

IATA: Restrictions A Concern, Travel Up

IATA remains concerned by the impact that travel restrictions or closing of borders may have on travel—but the agency's director general Alexandre de Juniac says it has 'not seen the attempted US ban on travel from six countries translate into an identifiable traffic trend'.

"Overall travel demand continues to grow at a robust rate," says the IATA boss as it announces the Feb passenger demand figures, which show continued demand growth for 2017.

"The year has opened with some shocks—the attempted ban on travel to the US by citizens of six countries and the restrictions on the carry-on of large electronic items from certain airports in the Middle East and North Africa on direct flights to the US and the UK," says de Juniac. "The potential implications of the Brexit talks on the air transport industry are significant and the political rhetoric of protectionism and closing of borders is adding to the ambiguity." Lower overall fares and a healthier global economic backdrop have contributed to the continuing strong demand momentum, says IATA.

Total Feb revenue passenger kms

(RPKs) rose 4.8%, year-on-year; monthly capacity (available seat kms or ASKs) was up 2.7%, and loads rose 1.6 percentage points to 79.5%, year-on-year—the highest ever recorded for Feb. notes IATA.

. . . International

International passenger demand was up 5.8% in Feb; total capacity climbed 3.4%, and loads rose 1.8 percentage points to 78.4%.

Feb traffic was up 5.2% in Feb for Asia Pacific carriers, year-on-year maintaining the strong momentum of the past few months, adds IATA. "Intra-Asia traffic remains robust and conditions on the Asia-Europe route have continued to recover from last year's terrorism-related slow-down," adds the airline body. Capacity in the region increased 2.9% and loads climbed 1.7 points to 79.8%.

Middle East carriers had the strongest growth, up 9.5% for Feb; while European carriers saw demand increase 6.5% year-on-year. "Traffic has resumed its growth [in Europe] after the terrorist disruptions in 2016, supported in part by momentum in the regional economy," says IATA.

Low-cost Regional?

Boeing is one of the investors behind a US company that's working on small hybrid electric aircraft which it says could cut the cost of regional flights by as much as 40-80%. Zunum Aero says its technology would make inexpensive short-haul flights a possibility, and hopes to one day see travellers hop on a flight instead of taking a bus or train. The company aims to be flying routes of up to 700 miles by the mid-2020s, according to reports.

Daydream Island Closed Until 2018

Daydream Island Resort and Spa will remain closed until the middle of 2018, with the property bringing forward a planned refurbishment after substantial damage from Tropical Cyclone Debbie.

Daydream announced earlier this year that it would close for a period early next year to allow an AUD50 million refurbishment to go ahead. It now says it's not feasible to invest money in reopening in the next few months, only to close again for the refurbishment. Following the cyclone, Daydream had said it wouldn't accept guests until at least 30 Apr 2017. Guests with forward bookings are being contacted.

The resort is to receive major infrastructure upgrades including accommodation refurbishments,

Cyclone For New Cal

A category three cyclone near Vanuatu is expected to make landfall in New Caledonia tonight. Cyclone Cook caused strong wind, rain and flash flooding in Vanuatu over the weekend, but is said to have caused little damage. Airports in both Espiritu Santo and Port Vila have been inspected and reopened, and tourism businesses are back in operation today, says Vanuatu Tourism. There is some cleaning up to do which is already well underway.

The cyclone is expected to strengthen before hitting New Caledonia. Kiwis in New Caledonia should follow the advice of local authorities and their accommodation, says the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT).

OF Australia Sale

Qantas has flights to Australia on sale until midnight 12 Apr, with one-way fares priced from \$189 to Melbourne, \$199 to Brisbane and Sydney, and \$449 to Perth. renovations to existing attractions and new features which it says will turn it into an upscale 4.5 star resort. Major works will include redeveloping the Waterfalls restaurant, Lagoons bar, all room types, expanding the Lovers Cove function area and building a new Asianinspired restaurant overlooking Mermaids Beach.

Meanwhile, the Whitsundays region is steadily coming back on-line following the impacts of ex-Tropical Cyclone Debbie, says Tourism Whitsundays.

The foreshore and beach areas as well as the main street of Airlie Beach have been cleaned up; while power is being reinstated to the region, area by area, with completion expected 11 Apr.

While the region is 'not out of the woods yet', Tourism Whitsundays chief executive Craig Turner says signs were looking good for the coming Easter weekend and ensuing holiday period, with plenty of tours and trips operating again and accommodation providers back up and running. Record 2017 Bookings For Avalon



With a record year for 2017 cruise bookings out of New Zealand, Avalon Waterways is seeing the momentum continue with its 2018 preview sales.


