








In the Children's Forest Project, children on








































Lokota artist, drummer and drum-maker, Pawl Mountain Skyrider, lives on Cortes Island.

Carla comes from Kingcame Inlet and is a member of the Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw Nation.











Elder Bill Assu is the oldest grandson of Chief Billy Assu of the We Wai Kai Nation (pictured left).












Here she is holding a gift with Flame Robins from Trawlwoolway artist Lisa Kennedy at the Nakoda Lodge on the Stoney Reserve.









Reserve of Morley.


