The above listed time limits include the time for reading reports. The Association has traditionally allowed visiting Messengers to speak before the body. Upon consent of the Moderator, such visitors shall be allowed to speak before the body without a motion for a period not to exceed 10 minutes.
- 6.18** Collections from the assembly for the organizations supported by the Association, or for other matters selected by the Association, shall be restricted to one occasion while the Association is in session. Collections shall be conducted prior to adjournment for the noon meal. These general collections shall be equally divided among all supported organizations or charities. Provided however, the Treasurer shall make accommodations for those who desire to make specific gifts to supported organizations or charities. The Treasurer shall supervise all collection procedures.

DISTRICTS, UNION MEETINGS, LOCATION OF ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

Article 7.

- 7.1** The Hightower Baptist Association shall maintain four districts. These districts may be realigned by the Association upon request and motion to the body or upon recommendation by the Executive Committee. Realignment of any district shall be determined considering the number of Churches in a district.
- 7.2** The location of the Association meetings shall be conducted through the Union Meetings. The meetings shall rotate sequentially between the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Districts of the Association. Any Church desiring to host the Association meeting should submit a request or invitation, one year in advance. This invitation shall be submitted through the Union meeting which shall have approved same. Hosts of Union meetings shall be selected one year in advance at the convention of the Union Meeting.
- 7.3** The conduct of Union meetings shall be subject to the same rules, terms and conditions affecting the Association, when appropriate. In most cases, the officers of the Union Meeting shall be the Pastor of the Church hosting the Union Meeting serving as Moderator, and the Clerk of the host Church serving as Clerk of the Union Meeting. The Clerk of the Union Meeting shall keep a record of the proceedings. The Clerk of the Union meeting shall furnish to the Clerk of the Association the meeting site of the next Union Meeting for the appropriate district and for the next Association Meeting, if hosted by the reporting district. Each district shall maintain a depository of the minutes of each Union Meeting and shall annually report the location of said minutes to the Clerk of the Association. The various Clerks of the Union Meetings shall cooperate with each other to transmit the previous minutes to the depository designated by the Union Meeting.

DUTIES OF THE CLERK OF THE ASSOCIATION, REPORTS DUE TO THE CLERK

Article 8.

- 8.1** The Clerk of the Association shall keep a regular record of the proceedings of the Association. The Moderator may appoint assistants at the request of the Clerk. These assistants shall aid and assist the Clerk and Assistant Clerk. The minutes of the Association shall be read and approved before the body adjourns, signed by the Moderator and attested by the Clerk. If the minutes of the Association are so voluminous as to be difficult or excessively time consuming to transcribe at the conclusion of the Association meeting, the Clerk may request the minutes be deferred until publication of the Association minutes; which published minutes shall be approved by the Association at the next annual meeting.
- 8.2** The Association shall furnish the Churches with the minutes of its' proceedings. It shall be the duty of the Churches to support the Association financially and to pay for the printing and assist in disseminating the minutes.
- 8.3** Each Church having an ordained or licensed minister shall report same to the Association for publication in the minutes of the Association. All inquiries or reports required by the Clerk or the Association shall promptly be provided by the member Churches, specifically including the lists of deceased members. Any Church failing to submit required reports shall be subject to discipline in the discretion of the Association. In extreme cases, discipline may include withdrawal of fellowship with the Association.

AMENDMENTS TO THE FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE ASSOCIATION

Article 9.

- 9.1** Amendments to the form of government may be made only upon presentation of the amendments to the full body of the Association in written form. Amendments may be adopted at any time during the afternoon of the meeting of the Association. Amendments to the form of government of the Association shall be submitted to the assembly before the noon meal of the annual meeting.
- 9.2** In the event that exigent circumstances exist that affect the ability to properly conduct a meeting of the Association, or for any other reason deemed appropriate by the Association, the body, upon special motion, may provide for amendment to the form of government at any time during a meeting of the Association. If a special motion is made, approval of the special motion to consider immediate amendment to the form of government of the Association must occur by two-thirds majority. The vote upon the amendment to the form of government shall only require majority approval.

CHURCHES FAILING TO REPORT, SANCTIONS

Article 10.

- 10.1** Any church failing to be represented by letter or delegate for a period of two consecutive years shall be notified by the Clerk of the Association that such Church is to be suspended from the list of member Churches of the Association at the next annual session of the Association. Upon report by the Clerk at the next meeting of the Association, the unrepresented Church shall be suspended from the list of Churches of the Association. Any such Church so suspended shall be freely readmitted to membership upon petition by such Church and motion and approval by a majority of the body.

PROHIBITION OF DISSEMINATION OF UNAUTHORIZED INFORMATION

Article 11.

- 11.1** No person or entity is authorized to mail or disseminate information in the name of the Hightower Baptist Association or call meetings in the name of the Association without approval by a majority of the body of the Association. If the Association is not convened, and in the case of exigent circumstances deemed beneficial to the body of the Association, the Executive Committee, upon unanimous approval of said committee, may authorize the mailing or dissemination of information. Such approval shall be promptly reported to the full convention of the Association at the next meeting.

Formation of Committees

- 12.2** The Nominating Committee shall be formed by the existing Nominating Committee appointing a Chairman of the Nominating Committee for a one-year term. The existing Executive Committee shall appoint two members to the Nominating Committee. Thus formed, the Nominating Committee shall undertake the following:
- 12.3** The Nominating Committee shall appoint the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Nominating Committee and two members from each district of the Association. Terms of office for Executive Committee members shall be two years in duration. Provided however, the initial term beginning in 1994 for one member of the Executive Committee from each district shall be for one year only such as to provide a staggering of terms of office for Executive Committee members. As a result, one-half of the Executive Committee will have one year's experience at all future dates. For the year 1994, the Nominating Committee shall inform the chosen members as to whether they serve a one-year term or a two-year term. The Chairman of the Executive Committee may serve no more than two successive years. Ex Officio members of the Executive Committee shall be the officers of the Association including the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Chief Parliamentarian. Ex Officio members of the Executive Committee shall endeavor to attend all Executive Committee meetings and assist the members of the Executive Committee in their deliberations and planing.
- 12.4** The Nominating Committee shall appoint standing Committee Chairmen to serve for the one year term succeeding the annual Association meeting. The Chairman of each committee shall be ineligible to succeed himself for a period of one year after having served for a maximum term of two years, with the exception of the Chairman of the Food Bank Committee who may serve additional successive terms. The Executive Committee shall appoint all other committee members for the standing committees. In the event that a committee chairman is absent, the Moderator shall appoint a committee chairman to serve during the annual meeting. Any such appointee shall, if possible, be appointed from the ranks of the committee members. The Nominating Committee shall also appoint Assistant Chairmen for the Teaching the Word (Sunday school) Committee and Vacation Bible School Committee. The Treasurer shall automatically be a member of the Finance Committee.
- 12.5** Additional duties of the Nominating Committee are as follows:
- (a) Provide a home for the annual Association meeting.
 - (b) Appoint the Preacher for the Introductory Sermon and an alternate.

