2022 Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeder's Award

Gene Bergschneider



The recipient of the 2022 Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeders Award is **Gene Bergschneider** of New Berlin. Gene and his family have raised purebred Hereford cattle on their farm in western Sangamon Co for 4 generations. A 1957 graduate of the University of Illinois with a degree in animal science, Gene was active in the Farmhouse Fraternity, Hoof and Horn Club and Army ROTC. His senior year as a member of the Hoof and Horn Club, Gene won the over-all showmanship, showing beef, swine, sheep and horses. Upon graduation, he continued to serve in the Army Reserves for 8 years retiring as a Captain.

In 1960, Gene exhibited the Grand Champion carcass steer on foot and rail at the

International Livestock Show in Chicago, a rare feat even to this day to win both. In 1965, he was recognized by the Springfield Jaycees as its outstanding young farmer. A lifetime member of the American Hereford Association and the Illinois Hereford Association, serving as district director as well as membership in the Illinois Beef Association and the National Cattleman's Association.

Gene's community involvement includes serving 16 years on the New Berlin school board, director on the Farmers Elevator board, New Berlin Men's Community Club, St. John's Lutheran Church board, served as director and president of the LG Co-op, Sangamon County Extension Council, Sangamon County Fair board director and past president for over 40 years, founding member of the New Berlin sports boosters and the past beef director of the Land of Lincoln Livestock Breeders Association.

An avid sports fan of the Fighting Illini, New Berlin Pretzels and the Chicago Bears, Gene truly does bleed orange and blue. He tirelessly volunteered as timer at New Berlin High School basketball games for 60+ years and was instrumental in starting the football program while on the school board and served as timer for football for 40+ years. Gene was honored for his many years of service by being inducted into the New Berlin High School Sports Hall of Fame as well as the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame as a friend of the sport.

A strong supporter of county fairs and the Illinois State Fair, Gene can still be seen at many fairs throughout Central Illinois finding a seat at ringside to watch the cattle show or tasting chili and enjoying a cold one with his buddy Wayne. On August 14, 1998 then Governor Jim Edgar declared it Gene Bergschneider Day in Illinois for his 50 years of exhibiting at the Illinois State Fair. A 70 year distinction of exhibiting Hereford cattle at the Illinois State Fair came to an end in 2018. Congratulations Gene on this well-deserved award from your family and friends.

THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SHALL SOLELY INTERPRET AND UPHOLD THESE RULES, IN ORDER TO PRESERVE THE QUALITY AND STANDARDS OF THE ILLINOIS STATE FAIR AND PROTECT THE SAFETY, SECURITY, AND WELL-BEING OF STATE FAIR EXHIBITORS, VISITORS AND EXHIBITED ANIMALS. IT IS A PRIVILEGE TO EXHIBIT AT THE ILLINOIS STATE FAIR AND THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DISQUALIFY AND REMOVE ANY ANIMAL AND/OR PERSON.

WHILE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS, LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS WILL BE UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE GENERAL LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT AND RESPECTIVE LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT SUPERINTENDENT.

BE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AT ANY TIME WHILE ANIMALS ARE ON THE
FAIRGROUNDS.**

GENERAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

Health Certificate of Veterinary Inspection: The term "Health Certificate" or "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" (CVI) means a legible record, made on an official form of the state of origin, issued by an accredited veterinarian, which shows that the animals listed thereon meet the health requirements of the state of destination.

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI):

1. Must accompany animals, except as noted and be available on request by Animal Health Officials; All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php>
2. Must show results of required tests and/or vaccinations;
3. Must show name and address of owner or exhibitor;
4. Must be dated and signed by an accredited veterinarian;
5. Must show only one (1) identification per line on the CVI; and
6. Must show the official identification of each animal.
7. For out-of-state livestock, a CVI shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
8. For Illinois origin livestock, a CVI shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
9. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.

Special Note: No Corrections or Additions will be allowed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

General Provisions:

1. Any Illinois cattle or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post entry.
2. Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair, soremouth, caseous lymphadenitis or multiple warts easily visible without close examination, will not be permitted to exhibit. Animals infested with scabies or mange will not be permitted to exhibit.
3. As a condition of entry in Illinois State Fair events, all exhibitors agree to cooperate fully with testing protocols including ultrasound. Department personnel may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced to test for the presence of any substances, practices or other adulterants. The Illinois Department of Agriculture may also collect blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
4. Market animals at the Illinois State Fair must meet the requirements regarding drug withdrawal and eligibility for slaughter. If any drugs are administered prior to the Fair, they must have a withdrawal time such that the animal is eligible by the time the animal arrives at the Fairgrounds.
5. Upon entry to the Illinois State Fairgrounds, no person shall administer internally or externally any medication or drug, including prescription and non-prescription, unless as authorized in Section 3 of this Premium Book. Any medication or drug administered without written authorization or in an unauthorized dosage constitutes a violation of show rules, and all premiums and awards from all shows for the owner, exhibitor and/or trainer will be withheld.
6. All exhibitors of animals at the Illinois State Fair shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and be ordered removed from the grounds with all awards and premiums being forfeited.
7. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical or mechanical application, will constitute a violation of show rules and is subject to the above provisions.
8. Market animals at the Illinois State Fair include steers and market heifers; barrows and market gilts; wether and market ewe lambs; meat goat wethers and market does; poultry meat pens, roasters and fryers; and rabbit meat pens and fryers.

CATTLE

Identification

1. Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number, or individual brand, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

1. Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

1. Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cattle.

Special Note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php>

Brucellosis

1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Are official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine Identification

1. Illinois swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine.

Special Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.

Brucellosis

1. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies

1. Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

Identification

1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
2. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis

1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by 1 of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal lab.

Pseudorabies

1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

1. Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag or microchip if the owner provides the reader.
2. Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.
3. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Infected or Source Herd or Flock

1. Sheep originating from a herd or flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd or flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd/flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php>

GOATS

Identification

1. Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag or microchip if the owner provides the reader.
2. Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.
3. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database. Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

1. Goats originating from a herd or flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd or flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd/flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php>

1. Goats originating from a herd or flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd or flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd/flock plan.
2. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

POULTRY*

General Requirements for all Poultry

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.

3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by an official fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the fairgrounds.
5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217)782-4944.

Special Note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H / FFA 1-day poultry shows where entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day.

PIGEONS*

There are no requirements governing the movement of pigeons within or into Illinois.

**** Special Note regarding Exotic Newcastle Disease: Illinois prohibits the importation of all members of the avian species or avian products that have originated from or been transported through any area where Exotic Newcastle Disease has been diagnosed and is under quarantine by any state, federal or tribal agency.***

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movement of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php>

Section 2. **Fire Prevention Rules**

The following restrictions are issued under advice of the Office of the Illinois State Fire Marshall and result from requirements set forth in Illinois law as well as the Illinois Administrative Code. Penalties provided by Illinois law will be imposed for violations. Fire prevention inspectors will be on the Fairgrounds to enforce the rules and require general compliance with fire-safe practices.

FLAMMABLE AND COMBUSTIBLE LIQUIDS:

1. Unattended heaters used inside buildings for animal or poultry production or care shall be equipped with approved automatic devices to shut off the flow of gas to main burners, and pilots, if used, in the event of flame extinguishment or combustion failure.
2. Flammable liquids shall be prohibited in barns and sleeping rooms. Exceptions include paints, insecticides and veterinary medicine that shall not exceed five gallons in any one barn or sleeping room location.
3. Storage of gasoline, kerosene and other flammable or combustible liquids in quantities or methods different than those listed below shall be forbidden throughout the Fairgrounds.
 - A. Containers shall be filled only in daylight, well away from source of ignition, and always outside of any building, structure and tent and a safe distance therefrom.
 - B. Upon vacating premises, concessionaires/exhibitors shall not leave any filled, partly filled or empty container which has been used for gasoline, kerosene, or other flammable liquid and will be held responsible for any accident or injury which may result from violation of this provision.

BARNs:

4. Smoking is prohibited in all livestock barns.
5. Portable heating and cooking appliances are prohibited in barns. Further, cooking via grills or open flame fires is prohibited in the barns.
6. No unauthorized extension cords from barns, stalls, and poles to campers, motor homes, or other electrical devices outside the barns will be allowed.
7. Sleeping is prohibited in lofts, hay or straw storage areas, or where combustible materials are located. Sleeping is allowed only during the fair on cots in the aisles, empty stalls and tack rooms. In all cases, aisles shall be maintained clear of obstruction at all times and access to fire exits and equipment shall not be blocked.
8. Vehicles are prohibited in barns at all times. Exceptions include State Fair Personnel and Grounds vehicles which may pass through buildings for cleaning and maintenance.
9. Only reasonable hay and straw storage shall be allowed in stalls and lofts.

DECORATIONS AND TRIM:

10. Draperies, curtains, hanging decorations and other similar furnishings shall be flame resistant as demonstrated by passing both the small and large scale test of NAPA 701, Standard Methods of Fire Tests for Flame-Resistant Textiles and Films -1991 edition. Material not complying with this provision will be ordered removed. Furnishings or decorations of an explosive or highly flammable nature shall not be used.

HOUSEKEEPING:

11. All fire lanes shall be posted and kept free of vehicles and storage. Vehicles shall not park within 15 feet of fire hydrants, fire hose stations, fire reporting stations, building doors or sprinkler system connections.
12. Booths, railings, fencing, displays, etc., shall not block or interfere with aisles, stairs, entrances, or exits in any building, tent, grandstand or other occupiable structure.

FIREWORKS:

13. The display, sale and/or use of fireworks, as defined in Illinois law, is prohibited except as authorized through the issuance of a special fireworks display permit issued by the Manager of the State Fair and approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

ELECTRIC LIGHTS AND POWER:

14. No items shall be attached to or hung from electrical wiring. All extension cords, or pendant wires, in temporary structures, tents or in the open shall be rubber-covered cords.
15. No wiring shall be laid on the ground or on the floor, of any permanent or temporary structure, tent or booth. Electric wiring shall not be fastened to or draped over fencing. Where installations require wiring to be placed on or over fencing the wiring must be secured to a non-conducting surface such as a 1" x 2" board.

Section 3.

Animal Care, Drugs, Testing, Violations and Penalties

Exhibitors with questions regarding medications and/or eligibility are encouraged to contact the Illinois State Veterinarian at 217-782-4944 prior to administration of medication. The State Fair Manager can also be reached at 217-782-0776.

1. All exhibitors in any and all events described in this Premium Book acknowledge by their entry into such events that they have no constitutional or statutory right to participate or compete in such events. All exhibitors hereby expressly acknowledge that the procedures set forth in this Premium Book are the exclusive procedures and remedies concerning any disqualification. The Illinois State Fair and/or the Department of Agriculture reserve the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.
2. Exhibitors and exhibitors' parents and/or legal guardians bear absolute responsibility for the care and custody of their animals. The use of drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of Federal Law.
3. The Illinois State Fair is entitled to disqualify any exhibitor whose animal tests positive for a drug, even if the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or legal guardian are unaware of any wrongdoing, did not administer the drug, or had no knowledge of the administration of the drug. Even if the source of the drug is unknown, the Illinois State Fair is entitled to disqualify the exhibitor.
4. If an exhibitor administers any medication or drug to an animal prior to the Illinois State Fair, it is the exhibitor's sole responsibility to ensure that withdrawal times allow the animal to be slaughter eligible by the time it arrives at the fairgrounds. The elimination time (the time it takes for no drug residue to be found in the system) is generally longer than the labeled withdrawal period for most approved drugs.
5. The Illinois State Fair has the right to examine and/or test any animal (deceased or living), feed, liquids, or equipment at any time. The Illinois State Fair may sample an animal's blood, urine, milk, saliva, and/or tissue. Any samples taken for testing become the property of the Illinois State Fair. Samples may be collected, stored and tested in any manner the Illinois Department of Agriculture deems appropriate. Positive test results may be made public.
6. The Illinois State Fair may impound any animal for testing. Refusing such tests shall be cause for disqualification. Any animal tested at the Illinois State Fair is subject to being detained at the expense of the exhibitor until the Illinois State Fair receives final test results.
7. The drug test results of the testing laboratories are final and binding upon the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or legal guardians.

8. Violations:

- A. Drug Administration: It is a **violation** if any medication or drug is administered to an animal after it has arrived on the State Fairgrounds without the supervision of the official State Fair Veterinarian. If an animal requires treatment while on the fairgrounds, only the Official State Fair Veterinarian is allowed to administer a medication or drug to the animal. Animals administered a medication or drug by the Official State Veterinarian having a reported withdrawal and/or elimination time period beyond the show date will be automatically disqualified from the competition.
- B. Unapproved Drug Use: It is a **violation** if a market animal tests “positive” (not a quantitative test) for any drug that has not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration and/or the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for such type of animal.

However, it shall not be a violation of this subsection if the exhibitor discloses the drug specifically as follows: the exhibitor provides to the Illinois State Fair, within 24 hours of check-in, the Illinois State Fair AMDUCA form properly completed by the veterinarian that prescribed the non-FDA-approved drug for the animal. It shall also not be a violation of this subsection if the State Fair Veterinarian prescribes a non-FDA-approved drug for an animal during the Illinois State Fair and completes the AMDUCA form. The AMDUCA form is available by contacting the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

Although the preceding paragraph allows for certain use of non-FDA-approved drugs, please be aware that federal law (21 C.F.R. § 530.41) prohibits the following list of drugs, families of drugs, and substances for extra label animal uses. Therefore, notwithstanding the above paragraph, it is a **violation** with an increased penalty, including notification to the relevant authorities, if a market animal tests “positive” (not a quantitative test) for any of the following:

- 1) Chloramphenicol;
- 2) Clenbuterol;
- 3) Diethylstilbestrol (DES);
- 4) Dimetridazole;
- 5) Iprnidazole;
- 6) Other nitroimidazoles;
- 7) Furazolidone;
- 8) Nitrofurazone;
- 9) Sulfonamide drugs in lactating dairy cattle (except approved use of sulfadimethoxine, sulfabromomethazine, and sulfaethoxyypyridazine);
- 10) Fluoroquinolones;
- 11) Glycopeptides;
- 12) Phenylbutazone in female dairy cattle 20 months of age or older; and
- 13) Cephalosporins (not including cephalirin) in cattle, swine, chickens, or turkeys:
 - i. For disease prevention purposes;
 - ii. At unapproved doses, frequencies, durations, or routes of administration; or
 - iii. If the drug is not approved for that species and production class.

- C. Violative Residue Limit (Tolerance): It is a **violation** if a test result indicates the presence of a drug, additive, or contaminant that exceeds a residue limit (tolerance) set by the FDA and applied by the FSIS.
 - D. Unethical Fitting and Grooming Practices: It is a **violation** if an animal evidences air pumping or the presence of inappropriate substances to alter conformation. Methods such as stomach pumping to induce artificial fill, performing surgical and/or non-surgical procedures to alter the animal's configuration or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, or unethical fitting are grounds for disqualification. The following generally accepted management practices are allowed: hoof trimming, dehorning, removal of hair, castration, branding, tattooing, ear notching and docking tails.
 - E. Falsification of Entries or Records: It is a **violation** to falsify or alter official entries, records or registrations of animals.
 - F. Unsportsmanlike Conduct: It is a **violation** for an exhibitor to act in any way that is outright discourteous or disrespectful to other exhibitors, judges, fair personnel or fair visitors, or to deliberately place or cause to be placed any animals or other person in a potentially harmful or disadvantageous position.
 - G. Approaching a Judge: It is a **violation** for any individual, except Illinois State Fair personnel, to approach a judge during a show. Further, it is a **violation** to interfere with a judge in the performance of his/her duty or to refuse the awards designated by a judge.
9. Penalties: In the event of a violation, the exhibitor and animal shall be disqualified. The Illinois State Fair will provide the disqualified exhibitor with a *Notice of Disqualification* setting forth the specific reasons for the disqualification. The exhibitor of the disqualified animal shall be subject to the following penalties:
- A. If exhibitor's first disqualification:
 - 1) Forfeiture of all monetary awards including sale proceeds associated with the exhibitor for the current State Fair. The exhibitor also forfeits the rights to any product resulting therefrom.
 - 2) Return of all trophies and non-monetary awards associated with the exhibitor for the current State Fair.
 - 3) Forfeiture of all titles associated with the exhibitor for the current State Fair.
 - 4) A ban from competing in any competitive event at the Illinois State Fair for the following year, unless the animal is disqualified for testing positive for a drug, family of drugs, or substances prohibited by 21 C.F.R. § 530.41, in which case the ban shall be for the lifetime of the exhibitor.
 - B. If exhibitor's second or subsequent disqualification:

All of the penalties above in 9(A), except the exhibitor shall be subject to a ban from competing in any competitive event at the Illinois State Fair for the following three (3) years, unless the animal is disqualified for testing positive for a drug, family of drugs, or substances prohibited by 21 C.F.R. § 530.41, in which case the ban shall be for the lifetime of the exhibitor.
10. Appeal of Disqualification: A disqualified exhibitor shall have 10 days following the receipt of the *Notice of Disqualification* to file a Petition with the Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture. The procedures set forth in 8 Illinois Administrative Code 1, SUBPART C shall govern the process of filing and considering a Petition from a disqualified exhibitor.

11. If a Grand Champion or Grand Champion Land of Lincoln animal is disqualified, the Reserve Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion Land of Lincoln will be elevated to the respective designation. Disqualified animal photos and designations shall not be used in any advertising or promotional activities following the State Fair.

SICK, NONAMBULATORY AND DECEASED ANIMAL POLICY

11. The Illinois State Fair is fully committed to carrying out Animal Wellness and Care principles and ensuring the proper treatment of all animal exhibits. Therefore, sick animals shall not be exhibited because of the risk to the animal, other animals, the exhibitor, other persons, and the integrity of competitions. The Illinois State Fair Management, Department Superintendents, State of Illinois Veterinarians, and their respective designees, at their sole discretion, may prohibit an animal from showing and may require an animal to be sent to quarantine or leave the fairgrounds on the basis of animal health and care concerns.
12. A veterinarian will be available during the State Fair and may be reached by calling 217/524-9755 or 217/372-1418.
13. Upon arrival at the State Fairgrounds, all Junior Livestock Division Exhibitors irrevocably consent to emergency medical care that may be needed to preserve an animal's life or prevent extreme suffering. 4-H and FFA exhibitors and any person affiliated with them hereby waive any claim related to emergency medical care and, to the fullest extent permitted by law, 4-H and FFA exhibitors and any person affiliated with them hereby agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Illinois State Fair, Illinois Department of Agriculture, Illinois 4-H and FFA Programs, the State of Illinois, and respective agencies, affiliates, agents, officers, and employees from all claims and suits including court costs, attorney's fees, and other expenses related to emergency medical care. If the following conditions have been met, the Illinois State Fair is expressly authorized to perform any medical treatment, including but not limited to medical practices/ procedures, administering of medications, surgery, and euthanasia, for an animal in the absence of the 4-H or FFA Exhibitor:
 - A. The 4-H or FFA Exhibitor is unreachable after due diligence has been made to contact the Exhibitor; and
 - B. The State Fair Veterinarian (or designee), Department Superintendent and General Livestock Superintendent jointly determine the animal's health is in danger and delaying treatment would be detrimental to the animal's life, or that the animal is in extreme pain.
14. Upon entry to the Illinois State Fairgrounds only the official State Fair Veterinarians (or designee) may administer any medications or treatments externally or internally to animals on the Fairgrounds.

