Area teen to represent Shriners Hosptial at PGA Tour tournament in Las Vegas

Garrett Heble, 15, a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston, will have the experience of a lifetime in November when he represents the local hospital at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, an official PGA TOUR event in Las Vegas, November 4-5.

Garrett was chosen as one of 22 patient ambassadors throughout the country to represent the Shriners Hospitals health care system at the tournament, where he will serve as a standard-bearer on the weekend, carrying the scores of a group of professional golfers as they compete in the tournament. It is a rare "inside the ropes" opportunity at a PGA TOUR event, as well as the chance to share how Shriners Hospitals have helped transform his life.


Garrett Heble, 15, is a sophomore at Columbia High School in West Columbia, Texas, where he competes on his school's golf team. This past summer, he had emergency surgery and therapy for a traumatic brain injury at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston following an ATV accident. It was a miracle that he even survived the accident, much less walked away from Shriners Hospital after only eight

days of therapy. The therapists at the Houston Shriners Hospital played a significant role in Garrett's swift recovery, pushing him the whole way. Now, he awaits surgery to replace the skull bone on the left side of his head.

As part of his participation in the tournament, Garrett's story and photo will appear in the tournament program, and his information will be shared with the Golf Channel, which will televise the tournament nationally, to be used during the broadcast. The broadcast reaches over 700 million homes across 240 countries worldwide.

The following section of the bylaws of the Imperial Council, A.A.O.N.M.S., is quoted for information and compliance:

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

(a) Electioneering.

A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) Expenditures Prohibited.

The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) Violation.

For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
(d) Notice.

At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

ANNUAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Oriental Guide Must Be Selected Wisely

When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan Line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for and worthy of advancement to the high office of Illustrious Potentate.

Hence it is quite evident that the nomination for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, prestige, interest and experience.

A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualification which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself and to his Temple in seeking the Office or in permitting his fellow Nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

Each Shrine Temple needs and requires able, high-type leadership. The normal starting point of that leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following Check List may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the Office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naive or presumptuous as to believe that any one Noble could possibly embody all of the virtues, talents, and qualifications which are set forth in this Check List. Nevertheless the List has practical value...for self evaluation by the Nobles whose ultimate aspiration in the Office of Illustrious Potentate...And for advance evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

- 1. He should have good business judgement.
- 2. He should be friendly and outgoing, a good mixer.
- 3. He should have the ability to express himself clearly, in language that will make us proud of him, rather than apologetic.
- 4. He should present an imposing personal appearance.
- 5. He should be able to hold his own and advance the interest of his Temple and Freemasonry in high places-as well as among the humble.
- 6. He should be a devoted Mason, and constantly promote the interest of Freemasonry everywhere.
- 7. He should be proud, yet humble.
- 8. He should have good character and a past open to investigation.
- 9. He should be a leader, have good standing in his community and be influential in its affairs.
- 10. He should be financially secure.
- 11. He should be in good health, full of energy and vitality.
- 12. He should be able to devote ample time to his duties.
- 13. He should be a man who, when he appears anywhere in public, you will be proud of and not apologetic for his shortcomings.
- 14. His wife should be able to understand his devotion to duty; realize that he is Potentate, and not she: be able to dress and wear appropriate clothing, and be familiar with the social amenities. Remember, she is destined to become Suez First Lady.

Nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability and interest.

Remember, you are electing your spokesman and standard bearer and the one who will represent you throughout the world.

We have great talent in our Temple. Let us seek out the best man we can find who is willing to make the sacrifice. And it requires great sacrifice! Many Temples have suffered from inferior Potentates because of hasty judgement and oversight of qualifications when selecting Oriental Guides. To be Potentate of Suez is a great honor. With that honor goes tremendous responsibility! Suez has great talent in its ranks. Let's seek it! The job requires and entails a lot of time-consuming, energy-consuming **WORK**.

Let's be fair and sincere. Let's get the very best we can find!
