What is Taizé?

The religious community of Taizé (teh-ZAY) is an ecumenical community of brothers in the hills of Burgundy, in eastern France. The community was founded by Brother Roger in 1949, with the intention of praying for peace and in reparation for the atrocities of war. Taizé prayer includes quiet reflection, readings from Scripture, and, especially, meditative chant. Throughout Europe and beyond, the brothers of Taizé have inspired millions of pilgrims, especially youth, to deepen their prayer experience.

The chants are designed to be a mantra; repetition and reflection are key. Since the Taizé community and their ministry are very international, Latin, a neutral language, is used for many of their chants. Often the language shifts among several languages in a single song. Much like the Rosary, we are invited to enter deeply into meditation through the recurring rhythm of the music.

What is NPM?



SCRIPTURE READING

A reading from the 2nd Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians.

Brothers and sisters: We are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

Working together, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says: *In an acceptable time I heard you, and on the day of salvation I helped you.* Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.



SILENT PRAYER

Extended silence is integral to Taizé prayer. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* instructs:

Contemplative prayer is silence, the "symbol of the world to come" or "silent love." Words in this kind of prayer are not speeches; they are like kindling that feeds the fire of love. In this silence, unbearable to the "outer" man, the Father speaks to us his incarnate Word, who suffered, died, and rose; in this silence the Spirit of adoption enables us to share in the prayer of Jesus. Sing text, then hum during petitions.



PRAYER AROUND THE CROSS

During the following chants, you are invited to come forward, if you wish, to pray around the cross in front of the altar. There is no formal procession; just come forward and return as the Spirit moves you. In Taizé prayer, this is a way of expressing communion both with the crucified Jesus and with all those who suffer around the world. "This prayer reminds us that now, risen from the dead, Christ accompanies every human being in his or her suffering, even when his presence is not recognized." (Songs and Prayers from Taizé)