(c) Appoint the Preacher for the Doctrinal Sermon and an alternate.

(d) Appoint the Preacher for the Missionary Sermon and an alternate.

The Nominating Committee shall select ministers with membership within a Church within the Association, or serving churches within the Association to preach all sermons before the Association. Ministers having membership outside the Association, but serving within the Association shall have full privilege to preach sermons or serve on any committee.

Duties of Committees and Appointment of Special Committees

12.6 All committees shall serve for a one-year terms, except for Executive Committee members that serve for two year terms, beginning at the conclusion of the annual Association Meeting and ending at the conclusion of the next annual meeting. The Executive Committee shall be charged with attending to the Association business when the Association is not in session.

All standing committees shall endeavor to convene when the Association is not in session at least once during the year. (However, it is acknowledged that certain committees, such as the Query Committee, function primarily while the Association is in session and meetings during the year, while recommended, are not mandatory.) The Chairman of each committee shall be charged with arranging such meetings and moderating same. Committee meetings, although less formal, shall be subject to the rules of decorum set forth herein.

12.7 The Moderator of the Association shall have the authority to appoint special committees on subject matters or doctrinal matters that are of concern to the Association.

The Moderator shall appoint the representative of the Hightower Baptist Association to the Georgia Baptist Convention for a term of office of 5 years. In the event that said representative resigns or is unable to serve said term due to death, incapacity or otherwise, the Moderator shall appoint someone to complete the 5-year term.

12.8 In order to enact the changes to the Constitution, Rules and Bylaws of the Association, and with the exception of the Executive Committee members chosen and serving for a two year term ending in 1996, the Officers, Chairmen and Committee members chosen in the 1994 Association meeting pursuant to the procedures set forth above shall serve through the conclusion of the 1995 meeting of the Association.

OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

Article 13.

13.1 The Officers of the Association shall be the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Chief Parliamentarian, Treasurer and the Executive Committee. Method of election, term of office and duties have been defined herein. Any officer who abandons his duties or by his actions adversely affects the function of the Association may be removed by two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee while the Association is not in session or by majority vote when the Association is in session. When the Association is not in session, the Executive Committee, upon majority approval, shall select replacements to serve unexpired terms. The Association, when in session, can select or replace any officer upon majority vote.

PARLIAMENTARIAN, APPOINTMENT AND DUTIES

Article 14.

14.1 The Nominating Committee shall annually select a Chief Parliamentarian to serve from the conclusion of the annual Association meeting until the conclusion of the next annual Association meeting. The Chief Parliamentarian shall be charged with assisting the Moderator or Assistant Moderator in ruling on matters of decorum or procedure in the annual Association meeting, or in any committee or Union Meeting occurring during the time the Association is not in session. The Chief Parliamentarian shall serve at the discretion of the Association, or until resignation. Assistant Parliamentarians representing each district shall be selected by the Chief Parliamentarian, which selection shall be communicated to the Clerk of the Association who will communicate the district's Assistant Parliamentarian name to the host Church of the Union Meeting. Assistant Parliamentarians shall attend and serve their respective Union Meetings as Parliamentarian. Assistant Parliamentarians shall be present at the annual meetings of the Association and may undertake the duties of the Chief Parliamentarian when so delegated. The Parliamentarian and Assistant Parliamentarians shall be seated as delegates. Assistant Parliamentarians will make efforts to assist the Chief Parliamentarian during the annual meetings of the Association and shall attend said meetings for training and experience.

SOLE CONSTITUTION AND RULES OF THE ASSOCIATION

Article 15.

- 15.1** Unless a Constitutional Rule or Bylaw is set forth herein, such Rule or Bylaw shall have no further binding influence or effect upon the Association. All previous provisions, rules, traditions, or bylaws are hereby expressly rescinded upon enactment of this document.
- 15.2** Changes to the Constitution, Rules or Bylaws shall be reflected as an addendum to this document indicating the year of passage. Any changes shall be merged into the Constitution, Rules and Bylaws at a frequency of not less than each five-year period. The Chief Parliamentarian shall have the responsibility to insure the correctness of any changes and the entry into the minutes of such changes. The Chief Parliamentarian shall additionally insure that addenda are properly prepared and shall undertake the merging of changes into the Constitution, Rules and Bylaws as required in Paragraph 15.1

ABSTRACT OF PRINCIPLES

- ARTICLE 1.** We believe in only one true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, three in one.
- ARTICLE 2.** We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice.
- ARTICLE 3.** We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- ARTICLE 4.** We believe in man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and holiness.
- ARTICLE 5.** We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the merits of Jesus Christ.
- ARTICLE 6.** We believe in the election of all God's people that they are saved and called according to His purpose and grace given them in Christ Jesus before the world began. II Tim. 1:9 and in II Thess. 2:13. *"But we are bound to give thanks always to God for you brethren, beloved of the Lord, because God has from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the spirit and belief of the truth."*
- ARTICLE 7.** We believe the saints shall persevere in grace and not finally fall away.
- ARTICLE 8.** We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ; that true believers are the only people subject and the only scriptural mode of baptism is immersion.
- ARTICLE 9.** We believe in the resurrection of the dead and general judgment.
- ARTICLE 10.** We believe no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only to such as have been called by God, as was Aaron, regularly baptized, approved by the church and come under the imposition of hands by a presbytery.
- ARTICLE 11.** We believe that none but believers have a right to the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper.

North Central Area Missions - Annual Report

Times, they are a-changing

If you were to take an extended trip overseas hindering you from all media and news, free from all the commentaries, pundits, and general “water-cooler” discussions, returning a year later, the shock may be too much! Most of us are simply “frogs in the kettle,” watching the temperature slowly increase over time. The alterations going on right under our noses by our cultural dictators of media and by our academic environments in every major city, are intentionally capturing every segment of our national values with the unabashed purpose of remaking our nation. It’s slow, progressive, but most certainly deliberate. The changes are in bite-size amounts, though in some places it’s more like gluttonous gorging. Still, it’s change – but not the good kind.