Special Note: It is a violation if any medication or drug is administered to an animal without the supervision of the official State Fair Veterinarian.

15. Notification to the State Veterinarian shall be completed by the attending official veterinarian and signed by the exhibitor or their guardian. Within 2 hours of treatment, the official State Fair Veterinarian shall electronically report all performed treatments to the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

16. No animals can be unloaded that are nonambulatory (i.e. downer) or unable to walk off the vehicle under their own power. The exception to this policy will be unloading the animal for euthanizing and disposing of the animal. If an animal becomes nonambulatory after arrival at the Illinois State Fairgrounds, the following policy will be strictly enforced:
 - A. The owner shall immediately notify the Department Superintendent.
 - B. The Department Superintendent shall immediately notify the State Fair Veterinarian and General Livestock Superintendent about the animal in question and the evolving circumstances.
 - C. The official Illinois State Fair Veterinarian, Department Superintendent, General Livestock Superintendent, and owner (or representative) will consult to determine the best course of action with primary focus on the animal's well-being. If euthanasia is determined to be the best option, this will be at the owner's expense.
 - D. Livestock that becomes nonambulatory after arriving at the Illinois State Fairgrounds must be disposed of or removed for treatment within 12 hours of discovery or receiving notice of the animal's condition. If the animal is treatable and the previously identified committee agrees, the owner must remove that animal from the Fairgrounds (at the owner's expense) within the 12 hour period.
 - E. If an animal dies while at the Illinois State Fair, the animal's owner(s) shall immediately notify the Department Superintendent, who shall notify the General Livestock Superintendent who shall contact the State Veterinarian. The animal shall be removed from the building or display area within 30 minutes. Fairgrounds staff will assist in loading the carcass into a vehicle for removal or to an appropriate holding area, but the animal's owner(s) is responsible for removing the carcass from the fairgrounds. In all instances, the Department Superintendent and General Livestock Superintendent must be present to assist in coordinating the removal of the carcass.
 - F. The Illinois Department of Agriculture reserves the right to examine and/or test any animal that dies on the fairgrounds, including having a necropsy performed. If a necropsy is performed, the Department of Agriculture will bear the cost.

ETHICAL CARE AND FITTING OF ANIMALS

17. The Illinois State Fair provides a showcase for Illinois Agriculture, highlighting the highest quality livestock, commodities and products through fair, unbiased and educational competitive events. Therefore, livestock exhibitors are held to a high standard of stewardship, integrity and ethics in each and every aspect of the care and exhibiting of animals. By making entries in the Illinois State Fair, exhibitors certify they have read the contents of this section of the fair book and agree to abide by all applicable rules and guidelines associated with the ethical care and exhibiting of animals, including specific rules relating to the administration of drugs to animals. Failure to do so could result in immediate disqualification from entered events, loss of entry fees and other identified penalties.
 - A. When caring for and exhibiting animals, ***ethics means***:
 - 1) Setting good examples.

- 2) Doing the right things.
 - 3) Making ethical decisions.
 - 4) Being accountable for your decisions.
- B. Specifically, **ethical care includes**:
- 1) Knowing how to properly handle and treat your animals and acting accordingly.
 - 2) Observing your animals each and every day.
 - 3) Treating your animals humanely at all times.
 - 4) Providing safe and humane housing for your animals that protects them from the weather and any hazards that could result in injuries, pain or disease.
 - 5) Transporting your animals in a manner that will avoid unnecessary stress or chance of injury.
 - 6) Being gentle and patient with animals.
 - 7) Providing adequate amounts of good quality and wholesome food and water. This means feeding and watering animals daily, even on busy, difficult days.
 - 8) Keeping your animals, pens and stalls clean at all times.
 - 9) Protecting your animal's health through implementing disease prevention strategies, such as following proper vaccination protocols and quickly responding to any change in the health status of your animal.
 - 10) Using and storing medications correctly and in accordance with label directions.
 - 11) Providing veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering.
 - 12) Helping others whenever possible.
- C. Specifically, **ethical exhibiting includes**:
- 1) Making sure each animal's records and entries are correct, including age, breed, weight and ownership papers.
 - 2) Following the deadlines for entry and arrival at shows.
 - 3) Being truthful in completing paperwork and entry forms and demonstrating honesty in working with other exhibitors and show staff.
 - 4) Keeping the promises made by signing the Illinois State Fair Affidavit that...
 - i. livestock exhibits have been cared for and maintained by the exhibitor and his or her immediate family,
 - ii. exhibitors will follow the rules of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act, and
 - iii. exhibitors will follow all fair rules on animal care, grooming and market eligibility.
 - 5) Properly handling your animals when they are being exhibited.
 - 6) Being courteous toward other exhibitors and adults working with the program.
 - 7) Listening to and following the advice of advisors and leaders.
 - 8) Dealing with anger and disagreements in a peaceful way.
 - 9) Accepting the results of competition and being a good sport.

D. ***Ethical behavior does not include:***

- 1) Striking, tormenting, overworking, starving or abusing animals in any manner.
- 2) Abandoning any animal where it may become a public charge or may suffer injury, hunger or exposure.
- 3) Using animal drugs illegally or not according to the label, as such action may potentially harm animals, make animal products unsafe for consumers and could result in criminal charges.
- 4) Turning in false paperwork about an animal's age, breed, weight, ownership, identity, or more.
- 5) Taking credit for work you did not do.
- 6) Illegally changing the appearance of an animal.
- 7) Exhibiting deceitful, disrespectful or discourteous behavior toward other exhibitors or show staff.

Section 4.

Land of Lincoln Breeders Award for Purebred Registered Livestock General Rules

PROGRAM ESTABLISHED

“The Department shall establish and promote contests and exhibitions of various classes of purebred registered livestock to be known as “Land of Lincoln Breeders Awards for Purebred Registered Livestock”.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Only animals which are Illinois bred, born and solely owned and exhibited by residents of the State of Illinois as printed on registration paper, shall be eligible to participate in such contests and exhibitions. All such animals, in order to remain eligible shall be maintained in the State of Illinois; provided, however, that such animals shall be permitted out of state for a maximum of 90 days for the purpose of showings and exhibitions or embryo transplants.”

GOVERNANCE

2. The General Rules published in the 2022 Illinois State Fair Livestock Premium Book and those listed under each department will prevail in connection with classes of purebred registered livestock.

ENTRY RULES

3. All entries must be made on specie-specific entry forms provided for Livestock Exhibitors. Entry forms may be secured through the State Fair Entry Department at 217/782-0786 or the State Fair website www.illinoisstatefair.info. Entry forms may be submitted directly to the State Fair Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794-9427.
4. Entry forms must be completely filled out with class numbers for both the Junior/Open Classes and Land of Lincoln Classes, if applicable and appropriate. If entry is for Junior/Open Class only, the Land of Lincoln class number column should be left blank. All animals must be shown in Junior/Open classes to be eligible for Land of Lincoln classes.
5. The livestock entry blank or card submitted to the Livestock Department for check-in, when signed and properly certified, will confirm an entry.
6. Junior Exhibitors desiring to make Open Show Land of Lincoln entries MUST make entries on Official Open Show Livestock Entry Forms.
7. Proof of eligibility through proper registration papers is required of all Land of Lincoln Livestock entries.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION AND OWNERSHIP

8. Original registration papers issued by respective breed associations will be required in all purebred classes. For Junior Show Land of Lincoln entries, registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects.

9. Effective dates for ownership must appear on the registration papers. Required ownership dates are printed in the specie sections.
10. Double registered animals will be allowed entry in only one breed show.
11. This division will be governed by rules and specifications set forth in the National Breed Associations unless otherwise specified (ex. Chianina must be 3/4% or higher to show as purebred).
12. A *Registration Paper or Certificate of Eligibility* is required for all steer, wether, and barrow entries. Exhibitor shall have a registration paper or certificate attested by the Secretary of a recognized National Breed Association or a 'Certificate of Registry' for each animal indicating that the animal entered is purebred and giving registry numbers of sire and dam. Certificates must be presented at time of check-in to complete entry. There will be no exceptions to this rule and failure to comply will disqualify the animal.

Special Note: In the Land of Lincoln Steer Show, the Champions and Reserve Champions of all breeds may have DNA collected to verify breed characteristics. Any breeder and/or exhibitor found to be in violation will not be awarded Land of Lincoln premiums and/or awards.

Illinois Exhibitor Bred and Owned Livestock Awards Junior Livestock Division Only

As a distinct part of the Land of Lincoln Breeders Awards, in the Junior Livestock Division, the Illinois State Fair also offers Illinois Exhibitor Bred and Owned Livestock Awards for breeding animals in Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goat and Dairy Goat Departments.

ELIGIBILITY

13. All animals must meet the eligibility requirements of the Land of Lincoln Breeders Award for Purebred Registered Livestock as previously stated.
14. Only breeding animals bred and owned under ownership of the Illinois exhibitor, as printed on the registration paper, shall be eligible to participate in such contests and exhibitions.
15. All eligible animals, in order to remain eligible, shall be maintained in the State of Illinois; provided, however, that such animals shall be permitted out of state for a maximum of 90 days for the purpose of showings and exhibitions or embryo transplants.

GOVERNANCE, ENTRY RULES AND ANIMAL REGISTRATION AND OWNERSHIP

16. All previously stated regulations associated with the Land of Lincoln Breeders Award for Purebred Registered Livestock governance, entries, and animal registration and ownership as previously stated apply to the Illinois Exhibitor Bred and Owned Livestock Awards.
17. In all instances, the Division Superintendent and General Livestock Superintendent have the right and authority to interpret the rules and proceedings of the shows associated with the Illinois Exhibitor Bred and Owned Livestock Awards program.

AWARDS

18. Champion Rosettes may be awarded to the highest placing, eligible purebred breeding animal of each of the Junior Livestock Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goat and Dairy Goat Department shows.
19. A single Illinois Exhibitor Bred and Owned Livestock Award banner will be awarded to the highest placing, eligible purebred breeding animal of each of the Junior Livestock Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goat and Dairy Goat Department shows.

Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeder's Association Scholarship

A scholarship will be awarded to a student or students between the ages of 17 and 20 years old by January 1 of the application year and furthering their education in an agriculture or related field of study. Applicants and/or their family need to be members of the Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeder's Association and involved in purebred livestock. The eligible purebred livestock are beef, dairy, goats, horses, llamas, sheep and swine as listed in the Illinois State Fair Premium Books.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Junior Livestock Division gives boys and girls of the Illinois FFA and University of Illinois Extension 4-H programs an opportunity to take part in the Illinois State Fair. Livestock Shows are provided in which 4-H and FFA members may exhibit the animals they have raised in their project work and demonstrate their knowledge and skills associated with the livestock industry and showmanship. Participation will be *educational* for every boy and girl who attends.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the Junior Livestock Division is to provide the youth participants the opportunity to accomplish the following objectives:

1. Participate in a quality educational experience through interaction with experts in a given project field, as well as fellow exhibitors.
2. Exhibit the livestock and showmanship skills associated with their project work.
3. Showcase the talents of individual participants.
4. Showcase the educational benefits of the 4-H and FFA programs.
5. Showcase Illinois Livestock and Illinois Agriculture.

HEADQUARTERS

The General Livestock Office will be near the milking parlor at the northeast corner of the lower level of Building #30, also called the Junior Livestock Barn. Headquarters for the 4-H Exhibit Division will be at the Orr Building on the West side of the fairgrounds. Mail should be addressed in care of Junior Division, Illinois State Fair, P. O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY RULES

The following Illinois youth are eligible to show in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair:

1. Any boy or girl, who during the year has conducted a supervised 4-H or FFA program, with records kept therein, may enter the Junior Livestock Division. A minimum age of 8 as **SEPTEMBER 1, 2021** is required to participate in the State Fair Junior Livestock Division.
2. Programs may be done under the supervision of:
 - A. 4-H leaders or Extension staff members
 - B. Teachers of Vocational Agriculture

3. Illinois 4-H members exhibiting in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair *must* be active 4-H club members, as verified by the County Extension Office, and at least 8 but not yet 18 years of age on September 1, 2021. Active Illinois FFA members, as verified by local Teachers of Vocational Agriculture, may participate.
4. Individuals previously enrolled in Illinois 4-H or FFA programs and under 21 years of age as of September 1, 2021, may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair *provided they are active FFA members* as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following options:
 - A. Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter;
 - B. Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a post-secondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or
 - C. Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter. FFA members must not have reached their 21st birthday as of September 2021.

A WORD TO PARENTS, LEADERS and TEACHERS

The Management of the Fair realizes the necessity of proper supervision of the activities of the young people participating in the Junior Livestock Division. Those in charge of the activities of this department have been selected because of their experience in working with young people. However, parents and leaders should be aware of conditions on the Fairgrounds and make provisions for adequate care and supervision of exhibitors.

TRUCK PARKING

Unless properly permitted, no stock truck or trailer parking will be permitted in Lot 1 west of the Junior Livestock Barn at any time from August 11-21, 2022. All livestock trailers must be parked in the half-mile track. Upon unloading, dump any excess manure from trailers into manure pits that are placed around Junior Livestock Barn.

Special Note: No vehicles may be parked in the half-mile track and no livestock trailers may be parked in tie-out areas. Vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

PREMISES REGISTRATION NUMBER VOLUNTARY

Premises Registration is voluntary to exhibit livestock (beef, dairy, horses, swine, sheep, goats, poultry and rabbits) at the Illinois State Fair.

Choosing to register your premises puts you on the frontline of controlling and preventing the spread of animal disease. A disease outbreak can't be predicted but it can impact every segment of animal agriculture. Participation ensures that you have the information you need, when you need it most, to protect your animals and your investment. Registering a premise involves obtaining a seven-character alpha-numeric "identifier" for the farm, ranch, veterinary clinic or other site where livestock or fowl are handled, housed, managed or processed.

If an exhibitor wants to register their animals an application form can be found on-line at www.agr.state.il.us/premiseid. Exhibitors who register on-line will receive a premise registration number immediately. An application can also be obtained by calling 866/299-9256. If completing application and returning by mail, it may take up to four (4) weeks to receive the number.

FILING A PROTEST

If another exhibitor or any member of the public has reason to believe that an animal should be disqualified, he/she must contact the appropriate Department Superintendent and/or State Fair officials and file a protest presenting his/her evidence in writing. Such protest and evidence must be filed after official check-in of the animal of protest or within forty-eight hours after the respective show. If, after reviewing the evidence, the State Fair disqualifies the animal and disqualified exhibitor requests an administrative hearing, the complaining person shall be required to testify under oath at the hearing and present his/her evidence. If the complaining person refuses to testify or cannot be found to be served with a subpoena, no disqualification will be made on the basis of that complaining person's evidence.

GENERAL RULES

for Junior Livestock Division Exhibits

ENTRY RULES, FEES AND INFORMATION

1. No employee (includes full-time, part-time, and/or contractual employees) of the Illinois State Fair or member of his/her Immediate Family is allowed to own or exhibit any animals and/or articles in any competitive event in which he/she is employed as a judge or superintendent. (Immediate Family is defined as the spouse, children, step-children, parents or step-parents, brothers, sisters, step-brothers or step-sisters.)
2. By submitting an Illinois State Fair Entry Form, Exhibitors agree to all terms and conditions in this premium book and all other laws including the *Humane Care for Animals Act*.
3. All Junior Livestock Division entries must be made on specie-specific entry forms provided for the Junior Exhibitors. Entry forms may be secured through the State Fair Entry Department at 217/782-0786 or the State Fair website www.illinoisstatefair.info. **Entry forms may be submitted directly to the State Fair Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794-9427.**
4. All exhibitors must sign the condition of entry on their entry form regarding Ethical Care and Exhibiting of Animals.
5. Entry forms must be completely filled out with class numbers for both the Junior Classes and Land of Lincoln Classes, if applicable and appropriate. If entry is for Junior Class only, the Land of Lincoln class number column should be left blank. All animals must be shown in Junior classes to be eligible for Land of Lincoln classes.
6. Gilt and Barrow ear notches and breed must appear on swine entry form in order to show.
7. All entries for the Beef, Dairy, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Swine and Goat Shows must be postmarked by July 1, 2022. Local Extension Offices may set earlier deadlines for submission due to local staff schedules.
8. Incomplete, faxed or emailed entries will not be allowed in the Junior Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair.
9. ***Absolutely no late entries will be accepted.***
10. ***The State Fair Management reserves the right to reject any entry***
11. Junior Exhibitors desiring to make Open Show entries MUST make entries on Official Open Class Livestock Entry Forms.
12. Entry fees for the Junior Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair are as follows:

13. Checks should be made payable to the *Illinois State Fair* and must be attached to all entry forms.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION AND OWNERSHIP

14. Registration papers issued by respective breed associations will be required in all purebred classes. Registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members (considered to be individuals living in the same household) including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects. Original registration papers, copies and electronic papers will all be accepted.
15. Double registered animals will be allowed entry in only one breed show.
16. Effective dates for ownership must appear on the registration papers. Required ownership dates are printed in the specie sections.
17. All animals, except horses and ponies, must be the property of the member exhibiting them and will be subject to periodic and random checks for identification (tattoo, ear notch, etc.) and compliance with class rules.
18. Market animals that have been a part of the member's project during the required ownership period and have been sold for future delivery through an authorized County 4-H or a Sectional FFA auction may be exhibited by the member in the Junior Livestock Division.
19. Horses and ponies must be owned or leased by the member and must be part of the member's project. By June 1 of the exhibit year, exhibitors will place on file at the local Extension Office or school (FFA), copies of ownership and/or lease papers for all animals that the member may plan to exhibit at the State Junior Horse Show. In addition to the ownership/lease papers, two (2) colored photos (one of each side) of each animal must also be placed on file to show proof of the specific exhibit animal. This will be mandatory for all horses and ponies, grade and registered animals. By June 20, local Extension Offices will forward this paperwork to the Competitive Events Office at the Illinois State Fair for entry verification.
20. Each exhibitor must have kept accurate records and reports of feeds, weight, gains and methods of handling animals in connection with their livestock project.

