To ensure an engaging and beneficial experience for all students, new ICAS assessments are developed annually for each subject in every year level. Most assessments are offered for Year 2 – Year 6 students in subjects such as Digital Technologies, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee, English and Mathematics.

If you are interested in having your child sit for these tests, we have registered for a school account which will allow parents to select the ICAS 2019 assessment/s they wish their child to participate in, and pay online for the tests.
