# **Year 7 Spooks Project: Two Minutes of Horror**

As part of the Year 7 genre study in English, Year 7 studied Horror. The students learnt about the conventions of the Horror genre through stories, poetry and drama scripts, learning about black cats, witches, ghosts and ghouls and all things a little scary through the study of literature. The history of the genre was studied looking at its long tradition in literature with ghost stories and poems from Edgar Allan Poe and more recently, in popular culture, the Harry Potter books and films.

Students worked collaboratively on creating a big scary idea that would appeal to the audience. The creative process, working together and agreeing on an idea were the first steps and at times, the challenge! Next step was making the film. Getting it all to come together in only two minutes! This included script writing, casting characters, locating a setting, gathering props and costumes, directing, filming, editing and App smashing! The students, prior to showcasing their films, participated in a range of workshops on Spooks Day run by the English staff. The students were involved in spooky spelling games, dramatic reading of a horror play, collaborative story-boarding a horror comic and readings of horror stories. # 7 Poseidon Team Day

7P went on an excursion to Manly Sea Life Sanctuary last Friday. We caught the ferry there and back and were lucky enough to miss all of the rain!

You will see some exciting photos of some of the sharks we saw and the 'scared' faces of the boys as they posed inside a model of a Great White shark's jaw.



A lot of us (including myself) were amazed to discover what the eggs of a grey nurse shark look like, and to be able to pick them up and feel them. These egg cases are made out of keratin just like our hair and nails and take many years to biodegrade.

The Manly Sea Life

Sanctuary plays an important role in the conservation of this species of shark since their listing as "Critically Endangered" in 1999. In the year 2000 the number of Grey Nurse Sharks in New South Wales was as low as 292.

We also saw the little penguins being fed and learnt that all Little Penguins originate from countries that exist only in the Southern Hemisphere – including Australia, South America and South Africa.