ARRIVAL, PENNING/STALLING, CHECK-IN, SHOWING AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS

21. All livestock exhibited in the Junior Division must meet the *Illinois Exhibition Animal Health Requirements* of the Illinois State Fair as previously identified. Health papers must be stamped by the State Veterinarian or designee on the grounds and must be presented when obtaining exhibitor numbers at check-in.
22. Time of Arrival: The Junior Livestock Division officially opens Tuesday, August 9 at 8:00 am. No animals will be penned or stalled before 8:00 am on Tuesday, August 9. Any animals in the building before that time may be moved according to Superintendent's instruction.
23. All pens and stalls are to be assigned by the superintendent or his/her assistants. Insofar as possible, county and school groups will be stalled or penned as a group. Animals must be stalled or penned according to these assignments.
24. Junior Division Exhibitors must stall their animals in the designated Junior Division space, unless full and otherwise directed and assigned by the respective specie Superintendent.
25. Unless otherwise directed by the Beef Superintendent, all steers in the Junior

- Division must be stalled and penned in the Junior Barn to collect premiums.
26. All animals housed in the Junior Barn must be eligible to be shown in Junior Division Classes, except for Dairy Cattle during the second week of the fair.
 27. All animals housed in the Junior Livestock Barn may be taken to the Open Division Barns and Livestock Center for exhibit only. Except for Dairy Cattle during the second week of the fair, no Junior Division animals may be left in the Open Division Barns overnight without the permission of the Superintendent.
 28. The State Fair Management encourages the displaying of county and school exhibit signs. Such signs, if displayed, must not exceed six feet in length and three feet in width. No commercial product or service advertising, other than the home, farm, or breed of the entrant shall be allowed on stalls, pens, hurdles, or in the show arena. Decorative lights and painting of any portion of State Fair facilities are prohibited.
 29. Practice scales will be provided by the Illinois State Fair for classes determined by weight. No scales other than those authorized by the Illinois State Fair in writing shall be allowed on the State Fairgrounds. Exhibitors found to have scales of any type on the grounds will be disqualified.
 30. Junior exhibitors of livestock must personally care for their animals or exhibit during the entire fair and must assume responsibility for having their animals available at the time of Junior Division judging.
 31. All animals must be exhibited in the show/judging rings by the owners unless exempted in advance by the Department Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict. In order for an exemption to be considered, a letter of request must be provided to the Department Superintendent no later than the time of animal check-in. The request must name the person, who must be a current exhibitor in the same Junior Livestock Show, who will show the animal(s).
 32. If an exhibitor shows two entries in a given class, becomes ill or injured while at the fair in a manner that would preclude exhibiting, or is exhibiting two species in the Junior Division showing at the same time, thereby creating a conflict, he/she may secure the aid of another Junior Livestock Division exhibitor in showing his/her animals, providing permission is received from the Department Superintendent.
 33. Animals shown in Showmanship Classes, regardless of the Livestock Department, must 1) be owned by the exhibitor in accordance with the prescribed ownership rules of the Illinois State Fair Junior Livestock Division, and 2) have been or will be shown in a specific market or breeding stock class by the exhibitor in the Illinois State Fair Junior Livestock Division. Further, if an exhibitor wins a showmanship class leading to a championship competition, the animal shown in the championship competition must be the same animal that was shown in the original showmanship class.
 34. Each exhibitor will be furnished ring cards showing the exhibitor number which must be worn in the show ring when animals are shown. Ear tags will be used for steer exhibitor identification. Exhibitor numbers are to be secured from the Superintendent of the Department at the designated time of check-in. To secure ring cards at check-in, each exhibitor (except in the Horse Department) must

present:

- A. Health Certificate of Veterinary Inspection approved by the State Veterinarian and showing animals comply with Illinois Exhibition Animal Health Requirements.
 - B. A certificate of eligibility or a certificate of registry, signed by the Secretary of the National Breed Association, indicating the animal exhibited is purebred and giving registry numbers of the sire and dam for all purebred Land of Lincoln classes.
35. Market class breaks will be made at the sole discretion of the Department Superintendent. Further, the Department Superintendent shall have complete discretion in determining specific breed division and assignments to allow for efficient show management, including the addition of an AOB class. If there are not at least three (3) different exhibitors and six (6) animals in any given livestock breed, the breed show may be eliminated with those animals assigned to show in an AOB class.

This rule **shall not** be interpreted to indicate any breed not listed in the fairbook as a current recognized/designated breed under a given show will be added as a breed to the show if at least three (3) different exhibitors and six (6) animals in any given livestock breed are entered and present at the fair. Breeds **will not** be added to a show if they are not listed in this year's fairbook as a current recognized/designated breed under a given show. Breeds **may potentially** be added to a future fair in accordance with the following rule.

36. Exhibitors/Breed Associations wishing to add new, previously un-designated breeds, to the standard departmental shows at the Illinois State Fair may be provided the opportunity to exhibit club or breed association shows as separate events at the fair, providing the Department Superintendent and General Livestock Superintendent are supportive and it is determined that such exhibitions can be accommodated in the facilities and schedule of the State Fair. In order for a new, previously un-designated breed to be added to standard departmental shows, it must be demonstrated, through a minimum of three (3) years of club or breed show exhibitions at the State Fair, the new breed can offer and sustain minimum required numbers of exhibitors and animals for future fairs.
37. Animals will be released in accordance with the schedules listed for a given Livestock Department. In all instances, exhibitors must obtain a signed release form from an authorized Superintendent and have the approved release form available for inspection by security at fair gates.
38. Animals may be released prior to the published release dates and times if, at the discretion of the Department Superintendent, an early release is warranted to preserve and protect the health and welfare of animals and exhibitors.
39. Understanding that the Illinois State Fair provides a showcase for the Illinois Livestock Industry and an opportunity for exhibitors and visitors alike to view the best livestock Illinois has to offer and learn more about responsible animal husbandry and its significance in quality food production, it is important for animals to remain at the fair for the prescribed exposition period. Exhibitors who remove their animals prior to the published release dates and times may be subject to forfeiture of all placings, awards and premiums.

GOVERNOR'S SALE OF CHAMPIONS

40. The following animals will be sold at the Governor's Sale of Champions Auction on Tuesday, August 16, 4:30 pm:
- A. Grand Champion Steer, Barrow, Market Lamb, Meat Goat Wether, Poultry Meat Pen and Rabbit Meat Pen
 - B. Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Steer, Barrow, Market Lamb, and Meat Goat Wether.

If the Land of Lincoln Grand Champion and the Grand Champion are the same, only that one animal will be sold.

41. Immediately upon being designated Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals, as identified in 40A and B above, urine samples will be collected from the designated Grand and Reserve Grand Champions by the State Fair Veterinarian. During sample collection **only the exhibitor and one (1) parent** will be allowed in the sampling area. Further, the exhibitor may decide to hold the sampling cup, have the present parent or a State Fair Vet do so while a urine sample is collected.
42. Animals sold in the Governor's Sale of Champions will be marked as the official Junior Grand Champions and the Junior Land of Lincoln Grand Champions of the Illinois State Fair.
43. The total sale price for the Grand Champion animals will be divided on the following basis:
- 50% to the owner/exhibitor of the animal sold;
 - 15% to the owner/exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion;
 - 15% divided evenly among the breed/weight class champions;
 - 10% in the name of buyer(s) to the Illinois 4-H Foundation; and
 - 10% in the name of buyer(s) to the Illinois FFA Foundation.
44. The total sale price for the Land of Lincoln Grand Champion animals will be divided on the following basis:
- 50% to the owner/exhibitor of the animal sold;
 - 12.5% to the owner/exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion;
 - 12.5% divided evenly among the breed/weight class champions;
 - 10% in the name of buyer(s) to the Illinois 4-H Foundation;
 - 10% in the name of buyer(s) to the Illinois FFA Foundation; and
 - 5% to the Land of Lincoln Purebred Breeder's Association.
45. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champions and the Land of Lincoln Grand and Reserve Grand Champions must be placed on exhibit in the Hall of Champions beginning Sunday afternoon, August 14. Animals sold in the Governor's Sale of Champions must remain in the Hall of Champions until 4:00 pm, Sunday, August 21. Reserve Grand Champions not sold in the Governor's Sale of Champions will be released after the sale on Tuesday, August 16. Exhibitors of animals in the Hall of Champions must provide all needed feed, water, bedding, etc. and be responsible for the animal. The exhibitors must remain with the animals in the Hall of Champions from 7:00 am - 7:00 pm. If the animal is removed from exhibition prior to release time, premiums and sale price will be withheld.

46. Ownership of animals passes from the 4-H and FFA Exhibitors or their families to the Illinois State Fair and auction purchasers when the Illinois State Fair takes possession of the animal exhibits for harvesting. All 4-H and FFA animal carcasses will remain under the jurisdiction of the Illinois State Fair until such time as all carcass examinations, tissue testing, and/or any other required testing as determined by the State Fair officials have been completed.
47. The Grand Champions and Land of Lincoln Grand Champions Steer, Barrow, Market Lamb and Meat Goat Wether will be harvested on Monday, August 22, 2022 and tested as provided in this premium book.

ADDITIONAL EXPECTATIONS

48. Absolutely no alcohol is allowed in the Junior Livestock Barn or in any area of Junior Exhibits housed in Open Barns.
49. When dogs are in the Junior Livestock building, they must be on a leash.
50. Due to limited storage space in and around livestock buildings on the fairgrounds, exhibitors will only be allowed to bring a reasonable amount of feed and bedding with them.
51. As a service to exhibitors, the State Fair Management contracts with reputable entities to supply livestock feed, bedding and some miscellaneous livestock supplies. Feeds will be of good quality with prices on a level with the area retail market. Feed, bedding and supplies purchased shall be on a cash basis and all bills must be paid with a receipt provided prior to animals being released. As a special service on the fairgrounds, bedding and feed can be delivered to assigned stalls and pens prior to arrival if exhibitors phone or write to: Feed Store, Illinois State Fairgrounds, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794; Phone 217-523-5400; FAX 217-882-2128; or Email www.evansfeed@gmail.com
52. Campers must be parked in the campground area. Unless specifically authorized, no campers will be allowed to park around livestock buildings.
53. There will be no wheelbarrows furnished by the Illinois State Fair for use by exhibitors.
54. Equipment left on the fairgrounds over thirty (30) days after the closing date of the State Fair is subject to removal at the discretion of the State Fair Management.
55. Care will be exercised to prevent accident or damage of any kind to people, animals or property, but the State Fair Management will not assume any liability for such.

AWARDS AND PREMIUMS

56. Awards will be made by the single judge system, unless in the judgement of the Department Superintendent more judges are needed. Judges will report to the Department Superintendent at the respective office by 8:00 am on the day fixed for awarding placings on the classes he/she is to judge. No person will act as judge in any class in which he/she may be an interested exhibitor, agent or employee of an exhibitor, or otherwise invested. If such circumstances are discovered by the Department Superintendent, the Superintendent may remove such judge and substitute another temporarily. In case an officially appointed judge is not present, the Department Superintendent has the privilege and

- authority to appoint a capable judge, providing he/she is not a State Fair Official or an exhibitor in the show or breed he/she will be judging.
57. No animal deemed unworthy will be allowed into a class for judging or awarded a premium.
 58. Objections to any person serving as a judge must be submitted to the Department Superintendent in writing, providing good and sufficient reasons, prior to the judge in question making any award in a given show. In all cases, the State Fair Management, in consultation with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full power and authority to act.
 59. The Superintendent of each Livestock Department shall instruct the Clerk to check the entries, as shown in the Entry Book, with the exhibits present and mark the Entry Books to show what animals were shown and passed upon by the Judge. The Department Superintendent will see to it the Entry Books, recorded properly with placings, awards and premiums and properly signed and certified by the appointed Judge and Clerk, and then known as the Judge's Books are returned as soon as a show is completed. Payment of premiums can only be authorized upon entries and associated placings and awards contained within the completed, returned and certified Judge's Books.
 60. Judge's Books only will be used as evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons/rosettes will not serve as evidence. Judge's Books will be supported by completed and certified Judge's Cards and Department Superintendent records completed in the showing at the time of judging.
 61. Premiums will be paid as rapidly as possible after the last day of the State Fair.
 62. Errors in premium statements will be corrected until November 1 following the fair, after which time the books will be closed and incorrect premiums forfeited.
 63. In all Livestock Departments, including poultry and rabbits, exhibitors are limited to two premiums in single classes and one premium in group classes, in both Junior and Land of Lincoln shows.
 64. All special premiums and/or awards will be paid or presented by designated associations or donors offering the same and the State Fair is in no way responsible for the payment or extension of such special prizes.
 65. No premium will be awarded to any animal or group of animals for the purpose of advertising any commodity.
 66. The Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the Livestock Premium Book.
 67. Ribbons and trophies will be presented to exhibitors at the time of judging and the State Fair will not be responsible for loss or the issuing of replacements.
 68. Champion classes are limited to first place animals, except reserve champions where the second place animal from the class in which the champion was selected may compete.

Section 6.

Superior Young Producer Awards

General Livestock (Beef Cattle, Sheep and Swine) and Dairy Cattle

PROGRAM ESTABLISHED

The Superior Young Producer Awards (SYPA) were established to create an educational activity at the Illinois State Fair which promotes youth development and personal growth through increased knowledge of the livestock industry and fosters career development.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE

The educational objective of SYPA is to provide youth participants in the Junior Livestock Division a practical experience that will develop their life skills, problem solving abilities and communication techniques.

ELIGIBILITY

1. The SYPA contest is open to any youth 14 years of age or older who are current bona fide Illinois 4-H members conducting project work in the species area for which he/she is entering the SYPA competition. The 4-H age is determined as of January 1, 2022.
2. Participants do not have to be exhibiting animals at the Illinois State Fair in order to participate in the SYPA contest.

ENTRIES

3. Entries are requested prior to the State Fair Junior Shows, but will be accepted up to the start time of the contests.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

4. The SYPA contest will be held during the Illinois State Fair, Springfield, Illinois.
5. The Beef, Sheep and Swine species are combined into a single Division contest to better reflect the National 4-H Livestock Skillathon Contest. The top four (4) contestants in this combined Division will represent Illinois 4-H in the National Livestock Skillathon held in conjunction with the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) held in November in Louisville, Kentucky.

The contests will consist of the following three (3) specific phases:

- Beef, Sheep and Swine: Skillathon, Management Test and Meat Identification and Judging
- Dairy Cattle: Skillathon, Management Test and Live Animal Judging

PHASE DESCRIPTIONS

Skillathon: This will involve a series of learning stations with specific tasks and questions for participants to answer. Participants will rotate from station to station to test their knowledge and abilities in a learn-by-doing atmosphere.

Management Test: A fifty (50) question written test will be given to each participant. Questions will relate to all aspects of management and will challenge their knowledge and recall of related facts.

Live Animal Judging: Classes of four (4) animals each will be placed by the participants based on type, conformation and, in some cases, production information. Participants will be scored on their ability to select quality livestock for the modern production system.

Meat Identification and Judging: Classes of retail cuts of meat will be identified and evaluated.

AWARDS

6. A plaque will be presented to each of the top three (3) placing individuals in the three (3) identified phase competitions for each contest.
7. A maximum of three (3) individual winners of the overall Superior Young Producer Awards will be selected in the Dairy Cattle Division and a total of nine (9) individual winners will be selected in the combined Beef, Sheep and Swine Division. Each identified overall winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship and plaque.
Special Note: The Overall Superior Young Producer Award Plaques are sponsored by the Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeders Association and the Illinois State Fair.
8. The overall SYPA winners will be announced and recognized at an appropriate time during the Illinois State Fair.
9. A participant may receive only one scholarship one time throughout his/her 4-H eligible years. Further, after receiving a scholarship in any of the specie award areas, the eligible 4-H member may participate in other specie award programs in following years but will be eligible to receive phase awards only.
10. In order to receive a scholarship, the 4-H member must pursue studies at an accredited two (2) or four (4) year college, university, certified post- secondary trade school or advanced educational program.
11. Scholarship monies are paid directly by the Illinois 4-H Foundation to the institution where the student is enrolled. No interest will be earned on scholarships.
12. Any unused scholarship money remains in the Superior Young Producer Award Endowment Fund for future recipients if a student has reached his/her twenty-first (21st) birthday as of January 1st and has not claimed or applied the scholarship for purposes of furthering his/her education as previously described.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

HEADQUARTERS

The General Livestock Office will be near the milking parlor at the northeast corner of the lower level of Building #30, also called the Junior Livestock Barn. Mail should be addressed in care of Open Division, Illinois State Fair, P. O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY RULES

The Open Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair is open to all regardless of age or residency. Parental discretion is encouraged when considering the most appropriate age for young children to be caring for and exhibiting livestock in the Open Division of the State Fair. Further, parents should be aware of conditions on the Fairgrounds and make provisions for adequate care and supervision of young children.

TRUCK PARKING

Unless properly permitted, no stock truck or trailer parking will be permitted in any general parking lot at any time from August 11-21, 2022. All livestock trailers must be parked in the half-mile track. Upon unloading, dump any excess manure from trailers into manure pits that are placed around the Livestock Barns.

Special Note: No vehicles may be parked in the half-mile track and no livestock trailers may be parked in tie-out areas. Vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

PREMISES REGISTRATION NUMBER VOLUNTARY

Premises Registration is voluntary to exhibit livestock (beef, dairy, horses, swine, sheep, goats, poultry and rabbits) at the Illinois State Fair.

Choosing to register your premises puts you on the frontline of controlling and preventing the spread of animal disease. A disease outbreak can't be predicted but it can impact every segment of animal agriculture. Participation ensures that you have the information you need,

when you need it most, to protect your animals and your investment. Registering a premise involves obtaining a seven-character alpha-numeric “identifier” for the farm, ranch, veterinary clinic or other site where livestock or fowl are handled, housed, managed or processed.

If an exhibitor wants to register their animals an application form can be found on-line at www.agr.state.il.us/premiseid. Exhibitors who register on-line will receive a premise registration number immediately. An application can also be obtained by calling 866/299-9256. If completing application and returning by mail, it may take up to four (4) weeks to receive the number.

FILING A PROTEST

If another exhibitor or any member of the public has reason to believe that an animal should be disqualified, he/she must contact the appropriate Department Superintendent and/or State Fair officials and file a protest presenting his/her evidence in writing. Such protest and evidence must be filed after official check-in of the animal of protest or within forty-eight hours after the respective show. If, after reviewing the evidence, the State Fair disqualifies the animal and disqualified exhibitor requests an administrative hearing, the complaining person shall be required to testify under oath at the hearing and present his/her evidence. If the complaining person refuses to testify or cannot be found to be served with a subpoena, no disqualification will be made on the basis of that complaining person’s evidence.

