Students placing in the top 1% receive a High Distinction. The student who places first in NSW, for each subject area, is invited to attend a ceremony at UNSW, where they will be presented with a medal of achievement. Lillian will be attending this ceremony on 27 November. We are very proud of Lillian's accomplishment – an outstanding achievement!



New School App

For several months the school has been in consultation with Sentral for the creation of a Parent Portal and App for families at Floraville. Year 5 Leadership Preparation


