Dear Members & Friends.

Hello and welcome to the May 2016 issue of the Newsletter, edited by John G8IYS.

Editorial Intro

I know that I have been droning on about 4 metres for the last several months so.....I am going to continue on that theme. Exciting ??


At my home QTH in Sanderstead, my transverter, with hybrid (brick) linear amplifier is at last complete and fully functional. With around 1mW of drive at 28 MHz, it produces about 25 W of FM or SSB, or indeed any other mode, on 70 MHz. Also, my 450 ohm ladder-line Slim Jim is in place and working well with an SWR around 1.2:1. It is supported on a 5m roach pole

assisted by gaffer tape, nylocks, uPVC guttering on my conservatory and a step ladder.

On the SRCC FM Net (plus), on 70.300 MHz, I have worked Bill 2E0WBO in Croydon, Dave 2E0EBK in South Norwood, Pat G4FDN in Carshalton Beeches and Kim G6JXA in Morden, plus Selim M0XTA in Chigwell, Essex and Adam G7CRQ in Wallington. I have worked Martin G4FKK in Carshalton several times on 70.475 MHz FM. On SSB, around 70.220 MHz, I have worked Tony G4ECS in Caterham (I think) and John G4DGK at Burgh Heath, More distantly, I worked Ken M0KSJ/P on Beachy Head and Geoff G3NPI in Buckingham. I must say that I am finding activity on 4m to be quite lively.

My dual band 6m/4m yagi is progressing too. All 11 elements (5 active on 6m and 6 active on 4m) are all cut to length. I spent a long time calculating how to get 11 elements from 6 times 5m lengths of ½ inch aluminium tubing – with minimum wastage. Taking a respite from keying this input, I have marked up the 5m long 1 inch square section boom to locate the element insulators (Steiff). Drilling follows, but I have modified the mounting method (design originates from G0KSC Google search for lots of info) to use two insulators and two pieces of aluminium angle either side of the boom for mounting the driven element. The feed system is quite novel. The 6m driven element is fed directly with 50 ohm coax, via an "ugly" balun ie 5 to 6 turns of coax laid side by side in a coil of 50 to 60mm diameter, positioned close to the antenna feed point. The 4m driven element is energised by close coupling with that for 6m by using the Open Sleeve technique. There is no direct connection to the 4m driven element so it is continuous through a single insulator.

LAST MONTH'S CLUB MEETINGS. Reports by Hon Sec John Kennedy G3MCX

First Meeting. Monday 4th. April 2016 SRCC 76th Annual General Meeting.

Before beginning the Meeting the Chairman Pat McGuinness, G4FDN ran through the Agenda which he had put on the screen. He then closed the opportunity for nominations -after checking that there weren't any more and declared the Meeting open at 7.49pm. There were 18 members and one visitor present, Peter G0TIQ, who joined the SRCC after the meeting.

Apologies for absence were received from seven Members, Peter Burton G3ZPB, Roger Jenkins G8HDP, Gareth Evans G4XAT, Steve Jones G4FYF, Bert Smith G0IZB, Alvin Challen G6DTW and Michael Somers.

Copies of the Minutes of the previous AGM had been sent to all Members and were taken as read. No questions were asked and their acceptance was proposed John Stockley G8MNY, seconded by Quin Collier G3WRR and agreed.

The Chairman began his report by saying he thinks it is the tenth time he has done this but he has enjoyed being Chairman. Pat used a Power Point Presentation, as he has in the past, but his report was different, spending more time on what the Club's priorities are and less on the content of main Meetings. (All Meetings are well reported in our Newsletters and put on the Club Website -Hon. Sec's comment). During the year, two of our Members became Silent Keys: Bryan Aylward G6ODE, who ran his own valve business, and David Foster G3KQR, who was a GP and Coroner. The current membership was fifty-six which includes five Honorary Members, Ted Jones G3EUE, Maurice Fagg G4DDY, Ray Howells G4FFY, Prim Fagg G4CCY and Bert Smith G0IZB. The Membership was a little down on last year. Apart from the two Silent Keys,

others had either moved away or let their membership lapse.

Pat then went on to say that the Club is not all run by the Chairman. Our accounts are audited, Members help with fund raising, and put chairs away at the end of a meeting. They also help to move equipment on our second monthly meetings: Chat and Fix-it Evenings. The Club put on two Special Event Stations during the year. John, G8MNY put GX3SRC on the air with help from other Members at the Sutton Model Engineering Club in May and at Brooklands Museum in June.

The main source of funding is our equipment sales, here and also at Kemptom Park and CATS Bazaar. Helpers at these events are always welcome. Looking at the cost of room hire and the funds produced by subs, it is very clear to see that subs would need to be doubled - just to cover room hire without any other expenses. Thanks to John, G8IYS for the Newsletters, John, G3MCX as Secretary and to Maurice, G4DDY for providing refreshments at meetings. I think he has only missed once in five years. Some people are more inclined to come to formal talks and others to the less formal Chat and Fix-it Evenings. Thanks again to John, G8MNY for bringing all the test equipment along. Pat also thanked those who gave short talks in November.

We are able keep the cost of subs down, probably the lowest in the area. This allows us to keep Members who move away. We try to support a wide range of interest and have rebalanced the Calendar to spread the formal talks out. We have at least two non-radio talks during the year, the annual Club BBQ and one other of general interest. Pat went on to say that we hope new Members find their first visit friendly and welcoming. It is important to maintain a healthy bank balance for emergencies. This accumulates over the years, not quickly.

