NATIONAL SCHOOL SPORTS ASSOCIATION U12'S CRICKET CARNIVAL

The National School Sports Australia under 12s Cricket Carnival was held in Bunbury, WA from 12th to 19th December 2018. Harry Roscarel was chosen to represent NSW after a dominant performance at the NSW PSSA Carnival, where he was a member of the Western side that came third.

Harry was one of two country boys in the team, the other being Riley Keen from Condobolin Public School, who plays with Harry in the West Wyalong cricket team in the intertown competition. The fact two country boys from the same team were selected in the NSW team was a remarkable achievement. The other eleven players were from the Sydney region.

The week before the carnival there was a three day team practice in Raby, Sydney, from Wednesday to Friday. They were presented with their 'Baggy Blues' by former Australian fast bowler, Brett Lee. The first two days were spent in fielding drills, net practice and game play. On the third day the NSW 12's team played against an U14's. side. This was a good opportunity to get to know each other better and to play as a team. A good days play saw the NSW team have a relatively easy win. By the end of the three days the boys were all getting on really well.

Back home again Friday night, cricket on Saturday and then intertown rep cricket on Sunday in Young. Apparently there can never be too much cricket! Monday was a drive to Sydney to fly out to Perth. In the departure lounge the South Australian Cricket team were heading back to Adelaide and Harry got all of the team to sign his cap.

Day 1 NSW v SA

NSW batted first and made 8-167. In an exciting finish NSW bowled SA out for 153 with 8 balls to go. Harry did not have the best of days, only making 4 before being caught and bowled - at least it wasn't a duck!

Day 2 NSW v NT

On a very hot day, NT batted first and NSW bowled them out for 107. NSW chased the runs down in 28 overs, 1-111. Harry had a better day with the bat, came in first drop and scored 18 not out, in a 66 run partnership. This placed them at the top of their pool after day 2.

The following day was a rest day. There was a planned excursion to the aquarium. The boys travelled out to the end of a jetty on a train and then descended to the aquarium that was on the ocean floor. It was a great experience.

Day 3 NSW v WA

NSW took on WA to battle for top spot in their pool. This was a rather disjointed game with numerous stops and starts due to the rain. They eventually managed to complete the game. NSW batted first and were in trouble at 8/100 and then Riley Keen from Condobolin came in and put on a fantastic batting display, 46 runs from 52 balls. NSW were all out 161.

WA batted and after an early wicket there was an hour lost due to rain. It eventually cleared and NSW had to bowl them out before 6.00pm or it would be declared a draw. Some great bowling, catching, fielding and teamwork saw them bowl WA out for 60. This put NSW in a semifinal against ACT. The winner going into the GF and loser playing off for 3 and 4.

Day 4 NSW vs ACT (semifinal)

NSW batted first - 8/174 defeated by ACT 5/177.

It was a close finish, - 6 overs remained for ACT to get 24 runs for the win. It came down to 2 overs and 6 runs required for the win. Harry had a great throw in to the stumps to effect the run out of one of the ACT batters who was scoring really well. The boys fielded well, but the game went for 10 balls too many, leading to an ACT win. The boys were disappointed as this knocked them out of the Grand Final, however they could hold their heads high as they played hard till the last ball.

The next day was another rest day. Harry went to Tree Top Adventure Park which was an awesome experience, climbing and zip lining suspended in the trees.

Day 5 NSW v WA (play off for 3rd and 4th place)

NSW played very well, batting confidently and fielding well. WA batted first and were all out for 128. In reply NSW were 5/129 in 32 overs. Harry again batted number 3. He batted well before being caught for 27 runs in a 57 run partnership.

The NSW boys were the Bronze Medal winners and the NSW Girls were the Gold Medal winners, which made them the overall winners of the Combined Points Score trophy.

The cricket fields in Bunbury were all very green and looked like bowling greens. A great place to play cricket. While Harry didn't bat as well as he had hoped to during the carnival, overall he still put in a solid performance and ended up in the top third in Australia, which was an outstanding achievement.

As a finale to this competition the team were awarded their Bronze medals at the Sydney Cricket Ground during the New Year's Test Match against India.

What a wonderful experience this was for Harry. He made some great friends, some of whom he has since played with and against at carnivals in Orange and Dubbo. No doubt that he will continue to do so in the years to come.


