I have also heard the ARRL will be scheduling several talks at this year's Hamvention. And don't forget, we should start firming up our club's plans to go the River Raisin Park in Monroe.

Larry KB8POD is requesting volunteers to assist with Oakland County Siren Testing program. As he has done for the past several years, he will begin taking check-ins at some time around noon on the Clarkston Repeater (the same one used for our Monday night nets), and following his long standing tradition, is looking to having at least one report for every siren in the Northwest Corner of Oakland County. I will be sending e-mails at different times throughout the next nine months, and request that our members help him and Oakland County with this valuable service.

For the March meeting, I would like to have a show and tell night. It can be anything pertaining to ham radio, a recent award, a new piece of equipment, a recently constructed kit or do it yourself project. Even a QSL card from a special event station or rare DX will work. This will be our time to say that we can have fun with ham radio.

Every once in a while, I received some interesting materials, and this month, I have included a postcard from the Raleigh Amateur Radio Society. A friend of mine, Fred KK4HEG will be using PSK31 and will be operating as W4DW as one of the 50 point bonus stations.

And in closing, it's not too early to start thinking about the Dayton Hamvention, and an announcement from Arrow Communication Association is included for those interested in the bus ride from Ann Arbor.

Just wanted to share this picture from a postcard received earlier this month from the sponsors of the North Carolina QSO Party. The caption on the reverse side reads "Antenna feed lines leaving the Edward R. Murrow VOA (Voice of America) Site "B" Transmitting Facility to the antenna farm. Broadcasting on 2600 acres from North Carolina's eastern coastal plane. Voice of America was a decisive, diplomatic tool used by the United States and NATO achieving victory in the Cold War (1947 – 1991). Nine shortwave transmitters ranging from 50 to 500 KW, are output to a switching matrix of some 38 wire antennas, which include Dipole Curtain Arrays, Rhombics, and giant Log Periodics. Still in operation today, this voice of freedom can be heard in far reaches of the world using only inexpensive SW receivers where internet and satellites are yet a reality."
