Teachers have commenced specific, well-constructed learning programs in classrooms, supporting the work with learning and language focusing on managing self and relationships with others. A variety of high quality programs, which ensure a well-rounded educational opportunity for every student are underway, with students slipping easily back into established routines and meeting expectations.

To mention a few programs we are currently involved in:

- Aquatic sport is very big at this time of year, with a very successful swimming carnival conducted and primary swimming sessions for sport underway. PSSA representative trials have already been held for swimming and tennis and further trials are coming up this term for a variety of other sports. A couple of general reminders for our Parents and Carers:

Bus bays are not to be used as drop off or pick up points between 8.00-9.30am in the mornings and 2.30-4.00pm in the afternoon. We thank you for your support with this matter.

Students must not arrive at school earlier than 8.35am at which time there is teacher supervision. Similarly, students must be collected at 3.00pm unless they are catching a bus. If, for family or work reasons, you need your children to stay longer in the afternoon, then you are welcome to organise after school care through the Parkes Outside School Hours Care centre which operates out of our hall on 0428 770 760.

Teachers and students are currently working on creating learning intentions or goals in their classes and focusing on areas to help guide improvement in learning and teaching such as how we work collaboratively, how we can use feedback to improve and how it is okay to make a mistake sometimes in our learning. Well done to our students on their efforts in being proactive learners! Keep up the great work! Many of our teachers have been making contact with parents and families over the past few weeks. When the relationship between teachers and parents is ongoing with open lines of communication, research proves students achieve more positive outcomes from their schooling. In 2018 this is something we will continue to focus on throughout the year. Don't forget that progress interviews will be held towards the end of Term 1 so you can catch up on your child's development so far this year.

The International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) is an independent, skills-based assessment program which recognises and rewards student achievement. ICAS is unique, being the most comprehensive generally available suite of academic assessments for primary and secondary school students.

A new ICAS test is developed annually for each subject in each year level by a team of subject matter experts. All ICAS tests are reviewed by experienced teachers to ensure that they accurately assess students' skills and are relevant to what they are learning at school. Administration Guidelines are provided to the schools with the ICAS papers to ensure that the same conditions are afforded to all students sitting ICAS.



YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY WHEN THEY ARE TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL. Drive and park safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools.

You can help keep children safe by remembering the following:

- drop off and pick up children on the school side of the road
- never call out to children from across the road it is very dangerous
- * always take extra care when driving in 40km school zones
- * follow all parking signs these help keep children as safe as possible
- * park responsibly even if this means you have to walk further to the school gate
- * never double park it is illegal and puts children at risk
- * never do a U-turn or three-point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your children.

When travelling in a car ensure your children:

- use a booster seat if they are aged between 4 and 7 years old – it's the law
- * are correctly buckled up in their seatbelts
- always get in and out of the car through the 'safety door'
 the rear door on the footpath side of the car
- * are never left alone in the car.