With these changes comes the watchman’s trumpet alarm to the church to make necessary adjustments, to review our current battle plan, and see if there are ways we can mitigate the enemies advances in this changing climate. The church in America once impacted every segment of our society. Then for a while we were simply tolerated. Now we are seen as a threat, a vicious enemy against the progressive movement of remaking this nation, purveyors of hate and backwards thinking. Change will happen one way or another.

Our national denomination has experienced significant changes as well. For the first time in our history we have more funds for overseas missionaries and less missionaries accepting the call to the areas we need to send them. There is also the beginning of a divide within the SBC that no one wants to talk about over the interpretation of women ministers, attitude differences between boomers and millennials/nextgens/gen-z, and other smaller fissures that are forming regarding doctrinal differences. It’s not pretty, but change is going to move us into a new position, a new format, and require a new strategy. Funding will be the biggest piece of the pie that will force or control these changes.

Here in Georgia, change is the best way to describe our state convention. This year we elected our new Executive Director for the first time in 26 years. New leadership has naturally brought in a new vision and the implementation of this new vision has touched most all of the Associations and churches. Personnel changes, use of funds, and the future of the GBMB building are just a few of the top “management” level changes that will eventually impact everyone in the state. No one is immune from the reach of this change. And by, ‘no one,’ I am referring to the North Central Area Mission office. We have been hit by the necessity of change as well.

The Last North Central Area Mission Annual Report

As of December 31, there will no longer be any “Area Mission” programs in the state of Georgia. The Etowah, Hightower, Lanier, and Roswell Associations will decide for themselves if they will remain a combined Associational program, working together to meet the needs of the local churches in the North Central Area of

our state, or if they want to branch out and try something new. The assisted funding that has been provided from the state for these 45 plus years will be no more. Our churches will have to decide their relationship with this mission body and how they want to continue. These changes are outside of our control, but necessary as we make changes for the ministry reach of the future.

One thing is certain – the North Central Area Mission will have to change. Our name. Our personnel. Our ministry impact and services offered. Each of these will depend on the level of support that we receive from the area churches that remain a part of the North Central Mission program. Our vision has not changed – Strengthening our member churches and Planting new churches where needed. How we can do this may have to be altered, but the Lord will surely reveal that to us as we go forward.

My desire is to take the wisdom found in God’s Word and apply that wisdom to our current situation. I am required as a child of God, a student of His Word, and a called minister to follow the example of Christ. I am to obey His teachings and Word, and not allow my emotions to get in the way of seeking God’s direction and leading through these dramatic changes. Being patient in my spirit is far better than thinking I have all the answers. Leading in times of change is always the hardest challenge. I will commit to this body that my aim will be to make the changes that best represent the unchangeable teachings of God’s Holy Word, providing resources that brings maturity to our member churches.

The good news in all of this is found in the verses at the top of this report – God does NOT change! Regardless of how bad, unpredictable, or confusing things may get in this world and in our Associations, God is not confused, concerned, or out of control. This is our joy! He is dependable and He can be trusted.

In the past year, we have assisted 29 families. The beginning balance was \$9,450.38 on September 26, 2018. We received a total of \$5,331.98 in deposits and donations. Total expenditures were \$6,298.82. The current balance as of September 27, 2019 is \$9,439.54. I would like to thank God first and foremost. I want to thank the generosity of the Association churches and members for keeping us funded. Also, I would like to thank those at the food bank that filter the needs submitted.

History Committee

The current History Committee has talked about three things that we want to emphasize. Last year, we provided the Association with a history of the Hightower Association Food/Clothing Bank. This year we would like to recognize the churches that are celebrating 150 years in service for the Lord and talk to you about some of the history of education in the Hightower Association.

First, we recognize Amicalola Baptist Church of Dawsonville, GA, on their 150th Anniversary. It was organized in 1869 by 13 members and then established in a log building and joined the Hightower Association

in 1872. A new church building was built in 1879 and still is the foundation where the church stands now with many renovations and additions to the church. In 2018, the church reported it has 260 members. It holds Sunday School and Worship Services every Sunday with Prayer Meeting and Choir practice on Wednesday Evening. We pray that this church will continue to serve the Lord well in the Amicalola Community of Dawsonville, GA.

We also would like to recognize New Bethel Baptist Church of Dawsonville, GA on their 150th Anniversary. New Bethel was constituted on October 9, 1869 with 9 charter members. The Association history book states that there are no more records of the church until 1924. The church is located on Highway 136 in Dawson County. In 2018, the church reported 89 members. The Hightower Minutes show that they hold Sunday School and Worship services every Sunday and Choir Practice on Wednesday evening. We also pray that this church will serve their community by spreading the message about the love of our Lord and Savior.

Throughout the history of the Hightower Baptist Association, education has been emphasized by the leaders at our Hightower Association churches through Sabbath schools, Sunday Schools, and other forms of Christian education. There has been Sunday (Sabbath) School Committees for at least 140 years in our Association. This year, the History Committee is reporting about the history of Bible Study.

In 1876, six out of 39 churches reported Sabbath Schools: Beaver Run, Island Ford, Antioch, Amicalola, and Mt. Moriah. "Is the Sabbath School a Christian work?"

In the 1889 Hightower Baptist Association minutes, there were reports given from a Sabbath School Committee, an Education Committee, School Report Committee, and Organization of Sunday School Convention. Some reports from these committees: "We must exert ourselves, must plan and sacrifice for the Christian culture and the more complete development of our boys and girls". Thus, they had a committee to organize "a Baptist school of high grade in the bounds of the Hightower Association". "We would advise all the churches in our bounds to organize Sunday Schools at once."

In 1918 (101 years ago), the Sunday School Committee reported "only 24 churches in this great Association report Sunday School with about 1500 in attendance. We believe that not more than 35% of the church memberships...are engaged in this great work..." We earnestly ask that each church will organize a school of Bible Teaching at least.

In 1939, the Report on Christian Education states: "'As a man thinketh in his heart so is he.' The true principle of a Christian Education is to teach men and women, boys and girls to think correctly. Those who are trained to think, other than in the light of Christianity, are taught to think in the wrong direction. The great menace of the world today is the wrong kind of thinking. Not only is this true from a spiritual standpoint, but also from the standpoint of civil and religious liberty."