It is good to have a Committee that get on well together and rarely need to take a vote on things, we have probably had enough talks on Crystal Palace! The Committee meet monthly, normally on a Wednesday, making important detailed decisions on how Club business is managed. For example: Keeping up to date and accurate membership records, (2010) - Handling of money, receipts, donations and record keeping. (2014) - Accurate record of equipment donations. (2015)

Minutes of Committee Meetings are normally taken by the Hon. Sec., then reviewed and approved at the subsequent meeting. Meetings and actions taken by the Committee are recorded and saved.

The Chairman then did a quick review of the year. This was more a record of what took place each month.

August, The Crystal Palace story by Barrie McKay of the Crystal Palace Museum. September, Antenna Modelling by Quin Collier, G3WRR.

October, Surplus Equipment Sale and the start of the Thursday 4m Net.

November, The car projects of Gareth Evans G4XAT, from when he was ten years old upwards.

Kempton Park Rally.

December, The SRCC Construction Contest, one table for Gareth G4XAT, one for Steve G4FYF and one for John G8MNY and everyone else. Second meeting in December was the Christmas get-together. Maurice, G4DDY supplied hot mince pies and Chairman Pat, Christmas Spirit.

2016 - January, The Crystal Palace High Level Railway by Bernard Winchester.

February, Propagation by Mike Parkin G0JMI of Alton Antenna Arrays.

March, Surplus Equipment Sale where our Auctioneer, Gareth G4XAT sold the unwanted to the unwilling. Despite fewer Bidders last month, those at the AGM still want to keep it going.

Plus the Chat and Fix-it Meeting led by John G8MNY with the informal get-together normally held on the second meeting every month.

Pat then want on to - "What is coming up" (subject to AGM outcome).

An emphasis on 'how to' practical talks. - How to receive Weather Satellites - How to use an Oscilloscope - The next project would be a 4m Slim Jim antenna. - An expanded Component Bank - The equipment loan scheme, Pat mentioned some of the items that would be on

loan, initially most likely for a period of one month.

The Chairman finished his report to a round of applause as he handed over to the Treasurer. Our Treasurer Ray Howells, G4FFY had already handed out copies of the end of year accounts which included pie charts of income and expenditure. The Club had a very healthy balance and Ray said that subs would remain unchanged. Ray did mention a couple of other points, as the Club's financial year ends the income from the March sale would be included in next years account. The other being that the SRCC funded it's 80th. Anniversary Garden Party during the year. There was only one question, "Who was G2HBA?" - He was Charles Spencer, the last of our pre WW2 Members who became a Silent Key recently. He had not been to a meeting for many years but a considerable number of radio items from his estate had been donated to the Club by his family. Peter Woolhouse, G7PWV said he was pleased to audit the accounts in their present form. Acceptance of the Treasurer's Report was proposed by John Kennedy G3MCX, seconded by Maurice Fagg G4DDY and agreed. A vote of thanks to our Treasurer was proposed by Kim Brown G6JXA, seconded by Peter Woolhouse G7PWV.

Scrutineers were not required for the election as the number of Nominees did not exceed the number of Posts to be filled. John Kennedy G3MCX was the only nomination for Hon. Sec. proposed by Prue Glaisher. G4RWW, seconded by John Stockley G8MNY and elected unopposed.

Six Members, formally proposed before the meeting and having agreed to stand were elected.

Those six were Pat McGuinness G4FDN, Ray Howells G4FFY, Maurice Fagg G4DDY, John Simkins G8IYS, Rick Hewett M0LEP and Quin Collier G3WRR.

From the Committee for the position of Treasurer, Ray Howells G4FFY was proposed by John Simkins G8IYS, seconded by Peter Woolhouse G7PWV and elected. For Chairman, Pat Mcuinness G4FDN was proposed by Peter Woolhouse G7PWV, seconded by Bill Jones 2E0WBO and elected. The nominee for Vice Chairman was Rick Hewett M0LEP, proposed by John Kennedy G3MCX, seconded by Maurice

Fagg G4DDY and elected. Other positions would be decided at the first Committee Meeting after the AGM.

Peter Woolhouse G7PWV and Andrew Maish G4ADM were appointed Independent Examiners for the year 2016/2017. The previous year's Examiners, Peter Woolhouse G7PWV, Peter Burton G3ZPB and Quin Collier G3WRR received a vote of thanks especially to Peter G7PWV who brings years of experience and professional knowledge.

The Chairman then made an announcement regarding the Awards. The winners of the Johnny Hayden Rose, SRCC Club Cup and the Sutton Trophy (CW Cup) had not been decided. It could not be discussed at the last Committee Meeting as two Members of the Committee were absent.

Any Other Business was opened by the Chairman asking if any of the Committee Members or the Secretary had any comments to make. Pat then continued by asking for a show of hands from Members present to indicate if they were interesting in making a Slim Jim for the Club Project. Yaege FC-1/FC-2 (Yes Yaege not Yaesu!) Has anyone else come across this combined frequency counter and QRP power meter? It is available from various sources on eBay for around £30-£35.



As can be seen in the picture it displays signal level in dBm. It covers from 10Hz to 2.6GHz, has a sensitivity of less than 15mV at 1GHz. It also comes with rechargeable batteries and charger.

For more accurate power measurements up to 11GHz the **Eisch-Kafka-Electronic DET-01** looks like a nice piece of kit. It is available from Germany at Euro 159.00.
