

Notes from the Stated Session Meeting – Sunday, January 22, 2017

- Approved the details that will allow Rebecca Krueger to provide Line Dancing Lessons for members and guests in January and February.
- Approved four FLY fundraising events that will raise money to offset the costs for our youth to participate in both the Montreat Youth Conferences (middle and high school) and the High School Mission Trip.
- Approved a sexuality education event for parents of 5th 9th graders on Sunday, March 12th
- Approved plans for our annual Earth Day Celebrations on Sunday, April 30th
- Approved plans to host the summer camp run by the Autism Academy of SC this summer on Wednesdays and Fridays from June through early August.
- Approved plans to sponsor a Marriage Enrichment Retreat on Saturday, March 25th, led by Nancy Smith and held at the Rockbridge Club.
- Approved several items to facilitate the work of Stewardship and Administration:

MEMORIAL GARDEN NEWS

The Memorial Garden Committee, elected by Session to oversee the church's Memorial Garden, commissioned and purchased a new cross sculpture that has now been installed on the back wall of the Memorial Garden. FLPC member and artist, Peter Driscoll, designed and created the cross sculpture entitled *TRICRUCIA*. The sculpture is a three dimensional copper cross. We hope you will make time to visit the memorial garden and to appreciate the beauty of the sculpture. Peter wrote of his creation:

TRICRUCIA

The name, created by the artist, is intended to reflect the meaning of the sculptural forms of the three crosses used at the crucifixion. Some artist's thoughts about the design follow.

TRI Represents the three crosses that were used on Golgotha on Good Friday.

CRUCIAL Represents the severe trials and difficulties of the Cross.

opportunity and privilege of creating TRICRUCIA for the Memorial Garden.

The artist chose copper, a soft, malleable and ductile metal that can be rolled into sheets without breaking. The reddish orange color appealed to the artist. One of the properties of copper is that if properly sealed it will neither corrode nor oxidize. Copper was first discovered in 9,000 BC.

Three sheets of $24" \times 48" \times 1/8"$ thick copper were hand sawn, the edges filed, after which the surfaces were hand sanded and polished to a glossy finish, epoxied together, and sealed.

While designing, and fabricating the cross the artist reflected about the carpenters who might have been assigned the task of making the crosses used in the crucifixion. Who were they? How did they work the wood? What tools did they use? They probably belonged to a Guild, and used iron axes, saws, adzes, hammers and chisels to fashion half-lap joints to fasten the horizontal and vertical pieces of wood together. Would they somehow have been aware that Jesus had also been a carpenter? Finally, the three crosses might even have been commissioned by the Centurions who were in charge of arranging the crucifixions. The Cross is one of several major art commissions this artist has received and one of the most meaningful. The artist is grateful to Forest Lake Presbyterian Church and the Memorial Garden Committee for this

A PLACE AT THE TABLE: 40 DAYS OF SOLIDARITY WITH THE POOR

We live today in a culture built on consumption--especially of food—and it is easy to forget the poor that Jesus cared so much about.

Please join the CCI class for a Lenten study that invites you to on a journey of self-examination, discipline, and renewed focus on Jesus.

The creator of this curriculum, Chris Seay, challenges us to eat like the poor for forty days in solidarity with a much-neglected group of people, and to donate the money we save on groceries to a charity or project that serves the poor in concrete ways. But he doesn't expect them to go it alone. *A Place at the Table* includes a brief (2-3 pages) reading for each of those forty days with Scripture, reflections, prayers, and encouragements. The six-session DVD, shot in such locations as the Holy Land, Haiti, and Ecuador, will help us go on a passionate journey of faith, personal action, solidarity with the poor, and extravagant grace.

At FLPC the study will include short daily readings, optional short 2-minute online video devotionals, Sunday School classes using the video series and discussion, an invitation to eat differently during the week, and an option to join in Sunday feasts in our Fellowship Hall and in members' homes.

The Study will begin on February 26 - the Sunday before Ash Wednesday and will conclude on Palm Sunday. Books are available on Amazon.com for \$.01 (yes, that is only one cent) plus \$3.99 shipping.

Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering Luncheon
