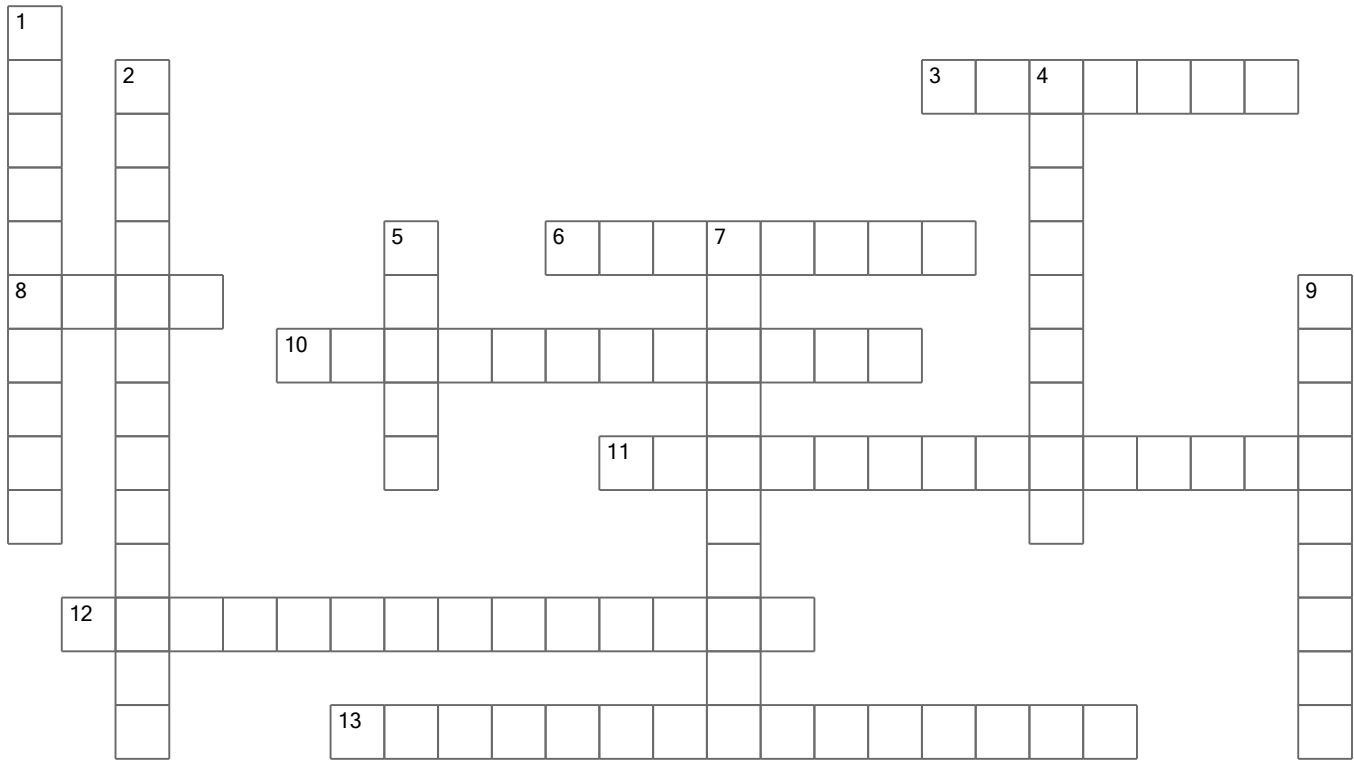

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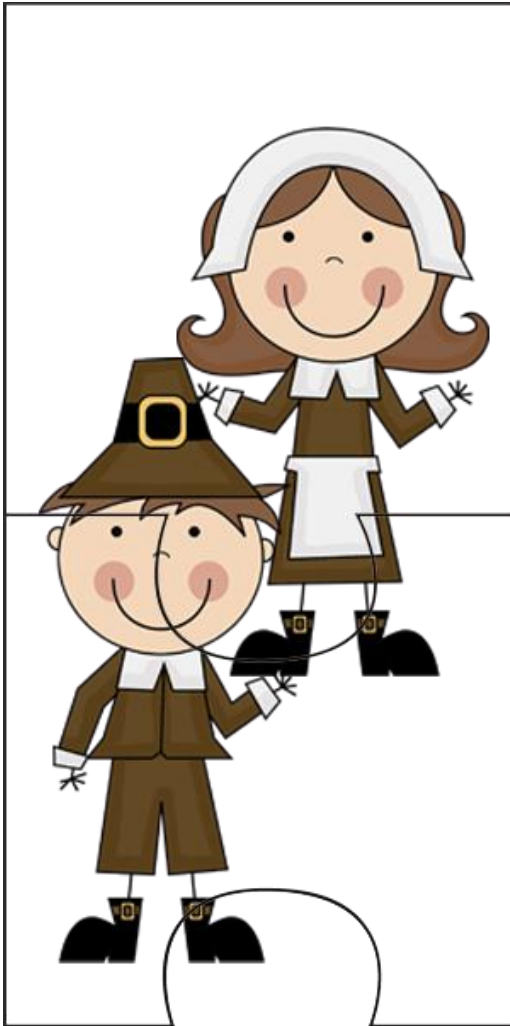
To make visor:

