

# Green Space Dream Getting Closer

A charge conference was held on November 11th to acquire 1539 Ninth Street. The vote was unanimous in favor of purchasing the property. This is amazing news! Cornerstone has been dreaming for years of having a green space for church picnics, upwards soccer, our children and youth, and whatever God has in store! We purchased the property for around \$30,000. We could use help if God puts it on your heart to offset the cost.

### **Christmas Offering**

This year's Christmas offering will go toward two great causes.

1) Honduras Mission-JARDIN DE GRACIA (Garden of Grace) MISSION SCHOOL is a ten year old mission, located in Honduras. This mission was formed to serve the very poorest of the poor in this area through educational programs. Without help, these devastatingly poor children would probably receive no education at all. Cornerstone is going to Jardin De Gracia in July 2014.

2) Upwards Sports-Cornerstone hosts over 250 kids every winter in basketball and cheer leading. The experience is fun for the kids and they hear the message of Jesus every week in practice and games. Many kids cannot play without help in the form of scholarships.

Please look for the Christmas Giving Tree in the Cornerstone Welcome Center.

The Christmas Giving Tree is a Portsmouth tradition begun thirty years ago to provide, in celebration of the birth of Christ, gifts for over 1,200 community children in need.

Select a child's name, then leave your name and contact information on the sheet. You should take the card for the shopping information.

GIVING TREE Pair up with a church friend and share a name if this is more convenient.


Coordinators will shop for you. Make a donation clearly marked for the Christmas Giving Tree. You can select the child's name if you wish and put this with your donation.

Sunday school classes and small groups are encouraged to share a name or perhaps a family. You will know a family because all the children have the same number. The ideal is all children in one family will receive comparable gifts.

Gifts are due back to the church by Sunday, December 8th. If possible, put your gifts in a large plastic bag with the tag exposed so nothing is separated during their transit. It is not hard to imagine the delight you will provide a child through your loving gift this Christmas. Joy!

#### Foodbank

These are some of the ways you can help Cornerstone's growing list of families to be served during the December 20th foodbank:

1. Donate canned vegetables, yams, package of dressing, cereal, peanut butter or other non perishable food item. Look for the container in the Cornerstone Welcome Center. Donate funds so these and other items can be purchased.

2. Wear a red top or Christmas sweater and distribute food on December 20th 9:15 to 11:15 AM. Bring your Santa hat! Be prepared to sing carols and spread Christmas cheer.

3. Share a sweater or coat you no longer need. Bring to the church in advance or the day of the foodbank. Look for the box by the coat rack near the church office.

4. Help set up the night before the foodbank. This requires heavy lifting.

5. Celebrate the generosity of Cornerstone's congregation in providing for a growing number of families and seniors with food insecurity. Every month guests comment Cornerstone's generosity is

If you know a high school boy or girl you will want to know all about the upcoming Southern Ohio Chrysalis flights. The Girls' Flight is scheduled for Saturday, January 18 through Monday, January 20. The Boys' Flight is scheduled for Saturday, February 15 through Monday, February 17.

So..... "what is Chrysalis all about" you might ask! Chrysalis is a three-day spiritual experience for high school students. Here at Cornerstone we have made special arrangements to accommodate college students as well. The three-day experience, called a "flight" is designed to bring participants closer to Jesus Christ. There have been occasions where a young person accepts Christ for the first time during a flight. But, more often, participants re-affirm a previously made commitment to Christ and discern how God is calling them to use their gifts and graces now and in the future. The weekend consists of unique worship opportunities, prayer, fellowship, speakers, small group discussions, singing, great food, and just plain fun. The weekend leadership team consists of both youth and adults who have been well trained for the Chrysalis weekend. It has been a joy for the past sixteen years to observe both flight participants and team volunteers grow as Christian leaders.
