

IT'S JERRY'S BIRTHDAY

On Friday, August 1, KLCC and Dead Air present an evening to celebrate Jerry Garcia featuring two full sets by the Garcia Birthday Band.

Jerry Garcia, famed lead guitarist, songwriter and singer for The Grateful Dead and the Jerry Garcia Band, among others, was born on August 1, 1941 in San Francisco, CA.

Dead.net has this to say:

"As lead guitarist in a rock environment, Jerry Garcia naturally got a lot of attention. But it was his warm, charismatic personality that earned him the affection of millions of Dead Heads. He picked up the guitar at the age of 15, played a little '50s rock and roll, then moved into the folk acoustic guitar era before becoming a bluegrass banjo player. Impressed by The Beatles and Stones, he and his friends formed a rock band called the Warlocks in late 1964 and debuted in 1965. As the band evolved from being blues-oriented to psychedelic/experimental to adding country and folk influences, his guitar stayed out front. His songwriting partnership with Robert Hunter led to many of the band's most memorable songs, including "Dark Star", "Uncle John's Band" and the group's only Top 10 hit, "Touch of Grey". Over the years he was married three times and fathered four daughters. He died of a heart attack

in 1995." Fans have kept the spirit of Jerry Garcia alive in their hearts, and have spread the spirit and the music to new generations. No one does it better than Eugene's own Downtown Deb, who hosts KLCC's *Dead Air* every Saturday night from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.


Dead Air with Downtown Deb features music of the Grateful Dead, Jerry Garcia Band, and much more. Deb has a discerning ear and shares quality selections from legendary live concerts, rare highlights, and fine studio releases. Dead Air is the genuine article, saturating the vast audio radiance, bringing the experience of the music to listeners far and wide.

The Garcia Birthday Band (GBB), based in Portland, is the Pacific Northwest's premier Grateful Dead experience! Formed in 1999, GBB is a group of veteran musicians celebrating and interpreting the vast repertoire of Jerry Garcia and the Grateful Dead.

An established draw in the Portland area, GGB played the Oregon Country Fair's Wally Slocum Memorial Teddy Bear Picnic in 2012 and 2013. They made their WOW Hall debut in April and played again in June.

With musicians hailing from the likes of New Riders of the Purple Sage (NRPS), David Nelson Band, Kingfish, Cubensis, the Buds of May, the Ike Willis Band, Brothers Jam and LOOS3, the band is certain to provide high musical adventure! Band members are: Jon Sokol (guitar and vocals), Arthur Steinhorn (drums and percussion), Scot Gillan (bass and vocals), Justin Pacuska (guitar and vocals), Joe Patterson (keyboards, fiddle, vocals) and Edward Connel (keyboards and vocals).

CHATHAM COUNTY LINE

On Sunday, July 27, the Community Center for the Performing Arts proudly welcomes Chatham County Line to the WOW Hall for a seated show.

"There's a lot of growing up in this record," muses Dave Wilson, Chatham County Line's vocalist and guitarist. "The next generation is coming. We're maturing in this world and seeing things through a different set of eyes – and that materializes in a lot of these songs..."

Entering their second decade as an ensemble, Chatham County Line elegantly reconcile the past and future, tradition and innovation, on the fittingly titled *Tightrope*, available on Yep Roc Records. The sixth studio album from the Raleigh-based fourpiece follows 2010's winsome, soulful *Wildwood* and the career-spanning concert album and film undertaking *Sight & Sound*, which was released in 2012.

Stirring, provocative, and disarmingly poignant, *Tightrope* was born out of a year's worth of intense focus, during which the band examined their legacy while carefully honing new material. All the while, the band's four members – Wilson (guitar), John Teer (mandolin, fiddle), Chandler Hold (banjo), and Greg Readling (bass, pedal steel, piano) – welcomed spontaneity and the sometimes palpable will of the songs themselves into the process.

"At the end of the day," Wilson continues, "you really want to write songs that have a reason for existing. For *Tightrope*, we worked together very closely on every decision and every word and every bit of everything to try to make it fit. We want every song to be on the future greatest hits album."

