If you were born **ON** or **AFTER** September 1, 1993, you **MUST** complete an approved Boater Education course to operate a PWC, windblown vessel over 14 feet in length or a boat with more than a 15 horsepower rating unless supervised from someone who is 18 years of age or older, who can lawfully (born before September 1, 1993 or completed an approved Boater Education course) operate the watercraft and is on board when the vessel is underway.

April 18, 2019

A meeting of the Board of Directors for Cherokee Water Company was held at 6:00 pm on Thursday, April 18, at NK 20 Lake Cherokee, Longview Texas 75603 with the following Directors present:

George Strunk, President Bill Adler, Vice President Johnnie Tyler, Treasurer Sue Wilson, Secretary Bo Besharse David Collins Seleta Davis Larry Lacewell Randall Latch Steve Lobue Randy Stringer Lynda Whalen

President George Strunk called the meeting to order.

Sue Wilson, Secretary, pronounced a quorum.

**A MOTION** was made by Bill Adler and seconded by Sue Wilson to approve the Minutes of the March 21, 2019 regularly scheduled Board of Directors meeting.

The motion passed.

Johnnie Tyler, Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's Report. The financial statements were reviewed in detail at the committee meeting on Monday. Operating revenues are on budget and operating expenses are under budget.

**A MOTION** was made by Johnnie Tyler and seconded by Bill Adler to approve the financial statements for month ending March 31, 2019.

The motion passed.

**A MOTION** was made by Johnnie Tyler and seconded by Randall Latch to certify the bills paid for month ending March 31, 2019.

Managers Memo -Report by Erin Summerlin:

- 1. I have requested Terry Winn to do the TCEQ REQUIRED 5-year amended/updated water conservation plan for us. This shouldn't be a big expense since it is just an update not much has changed and we still just have the City of Longview and Knox Lee as customers.
- 2. We just hired 2 part-time Patrolmen and 2 part-time Fuel Center attendants. We will hire 2 seasonal Maintenance guys soon to help with the mowing.
- 3. There is one full lease fee due for the 2017-2018 lease renewal period that was turned over to the Lake Attorney on February 1, 2018 for collection.
- 4. There are 10 full lease fees due for the 2018-2019 lease renewal period that were turned over to the Lake Attorney on February 1, 2019 for collection.
- 5. The 2<sup>nd</sup> half lease payments are being collected now and become delinquent on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 6. The Fuel Center summer hours will begin on Wednesday, May 1st- Tuesday-Friday 2:00 pm-6:00 pm, Saturday 8:00 am-6:00 pm and Sunday noon-6:00 pm.
- 7. Beginning Memorial Day Weekend, we have invited food trucks to set up at Firecracker Park every weekend until Labor Day weekend. Right now, Divine Catering, C Rojo's Mobile Cuisine, Tiki-Hut Snowballs, Sweet Treats & More, JC Cones and Street Licious have signed on.

Lynda Whalen, Chair of the Property and Rules Committee, reported that the Committee did meet this month and had three action items to bring before the Board.

**A MOTION** was made by Lynda Whalen and seconded by David Collins that the Board approve the recommendation of the committee for the following:

1. A REQUEST FOR A VARIANCE from Mitchell Reed, NG 45, to construct an attached open deck closer than 75' to the water. Both shareholders have signed off on this variance.

2. **A REQUEST FOR A VARIANCE** from Michael Cherry, NI 17, to construct a 10'x20' storage building closer than 6' to the property line. This building will have a 4/12 pitch roof and 12" overhang on all

4 sides. Both shareholders have signed off on this variance.

# 3. A REQUEST FOR A VARIANCE

from Chad Powell, NP 79, to construct a 1,960 sq. ft. boathouse farther than 50' from the shoreline. Both shareholders have signed off on this variance.

The motion passed.

Randy Stringer, Chair of the Building and Grounds Committee, reported that the Committee did meet this month and had no action items to bring before the Board.