The 2019 History Committee could give you many more examples of how Christian Education and the importance of studying the Holy Bible have been major concerns of the Hightower Association for over 180 years. However, you may want to research it for yourself.

Did you know that the Hightower Baptist Association Office has a Media Room? We have copies of 1982-2018 Hightower Association Minutes in that office for any of us to look at but not remove from the building. There are older copies in the clerk's office that can be reviewed if requested. It is so interesting to see what our churches were doing from 1835 until now. Our Hightower Association Clerk, Joey Wallace, has placed the Hightower Association Minutes from 2010 through 2018 on the Hightower Web Page at

<https://hightowerbaptist.net> We believe that the older Hightower Association Meeting Minutes are in the process of being scanned and will be placed on the Web page eventually.

The History Committee would like for you to help us stock the room with your church's history books. We have only a few thus far. So, if your church has published a church history book, please donate a copy to our Library. Do we really want this very important part of our lives to be lost forever?

Currently there are several of The Men and Missions of Hightower Volumes I- Ministers and The Men and Missions of Hightower Volume II – Churches available in the Hightower Association Office for you to purchase at a reduced price of \$20 each. (I have a few of these with me today). These are wonderful reference books that I personally use often. The 2019 History Committee wishes to thank Byron Burgess, Charles McPherson, Curtis Chappel, Rev. John Lummus and the late Charles Findley (and anyone else) for all their time and work in compiling these books. I looked in the volume II to see which of our churches have had special anniversaries lately. We have 15 churches in the Hightower Association who have celebrated over 175 years. On further research, we found that there are only 13 churches out of 58 that are younger than 100 years in our Association: North Canton (1923), Daves Creek (1925), Oak Dale (1927), Lebanon (1940), Cumming Second Baptist (1945), New Hope (1961), Pine Crest (1964), Canaan (1968), Ridgeview (1972), Silver City (1990), Carmel (2016 Association), Castleberry Road (2013 Association), and Dawsonville (2015 Association). We find this interesting that only eight new churches have been added to the Association in the last 58 years.

We also would like to share some information that Dr. Jimmy Orr graciously put together for us in September 2018 about the current theological Bible studies that are taking place in our Association for ANYONE.

The idea of a theological school that would later become Frederick M. Hawkins Center for Christian Studies began with a luncheon meeting in 1995-96 at Decker's Restaurant in Cumming. Attending the meeting were Rev. Berry Henderson, Rev. John Lummus, Rev. Ronnie McCormick, Dr. Eddie Martin, Mr. E.W. McConnell, and Dr. Jimmy Orr. (Rev. Rubin Smith may have also attended, but I'm not quite sure.) The meeting was held to discuss the possibility of starting a theological school to provide area bi-vocational pastors with the tools they need to be better pastors and preachers and leaders. The purpose was also to begin the long process of changing the existing negative mindset of the Hightower Association toward theological education and missions. For almost all of the twentieth century, the leaders of the Hightower Association had vehemently opposed theological education and the promotion of international and domestic missions.

The precursors to the Hawkins Center were the Education Extension Centers held beginning in 1984, and sponsored by the Georgia Baptist Convention. These Georgia State Education Extension Centers were held under the supervision of Dr. E. Frank Major and Dr. Clarence Drummond of the Georgia Baptist Convention. The local Education Extension Classes were located first at Concord Baptist Church, then later also at Haw Creek Baptist Church and Bethlehem Baptist Church. Rev. Rubin Smith taught the Concord study; Rev. Ben Hatfield taught at Bethlehem; and Rev. John Lummus and later Jimmy Orr taught at the Haw Creek center. Together, these centers attracted the largest attendances in the history of the GBC Education Extension Program.

Though these centers were not the F.M. Hawkins Center, they provided the motivation for starting a school whereby people could receive college level credit for theological course material.

At the Decker's Restaurant meeting in 1995-96, it was decided to ask Friendship Baptist Church for permission to use their facilities to house the new school, and to name the school after the founding pastor of

Friendship Church, Rev. Frederick M. Hawkins, because Rev. Hawkins had attended seminary in South Carolina and was a vocal proponent of theological education and missions in North Georgia. Friendship gladly agreed to the use of their facilities as well as to have the school named after its founding pastor.

The first classes of the Hawkins Center were held in the late 1990s with Rev. Ruben Smith serving as the professor. Five local pastors attended those early classes of the center. Other teaching professors have been Rev. A.B. Hatfield, Rev. John Lummus, Dr. Eddie Martin, Dr. Scott Gilbert, Rev. Christopher Bagley, and Dr. Jimmy Orr. In 2014, the center expanded its enrollment to include laypeople and Sunday School teachers who desired a more in-depth training in teaching biblical studies. As of 2018, Dr. Orr teaches a class with over 35 students enrolled, of whom most are laypeople.

In 2016, the Frederick M. Hawkins Center began a partnership with the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary to provide accredited diplomas to qualified students attending the Hawkins Center classes.

It should be noted that Rev. Paul Carder, a local pastor and member of Friendship Baptist Church has been extremely helpful in supporting, encouraging, and funding the activities of the Hawkins Center. Without Rev. Carder's involvement, the center might well have faded away.

Later note: In May 2019, ten members of the first class of this Frederick M Hawkins Center graduated from Leavell College of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary with each receiving a Biblical Teaching Certificate for the eight 16-hour courses that they participated in at Friendship Baptist Church.

Close your eyes...I want each of you to think of the day you were ordained a Deacon, a Pastor, took on a leadership role at your church, or just the day you joined the church where you currently serve. Now, think about the pews, the people around you. Who are they? Where are they? Are they the same people? Do they look the same then as they do now?

Picture the families who have moved within a five-mile radius of your church? What do they look like? Who are they? Do they know that your church exists? Wait...let's narrow that down to two miles and ask ourselves the same questions. And now let's make that one mile from your church...Ultimately...does your church look the same as it did one year ago, five years ago, 30 years ago? Our county does not, our state does not, our country does not...and our churches should not either. What are we doing as a church and Association to draw others to Christ? Many times, it is what we do on the OUTSIDE of the church through local, state, national & international Missions, that changes the faces and the empty seats on our pews INSIDE the church.

