

I hope that you are doing well and are having an enjoyable and safe summer! The weeks are going by quickly and we look forward to welcoming our students into the building for the 2021-2022 school year. We are busy in the building with renovations, repairs, and upgrades, but we are anticipating that all major work will be completed by August 13. This will be our first newsletter for the summer months. We will continue sending information to you on a weekly basis as needed.

Summer Programs – I am pleased to share that our students are enjoying Discover Earth Camp under the direction of Mrs. Angel McCoy and her team. The students have been having a wonderful time exploring a variety of hands-on, fun, and engaging STEM activities during the week and going to the pool on Fridays. We have a total of 42 students enrolled in the Summer IXL program. 35 students have been participating weekly and are reaping the benefits. I have enjoyed meeting with the students during the week and tracking their progress. The students are excited about their progress and how the program challenges them as well as rewards them when they reach a goal. IXL has reported that we have answered 13, 507 questions. We have mastered 320 skills and become proficient in 355 skills. Students have spent a total of 83 hours practicing and growing their skills! I am pleased with the IXL program and look forward to bringing it to the school in the fall.

Enrollment for the 2021-2022 School Year – Enrollment is well on its way at TA Prep and classes are filling up quickly. If you have not yet enrolled, please do so ASAP and complete your financial agreement so your student(s) will be ready for the upcoming school year. TA Prep will be fully open for the 2021-2022 school year. If you have extenuating circumstances that would keep your child from returning to the building and you would like to continue with virtual learning for the upcoming year, please contact Mrs. Booker-Malcolm. I am excited about the plans that God has in store for TA Prep and look forward to a phenomenal school year! Construction and Renovation Updates – TA Prep has several projects going on in the building this summer. We are excited to share with you that the hall bathrooms are being renovated. They will be freshly painted with new flooring and touchless water faucets. TA Prep is replacing all lights in the building and replacing them with LED lighting, which will provide us with savings and make us more energy efficient. Security needs to be a priority for TA Prep and so we are putting cameras and a security system in the building, improving the overall safety of our school. Finally, we are doing an overhaul of our network infrastructure in order to create a space for increased productivity. I am thankful that the projects at this time are scheduled to be completed by August 13. Please continue to keep TA Prep in prayer through the renovation process.



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Staffing Updates – I am pleased to announce that we have hired a new school counselor. Ms. Raysa Creque is a bilingual mental health Christian therapist who has experience working with children and adolescents. Her areas of expertise include reconciling, counseling, behavioral health, and interpersonal relationships. Ms. Creque will begin August 5. She is a member of our own Takoma Park Church. Unfortunately, every year, staff leave for a variety of reasons. We will be losing our school nurse, Mrs. Jennifer Danticat. Mrs. Danticat has been offered a position in a hospital and will continue her exceptional health care services there. She will be truly missed, but will continue to support TA Prep as a parent. TA Prep is currently looking for a Registered Nurse for the upcoming school year. Please contact Mrs. Booker-Malcolm if you are interested in this position.

TA Prep Athletics Program – We are beyond thrilled to share with you our plans for the TA Prep Athletic Program. We know last year was tough on EVERYONE, but this coming year we plan on bringing you our FULL athletic program. This means all three team sports will be returning. We will offer boys and girls soccer in the fall, boys and girls basketball in the winter, and co-ed flag football in the spring! I will provide more in depth detail once the school year starts. We also plan on bringing back a revamped intramural program as well as other athletic opportunities for the younger grades. Athletics is an integral part of the TA Prep experience and we could not be more excited to bring these programs back while making sure they are fun, challenging, and of course SAFE. 
