Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



FROM THE PASTOR

15 August 2021

Every so often a solemnity like the Assumption falls on a Sunday, giving more prominence to this special feast of Mary and the patronal feast of St. Mary's Church. When the angel Gabriel visited the young Virgin Mary with the momentous news that she would be the mother of God's Son, she responded faithfully, "May it be done to me according to your word." At the end of her earthly life, God drew Mary home, assuming her into heaven where she would reign as queen until the end of time.

From the beginning of her life on earth, when she was immaculately conceived, until the end, the Blessed Virgin Mary conformed her life to God's will. As we listen to God's word today, let us consider how we assent to God's will and incorporate God's word in our lives.

We welcome our bishop, the Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano to St. Mary's Church this Sunday as he presides at the festive Eucharist at 10:45 am and blesses Mary's Flower Garden and those in whose memory or in whose honor the flowers were donated.

Next Sunday, August 22nd, the Feast of the Queenship of Mary is observed. As is the custom on this day, the *Living Rosary* takes place at the outdoor Marian shrine next to St. Francis of Assisi Church at 7:00 pm. The Rosary is "living" because each bead is prayed by an individual person. 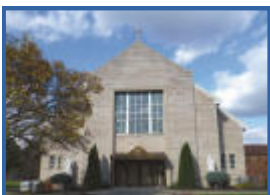

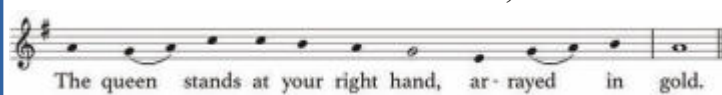

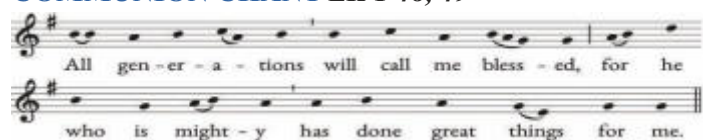

Our regularly scheduled Gospel reading has been interrupted by the Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven. The regular Gospel for the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Cycle B comes from John 6:51-58 which closes out Jesus Discourse on the Living Bread. In the Old Testament bread is strongly associated with the Word of God and this is likely how the initial listeners would have interpreted the beginning of Jesus Discourse. As we heard last week, the crowd of listeners start to murmur when Jesus begins to closely associate the bread with himself. The murmuring does not dissuade Jesus from continuing to teach the fullness of what God is now offering mankind; the Real Presence and True Manna constitutes the fullest consummation of Love. As you will hear in next week's Gospel reading, this idea is totally incomprehensible to the mind as it is a true mystery requiring the fullness of faith in Christ to comprehend. This week GOOGLE "EWTN Library The Minds Road to God" and begin studying St Bonaventure's mystical approach of moving the mind through the Heart!

Q: On what ethical principles should the Church's productive co-existence with the State be based?



A: The Church demands what is implied by the universal principles of religious freedom: freedom of expression and teaching, freedom of public worship and organizational freedom, freedom to appoint her own officials, freedom to construct houses of worship, the right to own private property and also to associate for various educational, cultural, medical, and charitable purposes.

Inspiration:

"The Almighty has done great things for me . . ." proclaims Mary. Can I list two "great things" God has done for me? How about two more? Make them specific.

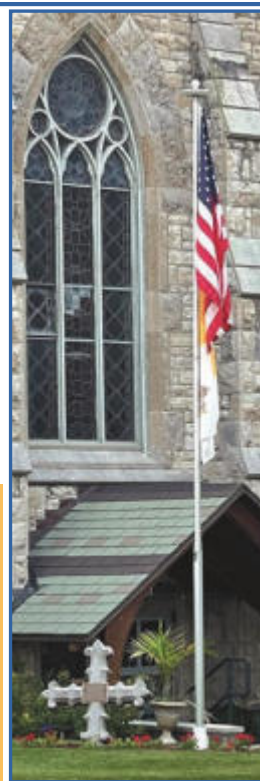

Remember, holy water at the entrance of the church is a reminder of our Baptism when we were baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



THE FLAGPOLE on the lawn between the church and the rectory was erected in 2018 on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the founding of St. Mary's Parish to commemorate those parishioners currently in the military and also those who had served in the past. 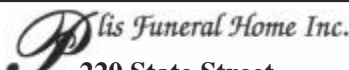