Now close them once more...Who are the ladies in your churches who are on FIRE for Missions? Are they young mothers, older ladies, single high school girls, married, divorced, widowed? Do they just hold down

their bench each week or are they actively pursuing mission work to uplift the Kingdom of God? I want you to pray about this today and every day. What are you doing to encourage the ladies of your congregations? We as the WMU are at a precipice...things are not the same in our organization either as it used to be. But all is not lost...We need Solid-Rock Standing, Souls on Fire, Do Something, Women on Mission ladies' groups who are working in every single church in our Association. Must they call themselves WMU? Of course, I want them to...but a name or title is not what gets the Work done, or the name of Jesus Lifted to a lost and dying community.

Let us, the Hightower Baptist Association, NEVER overlook or downplay the difference a few women on fire for missions will make in our churches, our Association, our state, our nation, our world!! Let's revisit our Theme Verse...But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Acts 1:8

This year instead of many paragraphs, I'm just going to highlight, grouped by this Scripture, some of the many activities of the HBA WMU groups.

Jerusalem (Hightower Baptist Association Local): Wayne Cook Family Mission; Diapers for Hightower Food Bank, Church Camp sponsorship/supplies/fundraisers, Jesse's House Inc. (an emergency shelter in Forsyth County for at-risk girls ages 7-17), Meals for VBS, Card Ministry, ICU Baskets at Northside Hospital, Hospice Center Pantry, Food Ministry, Host Father/Son Banquet, Graduation Recognition, Senior Recognition, Christmas in July event, Women's Retreat, Sheet sets donation to Food Bank, Children's Mission Day, Fire stations visits/food/cookies, Monogrammed afghans for elderly, Whispering Hope donations, Summer Revival breakfasts, Pastor Appreciation meals, Thanksgiving Luncheons, NFHS Football breakfast, Ladies Night Out, Ladies Tea, Lunches of Love to kids on free lunch program (Sponsored special events for these kids during Spring Break/Summer Break-as Adopt a School initiative), WMU Memorial Scholarship for High School Seniors, Veteran's Day cake to VFW.

Judea (State Missions): Esther Fund; GA Baptist Children's Home collections, North GA Youth Gospel Convention sponsorship, Baby Bottle Boomerang-The Hope Center of Woodstock, attend state mission meetings/conventions, Go Georgia, WMU Spring Event.

Samaria (USA): Christmas Backpacks, Annie Armstrong Offerings, sponsored youth to attend Mission Trips, Uttermost (International): Lottie Moon Offerings, Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes, Foreign Missionary prayer and financial support, Provide Rice/Beans for Haiti children through Acts 1:8 Ministry, Pure Water/Pure Love-water filters for missionaries

"By All Means" is the theme of our National WMU and is intended to challenge us to follow Jesus' example, step into the world around us, cultivate relationships, and create opportunities to demonstrate the love of Christ. For those of you who may not know, WMU was established as, and remains an auxiliary to the Southern Baptist Convention and has educated and involved generations in Christian missions since its inception in 1888. It is our purpose to challenge Christian believers to understand and be radically involved in the mission of sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ. Women's Missionary Union is a mission organization that was founded by a few women dedicated to the cause of missions. Since that time, WMU has become the largest Protestant organization for women in the world, with approximately one million members. To this day, Hightower Baptist Association WMU is still just that, a mission organization of a few women dedicated to that cause - no matter where or what the mission might be. Let me share an excerpt that our forefathers wrote in our Hightower Minutes back in 1918 about the Women's Missionary Union:

“We believe that, generally speaking, women are more interested in the work of the Kingdom of God than men and we furthermore believe that the Lord intended that they should have some special part in the establishment of His Kingdom in the world, more than being keepers at home and discharging well the duties of Christian wifehood and motherhood.

We find that certain women ministered to the Savior in special service and thus aided Him in His great work. The apostle Paul commends certain women who labored with him in the gospel and down through the centuries of Christian work, women have always been used of the Lord as prominent factors in carrying forward the work of the kingdom.

Woman’s work in the church means women doing their work through an organized capacity, called a Woman’s Missionary Society, in connection with the work of which the women of the church meet at stated times for devotional worship, for Bible and missionary study, for special seasons of prayer and making their offerings to the Lord’s cause. It is neither their desire nor purpose to usurp the place of men and do the work which the Lord has allotted to men, but rather to do effectively what the Lord meant for them to do and thus be helpmeets to the men in carrying forward the work of the kingdom.

A glance at figures will prove the value of their organized work. Baptist women of Georgia alone gave last year for our various missionary and benevolent objects the princely sum of \$101,748.69 this being more than \$11,000 more than their apportionment. These figures do not include their contributions for local work. Brethren, we feel that we should heed the injunction of the apostle Paul and “help those women.” C. B. Otwell, Chairman, S. L. Coker.”

So many of our activities, in our history and today, fit right in line with our WMU objectives, as it is Who we are and What we are to be doing.

1-Pray for Missions; 2-Take part in Mission Action and Witnessing; 3-Learn About Missions; 4-Support Missions; 5-Develop Spiritually Toward a Missions Lifestyle; 6-Take part in the Work of the Church and the Southern Baptist denomination. I’ve listed these on purpose to remind each of us what WMU is all about and ultimately what our job as a Christian is.

Each year Hightower WMU ladies have continued to work toward objectives in various outreaches - both collectively and through our individual WMUs. In January and in August, we hosted two WMU Directors Meetings at Friendship to share news from Georgia WMU and National WMU and make plans for our upcoming year. During our April Pastors Appreciation Dinner, we shared and had “meetin” when we gave our WMU Pastors time to share with each other what they are doing in their churches to encourage and promote missions. Last year’s Fall Missions Meeting was held at Castleberry Road Baptist and we had the privilege of hearing great testimony from Karen Pace, GA WMU and from Bill Barker, Director of Appalachian Mountain Ministry, who spoke to us about our Christmas Backpacks mission and the movement and history behind it and the future as well.

Through these meetings and the objectives, we are reminded that the whole Hightower Baptist Association WMU is much more significant in our community when we are Strong Sisters together. Though we are few in number, WMU is one of the consistent methods for our churches to help spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to others through Missions (In 1918 and still today). We, as WMU members, will continue to share the Love of Christ in our work inside the doors of our churches, as well as outside the doors to communities who need Hope and need a Savior. Does this sound like an Evangelism report...well, I hope so! I looked up these two words to be clear that I understood each topic:

Evangelism: the spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness.

