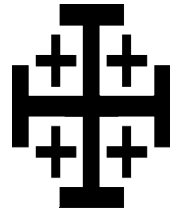

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

An ancient title for this Sunday is *Dominica in Albis*, or “Sunday in White.” During the Easter Vigil, the newly baptized are invested with a white garment, a sign that they have put on Christ. At one time, the garments were worn for a full week of celebration and reflection, and on this Sunday the newly baptized would appear in their robes again in their new place among the faithful for Eucharist.

In later centuries, the energy of new life at Easter was largely forgotten, and this Sunday was renamed “Quasimodo Sunday,” or “Low Sunday.” In recent years, with the recovery of the insight that Easter is the privileged time for celebrating and renewing baptism, there is nothing “Low” about this Sunday. At a week’s distance, the beauty and grace of our Easter celebration is sustained by joyful alleluias, the blessing and sprinkling of holy water, and the comfort of the Lord’s presence to us. ### From Father Robert's Desk -

**"We are the Easter people and Hallelujah is our song."**

This quote from Pope St. John Paul II not only heralds the Risen Christ but also calls us to action. In the Gospel of Luke Jesus said, "I have come to set fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already blazing!" (Luke 12:49) and the Disciples on the road to Emmaus exclaimed after recognizing the Risen Christ in the breaking of the bread, "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:32)

Today marks not the end, but the beginning of the Easter season. Fifty days culminating with the descent of Holy Spirit on the apostles and all the faithful gathered in the upper room, the Advocate, that at the Last Supper Jesus promised the Father would send.

From there this small group of people, these Apostles and Disciples of Christ, emerged with hearts blazing and converted 3000 people that very day, eventually spreading Christianity to every corner of the earth.

Hallelujah! We are an Easter people!

With the Passion of Jesus still so fresh in our minds, St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta reminds us, "The reason for our existence is to quench the thirst of Jesus. When He asked for water, the soldier gave him vinegar to drink - but His thirst was for love, for souls, for you and me."

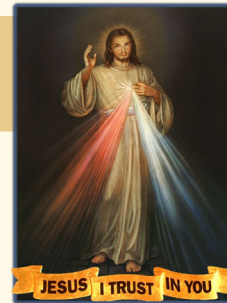

### **News from SVdP:**

The Nativity Conference received 19 calls in March and we were able to assist 5 families. One family requested food and they were given approximately \$50 worth of assistance from the food pantry. We had one family call for rental assistance and they received \$560 to be used toward their rent. Twenty-five dollars' worth of food was also provided to the family. We received 3 calls from families needing help to pay their utility bills. Each of those families received an average of \$415 worth of assistance. Two of the 3 families received an average of \$33 worth of food from our pantry. Thank you for your continued support of the Nativity Conference.

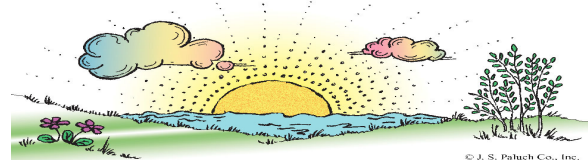
