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DESCRIPTION

MINISTER'S DIRECTIVE

No. MD 01-08

“Special Education” means programming and/or services designed to accommodate students within the public school system whose educational needs require interventions different from, or in addition to, those which are needed by most students.

“Special Education needs” refers to:

- (i) educational needs of students where there is substantive normative agreement such as blind and partially sighted, deaf and partially hearing, severe and profound mental handicap, multiple handicaps.
- (ii) educational needs of students who have significant difficulties in learning which do not appear to be attributable to (i) or (iii).
- (iii) educational needs of children which are significant and are considered to arise primarily from socio-economic, cultural and/or linguistic forms.

SPECIAL EDUCATION MATERIALS BUDGET

Every school has a Special Education Materials Budget for resources for special education students. This money is allotted by the Department of Education and is separate from any monies provided by the Eastern School District or Western School Board. Each school should receive its budget allocation sometime in April. This money is to be used during the government's fiscal year (from April 1, 2008 - March 31, 2009.) Contact the Student Support Specialist at 368-4472 to review your school's budget status. **EVERY SCHOOL MUST STAY WITHIN ITS BUDGET ALLOTMENT WHEN ORDERING.**

LOANING OF MATERIALS

For schools which do not have the funds to purchase the variety of materials they would like to be using or for schools which would like to use a particular resource for a short time, the Student Support Specialist can usually arrange for a six-week loan of the material. Almost every title listed in this document is available for loan.

Resource/special education teachers can phone or e-mail their requests; the courier will be used to deliver the materials.

TITLES DESIGNATED NON-CONSUMABLE

Most softcover workbooks have been designated non-consumable. Schools should consider these resources as textbooks and when possible, should teach the students how to record their answers in a notebook or use a piece of acetate over the page and ask students to record their answers with a non-permanent marker. Either way, schools will then be able to reuse these workbooks.

COST OF MATERIALS

The cost of each resource has been listed in the *Student Support Resource Guide* to enable the schools to make the best choices with their allotted money. These prices must be considered as approximate as publishers increase their costs periodically.

SPECIAL ORDERS

Any teacher looking to order materials that have not been listed in this document, must have approval from the Student Support Specialist prior to sending in your order.

Special orders, which accompany May's Special Education orders, *without prior approval*, will not be accepted.

ORDERING INFORMATION

Schools are expected to spend the bulk of their allotment on their May 2008 order. All orders must be mailed or faxed to the Student Support Specialist for authorization using the enclosed forms. Any titles that prove inappropriate may be returned to the Student Support Specialist as long as **they are on the list of core resources (pg. 6)** and your file will be credited.

- Please be advised that money cannot be carried over from one year to the next. The final order must be placed by the end of March 2009.
- Please make a photocopy of your completed order and check off each item as it arrives from PLMDC. Please indicate to your School Book contact that the item numbers of your special education titles will begin with the prefix 130-3xxxx. Contact the Student Support Specialist by e-mail before December 31, 2008 regarding any problems with your order.
- For teachers who prefer to have a small balance for unexpected needs, \$20.00 is sufficient. Please keep in mind that only core resources listed on page 6 are available for ordering throughout the year.
- ***Please note:***
Any discrepancies with May's Special Education must be brought forward no later than December 31st, 2008.

There is a wide range of students with varying math capabilities in every class. Teachers are expected to accommodate students who are working at up to two years below grade level within the scope of the regular math program. Adaptations such as:

- Using a calculator or multiplication chart
- Giving extra time

There is a wide range of students with varying math capabilities in every class. Teachers are expected to accommodate students who are working at up to two years below grade level within the scope of the regular math program. Adaptations such as:
