One of the purposes of the establishment of the Falmouth Collaborative was to provide opportunities to unite our three parishes. Our Youth Faith Formation program is one example as is the *That Man Is You!* program. The very well attended Thanksgiving Mass in November and the Anointing of the Sick Service in February are further examples of how, coming together, we can actually enhance our worship experiences and unite as a community. There are no greater liturgies than the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil). After discussions with other collaboratives in the diocese as well as with our Pastoral Council, this year in Falmouth we will celebrate **One Sacred Triduum: April 9, Holy Thursday evening at 7pm at St. Elizabeth Seton; April 10, Good Friday afternoon at 3pm at St. Patrick and April 11, Easter VIGIL at 7pm at St. Anthony.** Please note: the schedule for Palm Saturday/Sunday and Easter SUNDAY (with the exception of the Vigils) will be unchanged. I see this as a great opportunity to share our talents and resources as well as bring us together in worship of God as one faith community. I hope you will plan to join us for these sacred days.

FAITH FORMATION

For our younger students (Gr. 1-7), classes will meet as normal this week. **Sunday morning classes @9:45am (St. Anthony), Monday classes @ 4pm (St. Patrick) and Tuesday classes @5pm (St. Elizabeth Seton).**

As a reminder for students in our First Communion pt. 2 (Gr. 2) class, we will be having our First Communion retreat on **Saturday, March 21st at 10:00am at St. Anthony's**. The format will be very similar to that of our First Reconciliation retreat a few months ago. A parent should be present with their student at this retreat as we will be going over important information regarding the sacrament as well as information regarding rehearsals.

Our next pre-Confirmation (Gr 8) has been rescheduled for Sun. March 29 at St. Anthony's beginning with check in for Mass downstairs in the church basement at 10:45 followed by 11am Mass and a session **downstairs in the church (change of location) until 1:15**. Please note that the date has changed from the original schedule given out at the start of the year.

For those in Confirmation (gr. 9), please see the separate email that was sent out recently regarding information for the celebration of Confirmation. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on **Sunday, March 22nd at 2pm at St. Anthony**. A rehearsal will be held on **Tuesday, March 17th at 6:30pm at St. Anthony**. Both candidates and sponsors are required to attend the rehearsal. If a sponsor cannot attend this rehearsal, another adult must stand in for them.

PRECAUTIONS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK AND FLU SEASON
