Notes from Servant Community and Secretariat Meeting 15<sup>th</sup> July 2017 hosted by the Borders Ultreya

Doctrinal Talk: The Christian Community. We looked at Matthew Chapter 5 and the Beatitudes......'Blessed be......' In this passage we read 'Jesus went up the mountain and sat down'. This puts him in the position of teacher. He is speaking to disciples and the Beatitudes are really the first teaching on how to live in Christian Community. In small groups we discussed five modern translations of each of the Beatitudes and a good discussion followed.

## The modern day Beatitudes.

Happy are those who "recognize their need for God," who acknowledge their dependence on God and His gifts to them. Happy are those who though they are blessed with fine families and friends are still very concerned with the pain and suffering of others, either nearby or at a distance. These others are their human brothers and sisters.

Happy are the generous people who give of their love, their time, their money, and somehow keep on giving despite disillusionment and disappointment in seeing their efforts go wasted.

Happy are the "big people" who can forgive those who are petty, angry, rude, or neurotic, and seek to find and delight in the good qualities of the people around them.

Happy are those who respect a person as an individual and do not prejudge him or her because of race, colour, ethnic, or economic background or sexual identity. They do not, therefore, reduce that individual's many good qualities to one rather unessential characteristic.

## Fourth Day:

One group looked at the trifold leaflet we are introducing and how we can personalise this for Cursillo in Scotland. We will include a photo of a Celtic Cross on the front of this and agreed a best colour format.

A second group looked at the details for the new website, with some volunteers willing to work on this and see it is fast tracked. A third group looked at the new address list that has been compiled and how best to use this, making certain we abide with data protection law.

The fourth group looked at how we would organise a *Sunday Revisited* programme to allow existing Cursillistas to come together over 24 hours for a time of fellowship and teaching. It was noted that 2018 is the 30<sup>th</sup> birthday of Cursillo in Scotland, and perhaps we can combine these two events.
