Adult Workshops are charged per the workshop session of 7-8 classes. Session 1: Last week of Aug—3rd week of Oct.

Session 2: 4th week of Oct—3rd week of Dec (no class Thanksgiving week)

Fall Prevention for Seniors is cost is \$5 drop in fee.

Senior Tap cost is \$10 drop in fee or \$70 for the session of 8 classes.

Senior classes follow the workshop schedule of sessions (see above).

### **Volunteers Needed**

If you are waiting for your student during their class and would like to help us out, please let us know. We almost always have a need for volunteers.

# Tuition

The annual registration fee is \$75 per student or \$120 per family and is non-refundable.

Monthly payments are processed through JackRabbit on the 3rd of every month. If your credit card fails for any reason, you have until the 10th of the month to update our files and make your payment. If payment is not received by the 10th of the month a \$50 late fee will be incurred. Tuition payments must be received monthly for your student to participate in class. If you would like to pay by cash or check, that can be completed at the front desk before the 10th to avoid the late fee. The months of August (2 weeks) and December (3 weeks) are prorated.

If you are interested in paying for the full year in advance, please see the School Operations Manager to make payment.

There is a commitment deadline and fee for various performing opportunities. Tuition must be up to date for your student to participate in demonstrations, special events, or performances.

You are required to give a 30-day notice to leave the program. Balances will continue to accrue whether or not your student is in class.

## Family Discount:

Full tuition is paid on the highest-level student and then each additional family member is discounted 5%.

## Boys/Young Men:

Boys/young men enrolled in the Student Division in Levels 1-3 are given a 50% discount. Young men in Level 4 and above will receive 100% tuition if they commit to all classes.

### Tights

Children's Division—Pink/skin tone tights—Footed or Transitional

Student Division—Pink/skin tone tights—Transitional

Pre Professional Division—Pink/skin tone tights—Transitional *Tights and shoes should complement each other in either pink or flesh tone as appropriate.* 

### Boys/Men

Black shorts/leggings, white t-shirt and black ballet shoes.

#### Outer Wear

All students should wear coverups and different shoes when arriving at the school. Ballet shoes should never be worn outside.

#### **Ballet Shoes**

Pink ballet shoes with sewn elastic. Drawstrings must be tucked in. Either split or full sole is acceptable . Slipper style shoes are not acceptable

#### Hair

Proper hair is an important part of ballet etiquette. Hair should be pulled away from the face and neck in a high bun. Short hair must be secured back away from the face.



#### Jewelry

No jewelry except post earrings.

#### Warm-up Clothes

No warm-up clothes or cover-ups can be worn in ballet class.

#### Pointe Shoes Level 4 & Up

All pointe shoes must have sewn elastics and ribbons. First instructions will be provided by the teacher in class. Level 4 students, please wait to purchase your first pointe shoes until the teachers instructs you to do so. Any strings or torn material hanging off the tips must be removed.

#### **Ballet Skirts**

Skirts may be optional for some pointe & variations classes at instructor's discretion.

# **Rules & Policies**

### Drop Off/Pick Up:

All students should enter and exit from the building using the Sacramento Ballet entrance on the south side of the building from the parking lot.

The door will require a code to enter if it is dark outside. The School will send out this code via email periodically throughout the school year. All students must sign in and out at the front desk for security reasons.

Please note that Sacramento Ballet is not a child-care provider. Our fees do not reflect supervision outside the studio. Students must be picked up within 15 minutes of the end of their class. If you are unable to pick up your child in a timely fashion, kindly call the front desk to make them aware. Parents will be charged a fee of \$5.00 per 15 minutes for any time the staff must wait beyond the allowed pick up time.

### Attendance:

Students are expected to attend every class for which they are scheduled. Consistent attendance is critical to progress. Please make sure your child arrives to class at least 5-10 minutes before class begins, ready to learn and work. Late arrivals disrupt class concentration. Students late to any class may be asked to sit and observe.

Please notify the school as soon as you may know of an absence.

Missing more than 10% of classes will affect participation in performances and may require repeating the level the following year.

### Make Up Classes:

If a student would like to take a make up class in the Children's Division or in Level 1 or 2, please contact the front desk to schedule an appropriate class.

Level 3—Pre-Pro may take any class in a lower level with prior approval from the teacher.

## Sickness and Injuries:

In the event of an illness please keep your child at home and notify the front desk as soon as possible.

Injured students are asked to observe required classes and rehearsals while recovering from injury. If they're under the care of a doctor, both a doctor's note and release letter are required.

## Ballet Classroom Etiquette:

- Talking in class is not permitted. If a student has a question, they should raise their hand and wait to be called on.
- Only bottled water is allowed in the studio. Eating and drinking is allowed in the hallway. Students MUST clean up after themselves.
- Students should not touch or place anything on the pianos or electronic equipment.
- All electronics must be silenced and kept in a dance bag. Sacramento Ballet is not responsible for any missing valuables. Students are responsible for keeping their belongings secure.
- Children's Division students should store their items in the black cubbies. Upper level female students should use the dressing room and upper level boys should bring their bags into the studios.

# Code of Conduct

It is the policy of The School of Sacramento Ballet to maintain a positive and productive learning and working environment for all students, staff and Company Artists. As part of their training, students are expected to behave in a responsible and disciplined manner and to adhere to the rules and regulations in this document, both inside the Sacramento Ballet facility and outside in the greater community when representing The School of Sacramento Ballet or the Company.

The School of Sacramento Ballet strives to ensure that all rules are clear and reasonable, and students are expected to observe the established Code of Conduct. Sacramento Ballet reserves the right to suspend or dismiss any student whose conduct or attitude is found to be unsatisfactory.

The School of Sacramento Ballet emphasizes discipline, focus, a positive attitude and proper classroom etiquette.

We will utilize a "Three Strikes Rule" regarding disciplinary action. A "Strike" is applied when a student does not fulfill the rules, procedures, and standards of conduct as outlined in the Code of Conduct Agreement.

How the Three Strikes Rule works:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Strike—Warning by Faculty or staff member; the student is reported to School Director.
- 2nd Strike—Disciplinary meeting with School Director; phone call to parent or legal guardian.
- 3rd Strike—Parent or Legal Guardian meeting with School Director.

- The School of Sacramento Ballet recommends a no use policy regarding social media. Any contact of classmates in a group chat or other groups on social media which does not include all and/or speaks poorly of the organization or others is strictly forbidden.
- The School of Sacramento Ballet reserves the right to determine, at its discretion, which actions fail to meet the principles and philosophy of the school. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in a warning, disciplinary action short of dismissal, suspension of a student, revocation of a parent/ guardian's privilege to attend or to participate in school activities, or dismissal depending on the severity of the offense.
- Bullying, harassment, or discrimination, including via social media, will not be tolerated. Students or adults who witness bullying, harassment, or discrimination should report it to the front desk immediately.
