omplementary therapies are therapeutic practices which are not currently considered an integral part of conventional allopathic medical practice. They may lack biomedical explanations but as they become better researched some become widely accepted. Therapies are termed *Complementary* when used in addition to conventional treatments and *Alternative* when used instead of conventional treatment. *Integrative* medicine combines treatments from conventional medicine and CAM for which there is some high-quality evidence of safety and effectiveness. It is also called *integrated* medicine.

## The National Center for Complementary and Alternative Medicine



The National Center for Complementary and Alternative Medicine (NCCAM) is the Federal Government's lead agency for scientific research on the diverse medical and health care systems, practices, and products that are not generally considered part of conventional medicine.

NCCAM's programs and organization incorporate 3 long-range goals:

- Advance the science and practice of symptom management.
- Develop effective, practical, personalized strategies for promoting health and wellbeing.
- Enable better evidence-based decision making regarding CAM use and its integration into health care and health promotion.

Five major objectives serve the above goals:

- 1. Advance research on mind and body interventions, practices, and disciplines.
- 2. Advance research on CAM natural products.
- 3. Increase understanding of "real world" patterns and outcomes of CAM use and its integration into health care and health promotion.
- 4. Improve the capacity of the field to carry out rigorous research.

5. Develop and disseminate objective, evidence-based information on CAM interventions.

Although consumers today have widespread access to various TM/CAM treatments and therapies, they often do not have enough information on what to know or check when using TM/CAM in order to avoid unnecessary harm. In this context, it is therefore necessary to develop information to meet the needs of consumers.

These Guidelines will provide governments and other stakeholders involved in the development of consumer information with an overview of the general principles and activities necessary for the development of reliable consumer information. The document will also be a useful reference to consumers in guiding them on the information they need to have in order to choose a TM/CAM therapy that is safe and effective.