Produced by Wilson and Chatham County Line, *Tightrope* benefits from an unusually rich, resonant sound that blends each member's contributions into a powerful, dynamic whole. The poetic insight of the album's eleven original songs is grounded by Chatham County Line's ongoing commitment to classic stringband instrumentation.

Tightrope also marks a return to Sound Pure Studios in Durham, NC, where the band recorded their third collaboration with Norwegian songwriter Jonas Fjeld. This unlikely partnership began in 2005, and has surpassed all expectations, resulting in chart-topping certified-gold albums in Norway, successful tours, and two Spellemannprisen (Norway's equivalent of a Grammy) nominations. Chatham County Line's ability to sincerely render Fjeld's music while still imparting their own perspective is testament to both the band's open mindedness and their deep roots in traditional stringband forms.

While their acoustic lineup informs their performances, it places no limitations on the band's formidable songwriting talent. The title track epitomized the processes that went into making the album.

"Tightrope of Love' began as an instrumental that Chandler had written," Wilson recalls. "We recorded it at practice, and I heard something in Holt's winding, chromatic banjo part that suggested the image of a tightrope walker. I wrote lyrics to that and reassembled it, giving it a different life. We worked a lot on that song. Hours and hours, different versions. We talked about the lyrical approach together. We named the album after it, because this is what this band does. We work together, walking this weird tightrope between bluegrass and acoustic music, creating this alternative folk country sound, and we choose to stay on our own narrow path. That image fit."

Above all, *Tightrope* reinforces the deep bond shared by the members of Chatham County Line. The lineup has consisted of the same four men for ten years now, giving them an unusually solid foundation. They have grown up together, weathered storms together, and performed around the world – fostering a vital, instinctive collaborative sensibility and deep reserves of trust.



As a teenager from the 60's San Francisco psychedelic blues music scene, Gaye Lee shied away from the "Janis" stigma that has followed her through the years. Wanting to be appreciated for her own "style", Gaye Lee embarked on her own musical journey for many years that eventually brought her back to her "Janis" roots. Deciding to finally embrace the music of Janis Joplin and satisfy her audience,

Berry, The Coasters, Dee Dee Sharp, and blues greats including James Cotton, Hubert Sumlin, Carey Bell, and Luther Guitar Johnson. Steady and deliberate, Pete brings the 60's alive with his awesome attitude and loving spirit. Also singing background vocals, Pete Burger rounds out the band Pearl Moon.

Powerhouse guitarist Roger McConnell, bassist Trey Longstreth and drummer Pete Burger, aka Pete the Beat, join forces with Gaye Lee Russell to create a chemistry that recalls the positive vibes of the flower generation and the unique vocal power of Janis Joplin. Together they recreate the truest essence and dynamic style of Janis with the most accurate renditions of Janis Joplin songs imaginable!

VINCE STAPLES PAISLEY TOUR

On Saturday, July 19, the Community Center for the Performing Arts and University of Oregon Campus Radio 88.1 FM KWVA proudly welcome Vince Staples' "The Paisley Summer Tour" with special guests Audio Push and Skeme.

West Coast natives Vince Staples, Audio Push and Skeme are joining forces for a summer tour of the West Coast and Southwest states, "The Paisley Summer Tour". The three artists begin the tour on July 17th in Seattle, Washington, and they'll run through Portland, Eugene, California and several other states before finally wrapping things up in Las Vegas on August 5th.

VINCE STAPLES

In April, Vince Staples played two shows at the WOW Hall with the ScHoolboy Q "Oxymoron" Tour. Both shows sold out. Now Staples is back to headline his own show.

After partnering with longtime collaborator Michael Uzowuru for the acclaimed Winter In Prague mixtape in 2012 and Mac Miller (under the alias Larry Fisherman) for the revered Stolen Youth mixtape in 2013, Vince Staples returns to his musical roots. With the release of Shyne Coldchain II, the gifted Long Beach, California rapper delivers the type of introspective reality-based street lyricism that has made him one of rap's rising stars.

"It's been a minute since I've really been 100 percent hands-on me, myself really going all the way in, deciding everything," explains Vince Staples, one of the latest signees to the legendary Def Jam Recordings. "So it's more personal this time than it has been with the last two I dropped. It's more of a complete vision for me. I feel like it's always going to turn out better that way."

