

Sharing Our Faith; Securing Our Future

Welcome. Love. Serve. – This is the mission of St. Raymond Parish and a driving force behind the work we do. Thank you again to everyone who participated in the surveys provided the week of June 10 and 11 regarding project plans for our parish. Your input allows us to continue to welcome, love and serve God and our community.

It is with great joy that I share with you a brief update from the survey regarding plans for our capital campaign. As noted in recent bulletins, St. Raymond is participating in the Archdiocesan campaign, *To Teach Who Christ Is.* But, our primary objective is to focus on our own parish needs through our own campaign that will include the commitment to the Archdiocese.

The purpose of the in-pew survey, online survey, and individual conversations, was to provide you an opportunity to share what you think to be the most pressing projects we should complete as part of this campaign. Additionally, we asked if you would financially support such an extraordinary effort.

I am pleased to share that the large majority of parishioners who participated in this review process support a campaign for St. Raymond Parish. We received extremely generous indications of financial support and we heard from you that it is important to address some, but not all, of the projects that were outlined in the survey. St. Raymond will be conducting a campaign to address the most critical safety, accessibility, and infrastructure needs that affect the long-term viability of our campus. We will accomplish this through our own campaign entitled, *Sharing Our Faith; Securing Our Future*.

You told us what is important to repair and update around our campus facilities. We think it's important to listen to you as well as act on what has been identified as critical projects through expert opinions. Early planning for the *Sharing Our Faith; Securing Our Future* campaign is underway so that we can maintain our facilities. We hope you are as excited as we are!

Over the coming months, every parishioner will have the opportunity to learn more about and support our initiative. We ask that when it is your turn to consider supporting, we hope you will approach this effort with a generous heart.

Our Opportunity Awaits!

Thank you to everyone that participated in our in-pew survey as well as those who completed it online a couple weeks ago. The big question is, *What was this for and how does it relate to St. Raymond*? Over the past couple weeks, you have been briefly made aware of projects that St. Raymond looks to address. Additionally, reference has been made to the *To Teach Who Christ Is (TTWCI)* campaign.

Back in 2012, Cardinal George and the Archdiocese decided to embark on a campaign to strengthen faith formation efforts within the Archdiocese. Each parish was asked to support this one-time capital and endowment campaign. Part of the effort is directed toward Archdiocesan needs, with funds earmarked for scholarships to Catholic schools, training for religious education catechists, innovative religious education programs and other critical facility needs. The added benefit of this campaign is that the **larger portion** of the funds generated by our parish, **remain with St. Raymond** to help strengthen and benefit our needs.

As you recall, in 2012 and for the next few years, St. Raymond was in the midst of its own *Upholding the Tradition* campaign. Because of this, St. Raymond requested and was granted permission to delay participation in this new Archdiocesan campaign as long as possible before the Archdiocesan campaign was completed. Following the completion of our *Upholding the Tradition* campaign in 2015, it is now our turn to take part in this Archdiocesan-wide effort.

In short, for the *TTWCI* campaign, each parish is given a minimum campaign target set by the Archdiocese and based on our annual offertory. How does this impact St. Raymond? Aside from our portion that goes to *TTWCI*, the parish has the opportunity to address its own needs under our own campaign title. There is a range of projects we know must be addressed to prolong the functionality of our parish facilities. These potential projects were all outlined in the survey questions you previously reviewed.

We have an extraordinary opportunity to take care of our most pressing campus projects. At this time, St. Raymond is in the planning stages of a campaign to satisfy the requirements of the Archdiocesan *TTWCI* campaign as well as our local needs. We are beyond grateful for your participation in the survey. It's important the parish listens and includes what you deem to be of a high priority project based on your survey responses and what we already know to be important. We will use the survey results to help develop a list of the St. Raymond campaign projects and the corresponding target goal for these local projects. These local projects, coupled with our share of the *TTWCI* campaign, will shape the magnitude of the campaign.

This year we will support the Sacred Heart Secondary School founded by the Children Outreach and Community Empowerment, Inc. Sacred Heart Secondary School (SHSS) was founded by Children Outreach and Community Empowerment, Inc., a 501 (C) charitable organization whose mission is to educate and empower needy children in northwest of Tanzania. SHSS has and continue to positively change lives of needy children and the community at large. A good number of our graduates are enrolled in several universities in Tanzania.



SHSS is positioned to produce better results. Its impact on the enrolled and future students is more promising. SHSS' academic stats sores, they are projecting bright and better future fruits. In 2015 Form Two (Tenth Grade) Mock Exam, a standardized exam, SHSS was awarded a certificate of appreciation by Muleba Education department for scooping the second position with class GPA 3.94. The numbers are getting better everyday. SHSS was rated 5th out of 226 schools in Kagera region (State). SHSS does not only differentiate itself from other schools based on good academic performance but also on good formation of students' mind, body and spirit.



The present SHSS students and staff members received a new year's gift- a special visitor. Bruce Becker, a COCE board member and continuous financial supporter of this mission visited SHSS and the community in January 2016. It was his fourth visit to the school. Mr. Becker motivated the entire SHSS community. While addressing Twelve Grade students, he said:

"Sacred Heart Secondary School (SHSS) has been a labor and love of this man, (Fr. Kiiguta) and many generous people. I want to encourage you to love and keep SHSS clean. We want to make sure this school is maintained well inside and out."





Mr. Becker had an opportunity to visit and motivate the community at large too. He visited over twenty homes most of which came SHSS students and alumni and interacted with many family members. All families appreciated his visit. Some said "Fr. Kiiguta thank you for bringing us a 'Mzungu' (white person) to our home and we love his positive encouragement."



This life and live changing mission continues. "All this positive impact to the needy children and the local community at large has been possible due to the prayers and financial support of many generous people. I pray that God return favors to them." Fr. Kiiguta

Registration for the Fall 2017-18 Religious Education year is now open!

It's that time of year again! Registration for the 2017-18 Religious Education Program is now open. We ask that all families at this time please complete all the necessary forms to ensure that your students will be registered. Registrations are due by July 31st! Registrations received August 1st and after will be assessed a \$50 late fee.

All registrations received on/after August 1st- students will be placed in a class IF there is room. Otherwise we will create a waiting list in the hopes we can find more volunteer Catechists. If we are unable to find Catechists for any remaining grades that need them, those students on the Waiting List will go into Home Study.

There are two parts to complete your registration:

- Completing the online registration form.
- Setting up a payment schedule Smart Tuition. *Families who do not set up a payment schedule via Smart Tuition (or pay in full by check) by July 31st will be assessed the \$50 Late Fee.*

Payment on Smart Tuition alone does not count as registration and will not reserve a space in class.

To begin registration go to the Religious Education section of the parish website, then select the "Registration" tab along the top horizontal menu.
