ENVIRONMENT & FORESTRY REPORT—Bob Nikolic, Director



Greetings to all Campers and welcome to new summer season.

In mid-May we carried out phosphorus water sampling and Secchi readings. We will also carry out Secchi readings in mid-July and again mid-September which will give us a good water clarity average for the season. There are plans to test the lake for oxygen content which is vital information as far as lake trout is concerned. It should give us some idea about water conditions to support this species.

As far as forestry is concerned there is harvest going on by Chartrand outside 1km no summer harvest. There is new road at about 9 km mark on Shaw road and harvest is located north of the road and quite far away from the lake. We will be visiting the site to monitor operations and don't expect any problem with this company.

Enjoy the clean water and beautiful forest around you – so many people around the world do not have a chance to do the same.

On June 4, 2016, the Trout Lake Campers Association AGM members had the privilege of attending a presentation on Emergency Preparedness. A big thank you to the facilitators Darrell Duval from Ornge and Robert Smith (Paramedic Services - Sudbury/Manitoulin Emergency Management Services).

The presentation was not only informative but it was engaging as well. They provided information on services available to residents in the area including land/air ambulances and the various services available at the time of need including specific medications and other life saving devices.

Discussion followed on the use of helicopter service and land ambulance service with the need to utilize GPS locations to assist in the accuracy of locating those in need of help. The importance of keeping your GPS location in a visible accessible area such as on your fridge was suggested.


We are recommending our members obtain their GPS coordinates i.e.: Longitude and latitudinal locates which can be found on your GPS or cellphone. Consider downloading an application called "Where am I?" https://ctrlq.org/maps/where.

Also recommended was keeping emergency information on hand for professional service attendants such as personal data including drugs being prescribed, health card number, address, latitude and longitude for those in the residence.

The presentation was followed by a question and answer period. Campers are urged to visit the websites for both organizations to obtain more information.




FISHERY REPORT—Larry Hewitt

CAMPFIRE & BURNING REGULATIONS (Ministry of Natural Resources & Forestry)

You are responsible for fires you light

From April through October, people using outdoor fires must follow <u>strict guidelines</u> under the Forest Fires Prevention Act of Ontario to ensure their fires are properly managed.

Anyone who starts a fire outdoors must take all necessary steps to tend the fire, keep it under control, and make sure the fire is out before leaving the site. A person failing to burn safely could be fined and held responsible for the cost of putting out the fire. People living in municipalities should check with local fire officials for bylaws on outdoor fires.

Rules to burn wood, brush and leaves

You don't need a fire permit to burn piled wood, brush, leaves or wood by-products if you follow these rules:

- ignite the fire no sooner than 2 hours before sunset and extinguish it no later than 2 hours after sunrise
- burn only a single pile at any one time
- ensure the pile is less than 2 metres in diameter and less than 2 metres high
- keep the fire at least 2 metres from any flammable materials
- have tools or water adequate to contain the fire at the fire site

ensure a responsible person tends the fire until it is extinguished

Using an incinerator

You don't need a fire permit to burn piled wood, brush, leaves or wood by-products in an incinerator if you :

- ensure the incinerator is an enclosed device constructed entirely of non-combustible material
- cover the incinerator with a screen having a mesh size of not more than 5 millimetres
- keep the incinerator at least 5 metres from any forest area
- keep the incinerator at least 2 metres from any flammable material

ensure a responsible person monitors the fire until it is extinguished

To get a permit, contact your local municipality or the nearest Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry office. (705) 564-7823

How to build a safe campfire

Choose a site

- pick a site close to a water source and sheltered from the wind
- build your fire on a rock surface or bare dirt
- build your fire at least three metres away from logs, stumps, trees and overhanging branches
- build your fire 15 metres away from buildings or tents

Prepare the site

- clear a space (about two metres wide) for the fire
- remove pine needles, grass, leaves and twigs
- scrape the area right down to the soil
- ensure you have a pail of water and a shovel to control the fire

Build your campfire

- keep your fire small it shouldn't be bigger than one metre high and one metre wide
- small fires are safer, easier to control, and easier to put out
- a small fire will also keep cooking tools from blackening and let you get close enough to cook

Stay nearby

- never leave a campfire unattended
- if you start a campfire, you are responsible for tending it, ensuring it is kept under control, and putting it out

Put the fire out

Use the following steps to put your fire out.
pour lots of water on the campfire
stir the ashes with a stick
pour more water over top of it

Repeat these three steps until:

- the ashes don't hiss
- everything looks wet
- no more smoke comes from the ashes

Safety tips for kids

- always have adult supervision when you are around a fire
- never play with matches or fireworks

if you see a fire burning out of control, tell an adult immediately



Even Biodegradable Soap Can Pollute Water Sources

We really need to clear up some misconceptions about biodegradable soap. There are many people out there with good intentions who are using biodegradable camp soap or shampoo IN THE LAKE, thinking that it is good for the environment. Biodegradable soaps are preferred over other soaps but should still be used at least 200 feet from any water sources.

All soaps, unfortunately even biodegradable ones, can contaminate fresh water sources.

Using a biodegradable soap doesn't reduce its immediate environmental impact...

..it just means that the soap will biodegrade in time.

What does biodegradable mean? Well by definition it means capable of being decomposed by biological agents like bacteria. Materials are usually deemed biodegradable if they break down to at least 90% h2O, CO2 and biomass within 6 months, although some materials may take years to biodegrade. Keep in mind that biodegradability doesn't necessarily mean environmentally friendly.



Biodegradable Camp Soap:

• Biodegradable soap is NOT biodegradable waten it ends up in a river or lake because it requires

soil for it to breakdown properly.

• Biodegradable soap is NOT NATURAL.... it is a chemical. If you wouldn't want to drink it then keep it out of water sources.

What to use instead of Biodegradable Soap:

- Use a washcloth.
 - Hot water and a little scrubbing can clean mostly anything.
 - Scrub dirt or grime away with wet sand and/or tiny pebbles.
 - Use alcohol based waterless hand sanitizers to kill germs. Soap is not 100% necessary for good personal hygiene

If you feel you must use soap:

Make sure that any <u>brands of biodegradable soap</u> you use are actually biodegradable and phosphate-free.

- Be sure to use biodegradable soap sparingly.
- Do all washing, bathing, or cleaning at least 200 feet from any water sources.
- Dispose of soapy wash and rinse water in a hole 6 inches deep to allow bacteria in the soil to com pletely biodegrade the soap.

Guess where we should use biodegradable soap? At home, instead of regular detergents. Hey let's all try to be "green" and lessen my environmental footprint any way we can.

The last thing anyone wants is a blue green algae bloom in front of their property. Remember why you come to the lake, for its pristine beauty and cleanliness. Please don't jeopardize it for everyone.