Open Livestock Division Exhibits

ENTRY RULES, FEES AND INFORMATION

1. No employee (includes full-time, part-time, and/or contractual employees) of the Illinois State Fair or member of his/her Immediate Family is allowed to own or exhibit any animals and/or articles in any competitive event in which he/she is employed as a judge or superintendent. (Immediate Family is defined as the spouse, children, step-children, parents or step-parents, brothers, sisters, step-brothers or step-sisters.)
2. By submitting an Illinois State Fair Entry Form, Exhibitors agree to all terms and conditions in this premium book and all other laws including the *Humane Care for Animals Act*. All exhibitors must sign the condition of entry on their entry form regarding Ethical Care and Exhibiting of Animals.
3. Entry forms may be secured through the State Fair Entry Department at 217/782-0786 or the State Fair website www.illinoisstatefair.info. **Entry forms may be submitted directly to the State Fair Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794-9427.**
4. All Open Livestock Division entries must be made on specie-specific Official Livestock Entry Forms provided for the Open Exhibitors. Entries made in different Departments must be made on separate entry forms with only one (1) breed per entry form.
5. Only one (1) exhibitor should be submitted on any one (1) entry form; that is, a separate entry form must be used for each exhibitor. In all cases, an exhibitor is the owner of the animal as evidenced by the name on the registration paper and an exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries per class. Animals owned in partnership must be entered in all classes in the partnership name as it appears on the registration paper. If more than one (1) exhibitor is made on one (1) entry form, such entry will not be accepted.
6. Fitting Companies or persons making entries for other individual owners must list the name of the animal and the name of the person or partnership identified as the owner on the registration paper.
7. Group entries must be made from animals entered and shown in single classes and must be the same owner as single entries unless otherwise stated in breed classification. Additionally, group entries are limited to one (1) entry per exhibitor. Further, partnership animals cannot be combined for group classes, including family partnership, unless otherwise stated in breed classification.
8. Entries must state the name and registration number of the animals to be exhibited; name, address and social security number of the owner (exhibitor); and name and address of breeder as it appears on the original registration paper issued by the respective national breed association.
9. Entry forms must be completely filled out with class numbers for both the Open Classes and Land of Lincoln Classes, if applicable and appropriate. If entry is for Open Class only, the Land of Lincoln class number column should be left blank. All animals must be shown in Open classes to be eligible for Land of Lincoln classes.
10. Entries should include the number of pens and stalls requested.

11. All entries for Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Swine and Goat Shows must be postmarked by July 1, 2022. Poultry and Rabbit Show entries must be postmarked by July 11, 2022. All Entry Fees must accompany entries. Substitutions may be made within the same class number of a Department until 4:00 pm July 26, 2022 unless stated otherwise in specific specie rules.
12. Incomplete, faxed or emailed entries will not be allowed in the Open Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair.
13. Late entries will be accepted with a late entry fee of \$50.00 per head through July 26, 2022. Positively no entries will be accepted postmarked after July 26, 2022.
- 14. State Fair Management reserves the right to reject any entry.**
15. Exhibits that have been erroneously entered may, at the discretion of the Department Superintendent, be transferred to or from a class and put into the proper class prior to judging. If classes have already been judged, those classes will not be re-opened and ineligible or late entries into the showing will be disqualified.
16. Entry fees for the Open Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair are as follows:

A. BEEF CATTLE.....	\$20.00 PER HEAD
B. DAIRY CATTLE.....	\$15.00 PER HEAD
C. SWINE.....	\$10.00 PER HEAD
D. SHEEP.....	\$10.00 PER HEAD

G. RABBITS.....	\$2.00 PER HEAD
17. Checks should be made payable to the Illinois State Fair and must be attached to all entry forms. ***There will be no refunds of Entry Fees under any circumstances.***

ANIMAL REGISTRATION AND OWNERSHIP

18. Registration papers issued by respective breed associations will be required in all purebred classes. Registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or partnership in which the exhibitor is a partner. Original registration papers, copies and electronic papers will all be accepted.
19. Original registration papers only must be available to the Department Superintendent at weigh-in/check-in and when checking ear markings, tattoos, or other identification. In extreme emergencies, a copy of the registration paper faxed from the respective National Breed Association *directly to the Illinois State Fair Entry Department, 217-782-8362*, when accompanied by a cover letter will be accepted. Breeders with market animals must have papers or faxed copy from the National Breed Association two (2) hours prior to the start of weigh-in and those with breeding stock must have papers or faxed copy from the National Breed Association two (2) hours prior to check-in. Litter papers for open breeding swine will be accepted only if the pigs have individual registration numbers included on the litter papers; no exceptions.
20. The name of the exhibitor, as signed on the entry blank, must correspond and be the same name as on the breed registration papers and all animals must be so registered and transferred in the name of the exhibitor or partnership at least thirty (30) days prior to the opening day of the State Fair.
21. For purposes of distinguishing the breeder, the owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the exhibited animal.
22. Double registered animals will be allowed entry in only one breed show.
23. Effective dates for ownership must appear on the registration papers. Required

ownership dates are printed in the specie sections.

ARRIVAL, PENNING/STALLING, CHECK-IN, SHOWING AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS

24. All livestock exhibited in the Open Division must meet the Illinois Exhibition Animal Health Requirements of the Illinois State Fair as previously identified. Health papers must be stamped by the State Veterinarian or designee on the grounds and must be presented when obtaining exhibitor numbers at check-in.
25. Time of arrival, showing and release of animals is identified in the previous Open Livestock Schedule and also printed in the specie sections. Any animals in barns prior to identified arrival times may be moved according to Superintendent's instruction.
26. All pens and stalls are to be assigned by the superintendent or his/her assistants. Animals must be stalled or penned according to these assignments.
27. The State Fair Management encourages the displaying of farm exhibit signs. Such signs, if displayed, must not exceed six feet in length and three feet in width. No commercial product or service advertising, other than the home, farm, or breed of the entrant shall be allowed on stalls, pens, hurdles, or in the show arena. Decorative lights and painting of any portion of State Fair facilities are prohibited.
29. Practice scales will be provided by the Illinois State Fair for classes determined by weight. No scales other than those authorized by the Illinois State Fair in writing shall be allowed on the State Fairgrounds. Exhibitors found to have scales of any type on the grounds will be disqualified.
30. All stock exhibited in breeding classes must be in breeding condition. All male animals shown in any breeding class must be entire and no animals shall be shown which are affected with any chronic disease, deformity or serious imperfection.
31. In most Departments, exhibitors will be furnished ring cards showing the exhibitor number which must be worn in the show ring when animals are shown. Ear tags will be used for steer exhibitor identification and paint numbers will be used for gilts and boars in the Open Swine Show. Exhibitor numbers are to be secured from the Superintendent of the Department at the designated time of check-in. To secure ring cards at check-in, each exhibitor (except in the Horse Department) must present:
 - A. Health Certificate of Veterinary Inspection approved by the State Veterinarian and showing animals comply with Illinois Exhibition Animal Health Requirements.
 - B. A certificate of eligibility or a certificate of registry, signed by the Secretary of the National Breed Association, indicating the animal exhibited is purebred and giving registry numbers of the sire and dam for all purebred Land of Lincoln classes.
32. Market class breaks will be made at the sole discretion of the Department Superintendent. Further, the Department Superintendent shall have complete discretion in determining specific breed division and assignments to allow for efficient show management, including the addition of an AOB class. If there are not at least four (4) different exhibitors and twenty-five (25) animals in any given livestock breed, the breed show may be eliminated, with those animals assigned to show in an AOB class.
33. The State Fair reserves the right to cancel any class where there are less than four (4) entries which are the property of different owners. The State Fair also reserves the right to combine or divide any class or classes should the best interests of the show warrant such.
34. When any breed of livestock drops below four (4) different exhibitors and twenty-five (25) animals, the State Fair Management has the authority, at its sole discretion, to eliminate the breed show classification for the following year(s). In such cases and in

order to regain the breed classification for future fairs, the exhibitors/Breed Association must present satisfactory evidence to the state fair management that they will have a show of the required number and quality in keeping with state fair standards.

35. Exhibitors/Breed Associations wishing to add new, previously un-designated breeds, to the standard departmental shows at the Illinois State Fair may be provided the opportunity to exhibit club or breed association shows as separate events at the fair, providing the Department Superintendent and General Livestock Superintendent are supportive and it is determined that such exhibitions can be accommodated in the facilities and schedule of the State Fair. In order for a new, previously un-designated breed to be added to standard departmental shows, it must be demonstrated, through a minimum of three years of club or breed show exhibitions at the State Fair, the new breed can offer and sustain minimum required numbers of exhibitors and animals for future fairs.
36. Animals should not be decorated or adorned with any unnecessary trappings during showing in the ring before the evaluating judge.
37. Animals will be released in accordance with the schedules listed for a given Livestock Department. In all instances, exhibitors must obtain a signed release form from an authorized Superintendent and have the approved release form available for inspection by security at fair gates.
38. Animals may be released prior to the published release dates and times if, at the discretion of the Department Superintendent, an early release is warranted to preserve and protect the health and welfare of animals and exhibitors.
39. Understanding that the Illinois State Fair provides a showcase for the Illinois Livestock Industry and an opportunity for exhibitors and visitors alike to view the best livestock Illinois has to offer and learn more about responsible animal husbandry and its significance in quality food production, it is important for animals to remain at the fair for the prescribed exposition period. Exhibitors who remove their animals prior to the published release dates and times may be subject to forfeiture of all placings, awards and premiums.

ADDITIONAL EXPECTATIONS

40. Due to limited storage space in and around livestock buildings on the fairgrounds, exhibitors will only be allowed to bring a reasonable amount of feed and bedding with them.
41. As a service to exhibitors, the State Fair Management contracts with reputable entities to supply livestock feed, bedding and some miscellaneous livestock supplies. Feeds will be of good quality with prices on a level with the area retail market. Feed, bedding and supplies purchased shall be on a cash basis and all bills must be paid with a receipt provided prior to animals being released. As a special service on the fairgrounds, bedding and feed can be delivered to assigned stalls and pens prior to arrival if exhibitors call or write to: Feed Store, Illinois State Fairgrounds, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794; Phone 217-523-5400; FAX 217-882-2128; or Email www.evansfeed@gmail.com
42. Absolutely no alcohol is allowed in any area of Junior Exhibits housed in Open Barns.
43. Campers must be parked in the campground area. Unless specifically authorized, no campers will be allowed to park around livestock buildings.
44. When dogs are in Livestock buildings, they must be on a leash.
45. There will be no wheelbarrows furnished by the Illinois State Fair for use by exhibitors.

46. Equipment left on the fairgrounds over thirty (30) days after the closing date of the State Fair is subject to removal at the discretion of the State Fair Management.
47. Care will be exercised to prevent accident or damage of any kind to people, animals or property, but the State Fair Management will not assume any liability for such.

AWARDS AND PREMIUMS

48. Awards will be made by the single judge system, unless in the judgement of the Department Superintendent more judges are needed. Judges will report to the Department Superintendent at the respective office by 8:00 am on the day fixed for awarding placings on the classes he/she is to judge. No person will act as judge in any class in which he/she may be an interested exhibitor, agent or employee of an exhibitor, or otherwise invested. If such circumstances are discovered by the Department Superintendent, the Superintendent may remove such judge and substitute another temporarily. In case an officially appointed judge is not present, the Department Superintendent has the privilege and authority to appoint a capable judge, providing he/she is not a State Fair Official or an exhibitor in the show or breed he/she will be judging.
49. No animal deemed unworthy will be allowed into a class for judging or awarded a premium.
50. Objections to any person serving as a judge must be submitted to the Department Superintendent in writing, providing good and sufficient reasons, prior to the judge in question making any award in a given show. In all cases, the State Fair Management, in consultation with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full power and authority to act.
51. The Superintendent of each Livestock Department shall instruct the Clerk to check the entries, as shown in the *Entry Book*, with the exhibits present and mark the Entry Books to show what animals were shown and passed upon by the Judge. The Department Superintendent will see to it the *Entry Books*, recorded properly with placings, awards and premiums and properly signed and certified by the appointed Judge and Clerk, and then known as the *Judge's Books* are returned as soon as a show is completed. Payment of premiums can only be authorized upon entries and associated placings and awards contained within the completed, returned and certified *Judge's Books*.
52. Judge's Books only will be used as evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons/rosettes will not serve as evidence. Judge's Books will be supported by completed and certified Judge's Cards and Department Superintendent records completed in the showing at the time of judging.
53. Premiums will be paid as rapidly as possible after the last day of the State Fair.
54. Errors in premium statements will be corrected until November 1 following the fair, after which time the books will be closed and incorrect premiums will be forfeited.
55. In all Livestock Departments, including poultry and rabbits, exhibitors are limited to two premiums in single classes and one premium in group classes, in both Open and Land of Lincoln shows.
56. All special premiums and/or awards will be paid or presented by designated associations or donors offering the same and the State Fair is in no way responsible for the payment or extension of such special prizes.
57. No premium will be awarded to any animal or group of animals for the purpose of advertising any commodity.

58. The Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the Livestock Premium Book.
59. Ribbons and trophies will be presented to exhibitors at the time of judging and the State Fair will not be responsible for loss or the issuing of replacements/ duplicates.
60. Champion classes are limited to first place animals, except reserve champions where the second place animal from the class in which the champion was selected may compete.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division as previously stated.
2. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless exempted in advance by Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.
3. Each exhibitor may nominate a total of ten (10) head for the Illinois State Fair Junior Beef Show. Market animals must be born on or after January 1, 2021.
4. Steers must be permanently tattooed, ear tagged, and nominated in the name of the exhibitor by designated personnel on or before February 28, 2022 through the official Illinois 4-H and FFA Market Animal Identification Program. Nomination forms must include the tattoo and tag numbers, the beginning weight and breed or description of the animal.
5. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show check-in and processing requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show. Open Show check-in and processing does not fulfill Jr. Show requirements.
6. Purebred animals must be recorded in their respective National Breed Book as evidenced by official registration papers or certificate of registration. No copies of registration or stamped duplicate of official registration will be accepted.
7. Registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects; that is, since January 1, 2022 for performance cow-calf pairs, February 1, 2022 for steers, and June 1, 2022 for breeding females. Animals

- may not* be cared for or maintained at a professional fitter's premise or facilities.
8. Registered Steers must have a fully healed tattoo that matches the tattoo number on the certificate of registration.
 9. Exhibitors are responsible for having his/her animal's ears clean, knowing where the tattoo is and knowing it can be read by officials at time of entry processing. All ear tags, with the exception of button EID tags and calfhood vaccination tags, will be removed from heifers and steers at check-in.
 10. Steers must be housed/stalled in the Junior Livestock Barn.
 11. Exhibitors *must* use stalls assigned by the Superintendent. No stalls may be bedded and no tack will be allowed on the fairgrounds prior to the identified date stalls are available.
 12. Tie-out space will be assigned by the Superintendent beginning Monday morning. If bedding is placed in tie-out area prior to the fair, the exhibitor will be required to remove it and place it in the assigned tie-out space.
 13. Only one (1) hanging fan per animal will be permitted in the Junior Livestock Barn. No misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units, freezers or similar appliances or cooling systems of any kind will be allowed. Generators and electrical fans or equipment of any kind are *not* allowed in the tie-outs. Any exhibitor's stalls or tie-outs found with any of the above will be immediately disqualified from exhibiting.
 14. Generators will be permitted at the Illinois State Fair Junior Beef Show in and around the Junior Barn *only*. Exhibitors utilizing generators must abide by the following regulations:
 - A. Any electrical cords running from generators must be properly grounded with three-point plug-ins and be suspended above the stall; and
 - B. Counties planning to use generators should contact the Beef Superintendent by August 1st so stalls can be located close to the outside of the Junior Livestock Building.
 - C. Individuals not abiding by the above rules will be excused from the Illinois State Fair Junior Show.
 15. The use of "sides" or awnings on tents used for grooming animals is prohibited.
 16. The Beef Department Junior Show will be governed by rules and specifications set forth by the National Breed Associations, unless otherwise specified. The Superintendent will make decisions concerning interpretation of such rules and regulations and, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
 17. Breeding Female classes will be determined at the end of heifer processing utilizing the futurity system of entry and class division.
 18. Substitute animals will be accepted for breeding heifers. Only steers listed on *original* nomination forms may show in the steer show.
 19. The following grooming rules will be *strictly* enforced and exhibitors found in violation of these rules, either prior to entering the ring or while in the ring, will be immediately removed from the show.
 - A. Dying or artificially changing the color of an animal is prohibited. Coloring agents may only be used up to the hock (knee). Powders are not allowed on any part of the animal. Animals will be given a white towel test as they enter the showing.

- B. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tail heads is prohibited, as is the addition of hair, hemp, or any similar substance to any part of an animal.
 - C. Tail ties are prohibited, as are spiked show halter leads and nose rings for breeding stock or steers.
 - D. Excess adhesive on the legs beyond what is needed to groom the animal's hair is prohibited.
 - E. No aerosols will be permitted in the make-up area. Any aerosol cans in the make-up area, will be confiscated by Department Staff.
20. Any animal displaying repeated unruly behavior will be dismissed from the class at the discretion of the Superintendent.
21. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR STEERS

22. Steers may be purebred or crossbred. However, all steers properly registered with a breed association will be eligible for Land of Lincoln awards provided the animal meets all Land of Lincoln eligibility requirements.
23. Each exhibitor may exhibit a total of six (6) steers; up to four (4) steers in the regular on-foot show and up to two (2) steers in the Premiere Show. Steers in the regular on-foot show may be of different breeds and none of these four (4) steers are required to be entered in the Premiere Show. Exhibitors may enter an additional two (2) head in the Premiere Class. In no case is an exhibitor allowed to show more than a total of six (6) steers.
24. All steers must have been weighed at the time of nomination to establish a beginning weight. Steers must weigh 900 pounds or more to be eligible to show, but there is no minimum average daily gain (ADG) required to show. All steers will have ADG calculated and printed on arm cards for judging purposes.
25. Steers will be shown by weight classes within each breed. Animals will be placed into weight divisions and classes based upon declared weights made at check-in. All class breaks will be at the discretion of the Superintendent. Exhibitors must check posted class assignments and be at the showing with his/her animal when the assigned class is called.
26. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors. At the conclusion of judging for each weight class, the top two (2) placing animals will be re-weighed for weight verification. Any animal that varies more than 5% from the declared weight will be disqualified.
27. Steers will have tattoos checked against the steer nomination form during processing. Exhibitors should bring a copy of the steer nomination form, a fully completed and legibly written entry/check-in card, and, if applicable, Land of Lincoln certificate or registration certificate with them at the time of processing.
28. Each steer will be ear tagged. The ear tag is the official exhibitor number. Land of Lincoln eligible steers will be tagged in the right ear. Non-Land of Lincoln Junior Show entries will be tagged in the left ear.
29. Steers will be identified and tagged during entry processing.
30. Any steer properly nominated on the Premiere Nomination Form is eligible for the Premiere Class.
31. Additional eligibility requirements to show in the various breed steer shows are listed

under specific breed rules.

