

Let Your Imagination Soar With Peter and the Starcatcher

Good Company Players' production of the exciting Peter and the Starcatcher opens at Roger Rocka's March 16.

This Tony-winning show upends the century-old story of how a miserable orphan comes to be The Boy Who Would Not Grow Up (a.k.a. Peter Pan). A wildly theatrical adaptation of Dave Barry and Ridley Pearson's best-selling novels, the play was written by Rick Elice (who also wrote the scripts for Jersey Boys and The Addams Family), with music by Wayne Barker. From marauding pirates and jungle

tyrants to unwilling comrades and unlikely heroes, Peter and the Starcatcher playfully explores the depths of greed and despair... and the bonds of friendship, duty and love.




