

Due to COVID-19, we have postponed our annual Garden Tour from May to July 17-18. We used the time to reconfigure our event to be compliant with current COVID-19 guidelines.



We are now pleased to invite you to our **Danville-Alamo-Walnut Creek AAUW Joy of Nature Garden Walk 2020!** This year's AAUW Garden Walk 2020 marks the twenty-year anniversary of our annual garden events. **Five homeowners in Danville and Alamo are opening their spectacular private gardens for us** to stroll through and enjoy at our leisure.

We offer two ways to experience these beautiful spaces:

- 1. **Join us in-person** for a self-guided walk (with appropriate social distancing and mask-wearing)
- 2. **Enjoy the natural beauty from home through our online** Garden Walk 2020 highlights video.

The Garden Walk is a tax-deductible fundraiser with proceeds dedicated to fund scholarships through the AAUW CA Special Projects Fund, a 501(c)(3) fund, Tax ID 68-043071. Our branch has provided over \$93,000 in scholarships over the last eight years to help local college women complete their degree programs.

Your suggested donation of \$35.00 per person is fully tax deductible.

How Can You Participate in the Garden Walk 2020?

First, you can volunteer as a docent. Important considerations have been incorporated into our plans to address possible risks, including availability of hand sanitizer, fewer docents and guests at each home at one time, directional arrows, plant ID stakes and one-way travel. Masks and social distancing will be enforced. Docents will be provided with a KN95 mask if desired. If you have already volunteered to be a docent, your head docent will contact you to confirm the new date and answer questions. If you would like to volunteer, contact Kathy Harkins.

Second, we all need to help promote donations to this event. The Garden Walk 2020 will be our main fundraiser this year for local scholarships so we need to make the most of this opportunity. One thing we all can do is

Public Policy Update

The following is a statement from AAUW CEO Kimberly Churches:

AAUW joins the country in mourning the losses of George Floyd, Ahmaud Arbery, Breonna Taylor and countless other people of color who have been unjustly killed across our nation. Our country needs healing. But healing will only come with justice. As an organization we condemn racism.

Systemic racism is firmly rooted in the U.S. and today's injustices mirror our shameful history — from police brutality to the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on communities of color. There can be no justice or equality when Black and Brown communities are seen as less deserving of basic human and civil rights.

On behalf of our 170,000 members and supporters, we commit to fighting for justice, long-term and lasting change, and we stand in solidarity against racism. We also acknowledge that as an organization we have our own work to do. And, as a member of the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights, we will work to advance the policies and systemic changes identified in the New Era of Public Safety: A Guide to Fair, Safe, and Effective Community Policing and Vision for Justice Platform.

California update: The Assembly Appropriations Committee, partially swayed by the recent death of Floyd George and subsequent nationwide protests, passed two bills that could possibly bring back affirmative action to California and may institute slavery reparations for African Americans.

ACA 5 and AB 3121: Assembly Constitutional Amendment 5, written by Assemblywoman Dr. Shirley Weber (D-San Diego) and Assemblyman Mike Gipson (D-Carson) would overturn Proposition 209, which ended affirmative action policies in California in 1996. Affirmative action, which factors in race and gender for public university admissions and state employment, has not been challenged in California since 2014. Assembly Bill 3121, also written by Assemblywoman Weber, set up a Task Force to compile documentation of the institution of slavery in the United States and then issue recommendations on reparations. Reparations to African Americans in California, if accepted, would most likely come in the form of cash.
