Grand Commander's Message

My Fellow Sir Knights of California:

This article combines a piece that I wrote for the California Supplement of the *Knights Templar* magazine with some remaining thoughts. This introduction was necessitated because the KT Magazine has discontinued the inclusion of the State Supplements in the print version and now requires those who remain interested to search the website, click on the Supplement link, find the appropriate State and then select the necessary month. Excuse me for being dubious but I doubt many of you will go to that trouble. I hope I'm proved wrong, but

One of the things that disappoints me about this decision is that new contributors to the Grand Commanders Club and Grand Masters Club programs of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation will not see their names in print. I always liked the recognition given to our contributors and would, for the Sir Knights I knew, try to call

and acknowledge their generosity. I still feel that way about those of you who commit your resources to this valuable and meaningful medical research. It saddens me that you may not be acknowledged to your peers.

Another disappointment is more personal. I've tried hard to provide content to you in my Message that might get you thinking about our Christian tradition and how it impacts our lives as Templars. Some of you have taken the time to acknowledge the message, for which I will always be grateful. This month I tried to tackle the issues of Time and Relativity, topics I'm barely literate about, but with a purpose. I wanted each of you to consider what you might do if God were to give you an additional day each month. Would you devote that time to considering your relationship to the universe and the ones you love? Would you consider how you could improve yourselves as men, leaders in your communities and Christians? I truly believe that most of you would. For me, when I wrote that State Supplement, I was thinking about my deceased lady, my wonderful, supportive and caring wife Hallie, who passed away last December. Because of this, I asked our editor Phil Hardiman, to reprint the article. Here it is:

September 2021 California Supplement

"If I could save time in a bottle, The first thing that I'd like to do, ..."

Jim Croce, *Time in Bottle* (1973)

Fellow Travelers on the Level of Time: How many of us have thought, "if I just had a little more time," or perhaps, "if I had to do it over. ..." Most of us have, I'm guessing. But that musing got me to wondering about the meaning of time. Likely too metaphysical a topic for this brief monograph, but a curiosity of mine and one that I hoped my casual thoughts might pique your interest in too.

St. Augustine, an early Christian philosopher, observed in *Confessions* that time is ephemeral: the past is no longer; the future is not yet; the present is, but lasts a fleeting moment. To Augustine, time was an irreversible succession of linear events, progressing inexorably from the past, through the present, to the future.

Time as a linear concept was accepted dogma from the first awareness of seasons. But as so often happens, philosophers, science-fiction writers, and literary pundits began speculating about "what if." What if we could travel back in time, whom would you visit? What if we could see the future, what would our lives be like? One notable author, H.G. Wells, penned a serial novella in 1895, entitled, *The Time Machine*. (I guess these days we'd call a serial novella either a comic book or a graphic novel. The Victorians are to be admired in many respects.) Most of us remember the story from High School English class: Wells' protagonist ventures forward thousands of years to a time when gentle, childlike creatures called Eloi live in pastoral innocence but are hunted at night for food by the fearsome, underground-dwelling Morlocks. Although societal commentary was surely behind Wells' plot, readers were fascinated by the concept of time travel.

Newtonian ideas about the relationship of material properties were questioned by theoretical physicists in the early 20th Century. Most importantly, Albert Einstein published his paper regarding the special theory of relativity in 1905. There he asserted that time was not constant but rather a relative. Einstein proposed that light traveling in a vacuum unaffected by gravity would alter time depending on the relative position of the observer. Thus, if a person were to board a spaceship traveling at near the speed of light and not subject to gravitational forces, the astronaut might complete the journey in what to him was but a few years. To an observer on earth, however, the trip would take decades. Thus, the 30-year-old astronaut might return home as a 35-year-old man, but his 30-year-old friends who remained behind would then be 80. Einstein called this concept the spacetime continuum, time being relative to the position and circumstances of the observer.

Einstein expanded his treatise with his general theory of relativity in 1915 to incorporate the effect of gravity. An explanation of this is well beyond the scope of my limited intellect but is fascinating reading for those of you with physics and/or mathematics curiosity. Subsequent astronomical observations have confirmed the presence of black holes as Einstein postulated, which raises the possibility of actual time-travel (I'm suggesting that you try this before me). The linear concept of time, evolving from past to future, is no longer the stuff of settled science.