Mission: 1: an important assignment carried out for political, religious, or commercial purposes, typically involving travel. 2: the vocation or calling of a religious organization, especially a Christian one, to go out into the world and spread its faith.

Another verse that is a favorite among our WMU, is Matthew 25:37-46: “Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?’ And the King will answer and say to them, ‘Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.’ As Jesus tells us in the Bible, we are called to serve the “least of these.” Whenever we care for people who are hungry, thirsty, sick, in prison, we are serving Him. Josh Wilson’s song, “I Refuse” is about sharing the love of Jesus with those in need. God has gifted all of us to do something. We need to refuse to do nothing. God wants us to serve Him with our actions as WELL as our words.

*To stand and watch, The weary and lost, Cry out for help, I refuse;
To turn my back, And try and act like all is well, I refuse;
To stay unchanged, To wait another day, To doubt myself, I refuse
To make one more excuse (I refuse)*

*Cause I don't want to live like I don't care, I don't want to say another empty prayer, Oh I refuse
To Sit around and wait for someone else, To do what God has called me to do myself
Oh I could choose, Not to move, But I refuse*

You’re going to hear a LOT of information today, but I beg you to make this an action item... Encourage your congregation to be Mission-Minded and Evangelical. Share this with the ladies in your church (WMU or not) to GO and WITNESS and be on a MISSION, intentionally, for the Kingdom of God. Refuse to “do nothing” when you see your pews empty, congregations dying and those who were so significant in your congregation just a few months ago but are slipping away and not returning. Make it your Mission, as the Men and leaders of your churches and this Association, to encourage your Women to nurture the orphans/homeless in our community, to provide diapers at the Food/Clothing Bank, to pack lunches for hungry kids, to pack backpacks to provide Christmas to the poor and to go to our school parking lots on prayer walks & above all to love unconditionally those who God has planted on our doorsteps. Do they need a ride to church? Then go get them! Do they need food? Provide it. Does your church need to commit more funding to Lottie Moon and Annie Armstrong? Make the commitment and Refuse to not reach your goals.

Lastly, that lady who you thought of being on fire for Missions when you closed your eyes at the beginning...I need her name. No really...Like today. If God placed her on your heart as a Missions Leader from your congregation, then I need to encourage her...lift her up. That is our jobs as your Associational WMU leaders. I have pink slips of paper with my phone and email. If you take this slip home with you, give it to her. If you prefer, write her name/number/email and drop it in the pink box in the foyer and I will contact her directly. Please support your Women’s Ministry and WMU Groups. Encourage them to be a “Soul on Fire” for Mission Work. Refuse to do nothing when it comes to Missions.

We have served 3,858 families. With an average of 4 people per family that's over 15,000 people that have been helped in the past 12 months. The HBAFCB has given out more than 224,538 pounds of food in the past 12 months.

The HBAFCB doors are open to help those in need the 2nd Saturday of every month. The need has increased in this area to warrant opening the Food and Clothing Bank for emergencies several more days during the month. Every Tuesday and Friday many volunteers work, sorting clothing, cleaning the building, and stocking the food inventory.

The need for volunteers is always greater than the supply. It takes 200+ volunteers each month to help those in need. There are 20,000+ members in the Hightower Baptist Association. It only takes 1% of the members to help each month. Is 1% too much to ask for?

Please take our need back to your Churches and ask how your Church can help in this mission field. God will bless your efforts greatly!

Sunday School Committee

In what country would you guess the church is growing most rapidly? How many guesses would it take you to get to Iran? Closed country, ruled by an oppressive Islamic government, but researchers believe they have been seeing people come to Christ at a greater rate than any other country in the world for several years now. What's their secret? They're using a very clever strategy that's working not only in Iran, but around the world. They're called Disciple-Making Movements, or DMMs, and we know of almost 1,000 taking place right now.

DMMs are based on what's called "obedience-based discipleship": Believers commit themselves to reading scripture and obeying what they read. And they commit to prayerfully teaching others to do the same.

That's it. That's the secret: Read it. Obey it. Teach others to do it.

That ought to sound really familiar, because that's exactly what Jesus told us to do:

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you.

The church in America... the church in Forsyth, Cherokee, Dawson, Pickens, Fulton Gwinnett... is the decline because we've forgotten our Great Commission. Jesus never called us to make converts. He called us to make *disciples*. Converts want to miss Hell. Disciples want to be like Jesus.

The secret to turning our churches around is only a secret because we've forgotten it, not because God has withheld it from us. As believers around the world discover it again, they remind us of what's possible – of the promise Jesus made in John 14 that anyone who believed in him would do the same works as he did and even *greater* works.

Our churches need to focus on making disciples, and Sunday School is the home base for that effort. It obviously takes more than an hour a week, but Sunday School provides the structure and discipline and community for the larger effort that has to happen in everyday life. Sunday School gets us on track and *keeps* us on track.

Our churches will only succeed to the degree that our discipleship efforts succeed. And our discipleship efforts will only succeed to the degree that our Sunday Schools do. Your Sunday School Committee is focused on helping all of us succeed.

Last October, we held a Sunday School training event hosted by Friendship Baptist Church. Jonathan Jordan, who works in the Sunday School and Small Groups division of the Georgia Baptist Convention, delivered an outstanding session followed by breakout group discussion among the Sunday School leaders in attendance.

We also held two High Attendance Sundays in 2019, on February 3rd and September 8th. Several churches have reported not only record Sunday School attendance as a result, but a very meaningful number of people who continued to attend Sunday School in the weeks afterward.

This year we plan to continue the High Attendance Sundays and to begin quarterly roundtable discussion where those involved with Sunday School can share together to learn, share, pray and encourage one another. The first of these discussions will be held on two dates – Sunday afternoon October 20th, at Brookwood and

Thursday evening, October 24th, at Coal Mountain – so that individuals have an opportunity to attend at least one event.

We believe that as we return to the calling God gave us, we will see the results we long to see. We know that he is faithful. As your Sunday School committee, our heart is to continue to do our part to see that vision realized once again?

Definition of a Disciple

One who accepts and assists in spreading the doctrines of another: such as, Christianity:

What Defines a Christian Disciple?

