SOUTHWEST HUMAN RESOURCE AGENCY RECEIVES AWARD

September 20, 2018

William "Sonny" Walker Self-Sufficiency Award

On Thursday September 20, 2018, Southwest Human Resource Agency received the William
"Sonny" Walker self-sufficiency Award presented at the Awards Banquet during the SEACAA
(Southeastern Association of Community Action Agencie) 2018 Annual Training Conference, in
Orlanda, Florida. Executive Director, Milke Smith, and other Southwest employees were on hand
to accept the award.

The Fatherhood Program, "Inside-Out Dad", and a comparable program, "How to Be a Responsible Mother" provide incarcerated individuals with basic needs to prosper upon re-entry into society. The curriculum includes instruction on being a better parent and spouse, adult education classes for those interested, resume" and interviewing guidance, and becoming acqualited with the services available through various agencie in our area. These efforts not only benefit the individuals in carcerated, but positively impact their families and the foregoes either of which the access care and the program of the program of the program of the control of the program of

After completing a pilot program in McNainy County in May 2015, the program was expanded to six other counties in the sentice area, including the introduction of a similar program for incarcerated women, entitled "How to be A Responsible Mother". More than one hundred fifty individuals have completed the classes since the June 2015 expansion.

In the eight counties served by Southwest HRA, seven have been involved in classes since October, 2014. Thirty two classes have been conducted for males, with one hundred twelve finishing. Thirties classes for females have yielded for three graduates, bringing the total number of graduates to one hundred fifty five. Of those who have completed the program, and of which we have knowledge, twelve have been arrested again, and are currently in custody. There are at least eight others that have been re-arrested and soon released. Currently, classes are underway in five counties, with twenty eight males participating, and classes for females in two counties with sparticipating. Two groups will complete classes by October 4, 2018, bringing the total number of graduates to one hundred sixty seven.

GUILT-FREE AUTUMN SNACK

Apple Chips



Ingredients

2 apples, thinly sliced2 tsp. sugar1/2 tsp. cinnamon

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 200 degrees.
- 2. Place apple slices into a bowl and sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon. Toss to combine.
- 3. Place a cooling rack onto a baking sheet. Lay apple slices onto the baking sheet so that no apples overlap. Cook for 2-3 hours, flipping halfway through.
- 4. Bake until dried out but still pliable. Serve.

IT Help Desk.

1. Shut Down The Right Way

This basic computer tip always sounds too simple to take seriously and therefore ends up creating many problems. When a computer is shut down suddenly, and without warning, the computer is usually in the middle of an operation. The main problem is that if an operation is interrupted it usually remains unfinished and leaves stray or corrupt files lingering on your computer.

To shut down computer, DO NOT just press power button on tower!

Click Windows button in bottom left corner then click "Shut Down" button.



You can also choose the menu to be given several options such as Log Off or Restart. But simply selecting the button that says "Shut Down" will properly shut down your computer.

2. Do Not Install Toolbars

When installing many free programs online, please watch for extra downloads that tag along such as internet browser toolbars. While the intended program may be useful, the "extras" can be harmful to your computer and greatly slow down your machine.

While going through the download process, read each prompt screen carefully and uncheck any extras that it may ask you to download. The box is almost always pre-checked to install.



If you aren't cautious, before you know it your PC will be loaded down with too many toolbars and running at a snail's pace!

3. Antivirus Software

Keep antivirus software installed and up to date. The IT Department will take care of this on office computers, but these tips extend into home computer use as well so I thought this was worth noting here. Antivirus software plays a major role in real time protection, its added advantage of detecting threats helps computer and the information in it to be safe. Some advanced antivirus programs provide automatic updates, this further helps to protect the PC from newly created viruses.