My practice has been to try to tie my monthly columns to our faith. In that regard, September's message was prompted by a recent First Degree. At one point, the Master recites: "In the beginning, God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. And God said, 'Let there be light:' and there was light." Genesis 1:1-3. To have a beginning, time must exist. Augustine argued that God created time at the conception of the Universe and that questions about what happened *before* creation are meaningless because "before" didn't exist. Try wrapping your head around the implications of that!

But to answer the question I first posed: what would I do if I could capture time? I think of my wonderful, recently departed wife Hallie, as you yourselves may think of your own families, and reflect on the remainder of Jim Croce's lyrics:

If I could save time in a bottle
The first thing that I'd like to do
Is to save everyday 'til eternity passes away
Just to spend it with you.

God Bless. And Thank You for taking the time to read my own lamentation.

"Fear Not: Proclaim and Celebrate Our Faith."

On Sunday, the 15th, the day before the Triennial convened, there were presentations made by a Professional Geologist, Scott Wolter, who has done much work on the Kensington Rune Stone. You may have seen him on the History Channel. He made a convincing presentation that that Stone is authentic and genuine, and furthermore was created here in North America by ancient Templar Knights in the late 1300s! It is further possible that they brought with them some of the Templar Treasury that was later used to fund the Revolutionary War! That may sound far-fetched, but he promised future documentation of his several themes.

On Monday the 16th, the Triennial began in earnest, with many introductions and presentations. Our own SK Bruce Pruitt was honored as Honorary Past Grand Master! He is in good company with nine other Living Most Eminent Honorary Past Grand Masters.

Also on Monday the Education Committee presented a certificate and pin to the winner of the first iteration in 2019 of the Templar Ritualist Program. For more info, see the Templar Ritualist article below.



On Monday afternoon and Tuesday, 26 Legislation were considered, using an electronic balloting system on loan from Oregon, and which gave instant results when the ballot was closed! Here is a synopsis of the more interesting items that were approved:

#05 - Public appearances in Uniform

#06 - Virtual Grand Conclaves

#07 - Virtual Constituent Conclaves

#08 – Summer Uniforms at discretion of Grand Commander

#09 – Use of Short Form Ritual required for Opening when less than 9 Sir Knights present

#14 – Offices in multiple Commanderies #16-18 – Holding, Special Purpose and Auxiliary Units

#20 - Templar Apron

#23&26 - Removal of sanctions against the Rectified Scottish Rite

One piece of Legislation failed – that which required a more extensive Attestation of Faith, and a uniform petition for all Commanderies.

SECRETARY and/or RECORDER ESSENTIALS

Forms and Documents you will need are located at the Grand York Rite website, which is: www.yorkriteofcalifornia.org.

Scroll down and click on "York Rite Forms and Documents." Then click on the appropriate logo. A window opens where you enter the userid, which is "cagyr" and the password, which is "brio"

Scroll down to Officers Manual, which has information for the Secretary, and print that out. Many concepts in the Grand Chapter manual are relevant to the Councils and Commanderies.

Priorities are as follows:

- 1. <u>Dues Collection</u> You should send out dues notices no later than October, with payments from members due by December 31st.
- 2. Membership control -- Especially important is the very last item, "Royal Arch Monthly Report." This is relevant to you as a Secretary/Recorder if you do not yet have a userid for access to MMS Masonic Membership Solutions. If you fill the paper report out each month, whenever you encounter changes to the membership, you will find it much easier at the end of the year to produce the year-end report, which is used to compute the amount of per capita the Chapter needs to pay. That payment is due by Jan 15th each year. Important changes to your membership include new members, demits, remits and deaths. Maintain e-mail addresses for members and you can easily then forward the monthly newsletter, The WORKMAN, to them.
- 3. Do not cavalierly suspend members for non-payment of dues. There is a Constitutional process that should be followed rigorously in order that members, who may have moved and not received your dues notice, are treated fairly. See the following sections of the relevant Constitution in order to learn about this process:

