These are high quality Cultural Capital books, carefully selected from Reception through to Year 6 which we want our children to experience and read.

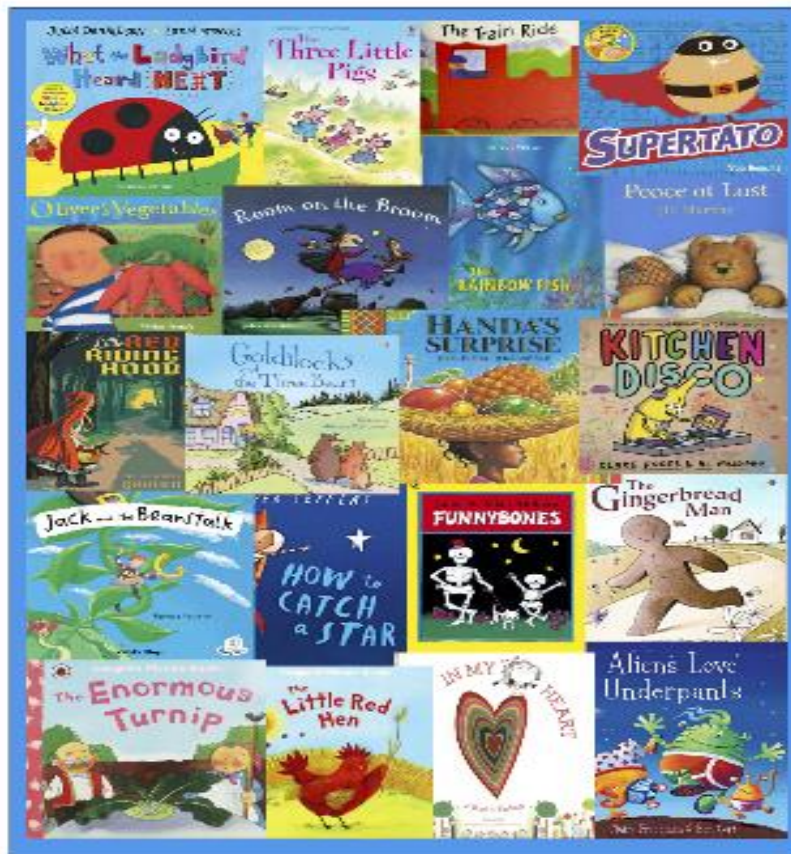
Why we are doing this?

Cultural Capital Texts give children the opportunity to explore stories, poems and writing which allow them to experience:

- New, complex vocabulary (Archaic Language);
- writing where flashbacks occur (Non-Linear Time Sequences);
- texts narrated from different points of view (Narratively Complex);
- figurative and symbolic text where a larger point about human nature is inferred (Complexity of Plot);
- texts which ask the reader to assemble meaning around many clues (Resistant Texts).