32. Breeds will be shown in the order posted by the Superintendent. Watch and listen for announcements.
33. In the Land of Lincoln Junior Beef Show, the Champions and Reserve Champions of Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford and Shorthorn may have DNA collected to verify breed characteristics should the Land of Lincoln Purebred Breeders Association Board of Directors so desire. Any breeder and/or exhibitor found to be in violation will *not* be awarded premiums and/or awards.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR BREEDING FEMALES

34. All Beef Females *must* be recorded with a recognized National Breed Association and be in compliance with breed specific bloodline show requirements.
35. Animals from breeds other than those currently identified in the show and, therefore, eligible to participate in All Other Registered Breed (AOB) classes, must provide registration paper or registration certificate from the respective National Breed Association. Bloodline show requirements and/or registration requirements for some of these breeds are as follows:
 - A. Red Poll, 15/16
 - B. Simbrah, recorded
 - C. Gelbvieh, recorded
 - D. Less than ½ Simmental, recorded registration certificate
 - E. South Devon, Land of Lincoln Certificates for Land of Lincoln Premiums
36. Only the Champion AOB Heifer will show for Supreme Champion Heifer.
37. Age requirements for the heifer classes extend from Sept. 1, 2020 to Mar. 31, 2022. All Sr. Females must be confirmed safe in-calf with documentation from veterinarian.
38. Breeds will show in the order posted by the superintendent. Classes within each breed will show from youngest to oldest.
39. Exhibitors will receive an official arm card number for each entry. Land of Lincoln entries will have the arm card stamped. Exhibitors are responsible for double-checking accuracy of class and Land of Lincoln designation and *must* display the appropriate arm card assigned and provided by the Illinois State Fair for each entry.
40. Substitution animals will be accepted at the time of entry processing provided the animal meets all rules and regulations. Once the entry is processed, no changes will be allowed.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR PERFORMANCE COW-CALF

41. Cows must have been owned and cared for by the junior exhibitor since January 1, 2022. Registration papers must indicate effective date of ownership.
42. There will be a Special Award presented to the Grand Champion Young Cow and Grand Champion Aged Cow. Also, the Reserve Champion of each division will be selected and awarded a rosette. The awards are administered and presented by the Cow-Calf Committee of the Illinois Beef Association and the Fred J. and Bev Killam Family.
43. Exhibitors and cows can win the award only once in a lifetime for each Young Cow and Aged Cow Division. Exhibitors and cows can win two (2) awards as long as the awards are presented in the Young Cow and Aged Cow Divisions. Exhibitors and cows cannot win the award in the same division. However, previous winners can compete for *premiums* regardless of previous award winnings.

44. Eligible females must be born before September 1, 2020.
45. All Beef Females *must* be recorded with a National Breed Association. This division will be governed by rules and specifications set forth by the National Breed Associations, unless otherwise specified. Eligibility requirements to show in the various breed and All Other Registered Breeds (AOB) Heifer Show are listed under *Specific Breed Rules*.
46. Previous Performance Cow-Calf exhibitors are required to have performance data/EPD's to qualify for showing. First-time exhibitors may show without performance data/EPD's but are eligible only for *Without Performance Data* premiums and may *not* compete for Grand Champion Cow.
47. Performance documents *must* be provided for Performance Cow-Calf pairs at the time of check-in. Performance Qualification Requirements:
 - A. Two (2) Year Old Cows - Individual EPD's for birth, weaning and yearling weights along with maternal milk as verified by breed association documents.
 - B. Three (3) Year Old Cows and Aged Cows - Past progeny, EPD's for birth, weaning, yearling and maternal milk. Also, cow EPD's for birth weaning, yearling and maternal milk. The progeny and individual information must be verified by breed association documents.
48. A maximum of two (2) entries may be shown. Substitutions can be made in the Performance Cow Division.
49. Breeds will show in the order posted. All Young cow calf pairs will be paraded, by breed, with performance data/EPD's announced and breed champions selected. Breed Champions will compete for the Grand Champion Young Cow-Calf Pair. This will be repeated for the Aged Cow division. The Grand Champion Cow-Calf entry is *not* eligible for Supreme Champion Heifer competition.
50. Cows must show with their most recent natural calf at side. Cows whose most recent calf is a weaned bull are *not* eligible to show in Performance Cow-Calf competition.
51. Age spread for the calf is from August 14 the preceding year for fall born calves and extending up to a calf born just before the current Illinois State Fair.
52. Heifer calves born from January 1 to March 31 of current year are also eligible to show in their breeds (or AOB) heifer show. Registration papers are required on these heifer calves to show in the individual class. Registration papers are not needed on the 2021 born calves to show *only* as part of the cow-calf pair.
53. Entries should be washed, clipped and brushed down. Neither cow nor calf should be groomed; no tail balling, no glue on legs, etc.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR SHOWMANSHIP

54. Exhibitors *must* show their own animal in the showmanship competition and animals shown *must* be entered in the current Illinois State Fair Junior Beef Show.
55. Showmanship participants *must* meet requirements outlined in the *Specific Rules for Steers and Heifers*.

56. There will be five (5) age divisions: Novice, ages 8-9; Intermediate, ages 10-11; Advanced, ages 12-14; Junior, ages 15-17; and Senior, ages 18-21. Each division will be divided into heats/classes. At the conclusion of each heat/class, the judge will select four (4) individuals to return to compete for Division Champion with the division championship held at the conclusion of the last heat/class in each division.
57. Heats/classes will be determined at the sole discretion of the Superintendent and will be posted at the Livestock Center and the General Livestock Office prior to the competition scheduled to start at 1:00 pm on Wednesday, August 10 at the Livestock Center. The official start time will be announced two (2) hours before the start of the competition.
58. The top five (5) individuals will be recognized in each division except for the Senior Division in which the top ten (10) individuals will be recognized. Additionally, the Division Champions will receive a plaque from the Illinois State Fair.
59. Showmen in all Divisions will lead a clean, un-groomed, dry and clipped animal when entering the showing. There should be no tail balling, glue on legs, etc. Judging will be based on:
 - a. Showing of the animal;
 - b. Knowledge of the project; and
 - c. Personal appearance.

SPECIFIC BREED RULES

Angus

60. Eligibility requirement to show is *Purebred* with an American Angus Association registration certificate. Angus registration paper will indicate effective date of ownership. Land of Lincoln certificates are *not* needed and will *not* qualify a steer to show with the Angus.
61. Steers must be free of horns or scurs. Scurs are defined as any portion of horny tissue attached to the skin of hornet of a polled animal.
62. Steers with white skin above the underline or on leg, foot or tail shall *not* be eligible for registration and will be barred from competition.
63. All entries are subject to DNA marker or blood typing for parentage verification at the discretion of American Angus Association.
64. For an exhibitor to be eligible for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, exhibitors are subject to the Association Rules as found in the breeder Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2: Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus Cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. The rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Hereford and Polled Hereford

65. All steers showing at the Illinois State Fair must be registered by the American Hereford Association (AHA) and out of a registered sire and dam. No steer certificates will be accepted, only registration papers. Hereford registration papers will indicate effective date of ownership.
66. All steers *must* have a basic DNA test on file at the AHA. Exhibitors should contact the AHA customer service department by calling 816-842-3757 or by email at records@hereford.org to request a DNA kit for their steer. Exhibitor must be a member of the AHA or NJHA to request a basic DNA test which includes genetic

profile, genetic abnormalities and parent verification, if parent DNA is on file. At the time of check-in, exhibitors will be required to present a registration paper and letter from the AHA stating their steer's basic test DNA profile is on file. Further, all Hereford steers entered for exhibition are subject to additional DNA testing at the discretion of the Illinois Hereford Association.

67. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA profile test to verify breed purity and accuracy of the recorded parentage. Rules detailing DNA profiling of Hereford animals can be found in the AHA Rules and Regulations Handbook at www.hereford.org.

Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus

68. Eligibility requirement to show Shorthorn is 15/16 and higher and Shorthorn Plus 50% to 7/8, as verified by an American Shorthorn Association (ASA) registration certificate. An ASA registration certificate will indicate effective date of ownership.

Simmental

69. Eligibility requirement for steers to show is 1/2 or higher as verified by a Simmental registration certificate. Commercial percent shall not be included as part of Simmental classification percentage. Simmental registration certificate will indicate effective date of ownership.
70. Eligibility requirement for heifers is 7/8 SM or higher and a registration certificate.

Low Percent Simmentals

71. Eligibility requirements for heifers to show is 1/2 SM to less than 7/8 SM and a recorded registration certificate.

Limousin

72. All heifers must be 75% (NALF Percentage, not actual), or greater, as indicated on orange NALF registration certificate or purple-papered Lim-Flex Cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificate. Percentage, full-blood, Purebred and Lim-Flex shall compete in the same classes and championships.

SPECIAL AWARDS

GRAND CHAMPION STEER: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand Champion Steer and the Land of Lincoln Grand Champion Steer of the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior Beef Show. Additionally, the Grand Champion Junior Show Steer and the Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Junior Show Steer will sell at the livestock auction of the 2022 Governor's Sale of Champions.

CHAMPION BEEF SHOWMAN: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the winners of each of the five (5) Showmanship Divisions of the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior Show.

CLEAN STALL AWARDS: Upon decision of the Beef Superintendent, a plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the County with the neatest beef exhibit of the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior Show. The top five (5) counties will be provided the opportunity to process entries in the first thirty (30) minutes of entry processing at the next year's State Fair.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Open Livestock Division as previously stated.
2. Open Show exhibitors *not* entered in the Junior Show are reminded they *must* adhere to the Open Show check-in and processing requirements in order to exhibit in the Open Show. Exhibitors showing in *both* Junior and Open Shows and checked-in through Junior Show processing do *not* have to check-in separately for the Open Show as Junior Show check-in will fulfill Open Show requirements.
3. Purebred animals must be recorded in their respective National Breed Book as evidenced by official registration papers or certificate of registration. Original registration papers *only* must be available to the Superintendent at the time of check-in. In extreme emergencies, a faxed copy of the registration paper from the National Association, accompanied by a cover letter, may *at the sole discretion of the Superintendent* be accepted. Absolutely *no* copies of registration, stamped duplicate of official registration, pending registrations or applied for documentation will be accepted.
4. When entering two (2) or more breeds, exhibitors must use a separate entry blank for each breed.
5. Steers must be permanently tattooed with the tattoo number listed on the entry form. Registered Steers must have a fully healed tattoo that matches the tattoo number on the certificate of registration. Exhibitors are reminded only one (1) owner/exhibitor is allowed per entry form.

6. Exhibitors are responsible for having his/her animal's ears clean, knowing where the tattoo is and knowing it can be read by officials at time of entry processing. All ear tags, with the exception of button EID tags and calfhood vaccination tags, will be removed from steers at check-in.
7. Exhibitors should check with the Superintendent in the Open Beef Cattle Office before making stalls and *must* use stalls assigned by the Superintendent. No stalls may be bedded and no tack will be allowed on the fairgrounds prior to the identified date stalls are available.
8. Tie-out space will be assigned by the Superintendent beginning Monday morning. If bedding is placed in tie-out area prior to the fair, the exhibitor will be required to remove it and place it in the assigned tie-out space.
9. Due to inadequate stalling space, no nurse cows will be allowed.
10. Only one (1) hanging fan per every three (3) animals will be permitted in the Open Barns. Free standing fans, butt fans, misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units or cooling systems of any kind will *not* be allowed. Generators and electrical fans or equipment of any kind are *not* allowed in the tie-outs. Any exhibitor's stalls or tie-outs found with any of the above will be immediately disqualified from exhibiting.
11. The Beef Department Open Show will be governed by rules and specifications set forth by the National Breed Associations, unless otherwise specified. The Superintendent will make decisions concerning interpretation of such rules and regulations and, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
12. In individual classes, the exhibitor is defined as the person whose name appears on the registration paper as the owner. In group classes where the herd is one (1) unit with animals registered in the names of different members of one (1) family residing on one (1) farm, entries may be made under the name of a single exhibitor.
13. Breeding Animal classes will be determined at the end of check-in utilizing the futurity system of entry and class division.
14. Any class of breeding animals with twenty-six (26) or more head will be divided by birthdates into two (2) distinct premium eligible classes.
15. Substitute animals will be accepted for breeding animals up to entry processing/check-in.
16. Each exhibitor may make only one (1) entry in group classes. No group entries will be added/allowed after an exhibitor's animals have been checked-in.
17. The following grooming rules will be *strictly* enforced and exhibitors found in violation of these rules, either prior to entering the ring or while in the ring, will be immediately removed from the show.
 - A. Dying or artificially changing the color of an animal is prohibited. Coloring agents may only be used up to the hock (knee). Powders are not allowed on any part of the animal. Animals will be given a white towel test as they enter the showing.
 - B. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tail heads is prohibited, as is the addition of hair, hemp, or any similar substance to any part of an animal.
 - C. Tail ties are prohibited, as are spiked show halter leads for breeding stock or steers.

- D. Excess adhesive on the legs beyond what is needed to groom the animal's hair is prohibited.
 - E. No aerosols will be permitted in the make-up area. Any aerosol cans in the make-up area, will be confiscated by Department Staff.
18. When on exhibition in the Livestock Center, each animal must be under halter and properly controlled by the exhibitor. Additionally, each exhibitor must wear an arm card corresponding with the number in the official program. If arm card is not visible, exhibitor may not exhibit his/her animal.
 19. Any animal displaying repeated unruly behavior will be dismissed from the class at the discretion of the Superintendent.
 20. Family bred and raised animals entered by Junior Exhibitors in the Junior Show and subsequently entered in the Open Show may be treated as family entries in group classes.
 21. Exhibitors must wait until 7:00 pm to move animals to tie-outs.
 22. Animals must be washed in wash racks. No washing of animals in any barn.
 23. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR STEERS

24. Steers may be purebred or crossbred. However, only steers properly registered with a breed association recognized by the Land of Lincoln Purebred Livestock Breeders Association will be eligible for Land of Lincoln awards provided the animal meets all Land of Lincoln eligibility requirements.
25. Steers *must* weigh 900 pounds or more to be eligible to show.
26. Steers will be shown by weight classes within each breed. Animals will be placed into weight divisions and classes of generally equal numbers of animals based upon declared weights made at check-in and in so far as possible. All class breaks will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
27. Breeds will be shown in the order posted by the Superintendent. Watch and listen for announcements. Exhibitors must check posted class assignments and be at the showing with his/her animal when the assigned class is called.
28. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors.
29. Steers will have tattoos checked during processing. Exhibitors should bring a fully completed and legibly written entry/check-in card, and, if applicable, Land of Lincoln certificate or registration certificate with them at the time of processing. An exhibitor who fails to bring his/her steer to check-in and processing will be disqualified from showing.
30. Each steer will be identified and ear tagged during entry processing. The ear tag is the official exhibitor number. Land of Lincoln eligible steers will be tagged in the right ear. Non-Land of Lincoln Open Show entries will be tagged in the left ear.
31. Any steer properly nominated on the Premiere Nomination Form is eligible for the Premiere Class.
32. Additional eligibility requirements to show in the various breed steer shows are listed under specific breed rules.
33. The management of the fair reserves the right to disqualify any steer for being over age and to move or properly enter any steer not exhibiting specific breed characteristics for the breed classification entered. These requirements will be closely examined by the Superintendent and his/her assistants who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.

34. In the Land of Lincoln Open Beef Show, the Champions and Reserve Champions of Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford and Shorthorn may have DNA collected to verify breed characteristics should the Land of Lincoln Purebred Breeders Association Board of Directors so desire. Any breeder and/or exhibitor found to be in violation will not be awarded premiums and/or awards.

SPECIFIC BREED RULES

Angus

34. Eligibility requirement to show is *Purebred* with an American Angus Association registration certificate. Angus registration paper will indicate effective date of ownership. Land of Lincoln certificates are *not* needed and will *not* qualify a steer to show with the Angus.
35. Steers must be free of horns or scurs. Scurs are defined as any portion of horny tissue attached to the skin of hornet of a polled animal.
36. Steers with white skin above the underline or on leg, foot or tail shall *not* be eligible for registration and will be barred from competition.
37. All entries are subject to DNA marker or blood typing for parentage verification at the discretion of American Angus Association.
38. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty-six (26) classes. Variation of division of numbers per class will be dependent upon age differential. The appointed committee will make official division of classes no later than twenty-four (24) hours after official stalling deadline and not before twelve (12) hours after stalling deadline.
39. For an exhibitor to be eligible for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, exhibitors are subject to the Association Rules as found in the breeder Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2: Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus Cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. The rules can be found at www.angus.org.
40. Authorized representatives of the American Angus Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein, as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Hereford and Polled Hereford

41. All steers showing at the Illinois State Fair must be registered by the American Hereford Association (AHA) and out of a registered sire and dam. No steer certificates will be accepted, only registration papers. Hereford registration papers will indicate effective date of ownership.
42. Exhibitors in Hereford classes are subject to the Association's special rule on class qualification, and any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show.
43. There are separate shows for horned and polled Herefords; therefore, horned or dehorned cattle must show in the horned show while polled and scurred cattle must show in the polled show. Any tampering with scurs will disqualify the animal from competition.
44. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty-six (26) classes. Variation of division of numbers per class will be dependent upon age differential. The appointed committee will make official division of classes no later than twenty-four (24) hours after official stalling

deadline and not before twelve (12) hours after stalling deadline.

45. All steers *must* have a basic DNA test on file at the AHA. Exhibitors should contact the AHA customer service department by calling 816-842-3757 or by email at records@hereford.org to request a DNA kit for their steer. Exhibitor must be a member of the AHA or NJHA to request a basic DNA test which includes genetic profile, genetic abnormalities and parent verification, if parent DNA is on file. At the time of check-in, exhibitors will be required to present a registration paper and letter from the AHA stating their steer's basic test DNA profile is on file. Further, all Hereford steers entered for exhibition are subject to additional DNA testing at the discretion of the Illinois Hereford Association.
46. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA profile test to verify breed purity and accuracy of the recorded parentage. Rules detailing DNA profiling of Hereford animals can be found in the AHA Rules and Regulations Handbook at www.hereford.org.

Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus

47. Eligibility requirement to show Shorthorn is 15/16 and higher and Shorthorn Plus 50% to 7/8, as verified by an American Shorthorn Association (ASA) registration certificate. An ASA registration certificate will indicate effective date of ownership.
48. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.
49. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the ASA. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the ASA and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final.
50. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty-six (26) classes. Variation of division of numbers per class will be dependent upon age differential. The appointed committee will make official division of classes no later than twenty (20) hours after official stalling deadline and not before twelve (12) hours after stalling deadline.

Charolais

51. Eligibility requirement to show is purebred as verified by an American-International Charolais Association (AICA) registration certificate. An AICA registration certificate will indicate effective date of ownership. An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herd Book.
52. Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.
53. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA.
54. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
55. Junior and Senior Bulls must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
56. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification.
57. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.
58. All exhibits of Charolais Breeding Cattle shall be governed by the AICA Rules and

Regulations, Article XV, Exhibitions of Animals. The inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in Article XV, Paragraph C, and consequence of non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in Paragraph D of the same article.

59. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty (20) classes. Variation of division of numbers per class will be dependent upon age differential. The appointed committee will make official division of classes no later than twenty (20) hours after official stalling deadline and not before twelve (12) hours after stalling deadline.

Simmental

60. Eligibility requirement to show for females and bulls is purebred as verified by an official American Simmental Association (ASA) registration certificate. Eligibility requirement for steers to show is 1/2 or higher as verified by an ASA registration certificate. Commercial percent shall not be included as part of Simmental classification percentage. Simmental registration certificate will indicate effective date of ownership.
61. Calves born in 2021 must have a registration paper to verify them.
62. Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
63. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty-six (26) classes.

Low Percent Simmentals

64. Eligibility requirements for females and bulls to show is 1/2 SM to 3/4 SM and a recorded registration certificate with the American Simmental Association (ASA).
65. Calves born in 2021 must have a registration paper to verify them.
66. Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
67. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty-six (26) classes.

Limousin and Limousin Flex

68. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF). Any animal over thirty (30) days of age, including calves to be shown at side of dam, must have proof of a registration certificate and be recorded with the NALF. For ET calves, parentage verification paperwork must be in the NALF system. All animals must be 75% (NALF Percentage, not actual), or greater, as indicated on orange NALF registration certificate or purple-papered Lim-Flex Cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificate. Percentage, full blood, Purebred and Lim-Flex shall compete in same classes and championships.
69. Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
70. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty (20) classes. No class shall contain more than twenty (20) head or have an age spread of more than sixty (60) days unless the animals are over two (2) years old.
71. All bulls over one (1) year of age must show with a nose-lead.
72. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow/calf division are eligible to show as individuals as long as the calf is registered and qualifies as determined by purple registration papers from NALF. All animals shown must be solid red or black above the

flanks, excluding birth marks.

Maine Anjou and Mainetainer

73. All animals must be registered in the American Maine Anjou Association (AMAA) as verified by an official AMAA registration certificate. All Maine Anjou females and bulls must be 75% or greater. Mainetainer females and bulls must be one quarter or greater.
74. Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
75. Animals over seven (7) months of age must be dehorned.
76. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
77. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have had a positive semen test and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
78. Individual classes of both sexes will be divided by an appointed committee as nearly equal as possible with no more than twenty (20) classes. Variation of division of numbers per class will be dependent upon age differential. The appointed committee will make official division of classes no later than twenty (20) hours after official stalling deadline and not before twelve (12) hours after stalling deadline.
79. All bulls twenty (20) months of age and older must show with a nose-lead.
80. Any and all cattle shall be available to have hair pulled for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances, or the presence of alterations. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of blood typing the owner may, at his expense, request the AMAA determine actual parentage. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA herd book.

SPECIAL DEFINITIONS AND RECOGNITIONS

EXHIBITOR DEFINITION IN CERTAIN CLASSES: In individual classes, the exhibitor is defined as the person whose name appears on the registration paper as the owner. In group classes where the herd is one (1) unit with animals registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one (1) farm, entries may be made under the name of a single exhibitor.

COW/CALF: Cow with most recent natural calf no more than 250 days of age at her side. Cow cannot turn more than five (5) years of age in current calendar year. The cow/calf entry is eligible for inclusion in group classes, but will be considered one (1) animal in those classes, except for groups of six (6) animals in which both cow and calf may be counted as individual animals.

PRODUCE OF DAM: Group to consist of two (2) animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one (1) dam. Animals may be owned by more than one (1) exhibitor and must be shown in individual classes.

TWO FEMALES OR PAIR OF FEMALES: Group consists of two (2) female animals of any age bred and owned or co-owned by breeder/exhibitor. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

TWO BULLS: Group consists of two (2) bulls of any age bred and owned or co-owned by breeder/exhibitor. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

SUPER COW CLASS: Cow with two (2) offspring of either sex and any age. Offspring do not need to be owned by the same exhibitor. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

JUNIOR GET OF SIRE: Group to consist of three (3) animals by one (1) sire with both sexes

represented. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

BREEDERS GROUP: Group to consist of three (3) animals with both sexes represented and all with the same breeder's name listed on the registration certificates. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

GET OF SIRE: Group to consist of four (4) animals by one (1) sire with both sexes represented. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

BREEDERS HERD OF FOUR OR BEST FOUR HEAD: Group to consist of four (4) animals, with both sexes represented, owned or co-owned by breeder/exhibitor. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

BREEDERS HERD OF FIVE, GROUP OF FIVE, OR BREEDERS BEST FIVE HEAD: Group to consist of five (5) animals, with both sexes represented, owned or co-owned by breeder/exhibitor. Animals must be shown in individual classes.

BREEDERS SIX HEAD OR BEST SIX HEAD: Group to consist of six (6) animals, with both sexes represented, of which the exhibitor is the breeder and first owner of the animals. Animals may be currently owned by different individuals, as long as the exhibitor was the breeder and first owner as identified on registration certificates. Animals must be shown in individual classes. For purposes of this class only, a cow/calf entry may be considered as two (2) animals.

PREMIERE HERDSMAN AWARD: Upon decision of the Beef Cattle Superintendent, a banner will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the Premiere Herdsman in each breed.

SPECIAL AWARDS

LAND OF LINCOLN GRAND CHAMPION FEMALES AND BULLS: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitor of the Land of Lincoln Show Grand Champion Female and Bull of each Land of Lincoln eligible breed division at the 2022 Illinois State Fair.

2. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless exempted in advance by Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.

3. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show. Open Show registration does not fulfill Jr. Show requirements.
4. All entries in the Junior Swine Show must be properly ear notched. Both ears must be notched and all ear notches must be completely healed and visible. Ear notches will be read on the purebred system. If exhibitor uses another system, he/she must draw a diagram. Any animal whose ears show signs of being tampered with will be disqualified.
5. Original registration papers will be required in all purebred classes. Certificates from breed association representative will not be accepted in lieu of registration papers.
Additionally:
 - A. Registration *must* show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects.
 - B. In extreme emergencies, a faxed copy of the registration paper(s) from the National Association with a cover letter will be accepted two (2) hours before the start of the barrow or breeding stock check-in.
 - C. Ear notch and breed must be on entry form in order for the animal to show. Ear notches will be inspected to determine if they agree with those recorded on the registration papers of the animals exhibited.
 - D. To be eligible to show, all purebred animals *must* meet all requirements for registration in accordance with their respective breed associations. Each breed will need a representative present during check-in to screen animals.
 - E. All of these requirements will be examined by the Superintendent and his/her assistants or appointed committee who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.

6. No boars will be shown in the Junior Swine Show.
7. All pens will be assigned by the Superintendent on the basis of a minimum of two (2) head per pen, unless an exhibitor has only one (1) entry. Animals must be penned according to these assignments. Additional pens, for any reason, will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
Special Note: Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own pen dividers to accommodate individual penning needs. No feed, equipment or show boxes will be allowed in pens.
8. No equipment owned by counties or exhibitors will be allowed to block aisles.
9. No turbo-fans, appliances, misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units or cooling systems, bicycles, skateboards or scooters of any kind will be allowed in the barns.
10. Special awards presented by Breed Associations are the responsibility of those associations and not the Department Superintendent or Illinois State Fair.
11. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR GILTS AND BARROWS

All Gilts

12. All gilts will be penned in the 30 Building/Junior Barn by County.
13. Gilts must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2022 and must have been the property of the exhibitor and a part of his/her project as of June 1, 2022. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership.
14. Gilt exhibitors are not required to have completed PQA (Pork Quality Assurance) Certification.
15. An exhibitor is limited to nominating twenty (20) total ear notches of which four (4) head will be chosen to show. Any exhibitor exceeding this rule will be disqualified from the show.
16. An exhibitor may show up to four (4) gilts with a maximum of two (2) animals in the same class. Gilts may be purebred, crossbred or any combination.
17. Gilts may be pregnancy checked using ultrasound. The Illinois State Fair Junior Gilt Show is restricted to open gilts. Any gilts detected as pregnant will be disqualified.

Purebred Gilts

18. To be eligible to show, all purebred gilts must meet all requirements for registration in accordance with their respective breed associations. A committee of two breed representatives, appointed by the Department Superintendent, will screen all gilts to check registration papers and breed character.
19. Purebred gilt classes will be split equally by total number of gilts checked-in per breed. All class breaks for purebred gilt shows will be at the discretion of Superintendent.

Crossbred Gilts

20. There is no minimum weight for crossbred gilts, but the maximum weight is 375 pounds. Crossbred gilts weighing more than 375 pounds will be disqualified.
21. Crossbred gilt exhibitors *must* complete and submit a check-in card, available from the Superintendent at the State Fair, for each crossbred. The cards must be completely filled out and legibly written providing the exhibitor's full name and address and the class, ear notch and weight of the gilt.
22. Crossbred gilt classes will be placed into weight classes based upon weigh-in weight at check-in. All class breaks for the crossbred gilt show will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.

23. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors. There will be *no* re-weighing at the conclusion of judging for each weight class.
24. Crossbred gilts are eligible for the Grand Champion Gilt competition.

Barrows

25. All barrows will be penned in the Open Swine Barn by County.
26. Barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2022 and must have been the property of the exhibitor and a part of his/her project as of June 1, 2022.
27. Barrows must be completely healed from castration and not show any scabs.
28. Premiere barrow exhibitors (only) *must* have completed the YQCA Quality Assurance Certification and submit his/her certification number at the time of premiere barrow check-in. Direct questions to Dan Jennings at 815-218-4358.
29. An exhibitor is limited to nominating twenty (20) total ear notches of which four (4) head, Junior and Open Show combined barrow entries, will be chosen to show and a maximum of two (2) barrows will be allowed to show in the same class. If properly nominated, two (2) of the four (4) barrows may be premiere barrows. Any exhibitor exceeding this rule will be disqualified from the show.
30. Premiere barrow ear notches, *must* be specifically listed on the entry form for the Premiere Class.
31. Barrows will be placed into weight classes based upon declared weights made at check-in. Purebred classes will have approximately twelve (12) animals per class and crossbreds approximately fourteen (14) per class. All class breaks for purebred or crossbred shows will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
32. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors. At the conclusion of judging for each weight class, the top two (2) placing animals will be re-weighed for weight verification. Animals that vary more than fifteen (15) pounds from the declared weight will be disqualified.
33. Barrow exhibitors *must* complete and submit a check-in card, available from the Superintendent at the State Fair, for each barrow. The cards must be completely filled out and legibly written providing the exhibitor's full name and address and the breed, class, ear notch and declared weight of the barrow. The check-in card, registration paper, health papers, and for premiere barrows, and PQA Certificate must be submitted at the time of check-in.
34. Barrows must have a declared weight of at least 220 pounds and not more than 320 pounds, except for premiere barrows, to be eligible to show. The Superintendent, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
35. All barrows *must* vacate the Open Swine Barn immediately after the conclusion of the Open Barrow Show on Sunday, August 15. Only premiere barrows will be loaded for the packing plant at the conclusion of the Open Barrow Show. All other barrows are the responsibility of the exhibitor and *must* be removed from the building. Pens will be available in the 30 Building/Junior Barn following the Open Barrow Show. At the discretion of the Open Swine Superintendent, there may be pens available on the far north end of the Open Swine Barn, but availability is not guaranteed.

SPECIFIC BREED RULES

Berkshire

36. All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire Association (ABA), 2637 Yeager Rd., West Lafayette, IN 47906. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).
37. All barrows and gilts must have a minimum of six (6) quality teats on each side to be eligible to show. A Berkshire cannot have white skin or hair that continuously encircles the body anywhere between the base of the ear and the base of the tail and must meet all registry requirements, including no swirls on the upper half of the body. All eligibility concerns shall be brought to the show committee which has the authority to disqualify any animal in question.
38. Pedigrees must have stress negative status printed on the pedigree.

Chester White

39. Only stress negative breeding stock are allowed to be exhibited.
40. The Junior Show Champion Chester White Gilt may sell at the Open Chester White Sale as long as the gilt is also shown in the Open Show. The sale position will be determined by the sale committee.

Spotted Swine

41. All spotted swine exhibited at the Illinois State Fair must meet any requirements set forth by the National Spotted Swine Registry.
42. A purebred spotted gilt, with a purebred spotted pedigree is eligible to show.
43. A spotted pietrain gilt is eligible to show and must be three-quarters (3/4) spotted blood concentration or higher with the remaining percentage being pietrain.

Landrace

44. Landrace swine may not exhibit "excessive" skin pigmentation or any hair color. "Excessive" is defined as other three (3) pigmentation spots, any one (1) of which is larger than the size/diameter of one (1) U.S. minted quarter.

SPECIAL AWARDS

GRAND CHAMPION AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION AND RUNNERS UP GILTS: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Gilts of the Junior Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair, as well as to the exhibitors of the Second, Third and Fourth Runners Up.

GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION JUNIOR BARROWS: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Barrows and Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Barrows of the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior Swine Show. Additionally, the Grand Champion Junior Show Barrow and the Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Junior Show Barrow will sell at the livestock auction of the 2022 Governor's Sale of Champions.

CHAMPION SWINE SHOWMAN: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the Champion Showman of each age division, as well as the Overall and Reserve Overall Champion Swine Showman of the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior Show.

JUNIOR SWINE FAMILY AWARD: Upon decision of the Swine Superintendent, a plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to a family that assists their own junior exhibitors, as well as other junior exhibitors in preparing for processing, weighing and showing in an exemplary manner.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Open Livestock Division as previously stated.

Special Note: All in-state and out-of-state boars and gilts entered in breeds conducting breeding stock sales must meet the following testing requirements:

Brucellosis: Breeding swine four (4) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, or originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.

Pseudorabies: Swine shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the past thirty (30) days prior to entry, or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.

2. All Open Show breeding stock must have a federally recognized permanently numbered ear tag with a premise ID.
3. Open Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Open Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Open Show. Junior Show registration does not fulfill Open Show requirements, except for Jr barrows showing in both Junior and Open Shows.
4. All entries in the Open Swine Show must be properly ear notched. Both ears must be notched and all ear notches must be completely healed and visible. Ear notches will be read on the purebred system. If exhibitor uses another system, he/she must draw a diagram. Any animal whose ears show signs of being tampered with will be disqualified.
5. All purebred animals entered in the Open Swine Show must be registered in the recognized National Breed Association record of their respective breed in the name of exhibitor, partnership or farm name.
6. All swine entries *must* have been farrowed between December 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022 and exhibitors are limited to twenty (20) *total* entries, ten (10) boar entries and ten (10) gilt entries, in December through March purebred boar and gilt classes. When making entries, designate *only* the number of December through March boars and gilts you plan to bring to the State Fair.
7. Exhibitors *must* complete and submit an entry card, available from the Superintendent at the State Fair, for each animal to be shown. The cards must be completely filled out and legibly written providing the exhibitor's full name and address and the breed, class, ear notch, registration number and for barrows, the declared weight. The entry card, stamped by the State Veterinarian, registration paper, individual health papers for each animal, and for premiere barrows, a PQA Certificate, must be submitted by the identified deadline for check-in the day before the scheduled show. Registration papers will be checked against entry cards and held, along with health papers for the Breed Association until after the Breed Sale.
8. Entry cards will be used to divide animals into classes for the shows. In no case will there be more than thirty (30) animals in a class or greater than a twenty-on (21) day age spread except for March pigs which will all be shown in a single class. Boar and

- gilt classes will be shown from youngest to oldest. In all cases, class breaks will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
9. Pens will be available on a first come, first served basis. In order to reserve or hold a pen, an animal must be in the pen. Wood shavings should be used for bedding and all pens should be cleaned each day before 8:00 am.
 10. Each breed, including crossbreds, must paint brand the boars and gilts by exhibitor number. Each breed association will supply the paint brands and paint for their breed.
 11. Each breed must provide an announcer for their show.
 12. Only those showing hogs (not more than one per animal) and officials of the State Fair will be permitted in the showing during the course of judging. An exception will be made in senior boar classes and older where not more than two (2) persons per animal will be permitted. No entry will be passed upon by the judge if it fails to comply with this rule. In all Boar Classes, for safety reasons, drivers must be thirteen (13) years of age or older.
 13. The Illinois State Fair strongly encourages the exhibitors in boar drives to use show boards. The fair will have boards available to assist exhibitors. However, the swine ring staff employed by the Illinois State Fair will not assist in breaking up boar fights.
 14. Class winning purebred gilts and boars are eligible for junior and senior championship drives and will be determined upon the number of classes. Grand Champions will be selected from Junior and Senior Champion animals.
 15. No turbo-fans, appliances, misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units or cooling systems of any kind will be allowed in the barns due to the excessive electrical draw they require. Exhibitors may use fans requiring less wattage. Additionally, no bicycles, skateboards or scooters will be allowed in the barns.
 16. Special awards presented by Breed Associations are the responsibility of those associations and not the Department Superintendent or Illinois State Fair.
 17. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR BARROWS

18. All Open Barrow pens will be assigned by the Open Swine Superintendent in the Open Swine Barn on the basis of a minimum of two (2) head per pen, unless an exhibitor has only one (1) entry. Animals must be penned according to these assignments. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own pen dividers to accommodate individual penning needs. Additional pens, for any reason, will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
19. Barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2022, except Premiere Barrows which must have been farrowed on or after February 10, 2022.
20. Each exhibitor is limited to showing four (4) barrows, Junior and Open Show entries combined, and a maximum of two (2) barrows will be allowed to show in the same class. If properly nominated, two (2) of the four (4) barrows may be premiere barrows. Any exhibitor exceeding this rule will be disqualified from the show. All barrow entries *must* be on one (1) entry form.
21. Barrows must weigh at least 220 pounds and not more than 320 pounds, except for premiere barrows, to be eligible to show. The Superintendent, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
22. Barrows must be completely healed from castration and not show any scabs.
23. Premiere barrow ear notches, must be specifically listed on the entry form for the Premiere Class.

