

"Being the Church Today Through Prayer"



This article is submitted to emphasize the importance and necessity of prayer, and how an effective prayer life is central to our well being.

As born again believers, we believe that the key to the kingdom is through communing in prayer with God, and our faith unlocks the door to the kingdom. Hebrews 11:1 says, Now faith is

the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Continuing in <u>Hebrews 11:6</u>, But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God, must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Faith through prayer is the key that allows us to enter into His holy presence, and once we are there, He will reward us in accordance with His will for our life.

I Thessalonians 5:17 says to "Pray Without ceasing.

Prayer is a learned art. In <u>Luke 11:1</u>, one of his disciples came to him and said. "Lord Teach us how to pray." The Apostles recognized that if they were to do the job that Christ intended for them to do, they must learn how to pray.

In Memory of My Long-time Friend, Rev. R. L. Sanders




You have finished your work. You have finished your schedule. Your agenda has been completed. You have been dismissed from work to go home. *This is your day!*

PRAYER BOWL 2011

The Annual Prayer Bowl was held on the evening of December 31, 2011. It began promptly at 6:00 PM and ended about 12:30 AM.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Prayer Bowl, it is Fairview's manner of watching the old year fade out and greeting in the new year in celebration to our Lord and Savior.

A large and enthusiastic band of worshippers started to gather shortly before 6 PM and many remained through the entire worship service and heard the benediction given. I am thankful once again, to report that God enable me to be there from the beginning to the end. This is the 15th Prayer bowl that I have been able to be a part of since becoming a member of Fairview.

A brief chronology of the proceeding follows. For those



of you who desire more of the details, Fairview's Media Ministry can be contacted for the entire worship session.

After the call to worship and an opening selection by Fairview's Praise & Worship team, a visiting Deacon invoked God's blessings upon the proceedings. The Praise team continued to lift us on up a little higher with another musical selection before giving way to the first speaker of the evening.

There were six Pastors and churches participating; Five of them from the local area and one from Texas. Each speaker provided inspired music to augment the spoken word.

Rev. Kelly R. Booker, Pastor of the New Union Baptist Church opened up with an inspiring message, which he titled "*From a Maniac to a Missionary*." His text was taken from Mark 5:15-20.

Next came **Rev Lee Cooper**, proud Pastor of the Prospect Baptist Church. Pastor Cooper reminded us that "It Ain't Over Just Yet" with <u>Luke 7:11-17</u> as the basis of that declaration

The 8:00 PM headliner was **Rev. K. Gerone Free**, Pastor of the Mt. Carmel Baptist Church. Pastor Free went to the book of <u>Genesis 50:14-21</u> to preach a message on "*Releasing The Hurt*."

From the St. John Missionary Baptist Church came Rev.

Dr. Major Lewis Jemison. Pastor Jemison added icing on the cake with a short, succinct, powerful message on "It Can Be Done," using Philippians 4:12-13 as his text. Pastor Jemison generally is a proclaimer of few words, but my oh my, does he say a lot with those "few words". The choir from St. John provided music for not only our ears, but souls as well.

At the 10:00 PM hour, **Rev. Levi Lenley**, cousin of Fairview's venerable Pastor John A. Reed Jr., was the featured speaker. Pastor Lenley used to have a local church, but over the past year, he moved to a church in Fort Worth, Texas. He spoke on "Dancing in The Rain" with Judges 4:9 as the text.

Quite fittingly to provide a solid foundation for the evening worship service, a Son in the ministry of Pastor Reed and the Fairview Church came on the scene to take us into the New Year. From the Greater Bethel Baptist Church, **Pastor Teron Gaddis** literally lifted the roof off the Sanctuary, and had the worshippers in an uproar with his message. His subject was "I Am Blessed In Spite" and preached from Ephesians 1:1-6.

Those verses proclaim the glory and the holiness of Jesus Christ and informs us that we too can display that same glory and holiness through Christ who strengthens us. The benediction followed after a brief word from Pastor Reed thanking those who attended.

We give a shout out to Sister Willa Nero who provided food to the ministers and refreshments to the masses with assistance from her Culinary Ministry members. Many thanks also to the Fairview Staff, Leaders, Ministries and membership for supporting the Prayer Bowl.