4. Insert elastic string into holes and tie to fit head. For yarn or other string, cut two pieces and tie a bow to fit.

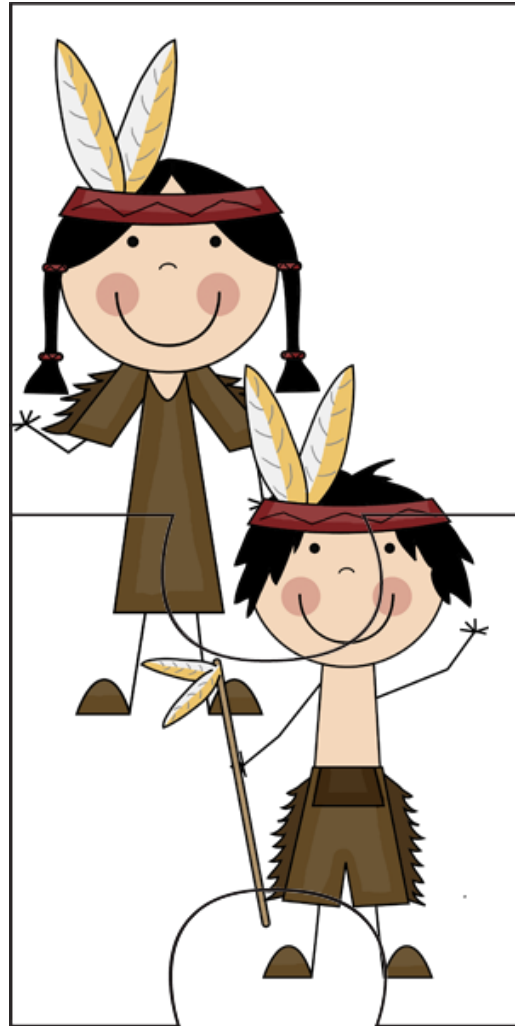

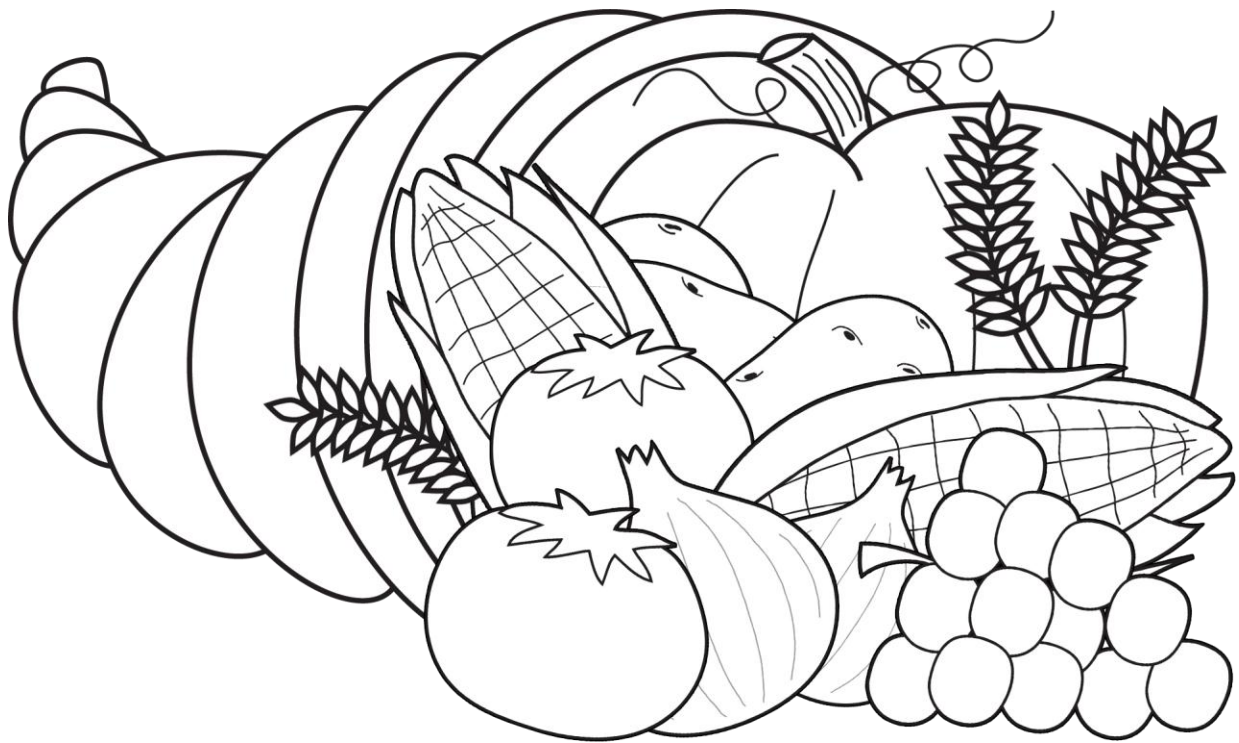