John 8:31 *Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;*

A disciple in the New Testament is simply a new believer, a new Christian. A Christ follower;

Acts 11:26 *And when he had found him, he brought him unto Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch.*

Everybody that was converted to Jesus Christ was a disciple. Discipleship is that *developmental process that progressively brings Christians from spiritual infancy to spiritual maturity so that they are then able to reproduce the process with someone else.*

2 Timothy 2:15 *Paul writes these words to the Christians, 'Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.'*

What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus? It means first of all that we want to learn from Him, and we will, as we study God's Word, the Bible, and listen to others teach from it. We must make the Bible a part of our life every day.

The Psalmist said, **Psalms 119:130** *The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.*

But being a disciple also means we want to put God's Word into action by seeking to live the way Christ wants us to live with God's help.

Proverbs 22:6 *Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.*

Christians are called to put Jesus first in all things. To be Disciples of Christ, we need to be set apart from the world and the things that separate us from God. Our focus should be on reflecting Jesus in every aspect of our lives. Instead of being self-centered, we should be Christ-centered.

Being a disciple also requires that we have love for other disciples. Jesus gave us a new command to love one another as He loved us and in John, we read these words:

John 13:34 *A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.*

John 13:35 *By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.*

For most of us, however, **what is required is not to die for Christ but to live for him.**

Becoming a Disciple

Matthew 28:20 *Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.*

Being a disciple of Jesus Christ is a lot different than just going to church once or twice a week. To get excited because the preacher challenged you and the choir inspired you is nice, but that's not spiritual growth. To enjoy Christian fellowship with your friends is a wonderful part of the Christian life, but it in and of itself is not discipleship.

The goal and the cornerstone of your activity that which brings God the most glory, is for believers to become disciples. God's goal is not only salvation for the unbelievers; His desire is that those when they are saved become disciples also.

Discipleship is that *developmental process that progressively brings Christians from spiritual infancy to spiritual maturity so that they are then able to reproduce the process with someone else.* The singular, goal of a disciple should be to bring all of life under the lordship of Jesus Christ and then help others else to do the same.

Jesus wants Christians to be used, and to be part of His ministry to the World. It is a high calling, but is a worthy calling as is stated in [Matthew 28:19-20](#):

Matthew 28:19 *Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:*

Matthew 28:20 *Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.*

The desire of God according to Scripture is not only that we know Him, but that we also become a disciple of Jesus Christ and allow our life to be centered in Him.

Discipleship is a Lifelong Journey.

When we hear Jesus' Great Commission Matthew 28:18-20:

Matthew 28:18 *And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.*

Matthew 28:19 *Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the*

Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

Matthew 28:20 *Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.*

New Testament writers stress the difference between immature and mature disciples. Paul tells the Ephesians that Christ equips his people to grow from infancy to spiritual maturity.

Ephesians 4:11 *And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers;*

Ephesians 4:12 *For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:*

Peter encourages his readers to “grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. ” 2

Peter 3:18 *But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen.*

Characteristics of a Christian disciple:

1. A true disciple of the Jesus worships God. If you are a new creation in Christ, you are someone who brings glory to God and recognizes His honor.
2. A disciple must be confident in the efficacy of Christ’s death and resurrection for his salvation. He must know that he is a child of God and Christ dwells within him.
3. A disciple walks in the fullness and power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is responsible for everything that happens in the life of a believer, his new birth, his daily walk, his understanding of Scripture, of prayer, etc. He produces the fruit of the Spirit in us, which enables us to live holy lives and witness for Christ.
4. A disciple demonstrates love for God, neighbor, fellow disciples, and enemies. Jesus commands us to love God with every fiber of our being and to love our neighbors as ourselves.
5. A disciple is one who knows how to read, study, memorize, and meditate upon the Word of God, to store its truths in his heart. It is impossible to walk in the fullness of God’s Holy Spirit without understanding God’s Word. The reverse is also true: you cannot understand God’s Word without the Holy Spirit.
6. A true disciple of Jesus is a man or woman of prayer. Jesus models throughout Scripture that communicating with God is one of the most important things in a Christian’s life. He models that those who are children of God seek the Father.
7. A disciple is one who obeys the commands of God in a lifestyle that honors Christ.
8. A disciple is one who trusts God and lives a life of faith. Scripture reminds us that, “without faith it is impossible to please God.”
9. A disciple understands God’s grace. God loves us unconditionally, whether we obey Him or not. This is the opposite of legalism – a heretic way of thinking that urges us to try to obey God’s laws in our own wisdom, strength, and power.
10. A disciple is one who witnesses for Christ as a way of life. If you love Jesus, you are challenged to tell people about Him, testifying to what He has done in your life.

In Matt 28:18-20, Jesus commissioned His disciples to make disciples of all nations. But who is a disciple? If we do not know our objective and what the finished product is, then we would not know the process needed to accomplish it! Therefore, to develop a strategy for disciple making, we need to define our goal.

In John's Gospel, Jesus gave **three prescriptive characteristics of a disciple** ... what a disciple should be.

A. Abiding in God's Word - John 8:31-32

John 8:31 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;

John 8:32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

Seemingly, some Jews declared their faith in Jesus who then began teaching what constitutes true discipleship.

To abide in God's word is to remain or to hold fast the teachings of His word. Discipleship is not simply a decision of belief at some point in time but an ongoing process of following, of obedience to His word. The result of abiding in Christ's word is freedom, spiritual freedom from the bondage of sin (John 8:32, 34;

Psalms 119:10 With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments.

Psalms 119:11 Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.

B. Bearing Fruit - John 15:4-8, 16

John 15:4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me.

John 15:5 I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

John 15:6 If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned.

John 15:7 If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.

John 15:8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

John 15:16 Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.

C. Loving One Another - John 13:34-35

John 13:34 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

John 13:35 By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

This characteristic of love is the distinguishing mark to the world that one is a disciple of Christ

1 John 3:23 And this is his commandment, That we should believe on the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another, as he gave us commandment.

The words "as I have loved you" (John 15:12-13) give the standard of love, sacrificial love with which the disciples should love one another.

To make new disciples we must:

Mark 8:35 *For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it.*

Mark 8:36 *For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?*

Mark 8:37 *Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?*

This year, we were blessed to be able to provide 11 students from Hightower Association churches with partial scholarships to the North Georgia School of Gospel Music (NGSGM). Given in memory of Jimmy and Rebecca Fagan and Ronald Martin, these scholarships are our way of preserving musical worship, and encouraging future generations to continue the strong tradition of Gospel music in our churches. At the school, students are taught the fundamentals of music theory, directing, and singing techniques. The school allows students to “unplug” from the world for two full weeks in order to fully experience the power of worshipping God through song. Although their time at the school passes quickly, we feel these students will use the knowledge gained at NGS GM for years to

come. We encourage all churches in the Hightower Association to promote the NGSGM, and if able, provide opportunities for more young musicians to attend in the future.

