General Information

Online Registration: Online registration for camp is available on the RCDS website, as well as an attachment to e-notes. Registration closes on Tuesday, June 2nd. Registration should be submitted prior to this day. Shortly after registering, you will receive an email confirming that your registration has been received. Campers who previously registered for the on-campus camp program will be given priority. Specific camps do have maximum numbers. If a camp cannot be offered because of insufficient enrollment, you will be notified as soon as possible, and your account will not be charged.

Payment: Please do not send payments by check, as all camp fees will be charged to your school account. The fee is \$50.00 per camp.

Virtual Participation: All camp instruction will take place on the video-conferencing platform, Zoom. Several days prior to the start of camp, you will receive a Zoom link and password to access your child's camp. Campers are expected to adhere to the general <u>Zoom Guidelines</u> set by <u>RCDS@home</u>.

Supplies: Campers will need a PC, iPad, or tablet Some camps require supplies or apps. Please gather the supplies listed in the program description before the first day of camp. Supplies are <u>not</u> provided by *RCDS* Wildcat Mini-Camp.

Withdrawal: If a camper withdraws from a registered mini-camp <u>after Tuesday</u>, <u>June 2nd</u>, <u>no refund will be</u> made.

Absence: If your child is unable to attend camp due to illness or scheduled absence, please notify the Camp Coordinator, Nicole Leath at email <u>wildcatminicamp@ryecountryday.org</u>
