COURSE DESCRIPTION

Senior executives of leading companies understand the value of the supply chain as a critical driver of shareholder value. For product-related firms, the supply chain includes most of the assets of the firm, 60 to 70% of the cost, and is the foundation for generating revenue and profits. Historically, firms have viewed the supply chain as primarily a cost center. However, supply chains make revenues possible, and properly developed and managed, can improve profitability and more effectively deploy capital. Hence, organizations of the future must focus on more than just driving cost and improving product availability.

As Supply Chain organizations evolve from back office tactical operations into strategic functions, it is becoming more important for supply chain professionals to "speak the language" of the CFO. Inside world-class organizations, the supply chain function is viewed by senior leadership as a critical success factor to achieving optimal "financial health" reflected on the P&L, balance sheet and cash flow statements. This necessitates that supply chain professional understand the financial impacts of their decisions and actions and are adept at "pulling the right levers" to improve a firm's financial scorecard.

This course therefore discusses essential processes of supply chain management and their interrelationships with finance across the supply chain, particularly on how supply chain management affects the financial performance of a firm, its customers and its suppliers. It further introduces financial tools and techniques useful in implementing supply chain management and provides a broad view of key supply chain finance strategies and critical decisions for managing effective and efficient supply chains.

COURSE MATERIALS

LEARNING GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Consistent with the overall learning goals and objectives at Rutgers Business School, this class will assist students with gaining command of an enabling area of theory and practice, the financial ramifications of operating a supply chain.

At the end of this course, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate their ability to compare and contrast the three main financial statements, understand relationships between financial statements and determine the financial health of the relevant supply chains.
- Apply their understanding of cost and working capital to propose solutions to optimize the financial impact of supply chains.
- Integrate and apply supply chain management concepts to resolve business and financial issues where possible.
- Understand and implement various supply chain financing tools and techniques to facilitate and improve supply chain management.

Students develop and strengthen these skills and knowledge through the following assignments:

- Case studies. Each student is required to individually complete five case studies included in the case pack. These cases will be discussed in class before the submission and can help students better understand the relevant class contents that can be used to tackle realistic business problems.
- **Exam**. Theoretical concepts and knowledge will be tested in this exam.
- **Group Project**. Students will be grouped into teams, each of which consists of 4-5 members and will be asked to identify a realistic project relevant to supply chain management and improvement using financial tools and technologies. Each project will be discussed in class with peers and the instructor before the project report submission so that everyone can have a better understanding about the applications of the knowledge and skills learned from the classes under different business settings.