- 4. Per Capita -- The Per Capita payment, due each Jan 15th, does not require action by the Chapter to be paid. You will need good, up-to-date end-of-year number of active members that is crucial for us when we compute your per capita payment. Without good data you will most likely overpay your per capita requirement. It is sensible to begin your process near the end of the CY, as soon as possible. It is also sensible, if you have access to the Grand Lodge database, to check each member to see if they are still alive. But most important is getting a userid to utilize MMS.
- 5. <u>Insurance</u> -- The Insurance payment, due each July 15th, does not require action by the Chapter, Council or Commandery to be paid. You will be billed for the payment by the Grand Secretary-Recorder.
- 6. <u>Lodge Book of Marks</u> Maintain this up-to-date, or perhaps arrange for a PHP to take on the responsibility of maintaining.
- 7. Minutes Take good minutes, but don't over-do it by trying to capture everything that is said. Focus on having a clear representation of motions made and the vote count by which they passed or failed. In addition to keeping petitions in a separate file, it is good practice to replicate the basic petitioner information in the minutes. It is also a good practice to keep the names of attendees at each meeting in the minutes. If conferring a degree, keep a copy of the cast members and the candidate(s). Also, please send the candidate class names to the Grand Secretary.
- 8. Grand Sessions Before the April meeting, remind the Dais officers they are responsible to attend, and arrange a stipend if your Chapter, Council or Commandery can afford it. Remind members who expect to attend to be sure to take their dues cards. If Dais Officers of the Chapter and Council cannot attend, they may issue a proxy, or they may elect a representative. This is true also for Commanderies, whose members cannot issue proxies. The appropriate forms can be obtained on the Grand York Rite website: Scroll to "Elected Representative and Proxy Credentials."
- 9. Order of High Priesthood Be sure the current HP and PHPs know they are eligible to receive this Order. In fact, it is a Constitutional requirement! Share the petition with them and send to the Grand Secretary. This requirement does not appear to be true for the Thrice Illustrious Master Degree or the Past Commander's Association. Petitions for all three bodies are available at the secure website.

- o **The Grand Master's Club One Thousand Dollars enrolls you as a concerned individual in the humanitarian work of the Foundation. The Grand Master's Club is available to all individuals, whether Templars or others, but not to organizations. Your membership in the Grand Master's Club entitles you to a lapel pin, an engraved wall plaque and the Crusaders Cross issued for the first 5 Grand Master Clubs. (As of 2/1/2015 once 25 Grand Master's Clubs are reached, a Sword of Merit will be awarded.)
- o **The Grand Commander's Club You can enroll in the Grand Commander's Club by sending in your first installment of \$100.00 or more. At the time of your enrollment, you will receive a lapel pin and wallet card (signifying your membership). In addition, members of the Grand Commander's Club pledge to make annual contributions of \$100.00 or more for nine more years until the total of \$1,000.00 is reached. Once contributions total \$1,000.00, the individual is enrolled in the Grand Master's Club. **The Grand Master's Club and Grand Commander's Club are available to all individual Templars or others, but not to organizations.
- o **Memorial Donations** These donations are of any amount in memory of a deceased person. A form is provided on the donor envelope.
- o **Honorary Gifts** These donations are given in honor of a living person in recognition of service or friendship.
- o **Wills and Bequests** Anyone who believes in the service provided by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. may leave a bequest to the Foundation in their will.
- o **Sight Crusader** Anyone who designates the KTEF in their will and provides suitable notification to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. will be listed in the Gold Book and designated a Sight Crusader.
- o **The Permanent Donor Fund** This unique fund gives perpetual recognition to any person or organization that becomes a recipient of the Golden Chalice or Sword of Merit. Recognition is given by presentation of the Golden Chalice or Sword of Merit and the name and amount contributed appear in the Annual Report on a continuing basis. Additional donations by the individual or organization in the amount of \$1,000 or more will be acknowledged in future annual reports. The donor may be an organization, foundation, corporation, or individual.

- o **The Golden Chalice** The Chalice is awarded in recognition of a single donation of \$10,000 or more. The donation may be applied to the Permanent Donor Fund.
- o **The Grand Master's Sword of Merit** This coveted award is given in recognition of a single donation of \$25,000 or more. The donation may be applied to the Permanent Donor Fund.

General Order 2022-01 Guidelines for Implementation of Conferral Fees

At the May 2021 Annual Conclave, our Sir Knights adopted Resolution 2020-03 as Templar Law. That Resolution raised the charge payable to Grand Commandery for conferral of the Order of the Temple to \$25 from the current \$14 assessment, an increase of \$11.

A question has been raised about the timing of this increase. Amendments to Templar Laws and Regulations become effective immediately following the conclusion of the Grand Conclave at which they are adopted.

Resolution 2020-03 also provides that the new charge for conferral be paid with the Annual Return. The conferral fee is based on the number of a candidates knighted in the preceding calendar year. Therefore, constituent Commanderies will be billed the new \$25 charge in 2022 based on the number of candidates knighted in 2021.