Johnnie Tyler, Chair of the Natural Resources Committee, reported that the Committee did meet this month and had no action items to bring before the Board.

Sue Wilson, Chair of the Policy and Conduct Committee, reported that the Committee did meet this month and had one action item to bring before the Board.

**A MOTION** was made by Sue Wilson and seconded by Bill Adler that the Board approve the following amendments to the bylaws of Cherokee Water Company.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 3, is amended to read:

A regular meeting of the directors shall be held in the principal office of the Corporation, or at such place as may be designated by the majority of such directors, immediately after the adjournment of each annual meeting of shareholders, and also on the third Thursday of January, April and July, provided however, that whenever such day shall fall upon a legal holiday the meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 5, is amended to read:

Notices of all regular and special meetings of directors shall be provided to each director by the secretary at least two (2) days previous to the time fixed

ARTICLE V, SECTION 6, is amended to read:

A quorum for the transaction of business at any regular or special meeting of directors shall consist of seven (7) members of the board of directors. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present at the time of the act is the act of the board of directors of the Corporation unless a greater number is required by these bylaws or law.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 11, is amended to read:

Any director missing four (4) consecutive regular meetings shall be automatically removed from the board of directors. The board may appoint a director to fill the unexpired term.

Geoge Strunk read ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1-...The Board of Directors may amend these bylaws by a vote of three-fourths of the directors at any of its meetings.

Randy Stringer, Chair of the Long-Range Planning Committee, reported that the Committee did meet this month and had no action items to bring before the Board.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:22 pm.

# LEASE RENEWAL REMINDER

There is much more to responsible boating than just ownership. If you have

never taken a class or if you want to brush up on your knowledge, or maybe you want to serve as moral support for your child or grandchild that is attending the class, please join us. Everyone will learn something, even the experienced! The cost of the class is \$20.00. Our famous Chef Hays will be grilling the hot dogs and chips and soft drinks will be provided. We have lots of door prizes and prizes for best scores on the test. You must pre-register so contact the office if you are interested in attending.



## **REMEMBER:**

Effective March 15, 2018, Lake Cherokee became a CONTROLLED ACCESS ONLY waterway. This means that the 3 boat ramps are closed and locked. Launching watercraft from shareholder lots is no longer permitted and private boat ramps are not to be used. Any watercraft put in Lake Cherokee is required to pass an inspection performed by a CWC officer. Arrangements can be made to launch and remove a craft by contacting Lake Patrol at (903) 643-7321. The fine for non-compliance is \$1,000.



# **CWC Boaters.....** Ten things that you may not know: Mike Brady, Area Chief - TPWD

- 1. The minimum age to operate a boat in the State of Texas without Boater Education certification is currently age 25! Each year the minimum age goes up - it applies to anyone born on or after September 1, 1993.
- 2. The rear-view mirrors on your PWC may not meet the legal requirements to tow a skier! All mirrors must be at least 4" wide and 4" from top to bottom. Factory installed mirrors seldom satisfy the law! Of course, towing behind PWCs is not allowed on Lake Cherokee
- 3. Dim Dem Damn lights! Docking lights are not navigation lights. Although they are very useful when navigating the boat roads at night they should not be used while on open water. Docking lights can be blinding and could interfere with the other operator's ability to determine which way you are going, or worse - not being able to see other boats, or sometimes even you! Bright white lights are confusing when determining distance or source. This is especially true in heavy boat traffic (such as after July 4th fireworks). They are often confused with lights on shore as well. State law requires that no lights be displayed that could interfere with navigation lights.
- 4. Drain & Dry your live wells! State law requires that you take measures to remove harmful plants and animals from your boat and trailer before launching and before leaving a boat ramp! You can be cited for not draining your equipment, including the motor, and bilges. Even bait buckets are to be drained - on land!
- 5. Citations for 'Boating While Intoxicated' (BWI) are treated the same as DWI. It will be added to your driving record!
- 6. Paddle Boarders must have a PFD onboard! May as well wear it!
- 7. Inflatable PFD's may not be included in the required number of lifejackets onboard unless they are being 'worn'!
- 8. There are no speed limits on Texas lakes. However, law enforcement can issue citations for excessive speed or reckless operation - on their own discretion! CWC is a private lake and we do have speed limits! 40 mph on open water, and 20 mph in the main boat channels. These limits are reduced for night boating.
- 9. Most infractions regarding boating laws and rules on Lake Cherokee are from adults! It is not 'the kids' as we would normally assume.
- 10. You can take the Boater Education class at the CWC office which will be held on Saturday, May 18th. Our class has been recognized by TPWD as one of, if not 'THE' best class offered in the State of Texas! Call Misty at the CWC office to sign-up!





