## **Course Description**

The purpose of this course is to learn basic sewing techniques applicable to theatrical projects. Students will develop both hand and machine sewing skills.

## **Student Learning Outcomes**

- 1.Students will gain an understanding of the process of taking garments from the page to the stage
- 2.Students will learn both hand and machine construction methods suitable for costume construction
- 3. Students will become familiar with the tools and materials within the costume shop
- 4. Students will be able to read a commercial pattern and basic patterning knowledge

## **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Students are required to execute projects based on tutorials.
- 2. Students are required to provide proof of work as required by instructor.
- 3. Students are required to participate in quizzes, assignments, etc. via D2L.

## Minimal Technical Skills Needed

- 1. Students must be able to navigate D2L via MyLeo.
- 2. Students must be able to use a word processing software (Microsoft Word, Google Docs, etc.) as well as presentation software (Power Point, Prezi, etc.).
- 3. Students must be able to check their email regularly.

## **Instructional Methods**

1. All students will be provided with essential tools and materials as described above.

- 2. Students will be presented with online quizzes throughout the semester that must be completed by the due date.
- 3. Students will be provided with online tutorials that will teach various sewing skills. These skills will be practiced on the fabric provided. You must provide photographic proof of practice weekly via D2L for their attendance/participation grade.
- 4. Samplers consisting of these compiled skills will be due throughout the semester, as described in D2L.
- 5. Students will make a pair of pajama pants, from pattern to finished product, as their final project.

# Student Responsibilities or Tips for Success in the Course

- 1. Students are encouraged to login multiple times per week in order to participate fully, check for updated information, and stay in contact with the instructor and fellow students.
- 2. Students should ensure they have stable, working internet connections in order to fully participate in online components of this class.
- 3. Give yourself plenty of time to practice the skills before you try to execute them for a grade.
- 4. Ask question. If you need clarification, just let me know.