The Bylaws of constituent Commanderies require that they adopt a fee provision for the conferral of Templar Orders. Rather than absorbing the added cost in their existing fee, local Commanderies may desire to amend their Bylaws to increase the fee charged for Orders or to automatically adjust the fee for conferral to include the amount charged by Grand Commandery.

Section 11 of the *Uniform Code of Bylaws For Chartered Commandery* establishes the procedure to amend Bylaws. The process requires at least two Stated Conclaves for passage. Before a change to the Bylaws becomes effective, it requires approval by the Grand Commander.

It is my intention to <u>approve without delay any change to the Bylaws</u> of constituent Commanderies that amends the fee for conferral of Orders consistent with the alternatives presented here.

This order shall be read at the first conclave of each constituent commanderies following its receipt.

General Order 2022-02 Guidelines for Re-opening Commanderies

This General Order sets for the guidelines and procedures required to conduct Commandery meetings or hold Commandery events.

On June 15, 2021, the State of California lifted its emergency COVID restrictions and Grand Master of Masons Art Weiss issued his "Reopening Directive II Addressing June 15th Removal of State-Imposed Restrictions on Meetings and Events." Consistent with the policies announced in those directives, the Grand Commandery of California publishes the following guidelines:

- Local Commanderies may conduct in-person meetings and events in compliance with county and local restrictions, if any. Individual counties and cities may choose to impose updated meeting limitations, in which case those restrictions must be enforced.
- 2. Combined virtual and in-person meetings are not presently authorized. Virtual meetings may continue until September 30, 2021, if the Commandery so desires.
- 3. Sir Knights and their guests who attend Commandery meetings and events must comply with any state, county or city guidance relating to face coverings in effect at the time of the meeting/event. Currently, the State and some localities are considering whether to reinstate mask mandates; be sure to check with all appropriate jurisdictions in advance of the event or meeting.
- 4. Sir Knights and their guests will not be required to show proof of a negative COVID test or vaccination card to attend in-person meetings.
- 5. Absent some change in State-mandated or applicable local directives, Commandery events and meetings will not require pre-registration, seating charts, special cleaning procedures, asylum COVID maintenance procedures or social distancing. Sir Knights are encouraged to practice safe gathering restrictions that are consistent with the ceremony undertaken.
- The guidelines published in this General Order shall apply to Commandery events, practices, conclaves, degrees, festivals and social gatherings within the State of California.
- 7. This General Order shall expire when superseded or at the end of my term in office.

The Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage is intended for <u>first time pilgrims</u>, those who have not been to the Holy Land before. GUIDELINES FOR THE SELECTION OF MINISTERS

The following are the selection criteria suggested for use in choosing ministers for the Knight Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage. <u>Please carefully consider these guidelines before inviting ministers to apply.</u>

Ministers to be considered should:

- Have never traveled to the Holy Land before.
- Be in **good physical health** (if the idea of walking a brisk mile or more uphill, non-stop, with steps is a concern, this may not be the program from which this person would benefit). This is a physically rigorous program. We average 5 7 miles of walking each day. Many surfaces are uneven, unpaved, with steps and some steep inclines. This is an important consideration. A person who is unable to fully participate will miss valuable parts of this experience. (We do offer a Senior Pilgrimage in the Fall of even years for those with mild mobility issues.)
- Be serving in some form of <u>Credentialed Ministry</u> (Ordained, Certified, Licensed, etc.)
 A copy of the minster's credentials (certificate or letter) is to accompany the nomination form.
- Be currently serving in a <u>leadership ministry</u>, with regular preaching responsibility. This means that they are employed by the church in a leadership role and that ministry is considered their primary source of income.
- Be mindful of the value of including women and minority pastors for consideration.
- Have <u>served at least one year</u> in full time ministry in a primary leadership role as pastor / minister.
- Have <u>at least ten years of full time service</u> remaining in their active ministry. This
 opportunity is intended to enhance the ongoing preaching, teaching and overall biblical
 understanding of the participant, and in turn, benefit those they serve.
- Be willing to travel with an <u>ecumenical group</u> of other ministers from many denominations and religious groups, both male and female ministers, and maintain a professional and courteous attitude toward all.
- Be willing to travel in a program sponsored by the <u>Grand Encampment of Knights</u>
 <u>Templar of the USA</u>, an appendant organization of <u>Freemasonry</u>.
- Be willing to travel **without their spouse**. This is non-negotiable.
- Have the understanding that this is a <u>strenuous educational and spiritual study</u>
 seminar / historical & cultural immersion experience and not a vacation trip.
