Throughout Term 3, THS students worked in collaboration with students from Hillvue Public School to create this fantastic artwork. Local Indigenous artists provided the artistic theme and design which incorporates the strong spiritual connection local Indigenous people have to their country and its valued native fauna and flora. All the animals that live within the park appear in the mural, which was installed on the outer wall of the Flight Aviary, during the recent school holidays.

Students have incorporated the mural into their studies of the local Gamilaraay language and really enjoyed seeing their contribution as a seamless part of the whole mural. Students have appreciated the experience and are enthusiastic to continue the connection and volunteer their time to further enhance the park and its facilities.





CHANGES TO BUS LINES



At the end of the school day it is expected that students walk home, are picked up by parents/carers or stay in the school grounds until their buses arrive.

No student is to be outside the school fence/gates or at the Southgate Shopping Centre.

If your child catches a bus to Limbri, Carroll Gap, Bithramere, Quirindi, Coledale, Westdale, Oxley Vale, Nundle, Dungowan or Longyard they are to wait in the Year 7 area until the bus arrives and depart through the top gate.





SICK BAY

If a student feels unwell, they are to let their class teacher know, who will write a note to take to the Front Office. The parents/carers will be contacted to inform them of the illness and organise for the student to be picked up.

Students should not phone parents directly, to pick them up.

If a student is unwell at home, please do not send them to school.

If any new medical conditions are diagnosed eg asthma, epilepsy, heart condition, diabetes etc, the school needs to have written notification from the treating Doctor as well as a health care plan for the school to follow when needed.



EARLY DEPARTURES

On occasions your child may need to leave school early, eg; Doctor's appointment. Please provide your child with a signed, dated note stating the reason and time required for the early leave. This note needs to be given to the staff in SAO **PRIOR** to Roll Call. An early leave pass will be processed and available for your child to collect in the first recess break.

This process ensures the students name is listed on the absentee sheet for the day with the time of departure, and that they are waiting to be picked up at the appointed time.
