





#### **Ecoware** – Practical, creative and good for the planet



**Big Bite Eco** is eco-ware for food lovers. Created in Sydney, the beautiful, affordable and reusable items include food storage, lunchboxes, bento boxes, drinkware, produce bags, and more. They're made from biodegradable bamboo, linen or silicone. Oh, and they sell face masks as well.



Reduce your food waste, save money and reduce the amount of plastic in the world! The Swag have created a range of food storage bags made from 100% natural, unbleached, unseeded cotton. Rather than the unnatural environment of a plastic bag, **The Swag** is a natural breathable bag that helps your food stay fresher for longer.



**#Untrashy** have a huge range sustainable and reusable alternatives to single-use plastic products. Everything from brightly coloured squishy, unsmashable silicone wine glasses to a take-anywhere telescopic straw and matching straw cleaner in a keyring case – you're sure to find something for everyone.



Amber's Food Wraps let you throw away your clingwrap and use non-toxic wax wraps to keep your food fresh. Amber's Food Wraps are made from 100% cotton designed by the traditional owners of the Northern Territory, Australia. They are dipped and finished in organic beeswax, which is locally sourced; organic resin, and organic jojoba oil.



Natural Panaa have created a beautiful alternative to plastic party plates and cups with products made from the Areca leaf. Make these a talking point at your next party! Did you know these products are created from fallen Areca leaves – so no trees are harmed in the production of these products – WOW!

### **Kids** – gifts for children with heart, inspiration and fun



For a beautiful range of timber and natural toys for children of all ages, head to Malvern (Melbourne) store Honeybee. You'll find non-toxic face pencils, nativity sets, music and jewellery boxes, child-sized gardening gloves, wobble boards, castles and even a kitchen sink



Little Earth Nest has a lovely range of toys, from fairy doors to pirate ships. There's a dump truck made from recycled plastic, a sustainable timber Victorian dolls house, recycled silver earrings, a gardening board game made from 75% recycled materials, natural bath crayons, and eco-chalk for hair colouring (instead of spray cans!).



100 Story Building produces books and a quarterly magazine edited by young people for young people. Read some crazy tales and find a whole lot of inspiration to get writing, drawing and creating. Inspire a young reader or writer you know with a magazine or workshop.



Lost in Books A kids' bookshop in Western Sydney with titles in 65 languages, Lost in Books is also a café, safe space for women, creative learning centre and language exchange hub. The books cater for newborns through to young adults and grown-ups.



Mama Maya's baby swaddles are made from organic cotton muslin, and each one purchased funds at least one clean birthing kit and its journey to the hands of a birth attendant in a developing country.



Grow Your Mind If a child in your life has difficulty with emotional regulation, these little gifts could be just what they (or their parents) need. From a fridge magnet that reminds children how to put their problems into perspective, to a "feelings" version of Snakes and Ladders and a breathing-style treasure wheel, this is a lovely and way fun to help.





Designed in Bondi Beach and made in Western Sydney, the **2xo** quality bags are made from upcycled billboards, firehoses, banners, sail cloth and rubber. From laptop sleeves to totes and tiny "fortune cookie" bags for coins.



The Pluralist make watches with numbers in kanji or Arabic, and donate \$5 from every watch sold to a not-for-profit organisation. Stylish and different!



**Nue Bar** have a selection of PH balanced hair care bars. Everything you want from your shampoo and conditioner but without the plastic bottle. The products are palm oil free, handmade, vegan, cruelty free, contain no SLS, SLES, parabens, silicones, petroleum by-products or artificial fragrances. 

Parramatta Mission Buy a loved one a virtual aift card from Parramatta Mission and you can help support the Festival of Christmas giving aifts and support to people in need.




The Smith Family Give a gift that puts a Christmas present under the tree for a disadvantaged child who might otherwise go without.

Unicef allows you to buy a range of gifts helping with education, clean water, nutrition, maternal health and more. For just \$51 you can provide 200 polio vaccines.



Help conserve endangered animals such as tigers, orangutans and pygmy elephants by "adopting" an animal through WWF, and your loved one will receive an adoption certificate, sticker, factbook and other goodies, including optional soft toy.



GiveNow is an Australian online donations platform that connects you to the causes you and your loved ones care about. You can donate money on someone's behalf or find other creative ways to give, like donating stamps to help a charity reach a bigger audience.

Words With Heart combines environmentally responsible production, funding for women's and girls' education projects, and word that empower. With your artwork they'll make anything from business cards and stickers to posters and notepads, and they'll use the profits to pay for education for women and girls in the developing world.



For beautiful Australian-made cards printed on 100% postconsumer waste recycled paper, head to **Earth Greetings**. They have cards for a wide range of occasions, and also sell wrapping paper, gift tags, bookmarks, and calendars. 10% of their profits are donated to environmental organisations.



Rosie Lou's Australian designed and made cards are beautiful and quirky, like the play-on-words "I love you from my head tomatoes" card, printed with vegetable ink on recycled paper. There are also gift packs of seeds, wrapping paper, notebooks and some textile items as well.



Charity Greeting Cards gives you dozens of charities to support when you buy your cards. The charities on offer include Father Chris Riley's Youth Off the Streets, The Children's Hospital at Westmead, MS, Kids Helpline and Parramatta Mission.



Customise your gift cards with **Charity Card Market**, a company that donates 20% of the takings to your chosen charity (over seventy to choose from!), prints the cards on eco-friendly paper and uses soy-based inks. You can even upload your own image.