Case in point is the powerful "Nate". Produced by Scoop DeVille and featuring James Fauntleroy, the hard-hitting selection features Vince Staples reflecting upon the influence his father had on his life, even though he was incarcerated.

"I never looked at my father like he was wrong," Vince Staples reveals. "Growing up how I grew up, people would often would say, 'It's no fathers. It's just deadbeats.' But in reality, it's just a bunch of dudes who never had something trying to figure out how to do it. If you ain't never prepared a meal before, the first time you cook, it's probably going to be bad. That's just how it is."

Elsewhere, Vince Staples drops the third installment of his "Progressive" series of songs with the Evidence & DJ Babu-produced "Progressive 3" and revisits the pain he caused his mother when he joined a gang in the remarkable "Trunk Rattle".

Writing such stirring songs, ones where Vince Staples turns the microscope on himself and his family and reports upon the good and the bad in honest, unflinching ways, is part of what makes his music among the genre's most remarkable.

"Ain't nothing realer than the truth," he explains. "Ain't nothing better than the truth, like I really did all that. I really seen all that. I really been around that my whole life."

The rest of the 10-cut *Shyne Coldchain II* features production from trailblazing producer and Def Jam Recordings executive No I.D. (Jay Z, Big Sean), as well as guest vocals from Jhené Aiko on the Childish Major-produced "Oh You Scared".

With a string of potent mixtapes, extensive touring opportunities and a spot on the roster of a legendary label, Vince Staples remains focused on making magnificent material.

"I'm just working on music," he says. "That's my life now, so I'm giving it everything that I got."

AUDIO PUSH

Young West Coast rappers Oktane and Pricetag together form the hip-hop duo, Audio Push. Best known for their stylish song "Shine", off of their latest mixtape, *Come As You Are*, as well as for the West Coast dance move known as "Jerkin", Audio Push has signed to Interscope and are also members of Hit Boy's HS'87 hip-hop group. Quite prolific, they have released a grand total of eight mixtapes since 2009.

In 2013, Audio Push appeared on the posse cut "Cypher", alongside artists such as ScHoolboy Q, Rick Ross, and Method Man.

SKEME

After years of delivering highly regarded, street-certified material, including 2010's *Pistols & Palm Trees* and 2011's *The Statement* and *Before My Next Statement*, Skeme decided it was time to reevaluate his creative approach.

"I've spent a lot of time going against the grain, going against what people wanted," the Inglewood, California rapper says. "Now that I've come of age and seeing how things work in the music industry, I'm giving people what they want and it's what I want to say."

Skeme's first foray in this new direction was his *Bare With Me* mixtape, a hard-hitting, 21-cut collection hosted by DJ Skee and DJ Base that features the street favorite "All That", longtime affiliates Game and TeeFlii on the club-ready cut "Poor Money" and Nipsey Hussle on "Cuban Linx".


Skeme's grounded approach makes sense. He's loyal to those within his circle and isn't trying to make business and creative moves that don't serve the long-term benefit of his team and his movement.

"I always have had a leader mentality with the homies," he says. "I'm probably the youngest person in my circle that has it going on for himself. It's different level of responsibility when you're wanting to be the example."



Purveyors of Western Thrash, Ventura County's The Pullmen are celebrating the release of Pine Ridge.

The Pullmen's studio debut, The Western Score, resonated with both fans and critics as a magnificent mutation of real Western twang with a blue-collar punk ethos. The unconventional combination of stylistic brash won a discerning cross section of followers few could reach. From Wanda Jackson and Donavon Frankenreiter to Guttermouth and Riverboat Gamblers, the range of The Pullmen resulted in non-traditional pairings going off without a hitch.

The Pullmen continue their narrative with the follow-up EP, Pine Ridge. Somewhere between Lee Ving and Clint Eastwood, they balance the art of storytelling with the spontaneity of rock 'n' roll release. These recordings were never released due to members disbanding and being replaced.

It was then that Omnihility began to write the material for the album, Biogenesis, as well as signing a one album contract with both the labels Sevared Records and Butchered Records. Biogenesis was finished in the summer of 2012 and released on both labels in the fall of that same year.

Shortly after the release, Armen Koroghlian had to move to the East Coast due to personal family matters that could not be ignored. At that time, Steve Crum stepped in to fill the drumming position.

