Academic: To ensure each student achieves optimal growth within the core academic disciplines based on multiple variables




Personal: To ensure each student develops the capacity to be responsible for their own physical and mental health



Interpersonal: To ensure each student demonstrates growth in personal development and civic responsibility


Within the District, we have operationalized the plan as follows:

 - Providing the resources necessary to support a Digital Learning Environment that enhances the delivery of instruction
 - Providing the resources necessary to expand the programs supporting Social and Emotional Learning
 - Implementing an expanded effort in Community and Family Engagement
- Maintaining a high quality instructional program, enhancing program
 offerings where needed with minimal, if any, additional costs.
- ◆ Continuing the level of support for extra-curricular and interscholastic athletic programs that provide a comprehensive educational experience for our students.

We must:


- meet all federal and state requirements for the education of our children.

Meeting student needs means we must:


- Understand our student population


Annual and Projected Enrollment: 2006 - 2026




K-12 Enrollment by Grade (9-30-2016) Total Enrollment: 8,806




K-12 Minority Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity 2006-2016




Students Qualifying for Free or Reduced Price Lunch 2006 - 2016




Non-English Dominant Students and English Language Learners (ELL) 2006-2016






Smarter Balanced Assessment – Math % of students Grades 3-8 scoring Level 3 & 4, combined




Smarter Balanced Assessment – ELA % of students Grades 3-8 scoring Level 3 & 4, combined




2016 Connecticut School Day SAT % of 11th grade students scoring Level 3 & 4




Science – 5th and 8th grade CMT and 10th grade CAPT % of students At or Above Goal




Science – 5th and 8th grade CMT and 10th grade CAPT % of students At or Above Goal




