Greetings Brothers and Sisters.

The flowers are trying to come out and that can only

mean spring is upon us and several things in the Odd Fellows. First is the Annual Pilgrimage to the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington, Virginia. What an honor it is to be able to represent our Jurisdiction with President Cathy Garcia at my side. Second, we have Memorial Day celebrations at cemeteries throughout the state. I personally will be speaking at the event at the Olympia Odd Fellow Cemetery. Third, Sessions are fast approaching.

BE ON TIME FOR SESSIONS

Each year I have heard people say they didn't know or didn't understand, so I am trying to be as up front as possible. Sessions start *promptly* at 9 a.m. Monday morning. Elections are held at 11 a.m. This is outlined in the Code Book. All Odd Fellow members who are Past Grands may vote at election of officers. All other business votes are by Representatives only.

I have tried to emphasize nostalgia this year, remembering who the Odd Fellows were, what we are, and what we can become. So much of tradition has been lost in recent years. One thing that we have lost is the formality of occasion. At a routine lodge meeting you would see men in suits 60 years ago. When I joined 20 year ago, a man did not enter lodge without a tie. Degree work was a more formal occasion that the suits were brought out. This formality gave a bit more substance to what it is that we do. Look good, feel good, do good.

Dress Code

I want to outline what is expected as dress for Sessions.

First off you will be required to wear a red collar. This simple item is the single most identifying item of an Odd Fellow. Opening day is quite formal, and western hemisphere business attire is appropriate. Officers are expected to have a dark suit or at least a blazer. Men, you are expected to be in a button dress shirt with tie and slacks at the minimum. A suit is not required, but if you hold an office or will be appointed to one you should have a dark suit or tuxedo with you. Jeans, denim, or chino style pants are not permitted, and you will be asked to leave and change. Ladies a dress, skirt or pants suit is proper. Sundresses or a sleeveless top are not acceptable unless worn under a blazer or shawl. No shorts, T-shirts, tank tops or flip-flops will be permitted in Sessions. Please save those for the pool. Our Sovereign Grand Master will be in attendance this year and we should show him the respect he deserves.

The final day of Sessions is usually fairly short, and we allow business casual "travel" clothes. However, this doesn't mean shorts and tank tops. You are still expected to be professional.

PLANT A TREE

April is "Living Legacy month" Talk to your town and see if you can donate a tree to a park or plant a new tree on your lodge property. Work with a nursery and get tree saplings and sell trees as a fund-raiser.

BRING ON THE CAP & GOWN



Services held for Donald E. Hepp

Service were held March 17 for Brother Donald Earl Hepp, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington and Past Grand Patriarch the Grand Encampment of Washington, who passed away Friday

March 2. The Odd Fellow Funeral Ceremony was performed by members of Olympia IOOF Lodge #1.

Brother Don, 92, was born December 7, 1925 to Elwin Pearl Hepp and Hulda Viola Hepp in Olympia where he resided his entire life.

Don joined the Olympia Odd Fellows on March 12, 1962, making him a 56 year member. He served as Grand Patriarch in 1976-77 and then as Grand Master 10 years later in 1886-87.

In addition to being an Odd Fellow, Don was a Rebekah, and belonged to the Fraternal Order of

Eagles, Grange and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Don's high school education was interrupted by World War II when he enlisted in the US Navy in November of 1943. He served in the Navy until April of 1946 where he achieved the rank of Gunner's Mate Second Class. Upon his return from the service, he continued high school and graduated from William Winlock Miller High School (aka Olympia High School) on June 6, 1947.

After high school, he ventured to Chicago where he worked in a boarding house while achieving certification in automotive and diesel mechanics from the Chicago Motive Trades Institute. Don worked on the maritime fleet staff at the Olympia Reserve Fleet for more than 24 years. Because of health issues, Don found it necessary to change careers and went back to school. He was hired at the Washington State Library as a clerk and during his 14 years at the library, he advanced to the position of Library Technician. He retired from that position on January 30, 1986 at the age of 60.