After a few months of self promotion coupled with promotions from the album's labels, Omnihility contacted Unique Leader Records. This resulted in a highly anticipated response in which a multi-album deal came forth. Omnihility plans to unleash the most brutal technical death metal they can conceive on their Unique Leader releases.

Omnihility has shared the stage with Fallujah, Dismal Lapse, Vital Remains, Origin, Abysmal Dawn, Decapitated, Rings Of Saturn, Decrepit Birth, Hate Eternal, Goatwhore, Theories, and many more. Be prepared as the onslaught ensues.

Dark Confidant is a metal band from Eugene formed in February of 2013.

IT'S MC YOGI TIME!

For a good time, sit next to the beat-happy, Krishna-crazed love magnet known as MC Yogi as he works his creative magic up in his Northern California studio, Photoshopping all kinds of dazzling personal India travel photos into wild collage art that will serve as backdrop for his "cosmic, electrifying" new shows with one hand, while simultaneously blasting tracks from his latest record, *Pilgrimage*, with the other.

"This record is the soundtrack to my journey to India, circling the sacred mountain Arunachala in the heart of Tamil Nadu, and discovering the intricate root system of yoga," Yogi says, eyes gleaming, as if casually describing the recipe to a funkified cocktail made of time and incense and God.

"It's a sonic trip, a journey toward the Self, toward what the yoga masters call the Supreme Soul," he adds, as chaotic street sounds of India blast through the speakers, mixing with madhouse beats, old-school turntable scratches and oh my Shiva those horns, with Yogi effortlessly rhyming over it all, and all of it so hook-laden and sun-blasted you can't help bobbing your head and aching to find a dance floor somewhere, preferably one with lots of Nag Champa and chanting.

The influences on *Pilgrimage* are all over the musical map. World beat, hip-hop, Bollywood, reggae, dancehall, house, dub. Indian tabla player and electronica producer Karsh Kale shows up on "Shedding Skin", a track that serves as homage to one of Yogi's foremost teachers, the late Larry Schulz, and also features DJ Solomon, who passed in early 2012 laying the scratches and turntablism for what would be his final project. Death and rebirth, you might say, are prominent themes.

As for Yogi himself, the basics are easy enough: he was born the same year as the Sony Walkman and the Cray supercomputer, 1979. He has a beautiful, powerhouse wife named Amanda with whom he co-teaches yoga in their sumptuous little studio in Northern California. A rescued pit bull, Mahatma, is the couple's personal guru.

Yogi himself is as devoted a practicioner and truth-seeker as you'll find anywhere. He reads the *Bhagavad Gita* every day, and follows Gandhi's humble practice of not speaking a word on Mondays. The rest of the time is split between creating art, running the couple's yoga studio, and of course, the music.

Here's where the story gets...colorful. A tranquil early childhood was cut short by a surprise family implosion that led Yogi to all kinds of messy rebellion: dropping out of school, graffiti punkdom, pre-teen drug abuse, stealing cars, lashing out at everyone and everything and not quite knowing why. Hey, it happens.

It all led to the honor of being kicked out of no less than four schools by the time he was 17 before finally, by way of an unexpected introduction to yoga and classical Hindu philosophy, a complete rediscovery of self, of the yogic path, of the true meaning of music, love and the million faces of God.

Wait; not done yet. Mix in all manner of pop culture influence: The Doors, the Beatles, the Beastie Boys, Lee "Scratch" Perry, Star Trek, Star Wars and Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom, classic comic books and lots of wonderfully insane Bollywood movies. Overlay it all with a preternatural gift for rhyming, and you've got a story for the alterna-rap record books.

"I'm just a working class mystic," shrugs the enviably laid back Yogi, grinning a little as he adjusts his trademark fedora, kicks up his Adidas and cranks the volume on "Born to Fly", an instantly addictive new track from *Pilgrimage*, one of those bouncy dub-rap songs that's so catchy it can stick in your head for a year -- but in a good way.

Mellow though he may appear, when it comes to the music and the art, Yogi is positively supercharged with a love of message like few others on the yogic path, and probably no other hip-hop musicians you can name.