As the music committee, it is our duty to support the musical worship for our annual Association Fall Revival. The music committee began working on selecting congregational singing and choir specials in July. After meeting multiple times, and prayerfully considering song selection, mass youth and adult choir practices were held. At these rehearsals, the youth choir had over 20 children and teens present representing over six churches in the association. The adult choir rehearsal had over 65 participants representing over 15 churches from the association. The music committee worked diligently selecting instrumentalists and preparing for a great night of worship at our revival held at Concord Baptist Church October 13th through the 15th. Our prayer was simple: musical worship would take place, and the name of Jesus would be lifted and glorified.

In closing, we would like to thank everyone involved in the musical worship of the Hightower Association churches. The efforts of every song leader, choir director, instrumentalist, and choir member are a blessing to God, and to each of us. When He is lifted, worship and praise take over, and the Gospel message is spread throughout the world. We pray that the musical worship of your church will lift the name of Jesus and that His Holy Spirit will draw lost souls into the fold.

*Rev. Dave Holbrook
Canaan Baptist Church*



Rev. Dave Holbrook (12-5-1944 – 3-26-2019) was a dedicated man of God. He served the Lord for over 56 years. His main goal was to win lost souls to Christ. He was a man with great talent and wisdom. He used every gift to work for the Lord. He told his preacher calling in 1966. He preached, played piano, sang, taught music school to a few church choirs and worked with youth teaching them to sing. He wrote several songs, preached and sang and hundreds of funerals, helped in Revivals and was called on to play the piano everywhere he went and never turned anyone down. His most requested song was *I'll Get My Reward*. In the 70's and 80's he played and sang in the Dave Holbrook Quartet with his wife Jean. He loved his wife dearly and they served the Lord together; you never saw one without the other. He started pastoring in 1974 at Amicalola Baptist Church and was there 2 years. He later pastored Ridgeview Baptist Church. He was there 6 years. Then the Lord called him back to Amicalola Baptist Church in 1992 for 13 years. He went on a preaching crusade to Jamaica in the 90's and lead many to Christ. In 2006 he started pastoring Canaan Baptist Church where he pastored until his passing which was for 13 years. The last 13 years of his life, he played and sang with his family, wife Jean, daughter Darlene and son Heath and was known as “The Holbrooks.” He witnessed everywhere he went from doctors, nurses, waitress and anyone who would listen. He led

several of his doctors to the Lord along with others he met while tuning pianos. Dave was asked to play Burl in Smoke on the Mountain at the Cumming Playhouse in June 2015. In 2016 he received an award for best piano player in singing network. When asked about all his compliments, his reply was “be careful not to get all puffed up, all the glory goes to God.” One of his favorite scriptures was Romans 12:1, I beseech you therefore, brethren by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

In the time of his ministry, he was blessed to Baptized close to 300 new converts including his grandchildren and great grandchildren. He was a loved and talented man whom is truly missed.

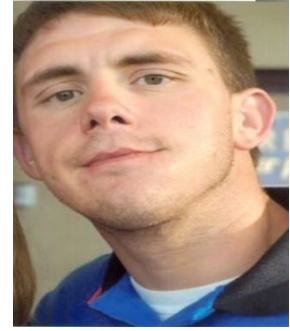

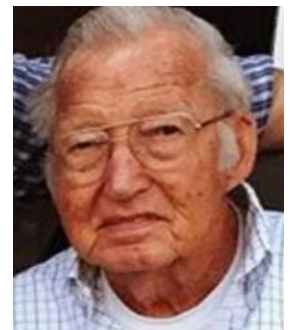

These groups are being used as sounding boards to further develop the ministry of the Mission Board.

**Letter to the Churches explaining the motion and job description for the Food and Clothing Bank Chairman
September 19, 2019**

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Hightower Baptist Association

The Hightower Food and Clothing Bank routinely serves 1,000 plus people on a distribution Saturday and countless others throughout the week. During Christmas, 1,000 children and their families will be ministered to. This is accomplished through the direction and power of our Savior and through the hard work of countless volunteers. There is a lot more work to the Food and Clothing Bank than what is seen on distribution Saturdays. There is food that is ordered and picked up from the Atlanta Food Bank. There are local stores that give damaged and overstocked items to the food bank that must be picked up through the week. Some opportunities for supplies are missed because no one is available to receive a delivery or physically pick up items. There is always sorting and stocking shelves in preparation for distribution. There are also certifications that are required by different agencies because food is involved. This requires one of our volunteers to keep the ministry current with reports to the different agencies and be available to have inspections done on the facilities. The Food Bank has grown to be the third largest in the state of Georgia behind the Atlanta Food Bank and the Northeast Georgia Food Bank. This speaks to the massive need and to the dedication of many volunteers.

We are immensely grateful to the leadership of Paul and Angie Bagley who have volunteered countless hours to the food and clothing bank. We are thankful for their willingness to respond to the call of God to serve the Food and Clothing Bank and our association over the past 4 years. This past year, Paul once again responded to the call of God on his life to serve as Pastor to Mount Tabor Baptist Church. With this great responsibility, Paul is looking to turn over the leadership of the Food and Clothing Bank to the next person that God has called. With this in mind, Paul approached the Executive Committee with a recommendation that would provide more opportunities to minister to people between distribution, to collect more items for the Food and Clothing Bank that require immediate availability, to make known the many stories of families helped and lives that are transformed and continue to grow the ministry. Attached to this letter is a list of actives that are required in order to keep the Food and Clothing Bank operating.

The Executive Committee will be making a recommendation to the Association at the Annual Meeting on October 2nd to hire a full-time Director for the Food and Clothing Bank. The committee is recommending that this individual be charged with the day to day operation of the Food Bank. This would include: recruit, train, and organizing volunteers, staying current with required reports and inspections, spending time in churches giving reports of the work of the Food and Clothing Bank, interfacing with businesses that currently give and others that have expressed interest in help with items and finances, maintaining facilities, and meeting regularly with the Executive Committee to report goals and progress of the ministry.