24. All barrow entries including the Illini Pork Premiere must be shown on foot to be eligible for carcass competition. Premiere barrows will be shown in a separate class.
25. Premiere barrow exhibitors (only) must have completed the YQCA Quality Assurance Certification and submit his/her certification number at the time of premiere barrow check-in. Questions may be directed to Dan Jennings at 815-218-4358.
26. Barrow exhibitors must complete and submit a check-in card, available from the Superintendent at the State Fair, for each barrow. The cards must be completely filled out and legibly written providing the exhibitor's full name and address and the breed, class, ear notch and declared weight of the barrow. The check-in card, registration paper, health papers, and for premiere barrows, and PQA Certificate must be submitted at the time of check-in.
27. Barrows entered in both Jr and Open Shows will be checked-in only at Jr check-in.
28. Barrows will be placed into weight classes based upon declared weights made at check-in. No show class will exceed thirty (30) barrows in number. All class breaks will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
29. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors.
30. Once a Premiere barrow crosses the scales, it will be sent to the packing plant.
31. The National Pork Producers Council *Procedures to Evaluate Market Hog Performance* will be used to evaluate barrows.
32. All barrows must vacate the Open Swine Barn immediately after the conclusion of the Open Barrow Show. Only premiere barrows will be loaded for the packing plant at the conclusion of the Open Barrow Show. All other barrows are the responsibility of the exhibitor and must be removed from the building. Pens will be available in the 30 Building/Junior Barn following the Open Barrow Show. At the discretion of the Open Swine Superintendent, there may be pens available on the far north end of the Open Swine Barn, but availability is not guaranteed.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR BREEDS

Berkshire

33. All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire Association (ABA), 2637 Yeager Rd., West Lafayette, IN 47906. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).
34. Pedigrees must have stress negative status printed on the pedigree.
35. All boars and gilts must have a minimum of six (6) quality teats on each side to be eligible to show. A Berkshire cannot have white skin or hair that continuously encircles the body anywhere between the base of the ear and the base of the tail and must meet all registry requirements, including no swirls on the upper half of the body. All eligibility concerns shall be brought to the show committee which has the authority to disqualify any animal in question.
36. For Premiere Sire and Premiere Breeder Awards, the Berkshire breed will add the total number of placings in each class for an exhibitor. The exhibitor is limited to twenty (20) entries but has no control over the number of the total twenty (20) entries credited in any one class.

Chester White

37. Only stress negative breeding stock are allowed to be exhibited.
38. The Champion Chester White Gilt of the Junior Show may sell at the Open Chester White Sale as long as the gilt is also shown in the Open Show. The sale position will

be determined by the sale committee.

Poland China

39. Boars must be stress identified on pedigree or with a certificate at time of check-in.

Spotted Swine

40. All spotted swine exhibited at the Illinois State Fair must meet any requirements set forth by the National Spotted Swine Registry.
41. A purebred spotted gilt, with a purebred spotted pedigree is eligible to show.
42. A spotted pietrain gilt is eligible to show and must be three-quarters (3/4) spotted blood concentration or higher with the remaining percentage being pietrain.
43. A barrow must be officially registered through the National Spotted Swine Record (NSSR) Appendix Registry Program and an official Spotted Appendix Registry Certificate AR Registry for a specific gilt must be furnished at the State Fair.
44. To be eligible to show, an animal must meet NSSR requirements for registration and cannot have a solid black head. Further, it must meet specific Spotted Breed characteristics including:
 - A. No red tinted hair or brown sandy spots;
 - B. No distinct white belt pattern encircling and/or extending down and onto each shoulder; and
 - C. Spotted Breed character is required; that is, ears down and reasonably sized, black and white or any combination of black and white, etc.

SPECIFIC RULES FOR CROSSBREDS

45. No purebred animals will be allowed to show in the Crossbred Show.
46. Crossbred Boar and Gilt Classes will be placed into weight classes based upon weight determined at weigh-in. There is no weight limit and classes will be determined based upon weight and the number of animals entered. All class breaks will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
47. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors. There will be no re-weighing of boars and gilts at the conclusion of judging for each weight class.

SPECIAL AWARDS

GRAND CHAMPION BOAR AND GRAND CHAMPION GILT OF EACH BREED: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand Champion Boar and Grand Champion Gilt of each of the Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Poland China, Spotted Swine, Tamworth and Yorkshire Breeds of the Open Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair. Additionally, a plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the 2022 Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Boar and Gilt of those breeds.

OPEN SHOW CHAMPIONSHIP PREMIUM AWARDS: The exhibitors of the Junior and Senior Champion Boars and the Junior and Senior Champion Gilts of the Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Poland China, Spotted Swine, Tamworth and Yorkshire Breeds of the Open Show at the 2022 Illinois State Fair will receive an additional premium award of \$20.00.

LAND OF LINCOLN GRAND CHAMPION PREMIUM AWARDS: The exhibitors of the Land of Lincoln Grand Champion Boar and Gilt of the Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Poland China, Spotted Swine, Tamworth and Yorkshire Breeds at the 2022 Illinois State Fair will receive an additional premium award of \$45.00.

GRAND CHAMPION BARROW: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand Champion Barrow of the Open Show and the Grand Champion Land of Lincoln Barrow at the 2022 Illinois State Fair.

OPEN SHOW AND LAND OF LINCOLN GRAND CHAMPION BARROW PREMIUM

AWARDS: The following additional monetary awards will be made to the exhibitors of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Barrows of the Open and Land of Lincoln Shows.

DIVISION 3 – SALES

1. Sales will be held in the showing of the Open Swine Barn following the breed shows.
2. Gilts and boars will be offered for sale as determined by a designated sale line-up committee of the respective state breed associations.
3. All gilts and boars must have been properly entered with Illinois State Fair Entry Department and shown in the assigned Open Swine Show class to be eligible to sell. This also applies to Junior Show animals. Exceptions to this rule are a) a Judge will be allowed to consign one (1) animal in a breed sale and b) the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Gilts from Junior Livestock Breed Shows will be allowed to sell.
4. The following Specific Breed Sale rules will be enforced with *no exceptions*:
 - **BERKSHIRE:** The Judge and/or Auctioneer will select which hogs will be included in the sale. Minimally all 1st and 2nd place Boars and all 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Gilts will be selected. Not all hogs shown will be selected for the sale.
If a hog is selected for the sale it must come to the sale ring and be offered for sale unless excused by show officials because of injury or illness.
An Exhibitor may consign additional hogs to the sale for a fee of \$20.00 per head that will go towards the commission if sold or forfeited if not sold. This must be done within 15 minutes following the champion drive. Illinois Berkshire membership must be paid up or will be deducted from the selling price. Out-of-state exhibitors are exempt from the membership rule, but will have a \$20.00 selling fee deducted from the selling price.
Sales commission will be no more than 15% or less than 10%.
The Buyer has the right to test stress negative status on any animal purchased within 60 days of the sale and receive a full refund plus testing cost if the animal is found to carry the stress gene. This guarantee is solely between the buyer and the seller, the Illinois Berkshire Assn. assumes no liability in connection with this warranty.
All hogs over 5 months of age (not used for breeding under 7 months of age) are sold as breeding animals for breeding purposes and are sold with a warranty that they are capable of and will breed. If and when any animal does prove to be a non-breeder, the seller shall make an adjustment to the satisfaction of the buyer, provided the buyer informs the seller of the situation within 90 days after purchase. All adjustments are between the buyer and seller.

- CHESTER WHITE: All swine through the Chester White Show and Sale will be under National Chester White Association Guarantee Rules, including stress policy which states “only stress negative breeding stock are allowed to be exhibited and/or sold”. For a copy of the policy, contact CWSRA at 309/691-0151. An exhibitor may elect to consign a hog(s) to the sale for a fee of \$20.00 per head that will go towards the commission if sold, or forfeited if not sold. All animals in sale require a health paper and registration paper for each individual to be collected prior to sale. All animals selected for the sale must sell in the sale unless excused by the sale committee. The penalties for this rule will follow Chester White National Show rules.
- DUROC: Champion and Reserve Champion boar and gilt must sell, unless the gilt is a Hog College Gilt. Sale animals will be picked by a sale committee after placing each class. Also, an exhibitor may elect to consign hogs to the sale for a fee of \$25.00 per head that will go towards the commission if sold, or be forfeited if not sold. All animals selected must go through the sale. Forty (40) plus boars and forty (40) plus gilts will sell.
- HAMPSHIRE: The top 10-25 head of boars and top 30-40 head of gilts, as selected by the Judge and National Staff must go through the sale. Also, an exhibitor may elect to consign a hog to the sale for a fee of \$20.00 per head that will go towards the commission if sold, or will be forfeited if not sold. Individual health papers for each animal must be presented at check-in.
- POLAND CHINA: All first (1st) and second (2nd) place boars in the December through March classes must sell, with five (5) boars to sell optionally as picked by the sale committee. A total of twenty (20) boars will sell. All first (1st) place gilts must sell. The gilt which stands second to the Champion Gilt must sell. Twenty (20) gilts will be sold optionally as picked by the committee. Dues must be paid prior to sale. Any person having a hog selected for the sale, shall pay the applicable membership fee to the Illinois Poland China Association. Also, an exhibitor may elect to consign a hog to the sale for a fee of \$20.00 per head that will go towards the commission if sold, or will be forfeited if not sold.
- SPOTS: It is mandatory that the Champion and Reserve Champion Boar, Champion and Reserve Champion Gilt, and all first (1st) place class winners sell in the sale. The sale order will be selected by the judge and all animals selected by the Judge must be sold. The only exception to this would be a gilt donated by the Illinois Spot Association.
- YORKSHIRE: The top 30-40 head of boars and gilts will sell. These will be selected by the Judge and National Staff. Individual health papers and individual pedigrees for each hog must be presented after check-in with the Swine Superintendent.
- CROSSBRED: A minimum of 60% of the crossbreds shown will be selected for the sale by the sale committee and must sell. By entering the sale, sellers are

providing a personal *guarantee* that their gilts will breed and settle. At the time of the sale, the gilts must be guaranteed open.

5. If selected for the State Fair sale, boars and gilts are required to go through the sale ring unless the sale committee determines the animal is sick or injured. The sale committee will provide the State Fair Sale Clerk with a list of approved animals that did not go through the sale ring.
6. Exhibitors of animals *not* approved by the sale committee to be pulled from the sale order, and who choose *not* to run their animals through the sale ring, will be charged commission on the breed's average selling price for that sex. Further, the exhibitor and immediate family will *not* be allowed to participate in future State Fair sales until the commission has been paid.
7. The cost of selling in the sale will be 15% of the selling price. All checks should be paid payable to the respective state breed association.
8. All financial arrangements will be between the buyer and the seller. The Illinois State Fair and respective breed association will *not* be responsible in any way.
9. Exhibitors will take any purchases home when the breed is released.
10. The Illinois State Fair would like a report from each breed association stating the total amount of the breed sale and the date the 1% checkoff was sent to the Illinois Purebred Swine Council. Please send such report to the Illinois State Fair, Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794. In addition to the 1% check-off, each breeder must comply with the National Legislative Pork Check-off at a rate of .45 of 1% (.0045) of the gross value. This additional check-off must be sent by the breeder to the National Pork Board.
11. The Illinois State Fair and respective breed associations assume no liability associated with these sales.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division as previously stated.
2. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless exempted in advance by Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict. A single showing helper will be allowed in the showing for yearling ewe classes *only* and all helpers must be bona fide Jr. Exhibitors.
3. Junior Show Sheep will be penned in both the South and North Sheep Barns. Exhibitors must write the number of animals entered and the number of pens requested in the South Junior Barn *and* North Open Barn on the Junior Show entry form. No lambs will be allowed to leave the North Open Barn until Saturday evening after release.
4. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show. Open Show registration does not fulfill Jr. Show requirements.
5. Purebred animals must be recorded in their respective National Breed Book as evidenced by official registration papers or certificate of registration. No copies of registration or stamped duplicate of official registration will be accepted.
6. Registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects.
7. A classifier will be used in the Junior Sheep Show market classes for purposes of breed verification. In all instances, the decision of the classifier shall be final. Official classification at the State Fair is not subject to protest.
8. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership. However, in determining original origin or ownership, state or federal identification will take precedence over registration papers. Entries in sheep classes must have been the property of the exhibitor and a part of his/her project in accordance with the following dates:
 - Breeding Animals, June 25, 2021
 - Market Lambs, May 15, 2022
9. Exhibitors in the Jr. Sheep Show will be allowed two (2) entries per class with a maximum of twelve (12) total entries in the breeding show and six (6) total entries in the Market Lamb Show. Substitutions are allowed during check-in. However exhibitors cannot show more sheep than the number of animals originally entered.
10. No mature rams, aged nurse ewes/goats are permitted in the Junior Sheep Show.
11. To be eligible to show in the Junior Sheep Show of the Illinois State Fair:
 - A. All Breeding Animals *must* be properly identified with a Flock Tag and Scrapie Tag.
 - B. All Market Lambs *must* be properly identified with a Scrapie Tag.
12. All sheep must be penned in one of the Sheep Barns. All pens and stalls are to be assigned by the Superintendent or his/her assistants. Pens will be assigned on the basis of a minimum of three (3) head per pen, unless an exhibitor has only one (1) entry. Animals *must* be penned according to these assignments. Exhibitors are responsible for additional fencing if needed to separate or confine animals and all pens must be bedded with natural straw, wood chips or sawdust. Exhibitors will be

allowed one (1) pen for tack. Additional pens, for any reason, will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.

13. No living quarters or tarps allowed in the Sheep Barns.
14. No appliances, misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units or cooling systems of any kind will be allowed in the barns.
15. Wethers and market ewe lambs will be shown together in market lamb classes.
16. All market lambs *must*:
 - A. Have been lambed on or after January 1, 2022;
 - B. Be properly identified by a Scrapie Tag and nominated in the name of the exhibitor, verified by local 4-H personnel or FFA Chapter Advisor, on or between March 15 and May 15, 2022;
 - C. Be docked and show ready slick shorn before check-in;
 - D. Weigh at least eighty-five (85) pounds;
 - E. Still have their milk teeth;
 - F. Wethers must show no sign of testicular tissue;
 - G. Free of any active fungus and/or sore mouth;
 - H. Be physically sound at check-in and show times.

All of these requirements will be examined by the Superintendent and his/her assistants who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.

17. Market lambs will be tagged at check-in and placed into weight classes based upon declared weights made at check-in. A minimum of ten (10) lambs of a given breed are required for a breed class. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors. At the conclusion of judging for each weight class, the top two (2) placing animals will be re-weighed for weight verification. Animals that vary five (5) percent or more from the declared weight will be disqualified.
18. Market lamb exhibitors *must* fill out a check-in form which will be provided by the Superintendent at the mandatory Market Lamb Exhibitors' Meeting for each market lamb providing the full name and address, legibly written, of the exhibitor and the Scrapie Tag number of the animal. The check-in form and original nomination form must be complete and submitted at the time of check-in and tagging. Registration papers verifying Land of Lincoln eligibility must also be provided for animals competing in the Land of Lincoln show. No phone nominations will be permitted.
19. All breeding animals *must*:
 - A. Have been lambed September 1, 2021 or after and still have their milk teeth with no evidence of permanent teeth.
 - B. Be docked and properly groomed for showing.

Special Notes:

- Shropshire sheep must be slick shorn. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks and on the face and head from the poll forward; the remainder of the body is to be shorn to the skin within 10 days of the show date.
- Southdown Sheep must be slick shorn within five (5) days of the show. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks, and also below the eyes around muzzle.
- Free of any active fungus and/or sore mouth;
- Be physically sound at check-in and show times.

All of these requirements will be examined by the Superintendent and his/her

- assistants who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
20. Birth dates, as listed on the registration papers or certificates will be used to determine the class division for all breeding animals. Take the show date and count back to the birth date to determine the age and class for the animal.
 21. A commercial ewe may be a crossbred or a straight bred not eligible for registry. Commercial ewes and ewe lambs must be ear tagged or tattooed for identification.
 22. Ring Cards will be issued for all sheep and *must* be worn by exhibitors in the showing at all times. Failure to do so is cause for ineligibility to show.
 23. Artificial coloring of sheep will not be allowed. Lambs will be white towed before entering the show ring.
 24. The use of muzzles is prohibited.
 25. When lambs are being judged, they must have all four (4) feet on the ground. No excessive lifting of the animals. Slapping of animals will not be tolerated and is cause for dismissal from the showing.
 26. Showmanship Contests will be held separately for exhibitors showing breeding animals and market lambs. In both instances, Showmanship classes will immediately follow the final breed show of the day and will be divided into Junior and Senior Showmanship competitions.
 27. Special awards presented by Breed Associations are the responsibility of those associations and *not* the Department Superintendent or Illinois State Fair.
 28. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

Show Rules

1. The purpose of the Leadline Show is to present a class of well-groomed sheep, at halter, led by a participant clad in fashionable and becoming wool clothing. The underlying objective is to present an attractive and coordinated package entry which will promote the use of wool to both participants and the viewing public.
2. The Leadline Show is open to all exhibitors, male or female, at least nine (9) years of age and not yet twenty-two (22) years of age as of January 1, 2022. Exhibitors do not need to be actively engaged in the production or showing of sheep.
3. Entry must be made in advance on an official Open Livestock Entry Form and be mailed to the Entry Department by July 1 with complete name and address.
4. Exhibitor class ages shall be determined at the discretion of the Superintendent.
5. The exhibit will be judged on attractiveness and originality of the costume, theme and the manner in which it is presented. A live sheep must be a part of the exhibit.
6. The exhibited animal must be a registered ewe, properly conditioned, groomed and fitted, and shown at halter in accordance with Illinois State Fair Sheep Show rules.

7. The type of outfit worn, whether it be dress, suit, slacks, skirt and sweater, etc., is optional. Of greater importance is if the garment is appropriate for the age and lifestyle of the participant?
8. There is no correct way to lead the ewe. A well-trained animal will respond with little assistance and with the lead strap in either hand of the participant.
9. The use of a blanket on the ewe is optional. If used, it should *not* cover more than two-thirds (2/3) of the animal. Excessive ornaments or baubles should not be used.
10. The use of gloves, boots, headwear, jewelry and other accessories by the exhibitor is also optional, whatever contributes to the overall neatness and attractiveness of the package is acceptable.

SPECIAL DEFINITIONS AND RECOGNITIONS

EXHIBITOR DEFINITION IN PAIR AND GROUP CLASSES: Where a pair, group of four, or flock is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premiere Exhibitor, Best Four Head and Young Flock.

BEST FOUR HEAD: Four (4) sheep of any age and sex. All animals owned by one (1) exhibitor/farm.

YOUNG FLOCK: Group to consist of one (1) yearling ram or ram lamb, two (2) yearling ewes and two (2) ewe lambs. All animals owned by one (1) exhibitor/farm.

