



President's Quilt

For those of you who have turned in completed blocks, thank you so much! To those of you who have not started or are part way completed, it is NOT too late! WE NEED YOUR COMPLETED HOUSE BLOCKS BY THE NEXT MEETING, FEBRUARY 14, 2012! Please do your absolute best to meet the Valentine's Day deadline!




- 1) **Theme** HOUSES WITH A COTTAGE FEEL Add cozy elements such as window boxes, flower gardens, fruit trees, cobblestone paths, bird baths, ponds, Adirondack chairs, etc.
- 2) **Colors** Soft and medium tones of 100% cotton fabric. Please NO bright fabrics and NO dark fabrics (except in very small amounts, such as for doorknobs). Of course, you can use brown for roofs, tree bark, etc. Also, use light or medium blue for the sky. Please no dark skies!
- 3) **Unfinished size** 6-1/2 "square (includes a 1/4 inch seam allowance on all four sides). The house design, landscaping and your signature need to fit within a 6" finished size, otherwise it will not show because of the seam allowances.
- 4) **Embellish, Embellish** Suggestions include trims, ribbons, buttons, embroidery, a small fabric photo of yourself in the window, etc. to embellish your block. The embellishments should not be too thick since the quilt needs to

If you have any concerns about attaching the embellishments, please put them in a small zip bag. Include a slip of paper with your name and the desired location of the embellishments. Then SAFETY PIN (so I don't stab myself) the bag to the block. We will make sure that the embellishment is

added when the quilting is complete.

be rolled onto a frame.



If special issues are preventing you from making a block, please contact me ASAP! I'm happy to make up some extra house blocks for those who wish to participate but can't. We want *everyone* in the Guild to be represented.

Have fun "building and landscaping" your house block. Thank you in advance for participating in this wonderful tradition!


8 1/2" UNFINISHED INSTRUCTIONS:

B **cut 4** 3 1/2" x 4 inches C **cut 4** 3.5 x 3.5 inches

D **cut 1** 3.5 x 3.5 inches

Lay C in corner of B and sew on diagonal line. Cut ¼" at dotted line. WE WILL SQUARE UP

wools, embellished with embroidery thread and perle cotton. She used metallic floss instead of beads so that she could complete the top before machine quilting, which was done by Terri Dramstadt. Kris is teaching this as a BOM at Sewing Party.



Kris Kouzelos (above) adapted an embroidery pattern from a small purse to make this pillow, one of a pair. They are made with her hand-dyed recycled wools and recycled linen pants. She has almost finished the second pillow. They will both live in her family room.

Even More Show and Tell



Mary Freedman (above) made this "Little Chubbie Airplanes" quilt for her future great-grandchildren; this is the first of many that she will put away for them. The quilt was hand appliqued and machine quilted by Nancy Burch.



Joann Bishop (above) made this "Little Bouquet" pillow for her daughter for Valentines Day. She was inspired by Judy Dunlap who taught this pattern from Cherry House Quilts at Mini Maniacs. The roses are raw-edge on the outside, but sewn log cabin style around the small centers. Fusible fleece batting; machine quilted with an envelope closure. Very fun and easy to make. Cherry House Quilts was noted in the January newsletter.

with tiny X's just waiting to become a lovely hand-worked surface. Frame some of the vignettes for beautiful wall art, use some stitched squares in your next quilt or stitch up a whole border for the edge of a dress or some new pillowcases."

I'm so full of new project ideas now that I don't know where to start. But isn't it always that way at Sewing Party!

Block of the Month: Calendar of Houses

LET THE FABRIC DO THE WORK

FEBRUARY - LINCOLN LOG HOUSE

Unfinished Block Size 12 ½" x 12 ½"

Fabric Needed:

Sky Background: 1 fat quarter Ground Background: Scrap 3" x 13"

House (Logs): 1 fat quarter or assorted strips Roof: Scrap 3" x 9" (fold in half and cut to form

triangle peak) Window: Scrap

Cut strips as follows OR make a "wonky" log house by freehand cutting center window approximately 2 ½" x 2 ½". Add strips of varying widths around window in log cabin fashion to end up with a "cabin" of approximately 7" x 7" before roof is added. Angle the roof asymmetrically if you like.

Referring to Diagram, As Follows:

- 1 3" x 2 ½" (window)
- 2 2" x 2 ½"
- 3 4 ½" x 2"
- 4 2" x 4 "
- 5 6" x 2 ¼"
- 6 2" x 5 ¾""
- 7 7½" x 2½"
- 8 3" x 7 1/2" (cut 2) sky background
- 9 2 ¼" x 12 ½" ground background
- 10 12 ½" x 2 ½" sky background

Roof:

Cut 45 degree angle off each side of $3" \times 9"$ scrap, creating a sloped roof.


Appliqué sloped roof to #10 sky background piece before joining to house section. Trim.

Embellishments:

Thinking along the lines of "Honest Abe" for February, this block could be embellished with books, a candle to read by, or maybe a top hat sitting on the window sill.


