"Nothing is Wasted"

This year for Lent, I am preaching through a sermon series I'm calling "COVID Lessons" – i.e. things I have learned, noticed, or observed over the past year of this COVID-19 pandemic. Now, I realize – some of you are already tired of talking about COVID. You just want to escape it all and get back to normal. Believe me, I get it!

And yet, I also know that, to quote one of my favorite songs,

And nothing is wasted Nothing is wasted In the hands of our Redeemer Nothing is wasted¹

The Apostle Paul also teaches this in his letter to the Romans: "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28, ESV). In other words, in the hands of our Redeemer, Jesus Christ, even the most horrible bits of our lives, even our times of grief and pain and loneliness, even our times of sickness and struggle – all these things are used somehow, by the mysterious grace of God, for good for all those who belong to Him. Nothing is wasted. Nothing that happens to us and nothing we experience is superfluous. By the grace of God, even these things will be made beautiful!²

So now that we are a year in to this time of epidemic, ask yourself: How has God been using this in my life? What has God been teaching me? How has this changed me? Is it for the better? Has this brought me closer to God? Or has it taken me further away?

So far in February, I've already focused on the prevalence of anxiety and fear in this past year, and how Jesus still tells us not to be anxious about our lives (see February 21's sermon: "Do Not Be Anxious About Your Life"). We've also looked at the importance not only of worship, but of *gathering together* for worship and fellowship (see February 28's sermon "Congregations Congregate"). In March, I'll present three more sermons on things that God has been pointing out to me, things I've been ruminating upon, or frankly, lessons I just think we need to hear again. These are just a few ideas, a few musings that God has been bringing to mind, and which I have felt convicted to share with us all.

My hope in all of this is not only that we all will grow closer to the Lord, but also that these sermons will get us all to think about what the Lord is trying to tell each of us. God may be pointing out different things to you than He is to me; He may have other lessons for you to learn or to share. Either way, Isaiah 55 admonishes us to "seek the Lord while He may be found" (Isaiah 55:6a, ESV). So as we consider these things together in this season of prayer and preparation, let us continue to draw near to the Lord to hear what He has to say to us in these unusual times. For indeed – nothing is wasted! Even these days will be made beautiful and glorious in the hands of our Redeemer, Jesus Christ, who lived and died for us!

Hallelujah! To Him along be the glory!

Also, the Pop-Up Children's Library will be available for children ages 0-12, in the Sunday school hallway during the Sunday school hour.


Lent continues this month

They are requesting: cleaning supplies such as dishwashing liquid, floor cleaners, swiffers, mops and endust, air fresheners (pop-up or sprays) and Personal care items: body wash, hair spray. Our free community meal, **Bountiful Hearts**, continues on the first Saturday of every month. Our next meal will be on Saturday **March 6**, from 11am – 1pm here at our church. **This month our meal is carry-out or delivery only**. We anticipate we will be delivering 40 to 45 meals to those who cannot, or have health concerns about, coming in for their lunch. In addition, we typically serve 35-45 carryout lunches.

It takes a team of 3-4 cooks, 6 delivery drivers, 3-4 servers to package up all the carry out meals. Yes, we all do double duty, but we still need about 10 volunteers each month. If you are interested or have questions, please let Tamela Hinson know.

High school age youth and young adults meet in the Y.C. Room on the second floor to discuss topics related to faith and Christian living.


Adult Sunday School