PREMIERE EXHIBITOR AWARD: Upon decision of the Sheep Superintendent, a banner will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the Premiere Exhibitor in each sheep breed. In case of a tie, the exhibitor with the highest placing flock will be declared the winner.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division as previously stated.
2. Open Show Sheep will be penned in both the North and South Sheep Barns. Exhibitors must write the number of animals entered and the number of pens requested on the Open Show entry form.
3. Open Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Open Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Open Show. Junior Show registration does not fulfill Open Show requirements. Further, all registration papers must be presented for check-in and ring card distribution in the Sheep Department Office 9:00-11:00 am the day before a given breed show.
4. Purebred animals must be recorded in their respective National Breed Book as evidenced by official registration papers or certificate of registration and bear the American ear tag of the National Association and corresponding flock tag. No copies of registration or stamped duplicate of official registration will be accepted.
5. Proof of ownership must evidence ownership prior to show and be presented for inspection by State Fair personnel or Sheep Superintendent. All entries must be entered under the name of the owner on the registration paper.
6. Exhibitors are allowed substitution within the breed from an individual class to an individual class or from a group class to a group class up to 8:00 am the day of the show. No added entries will be allowed.
7. A classifier will be used in the Open Sheep Show for purposes of breed verification. In all instances, the decision of the classifier shall be final. Official classification at the State Fair is not subject to protest.
8. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership. However, in determining original origin or ownership, state or federal identification will take precedence over registration papers.
9. Exhibitors in the Open Breeding Sheep Show will be allowed two (2) entries per class and one (1) entry in pair and group classes. Substitutions are allowed during check-in. However, exhibitors cannot show more sheep than the number of animals originally entered. Market lamb exhibitors are allowed six (6) entries in addition to two (2) premiere entries for a maximum of eight (8) entries in the Market Lamb Show.
10. No mature rams, aged nurse ewes/goats are permitted in the Sheep Show.
11. To be eligible to show in the Open Sheep Show of the Illinois State Fair:
 - A. All Breeding Animals *must* be properly identified with a Flock Tag and Scrapie Tag.
 - B. All market lambs *must* be properly identified with a Scrapie Tag.
 - C. All ear tags must be in place before arriving on the fairgrounds.
 - D. All identifying ear tags, tattoos or horn markings must be clearly visible for Superintendents and ring personnel.
12. All sheep must be penned in one of the Sheep Barns. All pens and stalls are to be assigned by the Superintendent or his/her assistants. Pens will be assigned on the basis of a minimum of three (3) head per pen, unless an exhibitor has only one (1) entry. Animals *must* be penned according to these assignments. Exhibitors are responsible for additional fencing if needed to separate or confine animals and all pens must be bedded with natural straw, wood chips or sawdust. Exhibitors will be

allowed one (1) pen for tack. Additional pens, for any reason, will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.

13. Only exhibitors or those associated with grooming and caring for sheep, will be allowed to stay in the barns in the vicinity of their animals.
14. No enclosure of pens with tarps or any other material is allowed and no appliances, misters, swamp blasters, air conditioning units or cooling systems of any kind will be allowed in the barns.
15. Wethers and market ewe lambs will be shown together in market lamb classes.
16. All market lambs must:
 - A. Have been lambled on or after January 1, 2022;
 - B. Be docked and show ready slick shorn before check-in;
 - C. Weigh at least eighty-five (85) pounds;
 - D. Still have their milk teeth;
 - E. Wethers must show no sign of testicular tissue;
 - F. Free of any active fungus and/or sore mouth;
 - G. Be physically sound at check-in and show times.

All of these requirements will be examined by the Superintendent and his/her assistants who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.

16. Market lambs will be tagged at check-in and placed into weight classes based upon declared weights made at check-in. Practice scales will be available in the barns for use by exhibitors.
17. Market lamb exhibitors must fill out a check-in form which will be provided by the Superintendent at the mandatory Market Lamb Exhibitors' Meeting for each market lamb providing the full name and address, legibly written, of the exhibitor. The check-in form must be complete and submitted at the time of check-in and tagging. Registration papers verifying Land of Lincoln eligibility must also be provided for animals competing in the Land of Lincoln show. No phone nominations will be permitted.
18. A minimum of ten (10) market lambs of a given breed are required for a breed class. Otherwise, market lambs will show in an All Other Breeds (AOB) class.
19. All breeding animals must:
 - A. Be docked and properly groomed for showing.

Special Notes:

- Shropshire sheep must be slick shorn. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks and on the face and head from the poll forward; the remainder of the body is to be shorn to the skin within 10 days of the show date.
 - Southdown Sheep must be slick shorn within five (5) days of the show. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks, and also below the eyes around the muzzle.
 - Cotswold Sheep fleece should be a maximum of three (3) inches in length and no grooming oils should be used.
- B. Free of any active fungus and/or sore mouth;
 - C. Be physically sound at check-in and show times.

All of these requirements will be examined by the Superintendent and his/her assistants who, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full

- authority regarding show eligibility.
20. Birth dates, as listed on the registration papers or certificates will be used to determine the class division for all breeding animals. Take the show date and count back to the birth date to determine the age and class for the animal. September 1 will be used as the base for computing ages of lambs in all classes. Yearlings shall be subject to veterinarian's examination whose findings shall be final.
 21. A commercial ewe may be a crossbred or a straight bred not eligible for registry. Commercial ewes and ewe lambs must be ear tagged or tattooed for identification.
 22. Ring Cards will be issued for all sheep and must be worn by exhibitors in the showing at all times. Failure to do so is cause for ineligibility to show.
 23. Unless otherwise defined by specific dates, some breeds will have yearling ewes divided equally into two (2) classes (A&B) determined by random draw after all sheep are entered and checked-in. Exhibitors are limited to three (3) yearling ewe entries and (2) premiums.
 24. Artificial coloring of sheep will not be allowed. Lambs will be white towed before entering the show ring.
 25. The use of muzzles is prohibited.
 26. When lambs are being judged, they must have all four (4) feet on the ground. No excessive lifting of the animals. Slapping of animals will not be tolerated and is cause for dismissal from the showing.
 27. Special awards presented by Breed Associations are the responsibility of those associations and not the Department Superintendent or Illinois State Fair.
 28. No loading or unloading of trailers between the North and South Sheep Barns one half (1/2) hour before the start time of any beginning of show.
 29. No washing of sheep in the sheep barns.
 30. All pens and aisles are to be cleaned each day before 8:00 am.
 31. No roller skates, skate boarding, scooters, inline skate, bicycles, tricycles, etc. allowed in or around the sheep barns at any time during the State Fair.
 32. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division as previously stated.
2. Junior Show exhibitors may enter more than one (1) breed and are encouraged to enter their animals in the Open Dairy Goat Show.
3. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless exempted in advance by Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.
4. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show. Open Show registration does not fulfill Jr. Show requirements.
5. Animals must be purebred or recorded grade, legibly tattooed, and registered in their respective National Breed Herd Book.
6. All registration papers must comply with ADGA Sanction Show requirements. Registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects. For does under six months of age, an official stamped duplicate must accompany animal, if registration papers are not available.
7. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership.
8. Entries in the dairy goat classes must have been the property of the exhibitor and a part of his/her project in accordance with the following dates:
Doe Kids and Yearlings not in milk, June 1, 2022
Milking Does, January 1, 2022
9. No bucks may be entered or shown.
10. Exhibitors are allowed open substitution up to time of check-in. Entry into additional classes is not allowed after July 1. Once substitutions have been made, those substitutions will be final.
11. All pens are to be assigned by the Superintendent or his/her assistants. Pens will be assigned on the basis of a minimum of four (4) mature and a minimum of five (5) kids per pen. Animals must be penned according to these assignments. Exhibitors are responsible for additional fencing if needed to separate or confine animals.
12. Class ages shall be computed from the Opening Day of the Fair, August 11, 2022.
13. No pre-show milkout will be held. Exhibitors should ensure that udders of milking does are not overly distended.
14. All goats must be properly groomed for showing and provided with a collar before entering the showing.
15. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

Stamped duplicates will only be accepted on animals that are under 6 months of age on the day of the show.
6. Open Dairy Goats are exempt from thirty (30) day ownership. Proof of ownership must evidence ownership prior to show and be presented for inspection by State Fair personnel or Dairy Goat Superintendent. All entries must be entered under the name of the owner on the registration paper. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership.
7. No bucks may be entered or shown.
8. Exhibitors are allowed open substitution up to time of check-in. Entry into additional classes is not allowed after July 1, 2022. Once substitutions have been made, those substitutions will be final.

3. Each exhibitor may enter one (1) entry per class with a maximum of thirteen (13) total entries. Specifically, exhibitors may enter *no more* than:
 - Nine (9) birds in Breeding Classes;
 - Three (3) entries in Market Meat Classes; and
 - One (1) entry in Market Egg Classes
4. All Other Breed (AOB) classes are for animals in breeds not separately listed.
5. *Do not enter* Championship Classes.

6. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own birds unless exempted in advance by Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.

DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Animals entered in the Junior and Open Premiere Shows, with the exception of Beef Cattle, *must* be shown in the live market animal classes of the Illinois State Fair. As a result, each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior and/or Open Livestock Division as previously stated.

2. Exhibitors with Premiere Steers *not* competing in the live market animal classes of the Illinois State Fair must deliver those steers to Reel's Livestock Center, Congerville, Illinois between 10:00 am and noon on Sunday, August 14 and load them directly on the truck for delivery to the designated packing plant. These steers will be checked-in at that time and will *not* be required to go through steer check-in on Wednesday, August 10 at the State Fairgrounds in Springfield and will *not* be required to have/submit an Average Daily Gain (ADG) calculation. However, entries must be made in compliance with all Illinois State Fair livestock entry requirements.
3. All premiere show entries *must* be made on the specie-specific entry forms provided for Junior and/or Open Exhibitors. Entry forms may be secured through the State Fair Entry Department at 217/782-0786 or the Fair website www.illinoisstatefair.info. Entry forms may be submitted directly to the State Fair Entry Department, P.O. Box 19427, Springfield, IL 62794-9427.
4. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show registration and ring card distribution requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show. Open Show registration does not fulfill Jr. Show requirements. And, Open Show exhibitors must adhere to Open Show registration and ring card distribution requirements, including using the correct and respective entry forms.
5. All entries *must* be postmarked by July 1, 2022. Junior Show entries must have signed verification of active membership in the 4-H or FFA program. As a result, Junior Exhibitors may find local extension offices set earlier deadlines for submission.
6. Exhibitors are allowed two (2) entries per class in Junior and Open Premiere Shows. In all cases, the Superintendents reserve the right to limit entry numbers as necessary due to limited space in designated packing plants.
7. All Junior and Open Premiere animals *must* have been permanently tattooed, weighed locally and nominated in the name of the exhibitor. Beef cattle and swine nominations *must* be made by designated personnel through the official Illinois 4-H and FFA Market Animal Identification Program. Market lambs *must* be nominated through submission of the *State Fair Lamb Premiere Nomination Form* between March 15 and May 15, 2022. No metal or plastic tags will be accepted for identification purposes except for a federal 840 beef tag for steers.
8. For all species, original nomination forms *must* be submitted by designated personnel to Dan Jennings, University of Illinois, Region 1 Office, 1100 E. Warrentville Rd., Suite 170, Naperville, IL 60563; 815/218-4358. Exhibitors will be provided a copy of nomination forms and *must* present those forms to the Superintendent at the time of check-in.
9. Exhibitors are responsible for having the ears of his/her animals clean, knowing where the tattoo is, and knowing it can be read by officials at the time of check-in. Animals with illegible tattoos, unhealed tattoos or tattoos that are inconsistent with nomination papers are ineligible to show.
10. Each exhibitor will be required to complete an information form at the time of check-in for each animal participating in a premiere class. Information requested will include: a) the full name and complete address of the exhibitor, b) complete and proper identification information for the entered animal, and c) class(es) in which the animal is entered. All forms must be filled out completely and legibly for payment purposes. Forms will be available during the fair from the Superintendent or the General Livestock Office in the northeast corner of the lower level of the 30 Building.

11. Only animals which meet identified birth and ownership dates and live weight limits are eligible to participate in Premiere Classes. Further, only carcasses which meet designated premiere carcass standards will receive premiums. To be eligible to participate and receive premiums and awards, the birth and ownership dates, live weight limits and minimum carcass standards identified under the *Specie Specific Rules* must be met.
12. All animals entered in Premiere Classes *must* be physically sound at check-in and show times to be eligible to participate in live and carcass shows. The Superintendent and his/her assistants, along with the General Livestock Superintendent, shall have full authority regarding show eligibility.
13. All premiere animals will be transported to the designated packing plant for harvesting and data collection. Carcass data will be mailed to exhibitors following the State Fair.
14. All animals will be sold subject to the contract between the Illinois State Fair and the designated packer. Pay weights will be hot carcass weights as determined at the packing plant. All carcasses will be sold on grade and yield basis and priced according to similar carcasses at the point of market with normal charges for transportation, commission, etc. deducted. In the event all or any part of a carcass is condemned by the meat inspector, the payment will be reduced accordingly.
15. Do *not* enter Championship Classes.

SPECIE SPECIFIC RULES

STEERS

16. Birth and Ownership Steers *must* have been born on or after January 1, 2021 and owned by exhibitor on or before February 1, 2022.
17. Live Weight Limits Steers *must* have a minimum live weight of 1,000 pounds.
18. Premiere Carcass Standards Steer carcasses *must*:
 - Grade at least low select;
 - Have a yield grade lower than 4.0; and
 - Have a hot carcass weight of 950 pounds or less.

BARROWS

19. Birth and Ownership Barrows *must* have been born on or after February 10, 2022 and owned by exhibitor on or before June 1, 2022.
20. Ear Notched and Tattooed Barrows *must* have been nominated, ear notched and tattooed before they are thirty-five (35) days old.
21. Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) Certification Premiere barrow exhibitors *must* have completed the YQCA Quality Assurance Certification and submit his/her certification number at the time of premiere barrow check-in. Questions may be directed to Dan Jennings at 815-218-4358.
22. Live Weight Limits Pigs cannot weigh more than the equivalent of 1.0 pounds per day of age when tattooed. Further, barrows cannot exceed 1.0 pound of growth weight per day of age since tattooed. Barrows weighing less than 220 pounds are ineligible to be shown at the Illinois State Fair.
23. Premiere Carcass Standards Barrow carcasses *must*:
 - Have a minimum hot carcass weight of 170 pounds;
 - Have a minimum 10th rib fat thickness of 0.50 in.;
 - Have a minimum carcass length of 30.0 in.;

- Meet the following tenth rib fat depth and loin muscle area requirements based on hot carcass weight:

Hot Carcass Weight (lbs.)	170-189	190-209	210-229	230-over
Tenth Rib Fat (max. in.)	1.00	1.15	1.30	1.45
Loin Eye Area (min. sq.in.)	6.00	6.50	7.00	7.50

- Meet the minimum meat quality standards for:
 - a. Color score of 2.0 and less than 6.0;
 - b. Marbling score of less than 6.0; and
 - c. Firmness/Wetness score of 2 or 3.

Special Note: Barrow carcasses will be placed on the basis of the pounds of lean pork gained per day on test from a healthy, visually sound pig originating from an acceptable production program. This procedure was recommended by National Pork Producers Council in 1991 (Third Edition).

MARKET LAMBS (wethers and ewes are eligible)

24. Birth and Ownership Market lambs *must* have been born on or after January 1, 2022 and owned by exhibitor on or before May 15, 2022.
25. Live Weight Limits Market Lambs *must* have a minimum live weight of 85 pounds.
26. Premiere Carcass Standards Market lamb carcasses *must*:
 - Have a minimum hot-carcass weight of 45 pounds;
 - Have at least 0.10 inch of fat cover at the rib eye;
 - Have a quality grade of low choice or better;

2022 Illinois State Fair Master Showmanship Contest

The Illinois State Fair Master Showmanship Contest (MSC) will be **Friday, August 12, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. or 30 minutes following the conclusion of the Supreme Heifer Show**. The contest will be held in the Junior Livestock Barn and the Open Swine Barn at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. The beef division will be in the junior beef ring and the swine and sheep divisions will be in the open swine ring. The state event will simultaneously run three species contests with a set of judges in each ring. Participants will be scored in each round based on overall showmanship abilities. **Participants must check in at the Illinois Farm Bureau tent outside the Junior Livestock Barn between 3:00 and 5:00 p.m.** on the day of the contest. If the participant is unavailable during check-in time, they may send a representative to check in on their behalf.

The Master Showmanship Contest is coordinated by the Illinois Farm Bureau and the RFD Radio Network. Contest results and photos will be posted on the "Illinois Farm Bureau Young Leaders" Facebook page following the contest.

Rules

1. The exhibitor must be a 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 (must be at least 14 but cannot have reached their 19th birthday before September 1, 2021 - birthdate between 9/1/2002 and 9/1/2007).
2. The exhibitor must be enrolled in a 4-H livestock event in the county they are representing.
3. **One (1) exhibitor per county** may participate in the MSC.
4. All contestants must be selected through their designated county University of Illinois Extension 4-H-affiliated show. There may only be one (1) contestant per county. Contestants who compete in a town/region/non-4-H affiliated fair contest will not be allowed to enter the MSC.
5. To participate in the state event, a county must select one (1) overall showmanship winner prior to the state event. This must be accomplished through a county-based contest or set of guidelines established and published to all available participants.
6. An exhibitor may participate in the state MSC for multiple years if the following permit:
 - a. The exhibitor has not previously been recognized as the Overall Winner of the state MSC.
 - b. The exhibitor is chosen as the overall county/fair winner.
 - c. County contest rules permit an individual to be the county winner multiple times.
 - d. County rules and guidelines adhered to and followed.

- e. The exhibitor must be able to attend and participate in the state contest at the Illinois State Fair. If the county winner cannot participate in the state contest, then the county University of Illinois Extension office may select an alternate.
7. Participants must supply their own livestock for the competition. Each exhibitor must own or borrow each: a steer or heifer, a market or breeding lamb, and a market hog or breeding gilt. **THE MSC WILL NOT PROVIDE ANIMALS FOR COMPETITION.**
8. All state contest participants will receive a t-shirt and are required to wear the t-shirt during the contest.
9. Prizes will be presented at the conclusion of the state contest: 1st - \$500; 2nd - \$300.00; 3rd - \$200.00; 4th & 5th- \$100. Additional prizes will also be awarded to the top five, division winners, and all participants. ****Winners are responsible for any and all applicable state or federal taxes due to the value of the prizes****
10. **County contest coordinators must submit the intent to participate form by June 1.**
11. To participate in the state contest, the exhibitor must have all paperwork filled out correctly with required information. **The contest organizer must receive this information by August 1.** If a fair occurs after the deadline, you must submit the participant information immediately following the county contest.
12. Due to timing and scheduling constraints, no special accommodations will be made to allow an exhibitor to participate in simultaneous events on the fairgrounds the evening of the MSC. If the exhibitor is not present at the beginning of the state contest, he or she will be automatically disqualified from competition.
13. Contest organizers withhold the right to expel any individual who has violated any of the rules or regulations or exhibits improper conduct that is unbecoming of a 4-H member.
14. In the event of a state contest cancellation, contest organizers are not liable for any lost revenues, expenses incurred, or schedule inconvenience, and are not bound to issue any awards or prizes.
15. The state contest will adhere to any and all guidelines in relation to the Illinois State Fair issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture and all livestock exhibited in the MSC must meet the Illinois Exhibition Animal Health Requirements of the State Fair.
16. Judges and emcees will only be furnished for the state contest.
