

I must admit to having mixed feelings about seeing all the decorations that go up in November – sometimes even October. It seems to happen earlier every year – the beautiful fall season is brought to an abrupt end much too soon by the appearance of trees, elves, wreaths, wrappings, and continual reminders of how many shopping days are left till Christmas. Thanksgiving Day itself has become the marker for the beginning of the holiday shopping season!

The other side of this, of course, is that anything which reminds me of the birth of Christ is a welcome and wonderful thing. The world needs this reminder – this story – more than ever before. It is a time to remember the significance of this child - that he taught us a new way to live – out of love rather than fear, under grace instead of under the law. Anything which brings him to mind gladdens our hearts and strengthens our spirits – even decorations put up much too early for my liking.

But this year, everything is different. Halloween is different, Thanksgiving is different, even Christmas will be different. Will there be many gathered around our table, as in previous years? The reality is, there's not much in this season that encourages us to focus on God's gifts to us, and to reflect on all of our blessings as the Thanksgiving season comes near. But this is indeed the time to pay attention to God's presence in our lives – to look for ways in which God's spirit touches us each day – especially during this challenging time, this "Caronatide."

Some of my friends make "gratitude lists", writing down one thing they are thankful for every day. I will admit I've never done this. It's not that I'm not thankful enough, I'm not organized enough. Others put something aside - an item of food, or clothing, every day to give to a mission at the end of the month. Others make time to be still and prayerful to keep themselves centered - and as Henri Nouwen observed, "Make room in your heart for God and let God cherish you."

An intentional spirit of gratitude helps lift our spirits, reduce anxiety, and temper the anger we may have because things are not the way we want them to be. There is always something to be grateful for - even now.

All are welcome!! Please join us on Sunday AM for study before Worship!!





We have all four buckets filled to the top with all the items that CWS wanted and I am sure they will be put to good use. Joanne Brown, Fran Pepin and Lou- Ann Laporte gave us a review of Saturdays ABWM's Spiritual Retreat. All the women who planned and participated in the zoom Retreat did a wonderful job.

The ladies have decided to have two mission projects for our November meeting. I will be ordering from the Church World Services Best Gift Catalog. "Buy Today, Change Tomorrow" is the title and their vision is "You won't find any gadgets or gizmos or gimmicks in our catalog, only the tools and resources that we need to do the most good around the world. So, share the power of money well spent and buy today to change tomorrow." I ordered 20 Jerry Cans (jerry cans have been repurposed for a use far greater than their original intent. Once used for fuel during times of war, today the containers help a family carry clean drinking water from a well or pump back home safely hygienically.) I also ordered 200 tree seedlings (Trees stop erosion and help the land both store and filter water. The gift of seedlings is rooted in progress and sustainability in service of others.)

The second project for November will be for donations to McAuley House in Providence.


