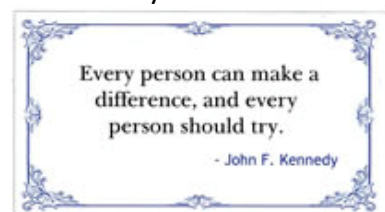

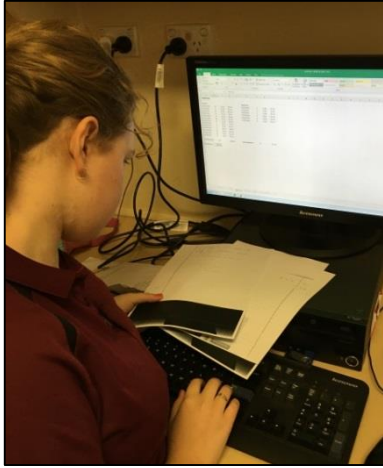
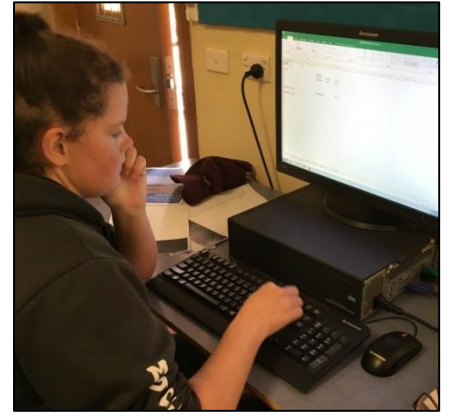

YEAR 9-12 CAREERS EXPO AT CONDOBOLIN HIGH

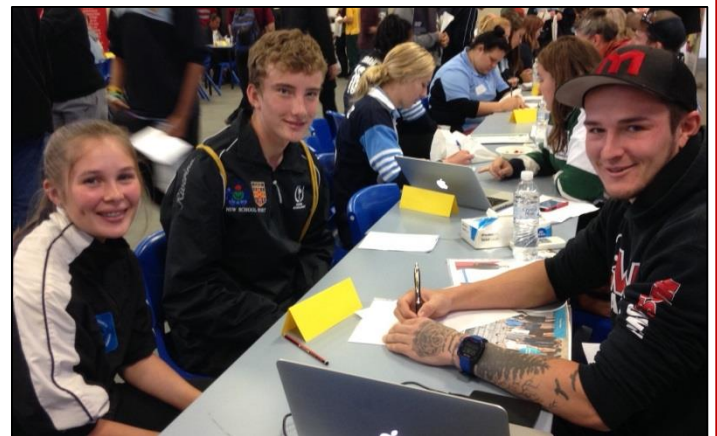