Square Peg Concerts welcomes MC Yogi to the WOW Hall on Wednesday, July 23, with special guests DJ Sol Rising. Tickets are \$16.50 in advance, \$19 at the door, and are available from WOW Hall and Ticketmaster. Doors open at 7:30 pm and showtime is 8:00. ★



RITTZ ON TOUR

On Monday, July 21, way-2hott.com presents The Rittz OD Tour with special guests Tuki Carter and Raz Simone.

Rittz is a Strange Music recording artist (Tech N9ne's label) who is headlining a nation-wide tour. The OD Tour will kick off on June 17th in Washington, DC and will conclude as currently scheduled on August 12th in Birmingham, AL.

Rittz says he's "just a normal guy who raps" -- a contradiction if there ever was one -- but he makes you believe, with the humility of the everyman and the talent of a superstar.

Raised in Gwinnett County, Georgia, Rittz embodies the same level of irony and self-conflict as his hometown, -- a suburb of Atlanta known as the Northside. Born into a musical family, he, his twin sister and their brother had always been exposed to the inner workings of music. The fact that their parents were heavily into rock and roll ensured that the kids were always around instruments or in studios. Once Rittz got to junior high, his musical tastes evolved. Atlanta's booming bass and rap movement had traveled north on I-85 to get the entire metro area jumping.

"When I moved here, I was introduced to rap music. When I started rapping, I was listening to any early Rap-A-Lot records, like Willie D, Geto Boys... Kilo [Ali] was like the first. So when I started at 12 years old, my early raps, I tried to rap like them," he explains, "but the early Outkast, and Goodie Mob was really the beginning of me wanting to rap and imitate them in finding my own style. Me and another guy were in a group called Ralo and

Rittz [1995-2003], we were like the white Outkast, or we tried to be like that. I had a studio in my basement, and we put out a bunch of tapes in Gwinnett. I felt like we were one of the first, if not the first... There were only maybe one or two other people rapping in Gwinnett at the time, from '95 to 2000."

During the earlier part of the millennium though, around 2003, Rittz had hit a wall. After eight years, he and Ralo had matured in different directions. His promising buzz had led to countless disappointments.

"I won Battlegrounds on Hot 107.9... and felt like I was 'bout to make it. But, so many industry up and downs, with managers, contracts..."

He was dead broke, feeling dejected, and living with friends - ready to resign from the rap game before even taking his rightful place in it. It wasn't until 2009 when he'd randomly received a call from another flamespitter who was repping an area as under-the-radar as Gwinnett was.

"I'm getting older, thinking it's time to hang it up," Rittz recalls thinking. "This isn't gonna happen and that's when Yelawolf put me on 'Box Chevy.' [on Yelawolf's *Trunk Muzik*]."

Nowadays, the rap career of Rittz is rapidly on the rise due to his first mixtape, *Rittz White Jesus* (hilariously inspired by a friend's term of endearment).

Everyone is asked to give it all they've got, but only in the way that feels good and right to them. Cynthia's intention is to hold a space for you to play, as you are, right now, however that is and in whatever "shape" you

The men and women who come to class are as diverse as you can get: ages 20 to 70, tons of dance experience and no experience at all, super fit or just getting started, first-timers and diehards. They all have one thing in common: they come to class to feel their hearts pound, get bathed in sound, and leave every care in the world outside for awhile. This is powerful stuff. Add to all that the fact that you burn about 850 calories in an hour and use EVERY muscle you have and people see some radical changes in their bodies over time.

Cynthia leads the choreography, but she'll remind you not to worry if you don't always get it. She'll give you the cues and if you're going right and everyone else is going left -- you just keep

having fun. When it comes to following the moves, her philosophy is: "Don't sweat it. Just sweat."

Zumba instructors use hand signals (and the occasional hooting and hollering) to cue the moves so you can stay with the music and just relax and feel it. Zumba is a high-energy workout, but it's easier than you think. The moves mimic the music so when the phrasing of a song repeats you will see the same choreography. Cynthia sprinkles in new songs every couple weeks so you are SURE not to be bored, but not so many that you have to think too much. It does get easier every time. The goal is for it to NOT feel like a workout, but to feel like a party and place where you can let go of stress, get happy, feel sexy and powerful; all while getting into amazing shape. It's hard not to get hooked!