# **DECALS**

The watercraft decals are TEAL this year. All boats operated on Lake Cherokee must be registered in the name of a lease-holder or leaseholder's spouse; have the owner's lot number affixed on each side of the watercraft, preferably half-way between the bow and stern and must be at least 3 inches in height and one half inches in width contrasting with the background color of the boat; and have the current teal decals affixed on each side close to the lot number.



Fines for an unauthorized boat or expired decals start at \$100.00. Replacement decals for watercraft are \$50.00 per set.

# Lake Cherokee Wood Ducks

The wood duck shares its genus with the Asian Mandarin ducks. Their breeding habitat is wooded swamps, shallow lakes, marshes, ponds and creeks in North America. They love Lake Cherokee.

Nesting choices are cavities in trees close to water and nesting boxes if available. Females line their nests with feathers and other soft materials. We use wood shavings in our boxes to help out. Unlike most ducks the wood duck has sharp claws for perching in trees and can, in our area, produce 2 broods in a single season, the only North American duck that can do so.

Females typically lay between 7 to 15 eggs that incubate in about 30 days. If nesting boxes are close to each other, the females will share, a behavior known as "nest dumping. This isn't a good situation because as many as 30 eggs leads to unsuccessful incubation. But whatever mom is sitting on the eggs she will take care of the baby ducks.

We have gotten to see the babies leave the box one time. A group of males surrounded the box area and our boathouse. The female called to the babies from the water. She doesn't help them in anyway. Eventually, they braved the big leap to the water. One didn't move fast enough to suit the one behind him and he got a shove. Wings flapping he hit the water bouncing forward and he looked like a bathtub rubber ducky. Mr. Impatient came quickly behind him. When all were out of the box the mother gathered them close to her and off they went to some unknown place on the lake. The males stayed with her until



she left. No meal for the turtles that day.

If they nest in a tree they can be up 50 to 65 feet. Because the ducks weigh almost nothing, they float down so the jump doesn't hurt them.

Swimming is no problem after they hatch and they are able to find their own food, which is mainly berries, acorns, seeds, but also insects, making them omnivores. Our wood ducks live on the lake year round. Their attractive plumage makes them one of the most popular waterfowl on Lake Cherokee.

Like most of our wildlife they too have enemies. In the 19th century market hunting both for meat and plumage for the ladies' hat material in Europe resulted in a severe habitat loss. The U.S. Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918 ended unregulated hunting and measures taken to protect remaining habitat made it possible for wood duck populations to rebound in 1920. The development of the artificial nesting box in 1930s gave an additional boost to weed duck production. For extra protection, guards help keep them safe from snakes and raccoons. Today fishing line and baits are threats to them. And if you decide to feed them, please, no bread.

These beautiful birds are one of my favorite subjects for my watercolor paintings. We watch for their arrival every spring. They are as exciting as our pelicans. We always hope to see the babies leave the nest even though such a treat is rare







---- "Gear Tags" (ID labels) must be attached to both ends of the main line with name, address and date the line was set. Valid for 10 days.

---- Abandoned/unattended trotlines are subject to be removed.




